Recognizing the Walter Family and Walter Grain Farms for their dedication and commitment to Jefferson County agriculture and related industries by hosting
Wisconsin Farm Technology Days 2019

Executive Summary

In 1952, several agencies formed a corporation called Wisconsin Farm Progress Days, Inc., now known as Wisconsin Farm Technology Days, with the first event being held in 1954. Its purpose was to demonstrate University research findings to Wisconsin citizens on a functioning farm at an outdoor show. The mission of the show was to promote technologies in agriculture and related industries and to provide leadership development and education. Today, Wisconsin Farm Technology Days is the largest agricultural show in Wisconsin and one of the largest in the The three-day outdoor event showcases the latest improvements in production agriculture including many practical applications of recent research findings and technological developments. Each year Wisconsin Farm Technology Days is held in a different Wisconsin county on a different host family farm. The Walter Family offered to host this event in 2019 at the Walter Grain Farm in Johnson Creek; 35 years after their family first hosted the event in 1984. This resolution formally recognizes the dedication and commitment the Walter Family and Walter Grain Farms have demonstrated to Jefferson County agriculture and related industries by hosting Wisconsin Farm Technology Days 2019. The University Extension Education Committee considered this resolution at its meeting on August 12, 2019, and recommended forwarding to the County Board for approval.

WHEREAS, the mission of Wisconsin Farm Technology Days is to promote technologies in agriculture and related industries and to provide leadership development and education, and

WHEREAS, Jefferson County has a significant history of Agriculture beginning with the Aztalan settlements through the efforts of W.D. Hoard for Dairy Farming and continuing today with National and International Agribusiness Companies, and

WHEREAS, sixty percent of attendees of Wisconsin Farm Technology Days live within a 75 mile radius of the event, and

WHEREAS, over 600 exhibitors were on-site to demonstrate their business and products to those attending Wisconsin Farm Technology Days 2019, in Jefferson County, and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin Farm Technology Days provides a County the opportunity to highlight itself and Jefferson County has within its borders the State's largest Nursey, the largest Ethanol plant, the largest Trout Farm, along with significant Pickle and Meat Industries and Agribusiness Technology Development, and

WHEREAS, Agriculture is the leading economic engine in Jefferson County and the Walter Family is proud of their farm, community and County, and

WHEREAS, Bud and Bev Walter, Mike's parents, proudly hosted Wisconsin Farm Progress Days in Jefferson County in 1984, and

WHEREAS, Mike and Sarah Walter, with son Adam and his wife Heather, and son Brad and his wife Kristine, again hosted Wisconsin Farm Technology Days 2019 in Jefferson County at the same location, marking the 35th anniversary of the first show the Walter family hosted, and

WHEREAS, through their efforts in hosting Wisconsin Farm Technology Days 2019 in Jefferson County, the Walter Family and Walter Grain Farms have demonstrated their dedication and commitment to Jefferson County agriculture and related industries.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Walter Family and Walter Grain Farms are hereby formally recognized by the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors for their dedication and commitment to Jefferson County agriculture and related industries by hosting Wisconsin Farm Technology Days 2019.

Executive Summary

The Central Services Department solicited bids from vendors to perform modernization and improvements to the Courthouse elevator. Two vendors responded to the County's request for proposals: MET Total Elevator Solutions for \$178,837 and Kone, Inc. for \$160,800. After reviewing these bids, the Building and Grounds Committee determined that Kone, Inc. is the lowest responsible bidder. This resolution authorizes Jefferson County to enter into a contract with Kone, Inc. for the modernization and improvement of the Courthouse elevator. The Building and Grounds Committee considered this resolution at its meeting on August 7, 2019, and recommended forwarding to the County Board for approval.

WHEREAS, the Executive Summary is incorporated into this resolution, and

WHEREAS, the Courthouse elevator is in need of modernization and improvement, and

WHEREAS, sealed bids were submitted pursuant to a Request for Proposals and opened on July 31, 2019, with the following results:

Creation of the 2020 Jefferson County Complete Count Committee

Executive Summary

The U.S. Census Bureau is required by the U.S. Constitution to conduct a count of the population which provides an historic opportunity to help shape the foundation of our society and play an active role in American democracy. Jefferson County is committed to ensuring that every Jefferson County resident is counted by creating a Complete Count Committee which is a volunteer group of community leaders that will play a key role to educate and motivate residents to participate in the 2020 Census. This resolution demonstrates the commitment of Jefferson County to partnering with the U.S. Census Bureau in participating in the 2020 census and creates a Complete Count Committee to help ensure that every Jefferson County resident is counted. The Executive Committee considered this resolution at its meeting on July 31st, 2019, and recommended forwarding to the County Board for approval.

WHEREAS, the U.S. Census Bureau is required by the United States Constitution to conduct a count of all persons, and

WHEREAS, census data helps determine how many seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives and is necessary for an accurate and fair redistricting of state legislative seats, county and city councils, and voting districts, and

WHEREAS, information from the 2020 Census is a vital tool for economic development and increased employment, and

WHEREAS, the Census count requires extensive work, and the Census Bureau requires partners at the state and local level to insure a complete and accurate count, and

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Complete Count Committee will bring together a cross section of community members who will utilize their local knowledge and expertise to reach out to all persons of our community, and

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Complete Count Committee will work with the Census Bureau and the State of Wisconsin to strive for an accurate count.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors hereby creates a Complete Count Committee to help ensure that every Jefferson County resident is counted in the 2020 census, with membership of the Committee consisting of at least 9 members but not more than 15 members, appointed by the County Board Chair, which shall include some or all representation from: heads of community organizations; heads of business associations; heads of the public school systems; members of socially or economically disadvantaged populations; heads of relevant government agencies and departments, and any other representation which the Chair determines will further the mission of the Complete Count

Committee. Members will receive mileage and no per diem for serving on this committee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Jefferson County is committed to partnering with the U.S. Census Bureau and the State of Wisconsin in participating in the 2020 census and will:

- 1. Support the goals and ideals for the 2020 Census and will disseminate 2020 Census information.
- 2. Encourage all County residents to participate in events and initiatives that will raise the overall awareness of the 2020 Census and increase participation.
- 3. Provide Census advocates to speak to County and Community Organizations.
- 4. Support census takers as they help our County complete an accurate count.
- 5. Strive to achieve a complete and accurate count of all persons within our borders.

RESOLUTION NO. 2019-

Creating the Jefferson County Condemnation Commission

Executive Summary

Eminent Domain, also referred to as condemnation authority, is the power of local, state and federal governments to compel a private property owner to sell property to the government for public use as long as the owner is paid just compensation. As part of the condemnation procedure, Wisconsin Statute section 32.08(1) requires the creation of a Condemnation Commission consisting of six commissioners. Each commissioner must be a resident of Jefferson County or of an adjoining county in the same Jefferson County judicial circuit prior to appointment and remain so during the term of office. This resolution creates the statutorily required Condemnation Commission for Jefferson County. The Executive Committee considered this resolution at its meeting on July 31st, 2019, and recommended forwarding to the County Board for approval.

WHEREAS, Chapter 32 of the Wisconsin Statutes requires the Circuit Court of every Wisconsin County to appoint members to the County Condemnation Commission, and

WHEREAS, there is currently no Condemnation Commission for Jefferson County, and

WHEREAS, Section 32.08(4) of Wisconsin Statutes provides that the condemnation commissioners shall be paid an hourly rate established by the County Board, and

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Circuit Court is proposing an hourly rate for commissioners to be \$100 per hour when attending condemnation commission hearings and viewing property, and \$70 per hour for reviewing cases, preparing decisions, and performing other required duties, and

WHEREAS, Section 32.08(4) provides that all commission compensation and expenses shall be approved by the circuit court.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Jefferson County Condemnation Commission is hereby created and the hourly rate for commissioners shall be \$100 per hour when attending condemnation commission hearings and viewing property, and \$70 per hour for reviewing cases, preparing decisions, and performing other required duties.

Fiscal Note: The fiscal impact of creating the Jefferson County Condemnation Commission will be determined based on the number of local governments using condemnation authority in Jefferson County.

Wisconsin Child Support agencies provide services to the public such as ensuring that children have a legal father designated on their birth certificates and that children have the financial support needed to grow and thrive. County Child Support agencies recognize the importance of providing services to both parents which helps them financially support their children and encourages involvement in their children's lives. Wisconsin child support agencies collected over \$772 million in 2018 and ranked fourth nationally in the collection of child support in 2018. This proclamation proclaims the month of August as child support awareness month in Jefferson County and recognizes that August is also National Child Support Awareness Month. Accepting bid from Energy Services, Inc. to manage the Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program

Executive Summary

The Jefferson County Human Services Department manages the Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program and contracts with Energy Services, Inc. to administer this program. On May 20, 2019, the Jefferson County Human Services Department published a Request for Proposals seeking bids to manage the Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program after the existing contract with Energy Services, Inc. ends on September 30, 2019. The current contractor, Energy Services, Inc., was the only vendor to submit a bid in response to the Request for Proposals. This resolution accepts the bid from Energy Services, Inc. to manage the Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program and authorizes the Human Services Department to enter into a contract with Energy Services, Inc. in the amount of \$118,748 commencing on October 1, 2019, and ending on September 30, 2020, with the option for annual renewals for up to three years. The Human Services Board considered this resolution at its meeting on July 9, 2019, and recommended forwarding to the County Board for approval.

WHEREAS, the Executive Summary is incorporated into this resolution, and

WHEREAS, Energy Services, Inc. has managed the Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program for Jefferson County since 1999, and

WHEREAS, Energy Services, Inc. has managed the Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program for at least twenty-two other counties, and

WHEREAS, Energy Services, Inc. has the staff and qualifications to continue to manage the Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program for Jefferson County, and

WHEREAS, Energy Services, Inc. provided a cost proposal to manage the Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program for an estimated \$118,748 starting October 1, 2019, and ending September 30, 2020.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors hereby accepts the bid from Energy Services, Inc. to manage the Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program and authorizes the Human Services Department to enter into a contract with Energy Services, Inc. in the amount of \$118,748 commencing on October 1, 2019 and ending on September 30, 2020, with the option for annual renewals for up to three years.

Authorizing a Cooperative Agreement between the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and Jefferson County

Executive Summary

The Jefferson County Parks Department is working with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources to construct a handicap accessible access point to the Bark River and Rome Pond Wildlife Area. The project will include an ADA accessible canoe/kayak launch and additional parking for access off of County Highway E at the Bark River in the Town of Sullivan. The purpose of this project is to increase access to the DNR Wildlife Area for hunters and fisherman in accordance with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resource's master plan. This resolution will authorize Jefferson County to enter into a cooperative agreement with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Recourses to increase access to the DNR Wildlife Areas for hunters and fisherman on the Bark River and Rome Pond in accordance with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources master plan. Entering into a cooperative agreement with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources will provide up to \$13,380 of federal grant funds as reimbursement to Jefferson County. The Parks Committee considered this resolution at its meeting on August 5th and the Finance Committee considered this resolution at its meeting on August 5th and the Finance Committee considered this resolution to the County Board for approval.

WHEREAS, the Executive Summary is incorporated into this resolution, and

WHEREAS, this Cooperative Agreement between the State of Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) and Jefferson County (COUNTY), entered into under authority of Wisconsin Statutes s. 23.09(2)(h), is intended to establish collaboration and provide funding solely for completion of the project, and

WHEREAS, the primary purpose of the project is to provide additional access to the Bark River and Rome Pond Wildlife Area for hunting and fishing in accordance with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources master plan in addition to increasing opportunities for canoe recreation, and

WHEREAS, work will be performed by contracted vendors, DNR staff, Jefferson County staff, and Adopt-A-Wildlife-Area volunteers, and

WHEREAS, the Agreement is effective upon signing and execution and remains in effect through the term of the public access easement, and

WHEREAS, The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources shall provide payments to Jefferson County upon completion of the project to the satisfaction of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Parks Department is authorized to enter into a cooperative agreement on behalf of Jefferson County with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Recourses for construction of an ADA accessible canoe/kayak launch which includes additional parking for access off of County Highway E at the Bark River in the Town of Sullivan.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Jefferson County will provide labor and materials for the project with expected reimbursement by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources in the amount of \$13,380.

Fiscal Note: Jefferson County will provide labor for this project which has been previously budgeted and will not exceed the reimbursed amount of \$13,380. No budget adjustment is required.

Amending Official Zoning Maps

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors has heretofore been petitioned to amend the official zoning map of Jefferson County, and

WHEREAS, Petitions R4158A-19, R4166A-19, R4167A-19, R4168A-19 and R4169A-19 were referred to the Jefferson County Planning and Zoning Committee for public hearing on July 18, 2019, and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendments have been given due consideration by the Board of Supervisors in open session,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors does amend the official zoning map of Jefferson County as follows:

FROM A-1, EXCLUSIVE AGRICULTURAL TO A-3, AGRICULTURAL/RURAL RESIDENTIAL

Rezone to create two, 2-acre building sites **near N5185 County Road P** from part of PIN 006-0716-3121-000 (34.8 Acres) in the Town of Concord. This is in accordance with Sec. 11.04(f)8 of the Jefferson County Zoning Ordinance. Rezoning is conditioned upon road access approval, receipt by Zoning of suitable soil tests and approval and recording of a final certified survey for the lots. R4166A-19 – Anfang Properties LLC

Create a 5-acre farm consolidation lot around the home and buildings at **W7091 County Road J** from part of PIN 014-0614-1912-000 (39.78 Acres) in the Town of Jefferson. This is in accordance with Sec. 11.04(f)8 of the Jefferson County Zoning Ordinance. Rezoning is conditioned upon approval and recording of a final certified survey map for the lot. R4167A-19 – Michael Fornecker/Edward V Fornecker Trust Property

Create a 1-acre farm consolidation lot around the home and buildings at **W8731 Advent Rd** in the Town of Oakland from part of PIN 022-0613-3331-009 (9.36 Acres). This is in accordance with Sec. 11.04(f)8 of the Jefferson County Zoning Ordinance. Rezoning is conditioned upon approval and recording of a final certified survey map for the lot. R4168A-19 – Michael Larson/Milo Larson Trust Property

FROM A-3, AGRICULTURAL/RURAL RESIDENTIAL TO A-1, EXCLUSIVE AGRICULTURAL

Rezone PIN 016-0513-3442-002 (0.47 Acre) to A-1 to add it to adjoining A-1 zoned property. The site is in the Town of Koshkonong, near **N278 Pottawatomi Trail.** This is in accordance with Sec. 11.04(f)6 of the Jefferson County Zoning Ordinance. R4158A-19 – Mark A Meyer

FROM A-3, AGRICULTURAL/RURAL RESIDENTIAL TO A-2, AGRICULTURAL AND RURAL BUSINESS

Create a 1-acre A-2 zone from part of PIN 022-0613-1324-000 (13.618 Acres) at N3888 Scheppert Rd, in the Town of Oakland. This is in accordance with Sec. 11.04(f)7 of the Jefferson County Zoning Ordinance. Rezoning is conditioned upon road access approval and approval and recording of a final certified survey map for the lot. R4169A-19 – Mark Marsh
