1. Call to Order

Meeting called to order at 8:10 a.m. by Reese

2. Roll Call (Establish a Quorum)

Committee members in attendance at 8:10 a.m. were Payne, Reese, Kutz and Patrick. Lund was excused.

3. Certification of Compliance With the Open Meetings Law

Ehrhardt stated that the Solid Waste/Air Quality Committee complied with open meetings law requirements.

4. Review the Agenda

No changes were proposed to the agenda.

5. Reese Introduction of New Members, Staff and Guests

Reese made introductions of the new members, staff and guests in attendance.

6. Election of Officers

Nominations for Committee Chair

Payne nominated Reese for Chair of the Solid Waste/Air Quality Committee and Patrick seconded the motion. Payne made a motion to close nominations and cast a unanimous ballot for Reese as Chair of the Solid Waste/Air Quality Committee for the next two years and Patrick seconded the motion.

Motion carried 4-0.

Nominations for Committee Vice-Chair

Payne nominated Patrick for Vice Chair of the Solid Waste/Air Quality Committee and Kutz seconded the motion. Payne made a motion to closed nominations and cast a unanimous ballot for Patrick as Vice-Chair of the Solid Waste/Air Quality Committee for the next two years and Kutz seconded the motion.

Motion carried 4-0.

Nominations for Committee Secretary

Kutz nominated Payne for Secretary of the Solid Waste/Air Quality Committee and Patrick seconded the motion. Kutz made a motion to close nominations and cast a unanimous ballot for Payne as Secretary of the Solid Waste/Air Quality Committee for the next two years and Patrick seconded the motion.

Motion Carried 4-0.

7. Public Comment

No public comment.

8. Communication

Bill Pinnow said he was announcing as of June 20th the City of Jefferson Recycling site will be closed. The City discussed moving the site to the compost site, but it is open 24/7. They would also need to staff the site. The City decided they want to continue the compost as it is. They have a waste hauler that could handle the additional e-waste because John's Disposal is a registered e-waste collector. Pinnow said that they made an agreement with John's Disposal to pick up the TVs and other electronics on bulk day. They will re-elevate their program again in 2017.

9. Approval of Minutes – April 1, 2016

Motion by Payne, seconded by Patrick to approve the April 1, 2016 minutes as presented.

Motion carried 4-0

10. E-Waste Collections

a. Discussion with Possible Action on Update Actions for Sites: Waterloo, Watertown, Ixonia, Jefferson, Fort Atkinson

Jefferson: See the comments from Pinnow under communication-item 8.

Fort Atkinson: Ehrhardt said the Selle told her they would be charging \$20 per CRT glass TVs and monitors. Everything else would continue to be free. Selle said he has a one year contract with URT for their electronics recycling. Selle said he wants Ehrhardt to continue to do the reports for the DNR.

Waterloo: Ehrhardt said the Hoffman called her to tell her that Waterloo Utilities raised their utility rate \$1 to cover the cost of recycling electronics, TVs and lamps. Their site is only open to City of Waterloo residents. Hoffman told Ehrhardt to continue to do the reports to the DNR. They are continuing with URT.

Ixonia/Concord: Karaliunas said that their site is only open to Town of Ixonia and Concord residents. They will be charging for TVs, flat screen TVs and all monitors. Karaliunas said they haven't heard back from Pfeiffer, but would like to continue with URT.

Watertown: Schultz said that they have gone to a truck pickup instead of dumpster and they are also sorting all their metals. They get about \$1,500 dollars for the full container of metals. Schultz said they have \$37,000 in the budget to cover CRT glass TV and monitor disposal with transportation charges. They are monitoring their site and it will only be open to City of Watertown residents. They have already issued some citations. He also said that only City of Watertown residents call bring mattresses to his site. Ehrhardt said she would advertise this accordingly. Schultz hoped that he can continue with the \$20,000 for Clean Sweeps in his budget. Schultz said that they are also staying with URT. Ehrhardt brought to the Committee's attention that if Schultz exceeds the \$37,000 he budgeted for electronic recycling he might have to use some of the \$20,000 he has budgeted for the Clean Sweep in Watertown. So Watertown Clean Sweep could cost the Committee more in 2017.

b. Discussion with Possible Action on Information from Refrigerant Depot and Legacy Recycling on Three Scheduled Events.

Ehrhardt show the committee the Recycling Event flyer and asked that they help in getting this information out to the public. Payne said she would try to get this placed as a news release in her local newspaper. Ehrhardt said she would be placing ads in the Jefferson County Daily Union and the Watertown Daily Times. Ehrhardt said that she got very good reports on Refrigerant Depot and Legacy from people she talked to at the DNR e-waste conference.

c. Discussion with Possible Action on Information on the E-Cycle meeting in Madison June 1

Visio and other manufactures attended the meeting. They say the Wisconsin e-cycle bill is one of the best in the country. They don't see increasing the weight for credits will help the problem. They think we will slowly see a decrease in the CRT TVs in the next years.

d. *Discussion with Possible Action on Information on Senate Bill 621 introduced by Senator Miller* Ehrhardt told the committee that Senate Bill 621 will be brought before legislative committee again and everyone will be asked to call our Senators to encourage them to get it on the floor for a vote. This past year it passed the committees unanimously, but could not get on the list from Senator Fitzgerald's office for a floor vote. Senator Miller also said that if you know a staff person of a legislator talk to them and push to get it on list for a Senate vote.

11. Discussion with Possible Action-Clean Sweep Items

a. *Summary of Clean Sweep and Tire Collection April 8 & 9, 2016*

No further discussion about the summary sheet.

b. *Donations Updates*

Donation totals: **2015** \$7,606.00 and **2016** \$6,925.00

c. *Advertising for Clean Sweeps & Events*

Will be placing ads in the Jefferson Daily Union and Watertown Daily Time, Advertiser, Facebook, Website (on already), Fair Park telethon, Town websites, will also send out a news releases that might get pickup on more newspapers and Cable TV.

d. *Drug Collection Updates*

Waterloo and Palmyra now have their drug drop-off containers. Ehrhardt will update our brochure and website with the new drug drop-off sites. Kutz was concerned that Rainbow Hospice still flashes their drugs on site when a loved one dies. Payne knows someone from Rainbow and will try to address that issue with them because we do have drug drop-off containers in almost all Jefferson County police departments. Ehrhardt said maybe they are under a different set of state or federal regulations.

12. Discussion with Possible Action on Information from Gary Kutz about Tire Removal along Rock River Road

Kutz said that a resident removed a bunch of tire from the river bed. Kutz understanding was that the tires were put in the river bed to stabilize after they put in a sewerage line in the 60's. They then fill with gravel and used as a boat ramp. What can they do about the tires? Reese suggested that Kutz the DNR. Schultz gave Kutz contact information for the DNR.

13. Discussion with Possible Action-Update, Deer Track Park Landfill with Don Smith

Smith was unable to attend the meeting. Reese said nothing has changed at the landfill.

14. Discussion with Possible Action-Jefferson County Debris Management with Donna Haugom

Haugom was unable to attend the meeting. Ehrhardt will put her on the next meeting of the Solid Waste/Air Quality Committee.

15. Discussion with Possible Action on Information from AROW and Recycling Council meetings – Ehrhardt

Ehrhardt attend the AROW Product Stewardship meeting and they will be investigating PaintCare for Wisconsin and Product Stewardship for Wisconsin's paints.

At the Recycling Council meeting they said they would back AROW for paint stewardship. The Council is also in the process of putting together a priority list of projects. They will be writing a letter to the Governor, Representatives and Senators about the RU grants and the tipping fee fund explaining the reason why they

the funds should be used for Clean Sweeps, recycling, recycling reseach and explaining the recycling business in our state.

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) Clean Sweep and Drug Collections

Jefferson County shall be responsible to develop, implement and operate a continuous household, agricultural, drug and business hazardous waste program with City of Watertown Street Department, City of Fort Atkinson Public Works Department, City of Whitewater Public Works Complex, City of Jefferson, Town of Ixonia & Concord Recycling Program, Waterloo Utilities and Jefferson County Sheriff's Office.

Jefferson County shall be responsible to develop and implement VSQG (Very Small Quantity Generator) and clean sweep educational components with the cooperation of the above parties.

Jefferson County will have a collection event in spring at the Jefferson County Fair Park and the City of Watertown Street Department and the City of Whitewater Public Works Department will have a collection event in fall. The number of events will be determined by dollars available for the events in the next ensuing year 2017.

Jefferson County shall be responsible for all administrative costs and services related to the collection, storage, transportation and final disposal of household, agricultural, and business hazardous waste collected during the hours of clean sweep events.

Jefferson County shall be responsible for hiring a state contractor for the disposal of hazardous waste material collected at clean sweep events.

Jefferson County shall be responsible for writing grants to obtain additional funds for the clean sweeps events. Jefferson County shall monitor program usage to insure that all costs will be covered by the available grants, contract fees and donated dollars, less in-kind contributions. Should there be the potential for overage; the decision to continue or discontinue the program shall be made jointly by all parties.

The City of Whitewater with Walworth County has made a site available for a clean sweep event. The City of Watertown has also made a site available for clean sweep events. Each party shall be responsible for its own employee costs including worker's compensation and shall maintain its own liability insurance in such form and amount as is sufficient to address the risks arising out of the implementation of this Agreement.

The City of Whitewater (Public Works Department) has an agreement with Jefferson County to pay for Walworth County residents of Whitewater who use the services of Jefferson County Clean Sweep programs. Jefferson County has agreed to pay for any Jefferson County residents who attend the Whitewater Clean Sweep

The City of Watertown has agreed with the Village and Town of Clyman in Dodge County to include all residents in the Clean Sweep events and drug collections in the City of Watertown.

The Jefferson County Solid Waste/Air Quality Committee has an MOU with Walworth County that when Walworth County holds a Clean Sweep event in the City of Whitewater, Jefferson County residents can participate. Jefferson County will pay an amount not to exceed \$7,500 for such services, which will cover services to about 75 Jefferson County residents.

The City of Watertown, City of Lake Mills, City of Fort Atkinson, City of Whitewater, City of Jefferson, City of Waterloo, Village of Palmyra and, UW-Whitewater Police Departments and the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office have agreed to drug collections at their sites. Non-controlled and controlled drugs

will be disposed of through the State of Wisconsin Department of Justice collection events. Jefferson County Clean Sweep events will dispose of all inhalers and mercury brought in by the Police Departments and Sheriff's Office. The Jefferson County Health Department and the City of Watertown Health Department will dispose of sharps/needles/Epi-pens and syringes. The drug drop-off sites are open to all Jefferson County residents. The Clean Sweep program has agreed to pay for the disposal cost of sharps/needles/Epi-pens and syringes brought to the two Health Departments.

All volunteers will be required to sign a release form acknowledging that no worker's compensation coverage exists and no such claim may be made against Jefferson County, Jefferson County Sheriff's Office, City of Watertown, City of Fort Atkinson, City of Whitewater, City of Jefferson, Town of Ixonia and Waterloo Utilities.
