APPROVAL OF MINUTES: MOTION MADE BY DAVID; SECOND BY BRAUGHLER TO APPROVE THE MINUTES FROM THE JUNE 22, 2018 MEETING AS PRESENTED – ALL AYES.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON ELECTRICAL BID FOR SECURUS VIDEO VISITATION KIOSKS USING JAIL ASSESSMENT MONIES – CAPT. SCOTT EXPLAINED THAT WE HAD A CONTRACT LAST YEAR WITH SECURUS TO DO VIDEO VISITATION IN THE JAIL. THE INITIAL PROPOSAL WAS USING THE EXISTING WIRING IN THE PHONES. AFTER THE BID CAME UP THEY WERE GIVING THE JAIL A MORE ROBUST SYSTEM THAT REQUIRED ITS OWN ELECTRICAL. THE MAINTENANCE PERSONNEL WERE GOING TO RUN POWER FROM THE TV OUTLETS TO POWER THE NEW SYSTEM BUT THE ENGINEER ADVISED THAT THE NEW SYSTEM NEEDED ITS OWN POWER SUPPLY. THE JAIL RECEIVED 3 BIDS FOR THE ELECTRICAL WORK THAT NEEDS TO BE DONE; CARINI ELECTRIC FOR \$11,580.00, JEFFERSON CURRENT ELECTRIC FOR \$11,588.00 AND MIDWEST ELECTRIC FOR \$22,195.00. THE MAINTENANCE PERSONNEL'S INPUT WAS THAT JEFFERSON CURRENT ELECTRIC HAD WORKED IN THE JAIL PREVIOUSLY AND WOULD BE MOST FAMILIAR WITH THE LAYOUT OF THE FACILITY. A MOTION WAS MADE BY BRAUGHLER TO USE THE JAIL ASSESSMENT MONIES TO ACCEPT THE BID BY JEFFERSON CURRENT ELECTRIC, 2ND BY DAVID — ALL AYES.

REVIEW OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT BUDGET – HAUGOM STATED THAT AS OF THE END OF JUNE THE EPCRA BUSINESS UNIT (12002) THE EMPG BUSINESS UNIT (12001) ARE BOTH AT 40% OF BUDGET FOR THE YEAR.
