JEFFERSON COUNTY ALCOHOL TREATMENT COURT

What is the Alcohol Treatment Court?

The Jefferson County Alcohol Treatment Court offers the repeat drunk driver the opportunity to break the cycle of drunk driving, improve the chances of a sober and healthy life and contribute to a safe community.

How Do I Qualify to Participate?

- 18 years of age or older
- Jefferson County resident (for the duration of the program)
- Charged with 3rd, 4th, 5th or greater OWI offense
- No prior violent felony convictions

What does the Path to Success Look Like?

You have the opportunity to:

- Increase your chances of living a healthy and sober life
- Heal relationships with family and friends
- Spend less time in jail
- Receive ongoing, individual support
- Experience freedom from alcohol dependence
- Enjoy better health

How Long Does it Take?

The length of the program is determined by each participant's progress through the four phases. Graduation may occur within one year, but it is likely to take additional time beyond that depending on the participant's treatment needs. Since inception, there have been 3 graduates.

How Does the Program Work?

- Admission: Takes place at sentencing and is dependent on available openings in the program.
- Court Appearances: The Judge will actively monitor your case through regular court appearances.
- Assessment: WCS conducts an initial risk and need assessment to determine consideration for eligibility. A list of approved treatment providers will be provided.
- Treatment and Support: Ongoing, individualized treatment is required in addition to self-help group attendance.
- Incentives & Sanctions: Rewards are given for positive behavior and sanctions are imposed for inappropriate behavior.
- Case Management: Your Case Manager will provide support and monitoring to assist you in reaching your goals. Electronic monitoring, random urinalysis and home visits are used.

Is there any other information?

- The District Attorney is the gatekeeper of the program and ALL referrals must go through their office.
- Please visit the WCS website (www.wiscs.org) to learn the eligibility criteria for the program.
