1. Call to Order

Tietz called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m.

2. Roll Call

3. Certification of Compliance with the Open Meetings Law

6. Approval of the February 2, 2015 Meeting Minutes

Foelker motioned to approve the March 2, 2015 Minutes. Christensen seconded. Passed on a 5-0 vote.

8. Discussion and Possible Decision on Resolution Authorizing Stewardship Application for

Recreation Trail (Interurban) from Watertown to Oconomowoc

Nehmer discussed the Stewardship Grant Program Funds.

Motion to move the Resolution to the County Board made by Christensen, seconded by Foelker Passed 5-0. (Christensen suggested to change wording in resolution from "lesson" to "reduce" on last line of last paragraph)

9. Discussion and Possible Decision on Resolution Authorizing Stewardship Application for Watertown Outboarders Property

Nehmer discussed the Watertown Outboarders Property. We are proposing to put in a well, toilet building, picnic area and rustic remote camping at approximately \$31,000. We received a grant from the Quirk Foundation of Watertown for \$28,000.

Motion to move the Resolution to the County Board made by Kelly, seconded by Christensen, Passed 5-0.

10. Discussion and Possible Decision on Resolution Authorizing Stewardship Application for Mountain Biking/Parking/Trail Connection at Human Services/New Highway Department Nehmer suggested we roll this item over to the 2016 agenda.

Motion to table discussions on item until 2016 by Foelker, seconded by Christensen, passed 5-0.

11. Discussion and Possible Decision on the Disposition of Two Buildings at Dorothy Carnes Park East Wiesmann said two buildings at the Dorothy Carnes Park East were not repairable and unsafe and requested to put out for bids for tearing down.

Motion by Foelker to start bidding process for disposition of buildings, seconded by Payne, Passed 5-0.

12. Discussion and Possible Decision on Crawfish River Park Plan

Nehmer discussed the progress of the plan and noted a charrette group is not done with planning and won't be presenting a plan until later in the year.

Motion to table the item until further planning is completed by Kelly, seconded by Foelker, Passed 5-0.

13. Discussion and Possible Decision on Tour of Jefferson County Parks

Nehmer suggested the Committee tour the Jefferson County Parks, possibly half in the Spring and half in the Fall. The Committed was agreeable to the tours and the Parks Department will work on developing dates for the tours.

14. Discussion and Possible Decision on Garman Nature Preserve Timber Sale

Wiesmann requested the go ahead to proceed with a timber sale at Garman Nature Preserve. Motion to go ahead with Timber Sale made by Kelly, seconded by Foelker, passed 5-0.

15. Discussion and Possible Decision on Resolution Supporting the Stewardship Program for Local Units of Government (Stewardship Program: The Governor's budget establishes a moratorium on Stewardship Program land purchases by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. The local assistance component of the Stewardship Program is not frozen under the Governor's Proposal.)

Nehmer noted significant changes are being made in the State Budget regarding Stewardship Programs.

Motion to support this resolution and move to Administration and Rules by Foelker, seconded by Kelly passed 4-1, Christensen opposing.

16. Update on Milwaukee Journal Sentinel Sports Show & Canoecopia Matthews reported.

17. Update on Natural Resources Foundation Endowment funds

Nehmer reported Trees for the Future funds were allocated to buy trees for the bike trail and the Jefferson County Parks Endowment funds were allocated to the Interurban Trail Project. The committee requested a Thank You note be sent to the Molinaro's for the tree fund donation.

18. Update on Watertown Outboarders Implementation Plan

Nehmer reported the plan should be ready to present this fall.

Reserve campsites at Carnes Park

JEFFERSON — Dust off those camping supplies! Did you know that Jefferson County's Dorothy Carnes Park provides two primitive walk-in camping opportunities at the park's east entrance off Jones Lane?

The two primitive camping sites are open for walk-in camping only. The park offers visitors 513 acres on which to explore a multitude of habitats ranging from tall grass prairies to hard wood forests.

Rose Lake, located adjacent to the park, is home to one of the most diverse bird populations in Wisconsin. The park offers more than 10 miles of trails provided for recreational opportunities for users of all abilities.

Each of the two campsites contains the following amenities: One picnic table, primitive seating, fire ring with grill, food hang, vault toilet, level area for tent placement.

Camping reservations

Campsites cost \$15 a night for each site. Reservations can be made starting today until Oct. 31.

Off-season reservations are made by special permit through the parks department office. All reservations must be made at least one week (seven days) in advance of desired check-in date.

Payment (cash or check) is required at the time of reservation. Cancellations made within seven days of one's scheduled reservation will result in forfeit of one's fee.

County attempting to build a bike trail

Jefferson County is attempting to build a bike trail from Watertown to Oconomowoc on the We Energies-owned old electric rail line that once connected Milwaukee with Watertown.

When successfully completed, this project will make it possible to ride a bike on designated trails from the lakefront in Milwaukee all the way to Watertown.

Trails like this are good for the local economy, our health and the environment. Jefferson County actually has identified outdoor recreation as a major component of local economic de-

velopment activities. Simply put, people and businesses want to be near these types of projects.

The project will be phased, with the first phase costing approximately \$1.4 million. Jefferson County is attempting to raise \$420,000 in private funds to complete the project.
