

1. Jefferson County is preparing the TAD Grant Re-Application for 2020, which is due September 12, 2019. This grant will continue to fund the Alcohol and Drug Treatment Court Programs through 2021. For 2022, the TAD Grant Funding Program will re-open as a competitive funding opportunity. Locations approved for that grant will then be approved for non-competitive funding for the remainder of the five-year grant cycle.
2. The Department of Justice has announced additional funding through the TAD Grant Program of \$750,000. This funding will first be allocated to Counties and Tribes which do not have alcohol or drug treatment court programs. Remaining funds will then be allocated to existing programs for program enhancement. Jefferson County is applying for this funding to increase treatment capacity at Human Services. Specifically, one Therapist position is being proposed to work specifically with Treatment Court applicants and participants. This position should allow dosage hours of treatment programming to increase with the goal of approaching the NADCP recommended dosage hours of 200 hours of programming over 6-9 months. In addition to increasing treatment hours, this position will also assist in coordinating an alumni and peer support program in an effort to help new or struggling participants as well as keeping graduates engage in the support community.
3. The Department of Justice and the WI Association of Treatment Court Professionals is hosting Treatment Court Standards training for new Team Members in the coming weeks. It is anticipated that the newer Team members will attend the one-day training in Janesville in August.
4. Due to the ATC and DTC programs being close to total stated capacity at the moment, the Treatment Court will have a discussion about County residency requirements for any new applicants until numbers change. The Team has observed out of County residents having increased difficulty meeting program requirements and, given the numbers, may prioritize Jefferson County residents for the time being.
5. The Treatment Court Planning Team will meet in September to discuss several possible program changes. Those include:
 - a) Whether we should consider promoting some DTC clients after 2 weeks in Phase I if they show sufficient progress and demonstrate they are stable.
 - b) Whether to have DTC clients start attending AA/NA in phase I, like ATC clients.
 - c) Clarifying on paperwork how frequently clients must meet with case managers (removing ranges, and just making a solid period of time ie: once every 2 weeks, not once every 2-3 weeks).
 - d) Enforcing requirements that clients that are not working do community service instead.
 - e) Status of after-care/alumni group.
 - f) Finalizing language for ATR's to be allowed into the ATC and DTC programs.
