FROM A-1, EXCLUSIVE AGRICULTURAL TO A-3, AGRICULTURAL/RURAL RESIDENTIAL

<u>R3701A-14 – Russell Bienfang/Donald Bienfang Property:</u> Rezone 4.7 acres around the buildings at N5775 **Ziebell Road** in the Town of Aztalan from PINs 002-0714-2231-000 (39 Acres) and 002-0714-2234-000 (28.75 Acres).

FROM A-1, EXCLUSIVE AGRICULTURAL TO N, NATURAL RESOURCE

<u>R3702A-14 – Russell Bienfang/Donald Bienfang Property:</u> Create a 16.3-acre Natural Resource zone on **Zimmerman Lane** in the Town of Aztalan from part of PINs 002-0714-2224-001 (15 Acres) and 002-0714-2231-000 (39 Acres).

FROM A-2, AGRICULTURAL AND RURAL BUSINESS TO A-3, AGRICULTURAL/RURAL RESIDENTIAL

<u>R3703A-14 – Bark River Campground and Resort, Inc:</u> Rezone one acre with the home at **W2340 Hanson** Road in the Town of Sullivan from PIN 026-0616-3024-000 (37.83 Acres).

CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT APPLICATIONS

<u>CU1769-14 – Brian & Bonnie Pernat:</u> Conditional use for expansion of the existing building at W1194 Marietta Avenue in the Town of Ixonia, modifying an existing conditional use. The site is part of PIN 012-0816-2231-009 (0.938 Acres) in a Community zone.

<u>CU1773-14 – David Raymond:</u> Conditional use for an extensive on-site storage structure exceeding square footage and height allowed in a Residential R-2 zone. The site is at **N715 Old 26 Road** in the Town of Koshkonong, on PIN 016-0513-2514-001 (1.322 Acres).

ZONING ORDINANCE TEXT AMENDMENTS

R3704T-14 – Jefferson County: Add 11.05(a)7. Revocation of Conditional Use Permits

This amendment adds language to the ordinance to clarify the process by which the County may revoke a conditional use permit (CUP). This process would be taken up after all other avenues or attempts at compliance have failed.

R3705T-14 – Jefferson County: Repeal and recreate 11.05(h) Mobile Tower Siting The legislature passed new statutory changes to Wis. Stat. 66.0404, which invalidated the current Wireless Telecommunication Facilities Ordinance, Sec. 11.05(h). The changes are quite specific as to what the County can and cannot regulate when it comes to new tower and/or colocation of new/replacement antennas and equipment. A new model ordinance that meets the new law was put together by the Wisconsin Towns' Association attorney and presented to County Zoning Administrators at our last conference. We are proposing adoption of this model ordinance. Right now, until the new ordinance is passed, there is no regulation for new towers or colocation.

R3706T-14 – Jefferson County: Modify 11.09 Non-Conforming Uses, Structures and Lots

Due to Act 170, passed by the legislature, it is necessary to change the non-conforming section of the ordinance. Act 170 now prohibits a county from regulating non-conforming structures by assessed value. What the County is proposing is to regulate non-conforming structures by limiting reconstruction of structural members, which includes foundation walls, walls, floor and roofs, to 50% of those members. It also proposes to limit expansions of non-conforming structures to 50% of the footprint. It also updates language from 59.69(10m)(b) which permits reconstruction of non-conforming structures when damage was caused by violent wind, vandalism, fire, ice, flood, snow, mold or infestation.

R3707T-14 – Jefferson County: Add/modify Adaptive Reuse of Barns – 11.02 and 11.04(f) 5, 7

This amendment comes forward after a year-long process which included multiple meetings involving Town representatives. The proposed language will allow historic preservation of pre-1970 barns and continue to preserve farmland and agriculture, while promoting economic activities and uses in these structures. This will add principal and conditional uses to the A-2 and A-T zoning districts which can be regulated to utilize old barns.

DENIAL OF PETITION R3694A-14

This petition was requested by Brian and Michelle Gauder to rezone the property at N1011 Vinne Ha Ha Road along with conditional use to allow a tourist rooming house. It is recommended for denial based upon the Town Board of Koshkonong's denial, and recommendation for denial from the Planning and Zoning Committee due to concerns over minimal road width, inadequate parking area, the fact that the lot is so small as to additionally require a variance for the proposed use, as well as neighbors' complaints regarding the current operation.

Amend Zoning Ordinance

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors has heretofore been petitioned to amend the Jefferson County Zoning Ordinance, and

WHEREAS, Petitions R3695A-14, R3696A-14, R3697A-14, R3698A-14, R3699A-14 and R3700A-14 were referred to the Jefferson County Planning and Zoning Committee for public hearing on January 16, 2014, and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendments have been given due consideration by the Board of Supervisors in open session,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors does amend the zoning ordinance of Jefferson County (and official zoning maps) as follows:

FROM AGRICULTURAL TRANSITION TO RESIDENTIAL R-2

Rezone PIN 016-0614-3333-039 (0.75 acre) at **W6429 USH 12** in the Town of Koshkonong. A conditional use has also been approved to allow an extensive on-site storage structure at this location. R3695A-14 – Jason Fiege

FROM EXCLUSIVE AGRICULTURAL A-1 TO A-3, AGRICULTURAL/RURAL RESIDENTIAL

Create a new 6-acre building site on **Findlay Road** in the Town of Cold Spring from part of PIN 004-0515-1622-001 (39 acres). This utilizes the last available A-3 zone for the property; therefore rezoning is conditioned upon recording of an affidavit acknowledging that fact. It is further conditioned upon road access approval, upon receipt by Zoning of a soil test showing sites for installation of both initial and replacement private sewage systems, and upon approval and recording of a final certified survey map for the lot. Rezoning shall be null and void and of no effect one year from the date of County Board approval unless all applicable conditions have been completed by that date. R3696A-14 – Ronald Drost

Rezone a 5-acre farm consolidation lot around the buildings at N1704 Findlay Road in the Town of Cold Spring from part of PINs 004-0515-0933-000 (40 acres) and 004-0515-1622-001 (39 acres). Rezoning is conditioned upon approval and recording of a final certified survey map for the lot. Rezoning shall be null and void and of no effect one year from the date of County Board approval unless all applicable conditions have been completed by that date. R3697A-14 – Ronald Drost

Create a 2-acre building site on **Hope Lake Road** in the Town of Lake Mills from part of PIN 018-0713-3334-002 (33.686 acres). This utilizes the last available A-3 zone for the property, and therefore is conditioned upon recording of an affidavit acknowledging that fact. It is further

conditioned upon road access approval by the Town, upon receipt by Zoning of a soil test showing sites for installation of both initial and replacement private sewage systems and upon approval and recording of a final certified survey map. Rezoning shall be null and void and of no effect one year from the date of County Board approval unless all applicable conditions have been completed by that date. R3698A-14 Harold Stilling/Stilling Farms Inc. property

Create a 2.9-acre farm consolidation lot around the buildings at N8066 CTH Q in the Town of Milford from part of PIN 020-0814-2812-000 (40 acres). This action is conditioned upon approval and recording of a final certified survey map for the lot. Rezoning shall be null and void and of no effect one year from the date of County Board approval unless all applicable conditions have been completed by that date. R3699A-14 – Stephen & Kathleen Duwe

FROM AGRICULTURAL/RURAL RESIDENTIAL A-3 TO A-2, AGRICULTURAL AND RURAL BUSINESS

Rezone a total of 3 acres from A-3 to A-2, with a 1.4-acre lot to be created around an existing telecommunication tower and 1.6 acres to be added to an adjoining existing A-2 zone at N515 Howard Road. Section 3. Section 3.05(2)(h) of the Board of Supervisors' Rules of Order shall be amended as follows:

(h) LAW ENFORCEMENT AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE -

Five members. This Committee shall consist of five members and shall have jurisdiction over issues affecting the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office. This Committee shall handle grievances arising under the Sheriff's Office labor contract other than those involving suspension, demotion or discharge mentioned in Wisconsin Statute 59.26(8)(b). This Committee is also responsible for all matters pertaining to Emergency Management and in accordance with s. 323.14(1)(3), Wis. Stats., the County Board Chairperson shall designate a member of the Committee to act as chairperson when this Committee is convened as an Emergency Management Committee. [Am. 02/08/05, Ord. 2004-31; 03/14/06, Ord. 2005-48g; 12/14/10, Ord. 2010-20]

This Committee shall work with the District Attorney and Coroner (<u>Medical Examiner effective 1/1/2015</u>) in handling business matters and in solving problems related to those offices and shall present matters to the County Board on behalf of said offices whenever necessary. [am. 03/11/08, Ord. 2007-37]

Section 4. Section 3.06(o) of the Board of Supervisors' Rules of Order shall be amended as follows:

- (o) TRAFFIC SAFETY COMMISSION In accordance with s. 83.013, Stats., the Traffic Safety Commission shall consist of the statutorily named persons, with the balance of the 12 members appointed to twelve members appointed indeterminate terms by the County Administrator. [Cr. 03/14/06, Ord. 2005-54; re-lettered 0/15/08, Ord. 2008-01 and Ord. 2008-02; am. 03/09/10, Ord. 2009-24; re-lettered 07/13/10, Ord. 2010-09; re-lettered 12/14/10, Ord. 2010-20; re-lettered 3/13/12, Ord. 2011-24]
- Section 5. Section 3.06(q) of the Board of Supervisors' Rules of Order shall be renumbered 3.06(r).

Section 6. Section 3.06(q) of the Board of Supervisors' Rules of Order shall be created as follows:

(r) WISCONSIN RIVER RAIL TRANSIT COMMISSION (WRRTC) — Three members to staggered three-year terms ending on April 30 in respective years and one alternate, appointed by the Chair and confirmed by the Board. The Commission was created in 1980 for the purpose of retaining rail service in the member counties which are now Crawford, Dane, Grant, Iowa, Jefferson, Rock, Sauk, Walworth and Waukesha. The Commission's mission is to further support maintaining rail accessibility for businesses in the County and possibly expanding such service south from Watertown to Jefferson and Fort Atkinson. [See Res. 2013-98, 01-14-2014]

Section 7. This ordinance shall be effective after passage and publication as provided by law.

Opposition to SB-349 and AB-476 limiting local control of nonmetallic mining operations

WHEREAS, the establishment, operation, and expansion of nonmetallic mining operations can significantly affect the local environment, economy, and public health of the community, and the general qualify of life in the surrounding area, and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 349 and Assembly Bill 476 have been introduced in the Wisconsin Legislature to restrict or eliminate local governmental authority in regulating these operations, and

WHEREAS, SB-349 and AB-476 prohibit local governmental units from imposing restrictions on expansion of these operations to neighboring lands, and

WHEREAS, SB-349 and AB-476 prohibit a county from enacting or enforcing a nonmetallic mining reclamation ordinance that requires an operator to obtain a permit other than a reclamation permit, or that includes standards related to air and water quality, or is more restrictive than Wisconsin DNR standards, and

WHEREAS, SB-349 and AB-476 prohibit counties from imposing any fee or other restriction on a highway user for damage to highways caused by the highway user unless the county has entered into a contract with a highway user to reimburse the county for the cost of repairs to a highway that meets specific requirements, including a requirement that the proportion of damages caused specifically by the highway user must be determined by an engineer selected by the user and the county, and paid for equally by the user and the county, and

WHEREAS, the health, safety, economic, environmental, and quality of life impacts of these operations are primarily issues of local concern, and

WHEREAS, SB-349 and AB-476 are worded in such a manner that Jefferson County feels that the eventual effect of the proposed changes could have far reaching and unintended consequences in other areas currently regulated by the County and could greatly affect health, safety, economic, and environmental issues from other uses, and ultimately greatly impact the quality of life of Jefferson County citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors that it supports local control of nonmetallic mining operations regarding their impacts on the community, and opposes Senate Bill 349 and Assembly Bill 476, and any other state legislation that would preempt the ability of the County to craft its own regulations tailored to its individual and unique circumstances, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to Governor Walker, Wisconsin DNR Secretary Stepp, the Wisconsin Counties Association, and Jefferson County's legislators.

Approve purchase of Bobcat

WHEREAS, the Fair Park has budgeted funds to purchase a front end loader for moving material including the need to load it into trucks, and

WHEREAS, their staff has tested a JCB (\$48,957) that was too small and could not perform all of the functions necessary; a Manitou MLT 625 (\$69,000) and a New Holland (\$62,900), and other equipment like compact wheel loaders; and through the process has decided that the Bobcat V417-Cab VersaHandler best meets their needs because of its lifting capacity and compactness to get in and out of the various Fair Park buildings, and

WHEREAS, the list price for a Bobcat VersaHandler including freight and dealer preparation is \$75,194, and

WHEREAS, Jefferson County may purchase said Bobcat as a member of the National Joint Purchase Agreement for the total amount of \$52,935,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Fair Park is authorized to purchase a Bobcat V417-Cab VersaHandler in the amount of \$52,935 from Mid-State Group, Inc., Watertown, Wisconsin.

Authorize Highway Department equipment rental for 2014

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Highway Department is renting equipment needed for 2014 highway construction and maintenance projects, and

WHEREAS, rental quotes for a time period of between two and four months were solicited for a variety of construction and maintenance equipment, and

WHEREAS, one equipment vendor (Roland Equipment) provided the lowest monthly rental rates for all the anticipated equipment needs:

ORDINANCE NO. 2013-

Update sections of the Personnel Ordinance to address vacation, holiday and voluntary benefit matters

WHEREAS, Personnel Ordinance, Section HR0130, states that the Personnel Ordinance shall be reviewed every January by the Human Resources Committee of the County Board, and

WHEREAS, the Human Resources Director recommends changes to various sections of HR0600, Benefits, addressing vacation and holiday carryover matters and consolidating voluntary benefit sections.

THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF JEFFERSON COUNTY DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section HR0690, Vacation With Pay, of the Personnel Ordinance shall be amended as follows:

HR0690 VACATION WITH PAY.

- Department heads shall have full responsibility and discretion for setting vacation periods for all employees under their supervision during the calendar year. In doing so the department head shall be guided by the good of the County service and orderly conduct of the work and functions of each particular department. Department Heads shall monitor accrual balances to ensure that each employee has a reasonable opportunity to use accrued vacation. [renumbered 12/13/11, ord. 2011-21; am. ord 2012-26, 02/12//2013]
- F. All employees shall be encouraged to make use of earned vacation time in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance. Any employee who is given a reasonable opportunity to take earned vacation and who does not do so shall be deemed to have waived said vacation and shall not be entitled to compensation thereof. An employee may, with department head, Human Resources Director and County Administrator approval, carry over a maximum of 40 hours vacation time which shall be used by December 31 of the succeeding year, or be forfeited. Requests to carry over vacation must be made to the Human Resources Department no later than December 15, and include the maximum number of hours to carry over and the reason(s) the employee was unable to use the accrued vacation time. The Administration and Rules Committee shall decide any request made by the County Administrator. [am. ord. 2005-43, 02/14/06; am. ord. 2007-50, 03/11/08; renumbered 12/13/11, ord. 2011-21; am. ord 2012-26. 02/12/2013]
- G. Employees who have 8 hours or less in their vacation bank on December 31 shall be able to carry over this time, with department head approval, to be used by January 20 or be forfeited.
- G.H. Hours in excess of 40 may be considered for carry over only for employees whose vacation was cancelled by the County during the month of December. If this occurs, a written request shall be made by the employee, approved by the department head, and submitted to Human Resources no later than January 5 of the succeeding year. The County Administrator shall consider all requests and if approved, will determine when the vacation shall be used by, or forfeited.
- H.<u>I.</u> A report summarizing approved requests shall be made to the Human Resources Committee.

L.J. Any employee who has exhausted earned sick leave credits shall be entitled to use earned vacation and compensatory time for sick leave with written permission from the employee only. [renumbered 12/13/11, ord. 2011-21]

Section 2. Section HR0645, Holidays, of the Personnel Ordinance shall be amended as follows:

HR0645

HOLIDAYS. [am. 12/13/11, ord. 2011-21]

A. All eligible employees shall be allowed the following days with pay, pro-rated for eligible part-time employees, working at least half-time: [am. 12/13/11, ord. 2011-21]

- B. Nonrepresented Sheriff's Department staff shall follow their respective union contract schedule. [am. 12/13/11, ord. 2011-21]
- C. In lieu of the paid holidays above, Communications Operators and Cooks in the Sheriff's Department, 9-month Seasonal Maintenance Workers in the Parks Department, and Intake/On-call Workers, Group Home Workers and the Lueder Haus Supervisor at Human Services, shall receive ten (10) floating holidays each year. Such days are to be taken at the discretion of the employee subject to the approval of the supervisor. Such employees shall work if scheduled on any day otherwise observed as a holiday by other County employees without additional compensation. Employees who have not used all of their holidays shall have them automatically paid out, on the first pay period in January at the previous year's rate in effect on December 31st. Holidays may be carried over into the new year upon approval of the County Administrator, used by March 1 or be forfeited. [cr. 12/13/11, ord. 2011-21]
- D. When a paid holiday falls on Saturday, the next preceding Friday shall become the paid holiday. When a paid holiday falls on Sunday, the next following Monday shall become the paid holiday. When December 24 is on Friday, the December 25 holiday shall be December 27. When December 24 is on Sunday, the holiday shall be December 26. [renumbered 12/13/11, ord. 2011-21]
- E. When an employee is required to work on a designated holiday or works extra hours during the week of a designated holiday, holiday hours which would be compensated in accordance with policy so as to exceed a total of 40 hours for the week may be banked for the employee's use at a mutually agreeable time. This section does not apply to exempt employees receiving random hours. [am. ord. 85-10, 7/9/85; ord. 2002-33, 3/11/03; ord. 2010-29, 3/14/11, renumbered 12/13/11, ord. 2011-21]
- F. Except as provided in HR0645 (C), unused holidays cannot be carried over from one year to the next. Unused holidays shall be deemed waived. An exception will be considered for new employees hired in November or December who can demonstrate that they did not have a reasonable opportunity to use the floating holiday. These employees may request carryover with approval by the department head, Human Resources Director and County Administrator. Also, in exceptional circumstances, such as when December 24 or December 25 are the

holidays affected by the emergency, the County Administrator may allow an employee to carry the unused holiday time into the next ensuing year. Such holiday time shall be used by March 1 of the succeeding year. A report summarizing approved requests shall be made to the Human Resources Committee [am ord. 2002-33, 3/11/2003; ord. 2003-27, 12/9/03; ord. 2006-35, 2/14/06; renumbered & am. 12/13/11, ord. 2011-21].

Section 3. Delete Sections HR0625, Deferred Compensation, HR0630, Disability Insurance, and HR0670, Section 125B Plan; amend Section HR0650, Life Insurance; and create Section HR0695, Voluntary Benefits, as follows:

HR0625 DEFERRED COMPENSATION. The County will offer employees an IRS qualified deferred compensation plan in which participants can defer some of their annual income (up to an annual limit), and which contributions and earnings are tax-deferred until withdrawal. [Resolution 1982-115]

- HR0630 DISABILITY INSURANCE. [am 11-12-2013, ord 2013-18] An employee who is regularly assigned 600 or more hours annually is eligible for disability insurance. The County will offer eligible employees the opportunity to participate in a voluntary long term disability insurance plan. The full cost of participating in the long-term disability plan will be paid for by the employee. The Human Resources Committee may approve vendor or plan changes when desirable.
- HR0670 SECTION 125B PLAN. The County will offer a Section 125 Plan which employees may utilize for insurance premiums, unreimbursed medical expenses or dependent care expenses. The Administrator for this plan will be reviewed on a regular basis and approved by the Human Resources Committee. The County Administrator may approve plan changes as necessary to keep it qualified. [Res. 2001-51, 10/9/01]
- LIFE INSURANCE. The County of Jefferson shall participate in the state group life HR0650 insurance plan for employee life, spousal and dependent children coverages. Eligible employees shall pay their required premium and the County shall pay its required premium for the basic plan. Eligible employees will also have the option of increasing their life insurance to three (3) times their annual salary by electing supplemental and one additional unit. For all coverage other than the basic plan, the employee will be responsible for the full cost of the life insurance. In addition, eligible employees may elect to participate in the Universal Life plan. [am. ord. 2006-30, 03/13/07]
- VOLUNTARY BENEFITS. Employees regularly scheduled to work 600 or more hours HR0695 annually may elect to participate in the County's voluntary benefit plans, unless as otherwise required by the benefit plan. The Human Resources Committee may approve vendor or plan changes when desirable, providing there is not a financial or negative impact to the County or employees, or the vendor/law requires full County Board approval. The County Administrator may execute amendments to such plan and the Human Resources Director shall act in the capacity of the plan administrator.
 - DEFERRED COMPENSATION. The County will offer employees an IRS A. qualified deferred compensation plan into which participants can defer some of their annual income (up to an annual limit), and which contributions and earnings are tax-deferred until withdrawal. [Resolution 1982-115]
 - DISABILITY INSURANCE. [am 11-12-2013, ord 2013-18] An employee who B. is regularly assigned 600 or more hours annually is eligible for disability insurance. The County will offer eligible employees the opportunity to participate in a voluntary long term disability insurance plan. The full cost of participating in the long-term disability plan will be paid for by the employee.

The Human Resources Committee may approve vendor or plan changes when desirable.

- C. <u>LIFE INSURANCE</u>. In addition to Group term life insurance, the County will offer a Universal Life policy.
- D. SECTION 125B PLAN. The County will offer a Section 125 Plan to employees eligible for health insurance, which employees may utilize for insurance premiums, unreimbursed medical expenses or dependent care expenses.

ORDINANCE NO. 2013-____

Establish procedure to set elected official salaries

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Register of Deeds, Clerk, Treasurer, Sheriff and Clerk of Court are elected to four-year terms with the Sheriff and Clerk of Court elections being in 2014, and the County Clerk, Register of Deeds and Treasurer next elected in 2016, and

WHEREAS, Section 59.22(1), Wisconsin Statutes, requires the Board to establish the compensation for these elective offices before the earliest time for filing nomination papers prior to each election cycle, and

WHEREAS, compensation needs to be established for the Clerk of Court and Sheriff before April 15, 2014, which is the earliest time for filing nomination papers in this cycle, and

WHEREAS, the Human Resources Committee through many election cycles has sought an objective method of establishing salaries for these offices, and

WHEREAS, the County had a Compensation Study done in 2012 for all county employees (except the Sheriff's Department deputies) which study also evaluated the elected positions and, based on the duties of said positions, recommend that the following pay grades be assigned to the various positions:

County Clerk	Grade 12
Clerk of Court	Grade 12
Register of Deeds	Grade 10
Treasurer	Grade 10
Sheriff	Grade 16

AND WHEREAS, for these offices the Human Resources Committee recommends establishing salaries by use of the same evaluation process used for other employees and further recommends assigning all elected officials to the mid-point of each pay grade, Step 6, for the duration of the four-year term in the amount that Step 6 is as of the day before the earliest time for filing nomination papers for said office in each election cycle, which amount shall remain unchanged during the balance of the four-year term,

THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF JEFFERSON COUNTY DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to Section 59.22(1), Wisconsin Statutes, salaries for each upcoming term of the elected offices of County Clerk, Clerk of Court, Register of Deeds, Treasurer and Sheriff, shall be determined by reference to Step 6 of the salary grades as set forth above for each

office as of the day before the earliest time for filing nomination papers for said office in each successive election cycle, which salary shall remain unchanged for said four-year term.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that county elected officials are entitled to participate in the Wisconsin Retirement System in accordance with law and the County shall pay its share of contributions required by law.

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the aforementioned county officials are entitled to participate in the County's health, dental, vision, disability, life insurance, Section 125B and other programs on the same terms and conditions as may be modified from time which apply to nonrepresented managerial employees with such variances as may be applicable to the Sheriff based on his law enforcement status.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the foregoing elected officials may request a salary grade review prior to the year of election for their office in the same manner as is applicable to other county employees requesting salary grade reviews.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be effective after passage and publication as provided by law.

Fiscal Note: The compensation increase for the five elected officials subject to this is \$85,155 through 2018, which is all four years of the upcoming terms for the Sheriff and Clerk of Court and the first two years of the terms for the Treasurer, County Clerk and Register of Deeds. (See the attached letter from Carlson-Dettmann, the 2013 pay chart and data reflecting salaries of Sheriffs and Clerks of Court in Jefferson and other counties.)

Re: Recommendations of Grade Placement for Elected Officials in Jefferson County

As part of the 2012 Compensation Study, Carlson Dettmann Consulting was asked for our recommendation on where the elective offices of Clerk of Circuit Court, County Clerk, County Treasurer, Register of Deeds and Sheriff would be placed on Jefferson County's approved salary structure if the respective elected positions were eligible to be included in that compensation plan. It is understood that it would be impractical for the salaries for these elective positions to be included in that compensation plan due to the fact that, in accordance with §59.22 (1)(a)1., Wis. Stats., the salaries must be established by the County Board before the earliest time for filing nomination papers for these offices for the ensuing term, and also that "a county board may not adopt a step-salary plan for elective offices related to experience of the officeholder as compensation is for the office, not the officer, and the officer is entitled to the compensation as an incident of the office." (61 Atty. Gen. 165, 403.) The County has advised us that the recommendation we are being asked to provide will be one of various considerations used by the Human Resource Committee when it makes a recommendation to the County Board regarding the salaries for these elective offices.

It is our recommendation that, if the elected officials were legally allowed to be placed on the approved 2013 structure, which as explained above they cannot, they would be placed in the following grades:

- Sheriff-Grade 16
- Clerk of Courts-Grade 12
- County Clerk-Grade 12
- County Treasurer-Grade 10
- Register of Deeds-Grade 10
