Zarling, Economic Development Consortium, introduced Resolution No. 2022-44. Supporting

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application to the United States Economic Development Administration for recognition of the Madison Region Economic Partnership as a federally designated Economic Development District

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors hereby supports the designation of the six-county Madison Region Economic Partnership comprised of Columbia, Dane, Dodge, Jefferson, Rock, and Sauk Counties, as a federally designated Economic Development District under 13 C.F.R. § 304.

Fiscal Note: This resolution has no immediate fiscal impact.

Zarling moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 2022-44. Seconded by Gulig and passed.

Zarling, Economic Development Consortium, introduced Resolution No. 2022-45. Amending the Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement for the Jefferson County Economic Development Consortium

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors hereby approves continuing the attached Jefferson County Economic Development Consortium Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement as amended and authorizes the County Administrator to execute the agreement on behalf of Jefferson County.

Fiscal Note: Jefferson County's funding obligation was approved by the County Board in the 2022 budget. There is no additional fiscal impact arising from this resolution.

Fiscal Note: This matter has been referred to Wisconsin Municipal Mutual Insurance Company (WMMIC) and will be resolved in accordance with the terms of the County's policy.

Jones, Finance Committee Chair, introduced Resolution No. 2022-47. Accepting grant funds

from the Wisconsin Department of Military Affairs, Division of Emergency Management to identify the types and amounts of hazardous materials transported into, out of, or within Jefferson County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors hereby accepts grant funding from the Department of Military Affairs in the amount of \$15,210 to identify the types and amounts of hazardous materials transported into, out of or within Jefferson County.

Fiscal Note: These grant funds will be used for diversionary programming to identify the types and amounts of hazardous materials transported into, out of or within Jefferson County and are available to be used until March 31, 2023. Jefferson County will receive reimbursement for costs incurred during this time. This is a budget amendment. This resolution authorizes the Finance Director to make the necessary budget adjustments to enact this resolution by increasing revenue and expenditure appropriations by \$15,210 in the Emergency Management Department's budget. County Board approval requires a two-thirds vote of the entire membership of the County Board (20 votes of the 30 member County Board).

Jones moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 2022-47. Seconded by Gulig and passed. Fitzgerald, Human Resources Committee, introduced Resolution No. 2022-48. Creating a full-time Resource Conservationist position and eliminating a vacant, full-time Geographic Information System & Land Use Specialist III position in the Land and Water Conservationist Department

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that one full-time Resource Conservationist position is hereby created, one full-time Geographic Information System & Land Use Specialist III Position is hereby eliminated, and the 2022 County Budget setting forth positions at the Land and Water Conservation Department be and is hereby amended to fund one full-time Resource Conservation position and eliminate funding for one full-time Geographic Information System & Land Use Specialist III position at the Land and Water Conservation Department to become effective upon passage of this resolution.

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Fiscal Note: The creation of the Resource Conservationist position has an annual cost of \$93,340.60 for salary and fringe benefits. There is an annual savings of \$98,397.60 from the elimination of the full-time Geographic Information System & Land Use Specialist III position. There is also \$10,808 of estimated revenues through an intergovernmental agreement with the City of Watertown in 2023 for agricultural conservation practice implementation that could assist with funding this position. Therefore, no additional tax levy is required for this position change. This is a budget amendment. County Board approval requires a two-thirds vote of the entire membership of the County Board (20 votes of the 30-member County Board).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors that the Land and Water Conservation Department will meet the financial obligations necessary to fully and satisfactorily complete the project and hereby authorizes and empowers the Land and Water Conservation Department Director to do the following:

- Sign and submit a grant application and supporting documents to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources for financial assistance that may be available
- 2. Enter into a grant agreement with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources
- Submit quarterly and/or final reports to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources to satisfy the grant agreement, as appropriate
- Submit reimbursement request(s) to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources no later than the date specified in the grant agreement

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Land and Water Conservation Department will comply with all local, state and federal rules, regulations and ordinances relating to this project and the cost-share agreement.

Fiscal Note: The total 2023 grant award of \$13,003.36 will cover the cost of staff time spent implementing the grant deliverables. The grant amount and corresponding expenses are included in the 2023 budget. Therefore, no budget adjustment is necessary.

Foelker moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 2022-49. Seconded by Turville-Heitz and passed.

Foelker, Land and Water Conservation Committee, introduced Resolution No. 2022-50. Authorizing the Application and Implementation of a Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Healthy Lakes and Rivers Grant

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors that the Jefferson County Land and Water Conservation Department will meet the financial obligations necessary to fully and satisfactorily complete the project and hereby authorizes and empowers the Land and Water Conservation Department Director to do the following:

- Sign and submit a grant application and supporting documents to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources for financial assistance that may be available
- 2. Enter into a grant agreement with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources
- Submit quarterly and/or final reports to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources to satisfy the grant agreement as appropriate
- Submit reimbursement requests to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources no later than the date specified in the grant agreement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Land and Water Conservation Department will comply with all local, state and federal rules, regulations and ordinances relating to this project and the cost-share agreement. Fiscal Note: The total grant request is \$5,500 of which \$5,000 will partially cover the costs of implementing the practices, with the landowners covering the remaining implementation costs. The remaining \$500 of the grant will offset the cost of existing Land and Water Conservation Department staff who will provide technical assistance for the projects. Currently, no budget adjustment is necessary to enact this resolution. The Land and Water Conservation staff will propose an adjustment to the 2023 budget based on the status of the projects after year-end as a part of the budget carryover process.
