TRAFFIC SAFETY COMMISSION MINUTES:

The minutes from the April, 20th, 2023, Jefferson County Traffic Safety Commission meeting, having been distributed in advance, it was moved by Udovich and seconded by Martin to approve the minutes as printed. Motion Carried.

CORRESPONDENCE:

- a. Johnsons Creek Fire Department inquired about adding emergency vehicle preemption (EVP) to traffic signals.
 - EVP's should be uniform county wide
 - Grant funding is available
 - Receivers do not need to be added to all emergency vehicles at one time, can add as the need arises
- b. Concerns regarding the ramp on Highway F
 - In the winter it is hard to gain traction
 - Other materials we can put on the roadways to help with slick spots

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Wiedenfeld and Untz both spoke about the concerns regarding Highway Q and Cemetery Road. (See Pages 3 & 4)

- Guardrail is not placed correctly
- Cars are still causing damage to the cemetery
- Suggest vacating connection of Highway Q to Cemetery Road and creating a cul-de-sac

OLD BUSINESS

Discussion regarding subcommittee meetings on public engagement on traffic safety

- 6 schools have responded
- Prefer a 45-minute presentation

• Most want assembly style, anywhere from 30-370 students

NEW BUSINESS

- a. Concerns regarding Highway Q (See Public Comment)
- b. Concerns regarding Highway Y and Highway 18 and Highway D and Highway 18 intersections.
 - People are running the stop sign
 - Possible solutions include lower speed, rumble strips, dual signage, flashing stop sign
 - Research needs to be done to determine underlying issue

10. Traffic Accident Spot Map – Jefferson County Sheriff's Department

The Spot Map was reviewed by the Committee. 4 Crashes, 5 Fatalities from April 2023 to July 2023. See pages 5 & 6 for additional details and link to Community Maps. No Motion.

11. WisDOT Southwest Region, Madison - Traffic Section

Chris Wells – in 2012, 54% of all fatal crashed happened on rural roads, while only 19% of the population lived in these rural areas. The fatality rate is 2.4 times higher in rural areas than in urban areas.

12. WisDOT Bureau of Transportation Safety – Transportation Safety Report & Highway Safety Input

Randy Wiessinger presented crash data trends, motorcycle crashes, and data on fatal crashes as a result of failing to wear seat belts and/or speeding. Randy mentioned that all reported crashes should have a "flag" as to why the crash happened.

- Governor's Conference on Highway Safety will be August 29th-31st, 2023
- National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) Speed Awareness Day is July 26th, 2023

13. Wisconsin State Patrol

- a. State Patrol discussed I94 complaints on crashes in the Winter months, roads seemed to be slicker this winter than past years.
- b. The State Patrol will be participating in Speed Awareness Day on July 26th, 2023 and will be increasing their patrol in the area.

We, the undersigned, electors of the Town of Aztalan, Jefferson County, Wisconsin, hereby petition for the execution of safety measures at the intersection of Cemetery Road and County Road Q, near N6603 County Road Q to increase traffic safety and protect property within the Town of Aztalan:


Whereas, the electors and property owners within and around the described location are affected by the high rate of traffic speed, run offs on to property causing damage by vehicles traveling on and off the approach of the I-94 overpass bridge, County Road Q, in addition to safety concerns in regards to the guard rail at the intersection of Cemetery Road and County Road Q due to the improper use of the guard rail from which it is designed and intended for, and the encroachment of the County Road Q road bed and road right of way on the east side of N6603 CTH Q (Aztalan Milford Cemetery) to compensate for the high rate of speed and the improper design of the curved approach, into a historic and sensitive burial location of the cemetery,

Therefore, the electors of the Town of Aztalan, petition Jefferson County, Jefferson County Traffic Safety Commission and Jefferson County Highway Department and the Town of Aztalan to execute measures to address safety concerns, property damage and encroachment onto properties, by vacating the intersection of Cemetery Road and County Road Q, engineer the appropriate curve on and off of the County Road Q overpass bridge and properly install guard rail in the manner in which it is intended to be used, in addition to lowering the rate of speed to not less than 45mph from the hamlet of Aztalan to the hamlet of Milford in conjunction with the recommendations to lower the rate of speed at the overpass approach as provided by the WI DOT in 2018 when the I-94 overpass drawings were finalized, for the safety of traffic and preservation of property.


