Tom Pinion, City of Baraboo, stated that the city has a meeting set up with WisDOT next week regarding the Trans 29 permit; this is necessary in getting the Wis DNR permits required.

7. Updates. **Announcements by Commissioners**

Molzof stated that she was recently promoted to Assistant Director at Southwestern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission, and while many of her roles may change, she will remain the Administrator for the Rail Transit Commissions.

REPORTS & COMMISSION BUSINESS

8. WRRTC Financial Report – Huttenburg, Treasurer

0 Motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. Anderson/Brien. Passed Unanimously.

Huttenburg reported that there were no bills paid in September, interest income is increasing which reflects the current interest rates, and financial statements reflect WRRTC financial activity which has been minimal.

9. 2022 Audit Report – Huttenburg, Treasurer

Motion to accept the receipt of the 2022 audit report from Johnson & Block. McCumber/Morris. Passed Unanimously.

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Huttenburg reported that there is nothing out of the ordinary in the annual audit and that the auditors do not value our physical assets.
10. Wisconsin & Southern Railroad's Report on Operations – Lucht, WSOR

Lucht reported that WSOR is nearing the end of their 2023 work schedule, have spent approximately \$2 million on track and structure materials, replaced approximately 9,000 ties system wide, installed 5 miles of continuous welded rail, and reconstructed 14 at-grade crossings. The recent derailment in Janesville was the result of a mechanical issues where the wheels were not fastened to the car the way that they should be and it had nothing to do with the track. The WSOR locomotive shop shell is up and they are planning to lay the track inside yet this year.

11. WisDOT Report – Stern - WisDOT.

Stern reported that the Merrimac Bridge project is wrapping up for the year, there is good movement on the Janesville Bridges, a meeting is being set up regarding the Baraboo Bridge and WisDOT and WSOR will be ordering removal of the sanitary sewer. Mohlke reported that he will be taking over the Janesville Bridge project and is looking forward to fulfilling his role.

12. WRRTC Committee(s) - Sweeney, Chair

• Motion to form a 5-member advisory committee appointed by commission chair for discussions regarding the Walking Iron Trail. Larson/Huttenburg. Passed Unanimously.

13. Walking Iron Trail, Dane County Portion. Stern – WisDOT.

Stern stated that amendments to the operating agreement will need to be done, WSOR has released up to milepost 4.72, and Dane County is ready to take over for the extension of the trail. WWRTC owns the infrastructure (rail, etc.); therefore, we will need an agreement to release ownership and decide how to dispose of it (sell it, donate, etc.). Krueger reported that the Sauk County bridge will be delayed until 2025 due to new comments received from Bureau of Structures and federal grant requirements. Krueger stated that this will allow Dane County time to get their trail extended and be ready for the bridge.

14. Walking Iron Trail, Dane County Portion. Stern – WisDOT.

- Motion to allow attendance by commissioners virtually on an as-needed basis. Schaefer/Huttenburg.
- Motion amended to require a 48-hour advance notice to administrator for those who need to attend virtually. Krueger/Larson. Passed unanimously.
- Amended motion: Allow attendance by commissioners virtually on an as-needed basis to those commissioners who request an option from the administrator a minimum of 48-hours in advance of the meeting. Passed unanimously.

Larson stated that commissioners are encouraged to minimize these requests; however, the commission should be accommodating in situations where virtual attendance is necessary.
