Criminal Justice Collaborating Council

January 25, 2017

1. Call to Order

Meeting was called to order by Judge Randy Koschnick at 12:00 p.m.

2. Roll Call

3. Certification of compliance with Open Meetings Law Requirements

Staff certified compliance with the open meetings law.

4. Review and approve minutes from December 7, 2016 meeting

Morris discussed some questions that he has regarding a situation he is dealing with in Dodge County.

Wehmeier said the contract was finalized in mid-December. 25 applications were received for the coordinator position. Wehmeier is working with WCS staff on the transition. No action taken.

• Incentives to increase number of participants

A number of ideas for increasing the number of participants was talked about. One idea was reducing penalties. The chart will be updated with these incentives and will be brought to the Council for review at the next meeting. No action taken.

c. <u>Update on SCRAM and Remote Breath</u>

Compliance summary reports on SCRAM and Remote Breath were provided for the Council to review. Gusse reviewed the information. No action taken.

8. Updates on coordination with Recidivism Council and other agencies

Forseth said that the Recidivism Council looked at year end data that they received. The data on this report is self-reporting so they discussed ways to improve on the data collection. They also looked at data collected by the United Way. No action taken.

9. Discussion on heroin/opiates/meth

Wallace said that there is a strong interested in their medical staff. There are a lot of variations within the physicians so they are trying to get things standardized. Wehmeier shared some 2016 data from the State of Wisconsin. From 2011-2015 meth use increased 250-300%; heroin use is on par with meth use. Lutz said that there is an educational opportunity "Stairway to Heroin" that will be presented in Jefferson in March. No action taken.




BEEN INCARCERATED WITHIN LAST 3 YEARS




REASON FOR INCARCERATION




DRUGS OR ALCOHOL RELATED




TYPE OF SUBSTANCE USED
