County-Run EMS Systems

Staffing

- Marquette County County employees, partner with local first responder units
- Sawyer County County employees
- Waushara County County employees, provide EMS supplies for local first responder units

<u>Ownership</u>

- Waushara County Countyowned and operated
- Florence County Countyowned and operated
- Rusk County Countyowned and operated

Funding

- Door County Fund countywide medical director
- Marquette County Fund countywide medical director
- Waushara County Fund EMR training throughout the county



Hybrid EMS Systems

Services

- Door County County for primary staffing, reimburse municipalities \$150/licensed EMR and per call
- Lafayette County Primary provider in some municipalities, backup in others
- **Oneida County** Rhinelander provides own services
- Portage County Contract with 3 local Fire Departments; county EMS service for special events and backup

Equipment/Staffing

- Oneida County County owns equipment, contracts for staffing
- Portage County EMS Division in Sheriff's Office with EMS Coordinator
- Taylor County County owns equipment, contracts for staffing

Funding

- Door County Funding for training, countywide medical director, dispatch
- Lafayette County Free or lowcost for all ambulance and EMR units in the county
- Portage County Annual grants for local departments



County-Supported EMS Systems

Services

- Green Lake County Contract for services
- Lincoln County Contract for services
- Milwaukee County Fire departments, private ambulances in Milwaukee

Admin Support

- Bayfield County EMS Coordinator
- Lincoln County County Finance Department bills for services
- Milwaukee County EMS Department for coordination, data analysis

Funding

- **Bayfield County** Formulabased stipend to local providers for critical incident services
- Green Lake County Contract rates based on actual expenditures
- Milwaukee County Formulabased funding to local departments

Bayfield County

2024 Countywide EMS Levy: \$458,000

EMS Structure Highlights (County-supported)

- Stipends to 9 EMS providers throughout the county
- County EMS Coordinator position in 2025



Door County

2024 Countywide EMS Levy: \$4,787,599

EMS Structure Highlights (Hybrid)

- One of 2 counties in WI offering countywide paramedic service
- Reimburse municipalities annually per licensed EMR
- Funding for trainings and a county-wide medical director



Florence County

2024 Countywide EMS Levy: \$1,768,966

EMS Structure Highlights (County-run)

- County-run EMS
- Shifted away from volunteers in 2022-2023



Green Lake County

2024 Countywide EMS Levy: \$2,463,800

County Involvement in EMS (County-supported)

• Contract for services with Berlin Emergency Medical Service and Southern Green Lake County Ambulance Service



Lafayette County

2024 Countywide EMS Levy: \$178,524

EMS Structure Highlights (Hybrid)

- County EMS Department Primary provider in some municipalities
- Backup provider throughout the county
- Free or low-cost training to all ambulance and first responder units in the county



Lincoln County

2024 Countywide EMS Levy: \$1,182,931

County Involvement in EMS (County-supported)

- Contracts with City of Merrill for southern portion of the county, Aspirus out of Tomahawk for northern
- County Public Safety Committee oversees contracting for services



Marquette County

2024 Countywide EMS Levy: \$1,545,240

County Involvement in EMS (County-run)

- County-run service
- Referendum to increase levy (approved)
- County-wide medical director



Milwaukee County

2024 Countywide EMS Levy: \$5,745,482

County Involvement in EMS (County-supported)

- County office of EMS to help with coordination, data collection and analysis, administer protocols and standards of care
- Services through municipal fire departments, some private ambulance providers in Milwaukee
- Formula-based distribution of funds to municipal departments



Oneida County

2024 Countywide EMS Levy: \$2,434,487

County Involvement in EMS (Hybrid)

- County-funded and county-owned equipment
- Contracts for personnel with Aspirus Rhinelander Hospital and Howard Young Medical Center



Portage County**

2024 Countywide EMS Levy: \$3,027,369

County Involvement in EMS (Hybrid)

- Mostly county-supported, but supplement EMS service for special events or as needed
- Contract with 3 municipalities for county-wide paramedic-level care and ambulance transport
- EMS Coordinator position since 2009
- Grants to municipalities

Rusk County

2024 Countywide EMS Levy: \$709,673

County Involvement in EMS (County-run)

- County-owned and operated EMS system
- Rusk County Ambulance Service partners with EMS of Rusk County



Sawyer County

2024 Countywide EMS Levy: \$1,200,787

County Involvement in EMS (County-run)

- County-owned and operated system
- EMS personnel are county staff



Taylor County

2024 Countywide EMS Levy: \$1,980,610

County Involvement in EMS (Hybrid)

- County EMS office operated through Memorial Medical Center
- County owns equipment (similar to Oneida)



Waushara County

2024 Countywide EMS Levy: \$2,083,567

County Involvement in EMS (County-run)

- County-owned and operated system
- County staff
- Provide trainings, including EMR training
