Counties in the northern part of the state are starting to change their county support staff to associate 4-H. They have found out that sharing a 4-H Associate Position between counties has good parts and challenges. Wen stated, knowing this information she would suggest going forward with a full-time 4-H Associate Position. This position could also do administrative tasks. Discussion was had. Steve Chmielewski, Community Development Educator, provided an oral report for the committee.

- The Entrepreneurial Venture Program in Jefferson is currently engaging small business operators on where there are gaps and other items that need to be addressed and how they can support operations that are happening now and upcoming operations.
- Started working with the Village of Palmyra on filling the gap of what the Chamber of Commerce did in the Village as they have dissolved.
- The Whitewater Childcare Study surveys have closed and data is being analyzed right now. This will help the group decide on how they want to move forward with developing a new childcare center in Whitewater.
- Julie and Steve have started working again on the office needs assessment. Currently, they are meeting the Jefferson School District and food pantry.

- The Economic Impact Study with The Wisconsin River Trail Transit Committee will be deploying soon.
- A Plan Commission Workshop is happening next Monday, October 20 in Waukesha. Currently there are 85 participants signed up.
- Working with a regional team to do a regional housing summit in the area in the spring.

- World Dairy Expo went well. Hosted the Spanish sessions.
- The El Break Info Lechero webinar series is going very well 500 people are registered.

- Working with the USDA on the Prohand Project which is going to start next year. This project will work
 on taking data from farms on animal and human welfare.
- Helping with a pilot training this Friday on safety in collaboration with farm management. This will be a train the trainers program to allow farm managers to then train their employees.

- 4-H enrollment period is happening and going well. People can pay online now.
- 4-H Online has updated its training programs for volunteers and it has been very effective.

- Attended the Care and Share Fair this past weekend to talk with people about 4-H.

- Continuing to attend the Watertown Farmers Market on Tuesdays to glean food. As of now 3,726 pounds of produce have been gleaned. These foods will be distributed at The Bread Basket Food Pantry. The last Tuesday of this month will be the final day of the gleaning program.
- Referred to the article in the packet on the gleaning program and the impact it has had on the community.

- Shared a few pictures of johnson grass weed plants that they have been researching over the past month. He shared some characteristics of the weed. The team will be creating articles and publications on this weed.
