2024 Community Based Safety Belt Observation Study – Strata 3

(Marathon, Kenosha, Walworth, Fond du Lac, Eau Claire, Jefferson, Columbia, Chippewa, La Crosse, Dodge, Sheboygan, Sauk)

Study Design: This observational study is designed as a pre-CIOT and post-CIOT survey period with the CIOT campaign being the intervention part of the study. The intervention portion will be championed by the local Traffic Safety Commission and community partners.

All seat belt use observations will be conducted during weekdays and weekends between 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. The schedule will include rush hour (before 9:30 a.m. and after 3:30 p.m.) and non-rush hour observations. Data collection will be conducted for 60 minutes by one observer at each site utilizing iPads to document observations. Site data will be emailed to BOTS and Dr. Buchman each day.

Start times will be staggered to ensure that a representative number of weekday/weekend/rush hour/non-rush hour sites are included each day. All passenger vehicles, including commercial vehicles weighing less than 10,000 pounds, are eligible for observation.

Observers: Three (3) Milwaukee based observers from the annual CIOT campaign will be asked to participate with each being assigned to 25 sites and an expectation that at least four (4) sites are observed on a day selected by the observer for observations.

Tentative 2024 Observation Dates:

Pre-CIOT – (Mon-Sat) May 6 – 18, 2024 *Annual CIOT* – (Mon-Sat) June 3-15, 2024. *Post-CIOT* – (Mon-Sat) October 7-19, 2024.

2024 Jefferson County Seatbelt Survey - Site Selection

Important Acronyms that will be discussed in this document include:

AADT = Annual Average Daily Traffic, the total volume of vehicle traffic on a roadway for a year divided by 365 days. Serves as a measurement for how busy a road is.

KABCO = Injury severity scale used by Wisconsin and most other states for defining the severity of crashes, referring to the most severe injury sustained by somebody involved in the crash.

- K = Fatal Injury
- A = Suspected Serious Injury
- B = Suspected Minor Injury
- C = Possible Injury
- O = No Apparent Injury

Priority in selecting sites:

- AADT: Higher traffic volumes to present opportunities for more motorists to record, but with a goal of including sites that have lower AADT volumes as well (mainly on local streets/county highway) for site diversity.
- Geographical diversity: Providing a distribution of sites that includes local streets, county highway, state highway, US highway, and interstate (if applicable for the site area) as well as spacing of sites throughout the analysis area.
- History of Unbelted Motorist crashes: Use areas that have a higher proportion of unbelted motorist crashes. Second, use areas that have more frequent crashes that are more likely than usual to not involve seatbelt use. These include teen driver crashes, as well as general injury crashes (injury levels KABC).




