Re: Request to Conduct Ground-Disturbing Activity to Facilitate Future Interments; Cataloged Potter's Ridge (JE-1208) Human Burial Site: Jefferson County

Dear Ms. Tesch:

Based on the information you have provided in your submittal, we have reclassified the Potter's Ridge burial site location described in your submittal materials as an active cemetery owned and used by Jefferson County to continue to inter the remains of indigent and other deceased persons as it finds necessary. This burial/interment activity includes the installation of columbaria for disposition of cremated human remains, the installation of other burial crypts, and or excavation of grave sites for in-ground burials.

While there are three distinct burial areas identified as "Potter's Ridge," this cemetery reclassification (described above) pertains to the specific burial site location identified in the map you provided in your original submittal materials. I have identified this cemetery location as "Potter's Ridge A." I am including a copy of your aerial photo showing the cemetery, and a copy of the map from our database confirming this cemetery location. The two other burial site locations of the Potter's Ridge burial site complex remain inactive and cataloged under Wis. Stat. § 157.70 (2).

Because the Potter's Ridge burial site is serving Jefferson County is its capacity as an active cemetery, we have determined that the proposed project activity that you have described falls under the provisions of Wis. Stat. §§ 157.11, 157.111 and 157.112 describing work that a cemetery organization is expected to carry out as part of its business.

Therefore, your proposed project to install a columbaria/crypt for placement of cremated human remains within the taking place within the boundaries of this cataloged burial site, does not require a permit, and is not subject to review or assessment by this office. No review for permitting for future activities carried out by the County in its capacity of providing for interment of the deceased taking place within the cataloged boundaries of the Potter's Field burial site is required under any provisions of Wis. Stat. § 157.70.

By copy of this letter, I am advising the Office of the State Archaeologist of these findings and the status of this burial location.

With questions, please contact me. No further coordination with this office either prior to or during construction is necessary for this project. I have no further concerns. Thank you for your continued attention to this matter.




