## 6. Approval of July 28, 2021 Executive Committee meeting minutes

## 9. Discussion and possible action on Supervisor Salary & Compensation Ordinance

Current salary information for Jefferson County and comparison salary information from other counties was provided for review.

Wehmeier talked about the data that was provided. The data from other counties is inconsistent. Nass suggested increasing the salary to \$110 per month and not make a change to the per diem amount. Braughler and Nelan prefer an increase in meeting per diem fees. The Committee discussed the options. They considered increasing the salary to \$110 and increasing the per diem amount to \$65.00. This would be a cost increase of approximately \$34,000.

Motion by Nass/Rinard to increase the salary of county board supervisors to \$110 per month and increase the per diem amount to \$65.00. Motion passed 5-0.

#### 10. Discussion and possible action on meeting per diem and mileage payment process

Roland from our IT department wrote a software application to be used for recording per diem and mileage payments. The software application was demonstrated.

Motion by Nass/Rinard to support using this software application and present it to supervisors at the October County Board meeting. Motion passed 5-0.

## 11. Discussion and possible action on Jefferson County redistricting timeline

Wehmeier gave an update on the timeline. A survey was conducted with municipalities. The timeline was adjusted as follows: No action taken.

- Week of August 30<sup>th</sup> and week of September 6<sup>th</sup>: Executive Committee will meet to discuss the tentative supervisory district plan and provide feedback to County Staff
- September 14<sup>th</sup>: County Board of Supervisors will hold a public hearing and review the tentative supervisory district plan. Following the public hearing, County Board will review and approve the tentative plan
- September 15th: Following County Board approval, the tentative supervisor district plan will be
  released to local municipalities for their review and approval. This step includes the review of
  ward districts and town supervisor areas
- September 15th November 1th: Stage 2 Local municipalities review and approve municipal wards/Town supervisor areas
- November 3<sup>rd</sup> (date to be confirmed): County Board of Supervisors holds a Public Hearing on the final supervisory district plan which includes municipal wards and town supervisor areas
- November 9<sup>th</sup> (date to be confirmed): County Board of Supervisors reviews and approves the final supervisory district plan.

# 12. Discussion and possible action on preliminary Jefferson County census data for redistricting and policy guidance for district parameters

Maps of current and proposed boundaries were provided for review. Zangl reviewed the maps, population changes and deviations. The proposed redistricting map will be shared with the county board and the municipalities. There will be a special Executive Committee meeting on September 7<sup>th</sup> to review the proposed redistricting maps. No action taken.

## 13. Discussion and possible action on amendments to the county board rules

Wehmeier said that they have a list of amendments that are being considered. Staff is looking at ideas for resolving issues with having committee quorums. A list of proposed amendments will be provided for review at the next meeting. No action taken.
