



Jefferson County – All Crashes Reported 7/17/2025 to 10/16/2025






Summary:

- Unit 1 was N/B on CTH N while Unit 2 was S/B as the two approached each other.
- Unit 1 slightly entered the east ditch line and overcorrected causing the vehicle to cross over the center line.
- Unit 2 driver took an evasive maneuver and ran off the roadway into the west ditch.
- Unit 1 also entered the west ditch where the two vehicles collided.
- Both vehicles came to a rest in the west ditch area.



Wisconsin Law Enforcement Phlebotomy Program - 2026 Cohorts

The Wisconsin Law Enforcement Phlebotomy Program announces the Wisconsin Statewide Law Enforcement Phlebotomy (LEP) training program. The LEP program trains law enforcement and those employed by a law enforcement agency in the proper technique for collecting blood for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) investigations. The Madison College School of Health Sciences is an accredited academic institution qualified to train individuals in basic laboratory skills (BLS) and phlebotomy. Upon completing the course, law enforcement will be trained phlebotomists and will be able to draw blood for OWI investigations.

At least nine other states have successful LEP programs. Building on those successes, Madison College has curated a program specifically to train law enforcement in legal blood draws. Hospitals have experienced short staffing and often find it challenging to accommodate the legal blood draws required in Wisconsin. In addition, the phlebotomists must appear in court to testify about the procedures followed during the blood draw. Often, law enforcement must wait for long periods before they can get a legal blood draw, causing the drugs and alcohol in the defendant's system to rapidly dissipate. The LEP program will allow for faster blood draws, remove the hospital staff's burden, and allow them to focus on patient care.

LEP Program Details

Madison College has tailored the curriculum to focus only on venous blood draws. This is the primary type of draw that occurs when collecting a blood sample for OWI investigations.

We are offering two courses for 2026:

January 5-9, 2026 (Application deadline: December 19, 2025)

May 18-22, 2026 (Application deadline: May 1, 2026)

Each class lasts one week, and a few hours of online preparation are required one week before the first day of class.

NOTE: Candidates will be drawing blood on each other during the training and on volunteers.

Course Location: Madison College School of Health Sciences 1705 Hoffman St. Madison, WI 53704

Cost: BOTS will pay the upfront costs for tuition and books and can reimburse an agency for lodging, wages, meals, mileage, drive time, etc., as long as they are already established contractual obligations. BOTS cannot reimburse for backfilling a position while gone at training but can pay for wages that can be used to offset any overtime that must be paid to backfill a position while an officer attends the training. BOTS cannot reimburse these items if your agency has not historically paid for them. The intent is to reimburse agencies for things that need to be paid for, not to get free money for things that were never paid in the past. DRE SCHOOL - ADDITIONAL DETAILS

COVERED COSTS

BOTS will pay the upfront costs associated with registration, lodging, and equipment issued. Issued equipment includes a DRE kit bag, an Intoximeter FST Preliminary Breath Tester (PBT), stethoscope, sphygmomanometer, digital thermometer & probe covers, penlight, pupilometer, magnifiers and batteries. Issued classroom materials include student manuals & D-ring binders, 16GB flash drive, clipboard, ink pen, college ruled notebook and correction tape. BOTS will pay the cost for lodging. I will send the specific hotel/lodging information in a follow-up email after the candidate selections have been made. They DO NOT have to make hotel reservations. I will take care of that later and BOTS will pay for all the lodging. The two hotels we will be using are both Holiday Inn Express & Suites, which provide a free breakfast. The DRE candidates will each have their own room so they can study without any distractions. The classroom portion of the training for the first 2-weeks will be held at the hotel, which has a classroom on the first floor. The field certification portion of the training for the last 2-weeks will be held at the Milwaukee Police Academy, which is only a 7-minute drive from the hotel.

AGENCY COSTS

Underserved agencies can be reimbursed for most of their contractual obligations such as wages, meals, mileage, drive time etc. If your agency needs help covering these costs, please contact Valerie Cargill from BOTS at valeriel.cargill@dot.wi.gov to request help sending someone to the DRE School. BOTS can reimburse certain costs as long as they are already established contractual obligations. Pleases submit the request to Valerie Cargill at the same time the application packet is submitted to me.

IMPORTANT DETAILS

Half of the officers attending will need to provide a squad car for use during the Field Certification Portion of the training. Unmarked squads are preferred, but it must have adequate emergency lighting if necessary. Grant funded local Milwaukee Police Department officers will be riding along in the squad cars and will be the authority during this portion of the training. We will be working in a training capacity and function with that being our primary objective, not law enforcement or making arrests! Each officer will need a laptop computer (capable of processing "Word" documents and "pdf" files) to complete evaluations and narratives during the Field Certification Phase of the training. They are not required to bring a laptop during the classroom portion of the training, but some find it useful for taking notes and such. During the classroom portion of the training they will be expected to dress in business casual attire. No jeans, cut-offs, or T-shirts are allowed during class. 5.11 pants, khaki pants, polo's, button-up shirts are fine. Ties are not necessary (just look decent and still be comfortable). They will be expected to be in full uniform for all Field Certifications portions of the training. This will include full duty belt, gun, and ballistic vest, but no body worn cameras, because we do not record law enforcement training events.








Community Maps WiSTAR


- Pilot program to map LE traffic stops indicating the date, time, location, UTC/Warning violation type.

- Determine where enforcement efforts are at in relation to crash types.


Search CM (Speed Flagged Crashes)




Access Traffic Citation GEO Overlay




Activate Traffic Citation GEO Overlay











Heat Map Layer Selected


