REVIEW EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT BUDGET: HAUGOM STATED THAT THE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT OFFICE IS ALMOST \$11,000 UNDER BUDGET. THE OFFICE HAS CAPITAL COMING IN FROM GRANTS OF A LITTLE OVER \$2,000,000 AND THE ENTIRE BUDGET IS \$2,384,588 WITH THE GENERAL EM BUDGET BEING APPROXIMATELY \$185,000.
