Birmingham – Council is interested in hearing from the public what they would like to see listed as a Jefferson County Historic Landmark.

Nass – would like to appeal to the public as to what they think the Council should be doing.

12. Potter's Field site nomination for landmark status

Morse – resolution nominating Potter's Field has been drafted by Ward and is accompanied by a map.

Birmingham – map shows two areas as designated as part of Potters field. Both areas were formally mapped and designated as Historical. There is a third area, previously mentioned in a report, cemetery #1 (behind extension), #2 (highway), and cemetery #3 (along annex road) has been identified but the boundaries are not clear as they are not yet surveyed and/or designated as a burial site when the other two were identified. More research needs to be done to formally designate #3. Question is, are we designating Potter's Field (in general) or the two sites as identified on the attached map. Morse – Phil Salkin report (at end) makes note of a possible third site.

Nass – does it meet the criteria? Reviewed and meets the criteria as outlined in the ordinance.

Nass/Mode motion to advance the resolution to the July Parks Committee and July County Board meetings. Motion carries 5/0.
