AFCSP

The Alzheimer's Family Caregiver Support Program

Who is eligible?

To join AFCSP, a person must:

- Have Alzheimer's diagnosis or another type of irreversible dementia diagnosis.
- Have an income of \$48,000 each year or less.



How AFCSP works:

- BADR Oversees funds, distributes to counties & tribes.
- Our Support Specialist assesses
- Assists in finding services
- Providers send us bills
- Caregivers send us receipts
- We pay or reimburse expenses
- \$4,000 per year



Grant total for 2024:
\$40,500

- In 2023, we served 10 caregivers and 10 care recipients with this program.

What services are covered?

Services can include:

- Adult day care.
- In-home help.
- Respite care.
- Support groups and self-care.
- Transportation.

Goods can include:

- Chair lifts.
- Hobby supplies.
- Meals sent to your home.
- Nutrition supplements.
- Security systems.
- Special clothes

- This program serves family members caring for loved ones as well as grandparents raising grandchildren. Last year we partnered with the Children's programs to promote this important support. It was our 1st year doing so and we assisted 7 families in 2023 in this way.

How NFCSP works:

- OAA Oversees funds, GWAAR distributes to counties & tribes.
- Our Support Specialist assesses
- Assists in finding services
- Providers send us bills
- Caregivers send us receipts
- We pay or reimburse expenses
- \$1,200 per year



Budget for 2024:
\$39,806 with a required
match of \$13,269. Total
of \$53,075.

- This program is for people 60 years old or older who are having trouble in various areas of daily living.
- It is a short-term program that will provide up to \$1,500 over a 12-month period.



Supportive Services Title III B

The types of services that can be covered through this program include:

- Adaptive Equipment
- Consumable Supplies
- Homemaker Services
- Personal Care Chore Services
- Support Groups
- Recreation/Socialization

Our Budget for 2024 is : \$78,332 with a required minimum match of \$8,704.

In 2023 76 participants were served



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
