This grid security exercise, which takes place every two years, provides an opportunity for utilities to demonstrate how they would respond to and recover from simulated coordinated cyber and physical security threats and incidents, strengthen their crisis communications relationships, and provide input for lessons learned.

Updated and increased employee connection through the Government Emergency Telecommunications Service (GETS) and the Wireless Priority Service (WPS)
