Minutes of the Jefferson County Solid Waste/Air Quality Committee Friday, March 15, 2013 at 8:00 A.M. Jefferson County Courthouse – Room 203 320 S. Main Street, Jefferson, WI 53549

1. Call To Order

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Reese at 8:00.

2. Roll Call (Establish a Quorum)

Committee members present were Reese, David and Torres. Also present were John Molinaro, County Board Chair; Mark Heal of Veolia; and Don Smith of Deer Track Park Landfill. Zoning staff in attendance were Rob Klotz and Deb Magritz.

3. Certification of Compliance with the Open Meetings Law

Klotz verified that the meeting was being held in compliance with open meetings law requirements.

4. Public Comment

There was no public comment.

5. Review the Agenda

No changes were proposed to the agenda.

6. Approval of Minutes – February 15, 2013

Motion by David, seconded by Torres to approve the minutes as presented. Motion carried on a voice vote with no objection.

Communications – Discussion with Possible Action

Molinaro questioned the appropriateness of "possible action" without a particular communication being specified. Discussion.

David remarked that Sharon Ehrhardt had sent out an article regarding incineration of landfill waste which he found particularily interesting. Smith asked to be sent a copy of that article.

7. Discuss with Possible Action-Update from Waste Management-Deer Track Park Landfill – Don Smith

Smith reported that funds coming to the County from Deer Track Park may be less than usual. Material coming into the landfill is down by 25% year-to-date, and may be down around 20% by year end due to the end of a waste swap with Veolia, and because another large customer is not getting in their expected amound of scrap material. Klotz asked Molinaro about the need to adjust the Zoning budget, but Molinaro suggested waiting a bit to do so.

a. Notification of Acceptance of Out-of-State Waste – Deer Track Park Landfill

Smith reminded those present of the host agreement which runs parallel to their permits and does not allow acceptance of out-of-state waste. He reported that inadvertently, in February two loads were taken from Illinois. He explained how it happened and what he has done to help prevent a reoccurence. Smith also noted that significant volume reductions mean smaller host fees but longer landfill life, and that densification is up by 15% in recent years. David asked about recycling leachate and Smith explained. Discussion ensued about asbestos, and the fact that Deer Track Park does take it at a higher price.

- 8. **Discuss with Possible Action-Update from Watertown Street Department Rick Schultz** Schultz was not present with an update.
- 9. Discuss with Possible Action-Update on Clean Sweep Information
 - a. Clean Sweep Jefferson County Fair Park, Saturday April 13, 2013

 Committee members were asked to let Ehrhardt know if they can help at the event. Surveys are being taken as participants make appointments to help streamline things at the event.
 - b. Updated Information about DATCP Rules Changes for Clean Sweep, Thursday, April 18, 2013

It was suggested that there may be a Webinar or something similar on April 18 regarding this matter. Ehrhardt will get more information out to the Committee, possibly at Clean Sweep on April 13.

c. Donations Update

Molinaro stated that there will be some changes to the process of accepting donations. Heal remarked that Jefferson County is more successful than many counties throughout the state in collecting donations.

Reese stated that these collections have been very successful. Universal Recycling Technologies (URT) has agreed to drop trailers for temporary collections.

f. Drug Collections Update

The drug collections have been successful. The increased number of sites available has spread the volume collected across all sites.

10. Updated Information for the 2013 Wisconsin Integrated Resource Management Conference (WIRMC)

Reese reported that he received many compliments about the Jefferson County program at the conference. Both Reese and David said that it was a good conference.

11. Discuss with Possible Action-Disaster Debris Management Updates

Klotz and Ehrhardt went to the Towns' Association meeting in February, but due to inclement weather, few Towns were represented. They have been invited back to April's meeting.

12. Discuss Chemical Training - March 8th with John Kannard

Heal explained that it was a six hour long hazardous awareness training, and that ten are offered this year throughout the spring. It is likely that there will be another session in Madison yet this spring.

- 13. **Updated Information on Sharon speaking at the Heart of the City and Fort Atkinson's Lions Club**In addition to Ehrhardt speaking, Lake Mils and Cambridge will be putting the video on local cable. David offered a suggestion for getting it out nationwide.

Resolution in Support of the Responsible Electronics Recycling Act (HR2791) By Wisconsin Council on Recycling Presented: August 7, 2013

WHEREAS the <u>US International Trade Commission</u> reported that 757,721 tons of used electronic products ("UEP") were exported by the US in 2012;

WHEREAS Wisconsin recognized the need to actively and responsibly recycle electronic waste (e-waste) by passing 2009 Wisconsin Act 50ⁱⁱ, now known as "E-Cycle Wisconsin";

WHEREAS a major goal of this statewide legislation is to divert as much e-waste from land disposal to responsible recovery and recycling;

WHEREAS investigative reports by <u>60 Minutes</u>ⁱⁱⁱ, <u>Frontline</u>^{iv}, <u>Business Week</u>^v, <u>National Geographic</u>^{vi} and other respected news organizations traced e-waste claimed to be responsibly recycled in the US to China and Africa where primitive processing technologies and methods were employed to recover metals from electronics while hazardous materials were burned off or disposed in open dumps - this practice offshores recycling jobs, poisons communities in developing countries, and threatens national security;

WHEREAS the US International Trade Commission stated in their February, 2013 report titled <u>Used Electronic Products: An Examination of US Exports</u>, vii "However, [if the Responsible Electronics Recycling Act were enacted into law] the product mix [of export] would likely change to reflect more tested and refurbished products and fewer end-of-life products [exported]. Conversely, exports of commodity-grade material would likely increase, as more recycling activity would take place in the United States and UEP-derived commodities would be exported to manufacturing centers in non-OECD countries." (p. 6-8).

WHEREAS the E-Cycle Wisconsin program does not have the jurisdiction to restrict the export of hazardous waste (including untested, non-working hazardous electronics) to other countries;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Wisconsin Council on Recycling urges the US Congress and President to pass the <u>"Responsible Electronics Recycling Act" (HR2791)</u>viii which restricts the export of untested, non-working, hazardous electronics to non-OECD countries. Furthermore, we believe this legislation will create jobs in Wisconsin and the rest of the United States, mitigate security and counterfeiting risks from the unfettered export of unprocessed electronics, and protect the environment from uncontrolled dumping of hazardous e-waste in developing countries.

The foregoing resolution was passed the Wisconsin Council on Recycling (a citizens group appointed by the Governor to advise the Governor, Legislature and state agencies on solid waste reduction, recovery and recycling policy) this 7^{th} day of August, 2013.

Dear Ms. Latsch and Mr. Jensen:

In accordance the Second Waste Facility Siting Agreement (Agreement) dated November 11, 1993 between Deer Track Park Landfill, Inc., the Town of Farmington and Jefferson County, we have enclosed a \$75,000 performance bond for the Town of Farmington and a \$25,000 performance bond for Jefferson County. Under Section 23, Financial Security of the Agreement, Deer Track Park Landfill, Inc. is required to provide these instruments to you to "...secure prompt and full compliance of each of the terms, conditions and financial obligations of the Agreement and provide prompt payment for any damages, costs and expenses which might be recoverable by the County or the Town from Deer Track." These bonds have a term of one year and will be annually renewed in accordance with the Agreement, with the anticipated release to occur on or about the tenth anniversary of the final closure of the Deer Track Park Landfill.

Subject: Authorization to Accept Out-of-State Shredder Fluff from Clayton County Recycling

Dear Don:

After reviewing the Deer Track Park Landfill November 11, 1993 Siting Agreement (Agreement) and its amendments, with particular consideration of Section 7 of the Agreement relating to out of state waste, we hereby authorize the acceptance at Deer Track Park Landfill of auto shredder fluff generated by Clayton County Recycling outside of the State of Wisconsin, for use as daily cover. This authorization in part, is based on the following considerations:

- This material will be utilized as alternative daily cover at the landfill. The use of this
 material in this manner is viewed by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources
 (Department) as a "beneficial use". As a matter of public policy, the Department desires
 to encourage the beneficial use of certain materials. As such, it exempts materials
 beneficially used from the \$13.00/ton state tipping fee.
- With increased diversity of suppliers of alternative daily cover, there is a decreased need for clean soil to be used in the daily landfill operations. Decreasing the need for clean soil use within the landfill, soils that have been historically mined from the Deer Track Park properties, is viewed as desirable in that it reduces acreage that needs to be disturbed merely for daily cover soils.
- Utilization of higher permeability alternative daily cover materials like shredder fluff, as compared to lower permeability virgin glacial till soils, allows for improved leachate and landfill gas collection efficiencies. These improved efficiencies in turn, reduce the potential for leachate or gas collection problems during the operating and the postclosure life of the landfill.

- This fluff, at least in part, is a by-product of processing scrap metals recovered in the State of Wisconsin. Further, the delivery of this fluff to the Deer Track Park Landfill was originally conceived as a "back haul" for empty Clayton County Recycling trucks collecting scrap metals from the State of Wisconsin. This back haul effectively facilitates the collection and recycling of scrap metals from Wisconsin.
- The use of shredder fluff in lieu of clean soil results in less permitted airspace being consumed by daily cover. This results in more airspace being available for waste disposal over the life of the landfill, which in turn results in additional host fees paid to the local communities.

In conclusion, we believe that the acceptance and beneficial use of the Clayton County Recycling shedder fluff, is good public policy, good for the environment, and will ultimately result is increased host fees to the Town of Farmington and Jefferson County. As such, we authorize the acceptance of this material that is generated outside the State of Wisconsin at the Deer Track Park Landfill.

Aware that Waste Management intends on entering into a three-year, renewable contract with Clayton County Recycling, the town and county retain as an option, the opportunity to review how the Clayton County fluff is being managed at the landfill to assure that it is being beneficially reused as described above and in accordance with Department regulations. This review shall be conducted in a timely manner, before the first three-year renewal, so that resulting recommendations may be implemented at the time of the renewal, if appropriate.
