ORDINANCE NO. 2005-29

THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF JEFFERSON COUNTY DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, Jefferson County is a self-organized county, authorized by law to establish salary and compensation for county board supervisors, and

WHEREAS, in addition to meeting fees, Ordinance No. 2001-20 establishes a salary of \$550 per month for the position of county board chair, together with county payment of required Wisconsin Retirement Fund contribution of the employer and the employee, and the employer's share of the State Life Insurance Plan policy, and

WHEREAS, the Finance and Human Resources Committees have reviewed the compensation for the position of county board chair and recommend in addition to those items approved in Ordinance No. 2001-20, the county board chair shall also be eligible for health and dental insurance upon payment of the contribution required for eligible non-union employees and other elected officials.

Section 1. The county board chair shall be eligible for health and dental insurance upon payment of the contribution required for eligible non-union employees and elected officials.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect April 18, 2006.

Fiscal Note: The County's contribution for family health insurance coverage is \$996 per month. The employee contribution is \$41.62 per month. For family dental coverage the county contribution is \$60 per month. In 2006, eight months of family health and dental insurance will cost \$8,448. In 2007, a full year at current rates would be \$12,672. Such funds will be utilized from the county board budget account.

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14	Wisconsin State Statute Section 710 has regulated the amount of land that non-resident aliens can own in the State of Wisconsin for 126 years. The 1887 law limits non-resident aliens from owning more than 640 acres in the state. Governor Walker's budget proposal would remove Wisconsin Statute Section 710.02 in its entirety. This change would allow non-resident aliens and foreign corporations to purchase and hold unlimited amounts of land within the state. Foreign corporations would continue to be bound by the provisions of Section 182.001 which limits their ability to own productive farmland. Forests, land, and water are Wisconsin's most valuable assets. Allowing unrestricted ownership of our land, forests, and water by non-resident aliens and corporations would erode our independence and rights granted under the United States and Wisconsin Constitutions. Adding more foreign competition for land ownership in the state and, in particular, tax-preferred agricultural land, even when the land is not used for farming, would drive up land prices and edge some resident landowners out of the market.

2013 BILL

AN ACT to renumber and amend 301.03 (3); to amend 301.068 (5); and to create 301.03 (3) (a), (b) and (c), 304.06 (3g), 971.375 and 973.10 (2s) of the statutes; relating to: development of a system of short-term sanctions for individuals who violate conditions of extended supervision, parole, probation, or a deferred prosecution agreement and granting rule-making authority.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, if an individual who is on probation, extended supervision, or parole (release) violates a condition of that release, the person is subject to sanctions including incarceration. This bill requires the Department of Corrections (DOC) to develop a system of short-term sanctions for violations of conditions of release and permits the sanctions to be imposed on the individual. This bill also allows a district attorney to use the short-term sanctions system for violations of a deferred prosecution agreement. The short-term sanctions system must provide a list of sanctions for the most common violations. In developing the system DOC must account for the objective to be accomplished by imposing the sanction and consider the level of intensity necessary to achieve the objective; protect the public, correct the offender's behavior, and hold the offender accountable; determine when revocation is the required response; provide flexibility in imposing sanctions but also provide offenders with clear and immediate consequences for violations; provide examples of high, medium, and low level sanctions and what factors to consider when determining which level of sanction to apply; determine how to reward compliance;

(a) does all of the following: 1. Takes into account the objective to be accomplished by imposing the sanction, considers the level of intensity necessary to achieve the objective, and considers the extent to which sanction imposition is likely to accomplish the objective. 2. Takes into account the goals of protecting the public, correcting the offender's behavior, and holding the offender accountable. 3. Determines when revocation is the required response to the violation. 4. Provides flexibility in imposing sanctions but also provides offenders with clear and immediate consequences for violations. 5. Provides examples of high, medium, and low level sanctions and what factors to consider when determining which level of sanction to apply. 6. Determines how to reward offenders for compliance with conditions of parole, of probation, of extended supervision, or of the agreement. 7. Ensures that efforts to minimize the impact on an offender's employment are made when applying sanctions. 8. Ensures that efforts to minimize the impact on an offender's family are made when applying the sanctions.
