Amend Zoning Ordinance

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors has heretofore been petitioned to amend the official zoning map of Jefferson County, and

WHEREAS, Petition R3798A-15 was referred to the Jefferson County Planning and Zoning Committee for public hearing on April 16; Petitions R3844A-15, R3846A-15, R3850A-15 and R3851A-15 were referred for public hearing on October 15; and Petitions R3854A-15, R3855A-15, R3856A-15 and R3857A-15 were referred for public hearing on November 19, 2015, and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendments have been given due consideration by the Board of Supervisors in open session,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors does amend the official zoning map of Jefferson County as follows:

FROM A-1 EXCLUSIVE AGRICULTURAL TO A-3, AGRICULTURAL AND RURAL RESIDENTIAL

Rezone to create one, 2-acre building site on **Mansfield Road** in the Town of Aztalan from part of PIN 002-0714-3021-000 (40 acres). This utilizes the last available A-3 zone for the property; therefore, rezoning is conditioned upon recording of an affidavit acknowledging that fact. It is further conditioned upon receipt by Zoning of a new preliminary certified survey map and suitable soil test for the lot, upon road access approval, and upon approval and recording of a final certified survey map for the lot, including extraterritorial plat review if necessary. R3798A-15 – Cindy Krull-Begeman

Create a 1-acre building site from PIN 012-0816-1323-000 (29.601 acres) in the Town of Ixonia along **Genz Road**. This utilizes the last available A-3 zone for the property; therefore, rezoning is conditioned upon recording of an affidavit acknowledging that fact. It is further conditioned upon road access approval, receipt of suitable soil test and receipt and recording of a final certified survey map for the lot including extraterritorial plat review, if necessary. R3844A-15 – Rex & Teresa Nienow/Terrapin Properties LLC

Create a 1.5-acre lot around the home at **W6658 Sunset Lane** and a 1.5-acre vacant building site on **Grogan Road**, both from PIN 016-0514-3213-001 (9.259 acres) in the Town of Koshkonong. This utilizes the last available A-3 zone for the property; therefore, rezoning is conditioned upon recording of an affidavit acknowledging that fact. It is also conditioned upon road access approval, upon receipt of a suitable soil test and upon approval and recording of a final certified survey map for the lot including extraterritorial plat review, if necessary. R3846A-15 – Roger & Sandra Anderson

Create a 2.67-acre A-3 lot at **W2027 Church Drive** in the Town of Concord from part of PIN 006-0716-0833-000 (35.97 acres). Rezoning is conditioned upon road access approval for the remaining A-1 zoned land, and upon approval and recording of the final certified survey map for the lot. R3855A-15 – Theodore J Mueller

Rezone to create a 1.6-acre building site on **Lower Hebron Road** and **County Road D** in the Town of Hebron from part of PIN 010-0515-1511-000 (69.231 acres). This action is conditioned upon road access approval, receipt by Zoning of a suitable soil test and receipt and recording of the final certified survey map for the lot. R3856A-15 – Steven Holz

Create a 3-acre farm consolidation lot around the home at N2033 County Road A, and two, 1-acre building sites on Danielson Road, all from PIN 028-0513-0921-000 (39 acres) in the Town of Sumner. REPORT

TO THE HONORABLE MEMBERS OF THE JEFFERSON COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

The Jefferson County Planning and Zoning Committee, having considered petitions to amend the official zoning map of Jefferson County, filed for public hearing held on September 17, 2015, as required by law pursuant to Wisconsin Statutes, notice thereof having been given, and being duly advised of the wishes of the town boards and persons in the areas affected, hereby makes the following recommendation:

DENIAL OF PETITION R3829A-15

Petition R3829A-15 was a request by Philip and Sandra Bittorf to create an A-2, Agricultural and Rural Business zone at N7103 Stoney Creek Road in the Town of Lake Mills. Testimony in support of the request was given by the petitioner and Attorney Andy Rumpf; the Town of Lake Mills was in favor of the request. Opposition was voiced by numerous citizens. The file contains all information pertaining to the application, the public hearing and all documents submitted. The Committee based its recommendation for denial upon the findings that the proposal is in an area that is not relatively isolated and rural in nature and would be utilizing a narrow Town road, and, therefore, conflicts with the purpose of the A-2 zoning district as described in the Jefferson County Zoning Ordinance and the A-2 Agricultural and Rural Business Zoning District Policies of the Jefferson County Agricultural Preservation and Land Use Plan. The Committee found that the petition did not meet multiple standards of rezoning as listed in Sec. 11.11(c)6 of the Jefferson County Zoning Ordinance, which are required to be met in order to rezone out of the A-1 Exclusive Agricultural district.

Members of the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors:

One of the items before the County Board at its December 8, 2015 meeting is a petition to approve the rezoning of a parcel of property owned by Philip and Sandra Bittorf from A-1 to A-2, located in the Town of Lake Mills. This petition to rezone was first acted on by the Town of Lake Mills in August 2015 which gave a nonbinding recommendation to approve the rezoning request.

On September 17, 2015, there was a public hearing before the Jefferson County Planning & Zoning Committee at which time multiple residents and members of the public voiced their opinion on whether or not the County should approve the rezoning petition. At that meeting, there was significant opposition from the public to the rezoning from A-1 to A-2. On September 28, 2015, the Planning & Zoning Committee acted on the rezoning petition and voted to deny the rezoning. Four members voted against rezoning and 1 member voted in favor of rezoning. Because of this recommendation to deny the rezoning petition, a proposed resolution was drafted to DENY the rezoning petition and presented to the County Board for a decision on October 27, 2015. At that meeting, a majority of County Board members did not vote to deny the Bittorf rezoning petition. Because the County Board did not vote in favor of denying the Bittorf rezoning petition, Wisconsin State Statute § 59.69(e)5 requires the County Board to refer the petition back to the Planning & Zoning Committee, "with directions to draft an ordinance to effectuate the petition and report the ordinance back to the County Board which may then enact or reject the ordinance." Section 59.69(e)(5) states as follows:

5. Upon receipt of the agency report the board may enact the ordinance as drafted by the zoning agency or with amendments, or it may deny the petition for amendment, or it may refuse to deny the petition as recommended by the agency in which case it shall refer the petition to the agency with directions to draft an ordinance to effectuate the petition and report the ordinance back to the board which may then enact or reject the ordinance. (Emphasis added)

At its December 8, 2015 meeting, the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors will be asked to decide by majority vote whether or not to approve the rezoning petition filed Philip and Sandra Bittorf. The Jefferson County Zoning Ordinance, incorporating State Statutes, requires the County Board to consider 9 criteria before making a decision. These criteria are as follows:

- 6. Standards for Rezoning from the A-1 Exclusive Agricultural and N Natural Resource Districts: Land that is zoned A-1 Exclusive Agricultural or N Natural Resource may be rezoned to a zoning district that is not a certified farmland preservation zoning district if all of the following additional criteria are met (some of which are based on §91.48 of the Wisconsin Statutes): [am. 3/13/12, Ord. 2011-28]
- (a) The land is better suited for a use not allowed in the A-1 or N district. [cr. 3/13/12, Ord. 2011-28]
- (b) The rezoning is consistent with the County Comprehensive Plan. [cr. 3/13/12, Ord. 2011-28]
- (c) The rezoning is substantially consistent with the Jefferson County Agricultural Preservation and Land Use Plan. [cr. 3/13/12, Ord. 2011-28]
- (d) The rezoning will not substantially impair or limit current or future agricultural use of surrounding parcels of land that are zoned for or legally restricted to agricultural use. [cr. 3/13/12, Ord. 2011-28]
- (e) There will be adequate public facilities to serve the proposed and potential land use changes that would be enabled by the rezoning. [re-lettered & am. 3/13/12, Ord. 2011-28]
- (f) The burdens on local government for providing the needed services to the proposed and potential land use changes that would be enabled by the rezoning are reasonable. [re-lettered & am. 3/13/12, Ord. 2011-28]
- (g) The development will not cause unreasonable air or water pollution, soil erosion, or adverse effects on valued natural areas. [re-lettered & am. 3/13/12, Ord. 2011-28]
- (h) The soil productivity rating has been considered in the location of the area proposed for rezoning. [re-lettered & am. 3/13/12, Ord. 2011-28]
- (i) The remaining A-1 parcel shall front on a public road for a minimum distance of at least sixty-six (66) feet. Access to the lot shall be provided within this frontage. [cr. 3/13/12, Ord. 2011-28]

The Board must discuss all of the above criteria even if the discussion is to state that there is no question about whether or not a particular criterion has or has not been met. Additionally, the Board must consider the purpose and intent of the A-2 Zoning District and A-2 detailed policies in the Agricultural Preservation and Land Use Plan which are included in the County Board packet for December 8, 2015.

After considering and discussing all of these criteria, the County Board will vote on whether or not to approve the rezoning petition. If a majority of the County Board members present at the December 8, 2015 County Board meeting find that all of the above criteria are met, the petition to rezone property of Philip and Sandra Bittorf will be approved and the County Zoning Ordinance will be amended accordingly.

Dear Board Members,

This is a follow up to the board's decision on the above referenced zoning amendment issue at the meeting on October 27, 2015. I understand the Planning and Zoning Committee will approve the amendment at its November 30 meeting, as required by the County Board action on October 27. The amendment request will then be sent back to your board for a final decision to approve or deny the amendment.

After hearing the comments of many of the board members and giving this matter more thought, I felt it necessary and important to send you this letter. I continue to represent a group of property owners opposing this zoning amendment. I am sending this letter to you on their behalf. We request this letter be read into the record at the county board meeting on December 8, 2015.

First, I heard multiple board members make comments that this is somehow antibusiness to deny this request. There is nothing antibusiness about denying this request. Mr. and Mrs. Bittorf are free to operate their business; we just ask that it be done in a proper location under applicable zoning laws. The purpose of zoning laws is to keep certain uses of property in the appropriate locations, so as not to hinder the use and enjoyment of neighboring property owners. The appropriate location for this business is not on a rural town road that includes ten residences within a one mile stretch. It is best suited for an industrial zone.

We don't believe Mr. and Mrs. Bittorf will go out of business or any of their employees will lose their jobs if you do not approve this amendment. They will simply need to make a decision about where they are going to relocate their operations.

CAROL M. LORENZ Retired Furthermore, it is worth pointing out that according to Mr. and Mrs. Bittorf's own representations, their company only employs two seasonal employees, plus three part-time employees. Mid State Traffic Control is not a large employer in Jefferson County.

The next point I want to make is if you are looking at other A-2 amendments around the County, you need to remember that each situation is different. Because there are similar operations elsewhere does not necessarily mean it is appropriate in this situation. The exact operations of the business, the location, the road situation, the proximity of neighbors, etc. all factor in. No two situations are going to be exactly the same, therefore, one approval of an A-2 rezone does not mean another needs to be approved. Additionally, other comparable approvals do not necessarily create legal precedent requiring approval of subsequent requests.

Also, I remind you that your Planning and Zoning Committee decided this request did not meet the legal requirements for the amendment. The Planning and Zoning Committee is the committee your board has tasked with being the experts on this area to closely review and advise you on decisions involving zoning issues. The Committee closely reviewed the legal aspects and relevant factors in detail to make an informed decision to deny the request.

It is important for my clients to see the relevant law adequately reviewed and applied in this situation. We watched the Town of Lake Mills Board fail to do this at two meetings. The Planning and Zoning Committee then did a thorough review and voted to deny the requested amendment. We then witnessed your board's review of the request. Respectfully, we do not think your board did a detailed review of all the relevant legal factors. We hope and expect this will be done before a final decision is made. We still believe that this does not fit the requirements for the following reasons:

1) This is not an agriculturally related business.

2) The business is not located in a relatively isolated and rural location.

3) The nine criteria that must be met to rezone a parcel out of an A-1 zone have not been met (criteria set out in Section 11.11(c)6 of the County Zoning Ordinance).

At this point my clients are seriously considering pursuing this with the circuit court if this amendment is allowed to pass. This will be particularly true if the relevant ordinances are not thoroughly reviewed and considered for how they apply to this particular situation.

Finally, I want to reiterate this is nothing personal against Mr. and Mrs. Bittorf or their business. Denying this request may cause inconvenience for Mr. and Mrs. Bittorf; however, we believe they can still successfully operate their business from another location. Obviously, they can also still continue to live on Stoney Creek Road, should they choose to do so. While we are sympathetic to their situation, the fact remains they either did not do their due diligence before purchasing the property or they chose to ignore the relevant zoning requirements. The County Board should not be asked to turn a blind eye to the county zoning ordinances and state statutes to accommodate

individuals or select businesses as a matter of convenience. To make such accommodations creates a dangerous precedent.

I also want to again remind you the support for or against the zoning amendment by the residents in the area is not relevant. What is relevant is what is allowed under the applicable zoning laws. We are simply asking the laws be applied appropriately and that you deny this requested amendment.

Thank you for all of your prompt attention and consideration of this matter.

As previous owner of Mr. and Mrs. Bittorf's property and what was Stoney Creek Stable, it is my understanding that certain characterizations have been made about the stable during my ownership. The legality of my operation was called into question, and activities such as traffic and volume of business seem to have been exaggerated. Let's set the record straight.

To the best of my knowledge I was in full compliance with Jefferson County Ordinances. It is important to note that none of the boarders owned trailers. I owned the only trailer. The assertion that there was constant traffic of trailers, boarders and hired help is nonsensical. The barn chores were done by a friend who lived with me. Similar to other small farms around me, family, friends and neighbors would help during hay season. There were long periods of time when horse owners did not visit the stable.

Unlike many stables, there were few sponsored events. In three years we had a one-day fundraiser for the Midwest Horse Welfare organization, a one-day class for horsemanship, and a short-lived Pony Club for a handful of local children to ride in the arena during inclement weather.

The stable was already established when I bought the property in 2011. It was designed and built by the previous owners to exacting specification as a dressage riding arena. It was a great location for a small quiet stable with acreage to grow hay, fenced paddocks and pastures. Unfortunately, I had to sell earlier this year due to health and financial reasons.

Amending Board Rule 3.03(8) and (9) regarding time for all resolutions, ordinances, petitions, reports and communications to be filed with the County Administrator for County Board attention

Executive Summary

Current County Board of Supervisors Rules of Order 2014-2016 require resolutions, ordinances petitions and other matters of business requiring the attention of the County Board to be submitted to the County Administrator not later than noon on the Wednesday preceding a board meeting. This resolution changes the submission date of resolutions, ordinances petitions and other matters of business requiring the attention of the County Board to not later than noon on Monday of the week preceding a board meeting. This change is to ensure that all County Board Supervisors receive their County Board packets before the County Board meeting with sufficient to review the Board packet.

THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF JEFFERSON COUNTY DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Board of Supervisors Rules of Order 2014-2016, Section 3.03(8) and (9) shall be amended as follows:

3.03 BOARD PROCEDURE.

. . .

(8) All resolutions, ordinances, petitions and reports presented to the Board shall be in writing, sponsored by a board member or committee and filed in the office of the County Administrator not later than noon on the Wednesday Monday of the week preceding a board meeting. Each resolution submitted for consideration shall have a fiscal note. Motions to reconsider may be brought at the next succeeding meeting only if notice of the motion is filed in the office of the County Administrator not later than noon on the Wednesday Monday of the week preceding the board meeting. Proposed ordinances shall be reviewed by the Corporation Counsel for proper form and legality before being submitted to the Board. Resolutions and ordinances not introduced by a committee shall be referred to an appropriate committee by the Chairperson. A resolution or ordinance referred to a committee pursuant to this paragraph may be placed on the County Board agenda for further action upon the written request of five (5) County Board members which shall be submitted to the Chairperson not sooner than sixty (60) days after referral of the item to the committee. Such items shall then be placed on the next regular County Board agenda subject to any statutory requirements or other limitations. [Am. 06/10/03, Ord. 2003-03]

The sponsor of a major new resolution or ordinance or major revision of an existing resolution or ordinance shall prepare a written report or memorandum explaining the significant features of the proposed legislation, including the contemplated changes. Such written report or memorandum shall be mailed to board members as part of the agenda, but unless specifically ordered by the Board such reports or memoranda shall not be printed in the board proceedings.

(9) Any person having a matter of business requiring the attention of the County Board may present such matter to the Board by delivering a written communication to the County Clerk, County Board Chairperson or County Administrator by noon on the Wednesday Monday of the week preceding the next County Board meeting. The County Board Chairperson may, at his/her discretion, allow persons to be placed on the agenda to address the Board. Signed communications not presented personally to the Board shall be preserved by the County Clerk and shall be presented to the County Board as a communication at the next regular board meeting. Unsigned communications shall be referred to the Administration & Rules Communications may be referred by the Board, the Chair or the Administration & Rules Committee to an appropriate committee for study and attention. If feasible, such committee shall arrange to meet with the author of the communication. Such committee shall thereafter report back to the County Board in the usual manner and shall recommend what action, if any, should be taken by the County Board with reference to such communication. The Clerk may acknowledge receipt of communications by return mail. [am. 5/11/10, Ord. 2010-06]

WHEREAS, in December of 2014, the Achieving a Better Life Experience (ABLE) Act was passed at the Federal level, and

WHEREAS, the ABLE Act allows individuals whose disability manifests before the age of 26 to be eligible to set up ABLE accounts that are tax-advantaged savings accounts where they can save up to \$14,000 per year, up to \$100,000, which will not affect their eligibility for Medicaid, Wisconsin Long Term Programs and other public benefits, and

WHEREAS, each state is responsible for establishing and operating an ABLE program, and

WHEREAS, this resolution is supported by the Council on Aging and Disabilities and the Jefferson County Health and Human Services Board.

The Wisconsin Public Records law exempts from coverage certain employee personnel records, such as an employee's home address, home electronic mail address, home telephone number, social security number, performance evaluations, the employer's thoughts on future salary adjustment, promotions and job assignments. However, the term employee does not include the holder of a "local public office" which is defined to include the head of a department, agency or division of a local governmental unit. As a result, the social security number, performance evaluations and other data that is exempt from release under the law for an "employee" of a local governmental unit is <u>not</u> exempt for division and department heads. There is no valid reason that social security numbers, performance evaluations and other information of department heads should not be given the same protection against release as those of other government employees. This resolution supports the Wisconsin Legislature updating the Public Records law by amending the term employee to include individuals holding local public office.

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Public law makes clear that it is to be broadly construed in favor of the release of records and that exemptions to the law are to be narrowly construed (Wis. Stat. §19.31), and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Public Records law at §19.36(10) exempts from coverage under the law certain employee personnel records, such as an employee's home address, home electronic mail address, home telephone number, social security number, performance evaluations, the employer's thoughts on future salary adjustment, promotions, job assignments, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the definitions used in the Wisconsin Public Records law, the term employee does not include the holder of a "local public office" which is defined to include the head of a department, agency or division of a local governmental unit, consequently, the social security number, performance evaluations and other data that is exempt from release under the law for an "employee" of a local governmental unit is <u>not</u> exempt for division and department heads [Wis. Stats §19.32(1bg) and (1dm)], and

WHEREAS, there is no valid reason that social security numbers, performance evaluations and other information of department heads should not be given the same protection against release as those of other government employees which are generally exempt from release under the public records law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors supports the Wisconsin Legislature updating the Public Records law by amending section 19.36 limitations upon access and withholding, at section (10), Employee Personnel Records, by adding the following language: "Within this section, the term "employee" includes individuals holding local public office."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Jefferson County Clerk be directed to forward a copy of this resolution to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin, the Wisconsin Counties Association and Jefferson County's Legislative Representatives.

Resolution Opposing Senate Bill 326/Assembly Bill 429 requiring Human Services to refer all cases of suspected or threatened child abuse or neglect to law enforcement

Executive Summary

Current law requires child welfare agencies to refer all reports of suspected or threatened sexual abuse of a child to law enforcement agencies within 12 hours, exclusive of Saturdays, Sundays, or legal holidays. Assembly Bill 429 requires all abuse and neglect referrals to be reported to law enforcement "as soon as practicable, but no later than 12 hours, after receiving a report..." Most county child welfare agencies have an excellent relationship with their local law enforcement agencies. Many counties, in fact, have an MOU in place with their local law enforcement agencies governing the types of cases child welfare refers to law enforcement. The concern with the pending legislation is that it will have unintended consequences for child welfare and law enforcement agencies by increasing workloads and not allowing for prioritization of the most egregious reports.

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 326/Assembly Bill 429 have been introduced by Senator Robert Cowles and Representative John Macco, and

WHEREAS, the bills relate to the referral of cases of suspected or threatened child abuse or neglect to the sheriff or police department, coordination of the investigation of those cases, and referral of those cases to the district attorney for criminal prosecution, and

WHEREAS, the bills, on their face, may appear favorable, but actually compromise child welfare best practice, and

WHEREAS, even though the legislation impacts child welfare practice, the state Department of Children and Families, Office of Children's Mental Health, county child welfare agencies, and child advocacy organizations were not consulted on the legislation, and

WHEREAS, concerns with the proposed legislation include the following:

- Law enforcement involvement in all child welfare cases negatively impacts the opportunity for alternative responses, community responses and other voluntary services to be provided to families;
- The proposed legislation is in sharp contrast to evidence-based practice;
- The proposed legislation requires child welfare agencies to "coordinate in the planning and execution of the investigation" in all cases, including screened out cases in which the child welfare agency lacks statutory authority to act;
- The proposed legislation requires all reports to be referred to law enforcement within 12 hours, allowing for no prioritization of cases;

The implementation of the legislation has not been thought through, especially when it comes to confidentiality, jurisdictional issues, and the philosophical differences between law enforcement and child welfare agencies, and

WHEREAS, counties and law enforcement in most jurisdictions have a positive working relationship and have entered into Memorandums of Understanding with regard to how local agencies will respond to reports of child abuse and neglect, and

WHEREAS, counties have requested that the proponents of the legislation bring all parties impacted by the legislation together to gain an understanding of the others' needs, and

WHEREAS, counties believe a compromise on the legislation can be negotiated; however, such a meeting has yet to take place.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors does hereby oppose Senate Bill 326/Assembly Bill 429 and supports a meeting of all interested parties to discuss this proposed legislation in greater detail.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Jefferson County Clerk be directed to forward a copy of this resolution to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin, the Wisconsin Counties Association and Jefferson County's Legislative Representatives.

This resolution will authorize the County to enter into contracts for these services according to the attached terms and conditions.

WHEREAS, during the course of the past year, the Jefferson County Courts have determined that in order to reduce costs incurred for court appointed attorneys, it is necessary for the County to enter into annual contracts with attorneys to handle particular cases serving as a Guardian ad Litem (GAL) or adversary counsel for a fixed annual cost, and

WHEREAS, these cases include providing GAL and adversary legal counsel services for parties in cases such as guardianships, protective placements, restraining order/injunctions, estate matters, paternity, family, children in need of protection/services (CHIPS), termination of parental rights (TPR) and other miscellaneous matters as required by the court, and

WHEREAS, entering into annual contracts for a fixed dollar amount with attorneys to provide court appointed legal services will result in reduced costs to the County, and

FOR GUARDIAN *AD LITEM* and ADVERSARY LEGAL COUNSEL SERVICES in Chapter 51/54/55, Chapter 813 and other miscellaneous probate matters

THIS CONTRACT is made and entered into as of (date) by and between Jefferson County, a quasimunicipal corporation (the County) by the Clerk of Circuit Court, Carla Robinson and (Atty. name) (Contractor) with a social security number/FEIN of () and an address of ().

WHEREAS, (Contractor) is a consultant licensed to practice law in the State of Wisconsin and possesses considerable experience in providing Guardian ad Litem (GAL) and adversary legal counsel services; and

WHEREAS, the County is interested in obtaining the consulting services of a GAL/adversary legal counsel in order to provide GAL and adversary legal counsel services for parties in Guardianship, Protective Placement, Restraining Order/Injunctions, Estate matters and other miscellaneous matters as required by the court.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises, terms and conditions hereof, the County and Contractor agree as follows:

Terms of /Contract:

ATTORNEY NOT FIRM: Contract is in the name of the attorney, not the law firm with which the
contractor may be associated or employed. If an attorney leaves a firm, the contract follows the
attorney, unless he/she resigns from the contract by mutual agreement of the Contractor and
the circuit court.

The contract is for two years unless otherwise terminated by the circuit court or upon mutual agreement of the circuit court and the Contractor (see termination provision below).

More than one attorney in a firm may be awarded a contract.

- 2) **FEES**: Monthly payment of \$1,500.00 (\$18,000.00 per year) per Contractor. In addition the Contractor shall be reimbursed for:
 - a. Retention of investigative or expert services, including associated travel time and mileage, with prior approval of the court and with reimbursement obligations established by the court.
 - b. Reasonable mileage at the IRS rate. Reasonable mileage does not include mileage to and from the courthouse.
 - c. Photocopy costs if the Contractor incurs photo copy costs on any one case that exceeds five dollars (\$5.00). Copies of the assigned court file (unless an e-filed case) will be provided to the GAL upon appointment at no cost.
 - d. Long distance telephone calls. All calls must be itemized and documented as follows: Individual calls in the amount of five dollars (\$5.00) or more, and long

- distance calls on any one (1) case in the amount of twenty five dollars (\$25.00) or more.
- e. Certified or express mail costs which must be accompanied by a receipt if the total cost per mailing is five dollars (\$5.00) or more.
- f. Transcript preparation fees with prior approval of the court, and with the agreement of the party/parties to promptly pay the same.
- g. Service of process and witness fees with prior approval of the court.
- h. Any other reasonable expenses related to a case appointment with prior approval of the court.
- i. An increased case assignment due to termination of another contractor or special circumstances in the discretion of the assigned judge.
- 3) CASE ASSIGNMENT: If a case which is the type of case covered by this contract is being handled by Contractor pursuant to a Court appointment at the commencement of this contract, Guardian ad Litem and/or adversary legal counsel services shall continue by Contractor under the terms of this contract and all work performed on such case shall be paid pursuant to the terms of this contract commencing on the effective date hereof unless the Court specifically orders otherwise. The Contractor under this contract is assigned 50% of the annual GAL/adversary counsel case work for Guardianship/Protective Placement/TRO/Injunction/ Estates and miscellaneous matters in cases where the county pays (either due to indigence or partial indigence) on a rotating basis as follows (by date of appointment, not date of hearing):

- 4) CONSOLIDATED SERVICES: It is the intent that a single contractor be assigned matters that cross over between probate/civil or other courts. Therefore, a contractor that has a current assignment for a party will be assigned additional cases for that party even if outside the scope of that contractor's appointment type for the month (i.e.: currently assigned to a guardianship case and a new TRO case is filed in the same month for the same person).
- 5) CONFLICT: All Contractors must perform their own "conflict checks" and if there is a conflict, the Contractor shall notify the clerk in writing, and the clerk shall assign the case to another contract attorney. If all contract GAL/adversary counsel are unable to accept a particular appointment due to conflict of interest or personal conflict, the court will appoint an independent GAL/adversary counsel at the rate of \$70 per hour. If the Contractor becomes aware that a party in a newly assigned matter has a pending matter assigned to another contract GAL/adversary counsel, the Contractor shall notify the clerk who will reassign the case accordingly. The clerk will balance assignments made outside the standard contract due to conflict.

- 6) STATEMENT OF HOURS: Contractor must provide a Statement of Actual Hours in each case. The Statement shall be filed at least quarterly and within 10 days following the final hearing if appointment is not continued. Each monthly/final Statement of Actual Hours shall contain: date(s) of service, case number and name, service provided and time spent. The County prohibits any and all forms of double billing of GAL/adversary counsel time. Double billing includes situations where the GAL/adversary counsel bills the same period of time for more than one court case number.
- 7) DURATION OF APPOINTMENT: The Contractor's appointment to perform services on a case is complete at the final hearing on the matter for which appointed, unless otherwise extended by the court/statute. A de novo from a commissioner's order continues the appointment. The Contractor shall not include in any statement of hours, time incurred after the final hearing on the matter unless specifically authorized by the court/statute.
- 8) LIABILITY INSURANCE: Upon entering into this Contract, the Contractor shall file with the Jefferson County Clerk proof of liability insurance to insure against any claim for malpractice, injury or damage to persons or property that may be caused by the Contractor in the performance of his/her obligations under this Contract and must maintain said insurance for the duration of the contract.
- 9) LICENSURE/TRAINING: Contractors must maintain licensure with the Wisconsin state bar and meet all Supreme Court Rules related to training for GALs and/or adversary counsel. Failure to maintain licensure or meet SCR requirements will result in immediate termination of the contract.
- 10) E-FILED CASES: Contractors are required to "opt-in" to any case that is e-filed/converted to e-filed status. (Currently this is only available in FA/PA cases). Paper documents will not be provided.

11) END OF CONTRACT/TERMINATION OF CONTRACT:

- a. At the end of the two year contract period, this contract automatically renews for a two year period unless specifically terminated by either party.
 - If a Contractor does NOT want to renew the contract, the Contractor must submit notification in writing to the Clerk of Court at least 60 days prior to the end of the contract. A Contractor that elects not to renew the contract is required to complete any case assigned to him/her prior to the end of the contract. If the Contractor indicates to the court that the work cannot be completed prior to the termination of the contract, the court will determine whether to appoint the Contractor outside the contract at the \$70.00 per hour SCR rate to complete the matter, or to assign the matter to another contract GAL/adversary counsel.
 - II. The Clerk of Court may upon the advice and consent of the Jefferson County Presiding Judge and County Administrator, and upon 60 days prior written notice to the Contractor for any reason, elect not to renew the services provided by the Contractor under this Contract. Any pending matters assigned to the Contractor whose contract is not renewed will be reassigned

to another contract GAL/adversary counsel at the end of the contract period.

- b. Services may be terminated at any time as follows:
 - I. The Contractor may upon 60 days written notice to the Clerk of Court, for any reason elect to terminate this Contract. Any pending matters will be assigned to another contract GAL/adversary counsel for completion if not completed by the Contractor at the end of the 60 day period.
 - II. The Clerk of Courts may, upon the advice and consent of the Jefferson County Presiding Judge and County Administrator, and upon prior written notice to the Contractor, for any reason, elect to terminate the services provided by the Contractor under this Contract forthwith. Pending matters assigned to a terminated Contractor will immediately be reassigned to another contract GAL/adversary re counsel.
- 12) DISPUTE RESOLUTION: The parties agree that all disputes arising under this Contract shall be resolved by resort to binding arbitration using retired Waukesha Co. Judge Robert Mawdsley or any other retired judge agreed to by the parties as arbitrator. Each party shall bear its own costs of the arbitration, and shall pay one half of the arbitrator's fee.
- 13) NOTICES: Any Notices to be given hereunder by either party to the other may be affected either by personal delivery in writing or by mail, registered or certified, postage prepaid, with return receipt requested. Mailed notices shall be addressed as follows:

- d. Attend all hearings;
- e. Abide by all requirements and duties set forth in the Wisconsin Statutes for GAL/adversary counsel;
- f. Complete all matters timely and efficiently.

- 15) VACATION/ABSENCE: Contractor shall make arrangements with another contract attorney to cover appointments during any vacation/absence. - 4) CONSOLIDATED SERVICES: It is the intent that a single contractor be assigned matters that cross over between family and juvenile court. Therefore, a contractor that has a current assignment for a party will be assigned additional cases for that party even if outside the scope of that contractor's appointment type for the month. (i.e.: currently assigned to a family case and a new CHiPs case is filed in the same month for a child in the family action)
- 5) **CONFLICT:** All Contractors must perform their own "conflict checks" and if there is a conflict, the Contractor shall notify the clerk in writing, and the clerk shall assign the case to another contract attorney. If all contract GAL/adversary counsel are unable to accept a particular appointment due to conflict of interest or personal conflict, the court will appoint

an independent GAL/adversary counsel at the rate of \$70 per hour. If the Contractor becomes aware that a party in a newly assigned matter has a pending matter assigned to another contract GAL/adversary counsel, the Contractor shall notify the clerk who will reassign the case accordingly. The clerk will balance assignments made outside the standard contract due to conflict.

- 6) STATEMENT OF HOURS: Contractor must provide a Statement of Actual Hours in each case. The Statement shall be filed at least quarterly and within 10 days following the final hearing if appointment is not continued. Each monthly/final Statement of Actual Hours shall contain: date(s) of service, case number and name, service provided and time spent. The County prohibits any and all forms of double billing of GAL/adversary counsel time. Double billing includes situations where the GAL/adversary counsel bills the same period of time for more than one court case number.
- 7) **DURATION OF APPOINTMENT:** The Contractor's appointment to perform services on a case is complete at the final hearing on the matter for which appointed, unless otherwise extended by the court/statute. A de novo from a commissioner's order continues the appointment. The Contractor shall not include in any statement of hours, time incurred after the final hearing on the matter unless specifically authorized by the court/statute.
- 8) LIABILITY INSURANCE: Upon entering into this Contract, the Contractor shall file with the Jefferson County Clerk proof of liability insurance to insure against any claim for malpractice, injury or damage to persons or property that may be caused by the Contractor in the performance of his/her obligations under this Contract and must maintain said insurance for the duration of the contract.
- 9) LICENSURE/TRAINING: Contractors must maintain licensure with the Wisconsin state bar and meet all Supreme Court Rules related to training for GALs and/or adversary counsel. Failure to maintain licensure or meet SCR requirements will result in immediate termination of the contract.
- 10) E-FILED CASES: Contractors are required to "opt-in" to any case that is e-filed/converted to e-filed status. (Currently this is only available in FA/PA cases). Paper documents will not be provided.

11) END OF CONTRACT/TERMINATION OF CONTRACT:

- a. At the end of the two year contract period, this contract automatically renews for a two year period unless specifically terminated by either party.
 - If a Contractor does NOT want to renew the contract, the Contractor must submit notification in writing to the Clerk of Court at least 60 days prior to the end of the contract. A Contractor that elects not to renew the contract is required to complete any case assigned to him/her prior to the end of the contract. If the Contractor indicates to the court that the work cannot be completed prior to the termination of the contract, the court will determine whether to appoint the Contractor outside the contract at the \$70.00 per hour SCR rate to complete the matter, or to assign the matter to another contract GAL/adversary counsel.

- II. The Clerk of Court may upon the advice and consent of the Jefferson County Presiding Judge and County Administrator, and upon 60 days prior written notice to the Contractor for any reason, elect not to renew the services provided by the Contractor under this Contract. Any pending matters assigned to the Contractor whose contract is not renewed will be reassigned to another contract GAL/adversary counsel at the end of the contract period.
- b. Services may be terminated at any time as follows:
 - I. The Contractor may upon 60 days written notice to the Clerk of Court, for any reason elect to terminate this Contract. Any pending matters will be assigned to another contract GAL/adversary counsel for completion if not completed by the Contractor at the end of the 60 day period.
 - II. The Clerk of Courts may, upon the advice and consent of the Jefferson County Presiding Judge and County Administrator, and upon prior written notice to the Contractor, for any reason, elect to terminate the services provided by the Contractor under this Contract forthwith. Pending matters assigned to a terminated Contractor will immediately be reassigned to another contract GAL/adversary re counsel.
- 12) **DISPUTE RESOLUTION**: The parties agree that all disputes arising under this Contract shall be resolved by resort to binding arbitration using retired Waukesha Co. Judge Robert Mawdsley or any other retired judge agreed to by the parties as arbitrator. Each party shall bear its own costs of the arbitration, and shall pay one half of the arbitrator's fee.
- 13) **NOTICES:** Any Notices to be given hereunder by either party to the other may be affected either by personal delivery in writing or by mail, registered or certified, postage prepaid, with return receipt requested. Mailed notices shall be addressed as follows:

- 14) **DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:** Contractor is required to:
 - a. Contact the Attorneys and pro se parties as soon as possible after appointment;
 - b. Contact Child/Children/ward, etc. as soon as possible after appointment;
 - c. Interview pro se parties and those parties whose attorneys consent to interview;
 - d. In CHiPS/TPR actions: Notify the Department of Human Services Child Protective Services supervisor as soon as possible after appointment;
 - e. Attend all hearings;

- f. Abide by all requirements and duties set forth in the Wisconsin Statutes for GAL/adversary counsel;
- g. Complete all matters timely and efficiently.
- 15) VACATION/ABSENCE: Contractor shall make arrangements with another contract attorney to cover appointments during any vacation/absence. Contractors shall ensure that no more than two (2) of the contract attorneys are absent/on vacation at the same time. Contract attorneys shall balance the absence/vacation requests with the other contract attorneys. If a Contractor, due to emergency, illness, etc. is unable to take appointments for an extended period of time, the Contractor is to immediately notify the Clerk of Court and a temporary adjustment to the Case Assignment schedule will be made.
- 16) WARRANTY: By entering into a Contract with Jefferson County, the contractor warrants that the services provided shall be performed by qualified and competent personnel in accordance with industry practice and the high standards of care and practice appropriate to the nature of the services rendered and that any materials, equipment and goods furnished shall be free of defects.
- 17) TAXES: The Contractor is responsible for all applicable taxes. Neither federal, nor state, nor local income tax nor payroll tax of any kind shall be withheld or paid by the County on behalf of the Contractor, or any employees of the Contractor. Upon acceptance of a contract the Contractor shall provide the Jefferson County Finance Department with a federal employer identification or social security number to allow for proper reporting to federal tax authorities.
- 18) **BENEFITS:** The Contractor is not eligible for health, dental retirement or other benefits offered by the County with respect to services provided pursuant to this Contract.

19) GENERAL PROVISIONS:

- a. <u>Governing Law</u>: This Contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Wisconsin.
- b. <u>Invalid Provisions</u>: If any provision of this Contract is held to be illegal, invalid, or unenforceable, such provisions shall be fully severable and this Contract shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal, invalid, or unenforceable provision had never comprised a part hereof; and the remaining provisions hereof shall remain in full force and effect and shall not be affected by the illegal, invalid or unenforceable provision or by its severance therefrom.
- c. <u>Binding Effect</u>: This Contract shall extend to and be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto.
- d. <u>Entire Agreement</u>: This Contract sets forth the entire understanding of the parties and supersedes all prior arrangements and/or understandings, whether written or oral, with respect to the subject matter hereof. No terms, conditions, warranties, other than those contained herein, and no amendments or modifications hereto shall be binding unless made in writing and signed by Jefferson County and Contractor.
- e. <u>Execution</u>: This Contract may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be considered an original and all of which taken together shall be considered one

and the same instrument. A facsimile signature will have the same legally binding effect as an original signature.

20) **OTHER:** The County reserves the right to terminate this Contract at the end of any calendar year if the County Board of Supervisors fails to provide funding for any ensuing year.

Terminate insurance coverage with the Local Government Property Insurance Fund (LGPIF)

Executive Summary

During the course of the past year, County staff has been following various legislative actions related to the Local Government Property Insurance Fund (LGPIF). This initially started when the proposed state biennium budget included the proposal to eliminate the LGPIF. As a result of this proposal, work began on what could be a cost effective alternative for comprehensive insurance coverage for County owned assets such as buildings and equipment.

As the state budget process evolved, the LGPIF ultimately remained as an entity with several changes. One of the more significant changes was the need to increase premiums. In the case of Jefferson County this increase was from \$103,977 to \$167,334 per year. In addition to the premium increase to the County, there are several areas of concerns with the LGPIF. These include the LGPIF ended its fiscal year with a negative fund balance and several proposed pieces of legislation that could impact LGPIF operations. As a result, staff is recommending terminating coverage with the LGPIF and contract with a private insurance carrier at a lower cost.

WHEREAS, due to legislative changes in the State of Wisconsin, the annual premium payable by Jefferson County to participate in the Local Government Property Insurance Fund (LGPIF) has increased from \$103,977 per year to \$167,334 per year;

WHEREAS, the County is able to purchase private insurance for less than what has been offered by the LGPIF, and

WHEREAS, it is in the best financial interest of Jefferson County to withdraw from the LGPIF and purchase insurance on the private market, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements of section 605.21(3), Wis. Stats., to withdraw from the Local Government Property Insurance Fund, the local municipality must provide certified notice to LGPIF by majority vote that it has elected to withdraw from the fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors in session this 8th day of December 2015, and pursuant to section 605.21(3) of the Wisconsin Statutes, has elected to withdraw from the Local Government Property Insurance Fund effective December 31, 2015, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Clerk send a certified notice of this resolution to the Local Government Property Insurance Fund and the appropriate forms be completed.

Fiscal Note: The termination of coverage by this resolution will allow Jefferson County to contract with a private insurance carrier at a lower cost. The current bid for Property and Auto Insurance through the LGPIF was \$167,334 per year. The County was able to find comprehensive coverage through other vendors for \$130,251 per year. Adequate funds are in the 2016 Budget to cover this cost.

Select Property Insurance Coverage for 2016

Executive Summary

Due to significantly increasing insurance premiums by the Local Government Property Insurance Fund (LGPIF), the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors elected to withdraw from the Local Government Property Insurance Fund effective December 31, 2015, and purchase insurance through competitive bidding. Jefferson County worked with T.E. Brennan Company in seeking competitive bids for coverage to replace the coverage currently held through the Local Government Property Insurance Fund (LGPIF).

Insurance companies submitting quotes included the LGPIF, Municipal Property Insurance Company (MPIC), Chubb and other private market insurance companies. Based on reviewing these quotes for cost, coverage and ratings, staff is recommending entering into a contract with Chubb for Real and Personal Property; Contractor's Equipment and Monies and Securities, and entering into a contract with Liberty Insurance through Wisconsin Municipal Mutual Insurance Company (WMMIC) for auto coverage.

WHEREAS, after withdrawing from the Local Government Property Insurance Fund (LGPIF) due to significantly increasing insurance premiums, Jefferson County solicited quotes for insurance coverage from various insurance companies, and

WHEREAS, after engaging in due diligence by comparing premium costs of multiple insurance companies, it is evident that Chubb through M3 is the most responsible lowest cost insurance company for Real and Personal Property; Contractor's Equipment and Monies and Securities coverage, and entering into a contract with Liberty Insurance through Wisconsin Municipal Mutual Insurance Company (WMMIC) for auto coverage.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the County Clerk is authorized to enter into contractors with Chubb through M3 and and Liberty Insurance Company, through Wisconsin Municipal Mutual Insurance Company (WMMIC), to provide insurance coverage to Jefferson County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this coverage will be reviewed on an annual basis.

Fiscal Note: The current bid for Property and Auto Insurance through LGPIF was \$167,334. The County was able to find comprehensive coverage through other vendors for \$130,251. Adequate funds are in the 2016 Budget to cover this cost.

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Human Services Department contracts with several different state agencies, consortiums and in excess of 100 professionals and care providers in fulfillment of its statutory duties, and

WHEREAS, the Social Services & Community Programs contracts with the Department of Health Services and the Department of Children and Families, and the Youth Aids Program contract with the Department of Corrections must be authorized by the County Board, and

WHEREAS, the Human Services Board recommends approval of the Social Services & Community Programs contracts with the Department of Health Services in the anticipated amount of \$3,566,093, the Department of Children and Families in the anticipated amount of \$1,068,542, the AAA Older American Programs in the anticipated amount of \$354,199, the Department of Transportation in the anticipated amount of \$185,118, the Department of Health Services Division of Long Term Care in the anticipated amount of \$499,017 with anticipated federal funds of \$499,756 for the Aging and Disability Resource Center Grant, Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program in the anticipated amount \$194,235, and the Youth Aids contract with the Department of Children & Families for Youth Aid Funds in the anticipated amount of \$773,789, and the Child Care contract in the anticipated amount of \$165,854, and

WHEREAS, the consortium agreement requires Board approval for the State/Federal Income Maintenance Programs through Southern Consortium in the anticipated amount of \$1.354.862, and

WHEREAS, the Department contracts with numerous professional service providers and care providers, usually on an annual basis, as approved by the Human Services Board,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Human Services Director or the Administrative Services Division Manager is authorized to execute the state contracts and consortium contract set forth above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Human Services Director or the Administrative Services Manager is authorized to sign addendums or revisions to said contracts during the course of the year as necessary.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director or Administrative Services Manager are authorized to sign all other contracts with state agencies, consortiums and pursuant to § 46.23(6m)(c), Stats., all professional services/care provider contracts as approved by the Human Services Board.

The contracts are standard state forms which are not subject to negotiation by individual counties. Authorizing submission of application to participate in the Wisconsin Small Cities Community Development Block Grant-Emergency Assistance Program (CDBG-EAP) using Disaster Recovery-IKE Supplemental Funding

Executive Summary

Funding for the Small Cities Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) is provided to the State of Wisconsin by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). CDBG funds for housing and public facilities are administered by the Department of Administration, Division of Housing. The Division of Housing has authorized the Community Development Block Grant-Emergency Assistance Program to use Disaster Recovery/IKE Supplemental Funding for eligible units of government throughout the state that are in need of assistance due to a natural or manmade disaster. CDBG funds are awarded to the local unit of government which, in turn, provides housing assistance to low and moderate income homeowners and business owners. Eligible local units of government include all cities, towns, counties, and villages not otherwise receiving CDBG Entitlement funds. This resolution authorizes Jefferson County through its Law Enforcement / Emergency Management Committee to take the necessary steps in preparing and filing the application for receipt of CDBG funds as required by the Community Development Block Grant Emergency Assistance Program and further authorizes the County Administrator to sign all necessary documents for submission of the application and receipt of funds on behalf of the County.

WHEREAS, Federal monies are available under the Wisconsin Small Cities Community Development Block Grant-Emergency Assistance program, administered by the State of Wisconsin, Department of Administration, Division of Housing, for the purpose of disaster recovery, and

WHEREAS, after conducting a public hearing and complying with the requirements of the Community Development Block Grant Emergency Assistance Program, the Law Enforcement/Emergency Management Committee will take responsibility for submitting an application to the State of Wisconsin for funding the following projects:

To continue a voluntary county flood mitigation structure acquisition/demolition program that began in 1996 on Blackhawk Island Road along the Rock River in the Towns of Sumner and Koshkonong, and include additional structures within Jefferson County outside the Blackhawk Island Road area that were heavily affected by the 2008 flooding. Once the structures are acquired and demolished, the land will be allowed to return to a natural state, and

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors had previously adopted and approved a Citizen Participation Plan and Fair Housing Ordinance as required for receipt of Community Development Block Grant-Emergency Assistance funds, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the County Board to approve the preparation and filing of an application for the County to receive funds from this program, and

WHEREAS, the County Board has reviewed the need for the proposed projects and the benefits to be gained therefrom.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors does hereby approve and authorize the filing of an application for funds under the Community Development Block Grant - Disaster Recovery - IKE Supplementary Funding, and the County Administrator is hereby authorized to sign all necessary documents for submission of the application and receipt of program funds on behalf of the County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Law Enforcement/Emergency Management Committee shall conduct a Citizen Participation Public Hearing and submit certification thereof to the State of Wisconsin Division of Housing prior to Friday, January 15, 2016.

Fiscal Note: Funding received through this grant will be used to purchase properties affected by the 2008 flooding event. No county match is required. County staff time will be used to administer the grant.
