Call to Order was made by Chairman Hughes at 9:32 a.m. for the Landowners' Meeting Drain 36

There were 14 landowners present; the names of landowners present are attached to these minutes.

Order of Business

DRAIN 36

Chairman David Hughes called the meeting to order at 9:32 a.m. He introduced the Drain Board members, the attorney, and engineer. He stated the purpose of the meeting—to receive input from the landowners to correct the flooding problems caused by the limited drain capacity of the tiled drain.

Ronald Griebenow gave a background presentation of Drain 36 including previous drain repairs north of Fox Road, large quantities of water flowing from Dodge County and the northern area of the drain, overloading the southern drain area which has a pump. Ron stated that he and Jaeckel Brothers Excavating reviewed the drain and said the following could be considered:

- Put an additional 10 inch tile from Highway 16 to Fox Lake Road. Cost \$25,000 per mile
- 2. Remove trees which are causing root build-up
- 3. At Highway 16 add additional pump and water reservoir
- 4. Put new culvert under Highway 16 and railroad; need railroad and DOT approval.

Attorney Andy Griggs stated that there are 500 benefited acres currently enrolled in Drain 36. He said due to this clean out we need to broaden out to add additional acres who currently benefit from this drain.

The meeting was opened to comments, questions, and suggestions from the landowners. Statements made included the history and problems associated with this drain, various suggestions for corrective action, suggestion to have WE Energies talk to DOT and also contact railroad to get input concerning boring under the highway and railroad. Engineer Dan Prunuske discussed previous issues with this drain, size and type of pumps that would address the

problems, and enlargement of the reservoir area to handle heavy rain issue. Chairman David Hughes informed the landowners that action needed to be taken today to pay previous and current bills. He said the cost of a future meeting gets expensive.

Attorney Andy Griggs stated that the options are as follows:

- 1. Do nothing; live with the problem
- 2. A 10% assessment would raise \$12,125.00
- 3. A 20% assessment would raise \$24,250.00
- 4. A 35% assessment would raise \$42,437.00

Following some questions and comments, Bruce Degner made a motion to assess at 35%. The motion was seconded by Dave Pitchard. The vote was taken by the raising of hands and conducted by Chairman David Hughes.

Vote Results: 8 voted for the motion

5 voted against the motion

1 did not vote

Motion carried.

With no further business before the Drain Board regarding the landowners of Drain 36 meeting, Chairman Hughes adjourned the meeting at 10:51 a.m.

The balance of this drain clean out will be done after crop removal this fall.

3. The landowners' meeting was just adjourned with assessment voted to generate 35% or \$42,437.00. The Drain Board will now need to follow-up with final decisions and implementation of work to be done.
