May 24, 2017

1. Call to Order

6. New Business

Holler said that they have not started any new initiatives. No action taken.
- Stepping Up Initiative (Captain Scott - Subcommittee)
Scott said there will be a meeting on Friday. There will be a progress report at the next meeting. No action taken.
- Pharmacy Presentation
This will be presented at the June meeting. No action taken.

- a. Update on monthly jail data
There was no data available for review. No action taken.
- b. Update on JCATC outcomes
A report was provided for the committee to review. Gusse reviewed the data. DeLaRosa proposed some incentives for consideration. More incentive options will be brought to the next meeting. No action taken.
- c. Update on SCRAM and Remote Breath
Compliance summary reports on SCRAM and Remote Breath were provided for the Council to review. Gusse reviewed the information. No action taken.
- d. CJCC / Treatment Coordinator Report
Holler said that the Treatment Court Team attended a Treatment Court Conference. The draft drug manual has been finalized. There is another training that they will be attending in June. Everything is falling into place to start the drug court. They are

waiting for the court reporting system from the DOJ and WCS is in the process of hiring a case manager. No action taken.

8. Updates on coordination with Recidivism Council and other agencies

Forseth explained that they have subdivided into teams. They are discussing new technology to the jail. This could be used as a reward in exchange for education. They are looking into some fund raising options to support this program. No action taken.

9. Discussion on heroin/opiates/meth

Lutz said that they had a Task Force meeting last week. They have seen a decline in opiates but a rise in cocaine, marijuana and meth. There are two more educational sessions similar to Highway to Heroin coming up in the near future. No action taken.

They will be reviewing the drug and alcohol manuals to make sure they are both up to current standards. No action taken.

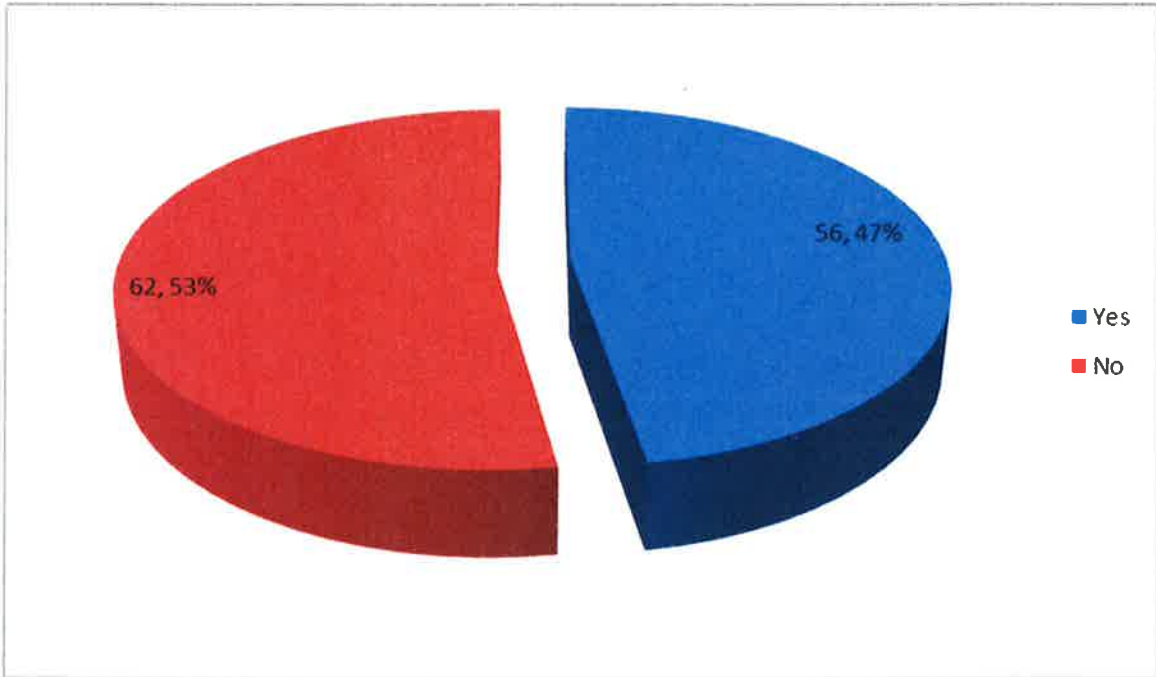

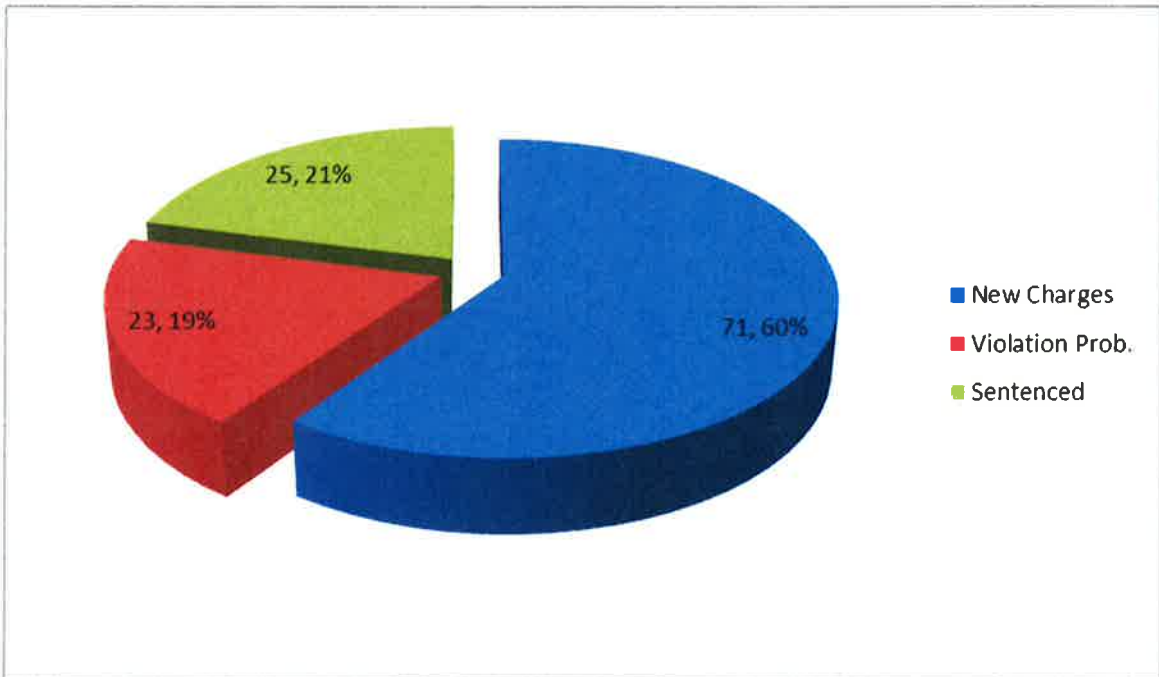

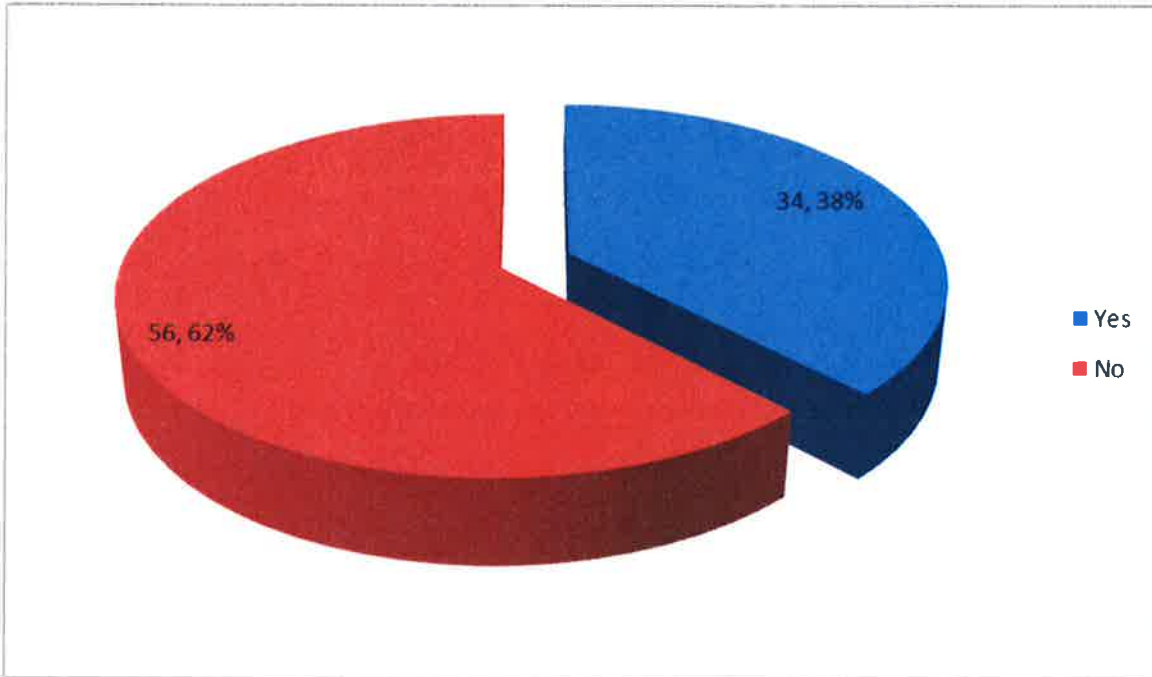


BEEN INCARCERATED WITHIN LAST 3 YEARS

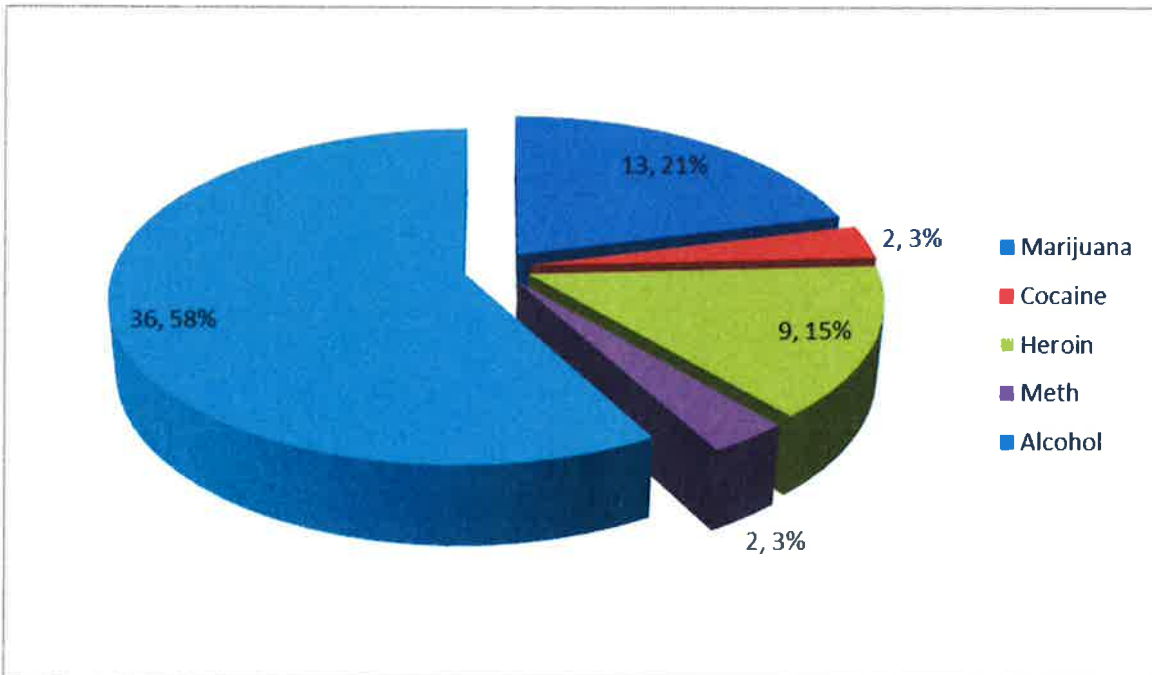


REASON FOR INCARCERATION

RE- INCARCERATION May 2017

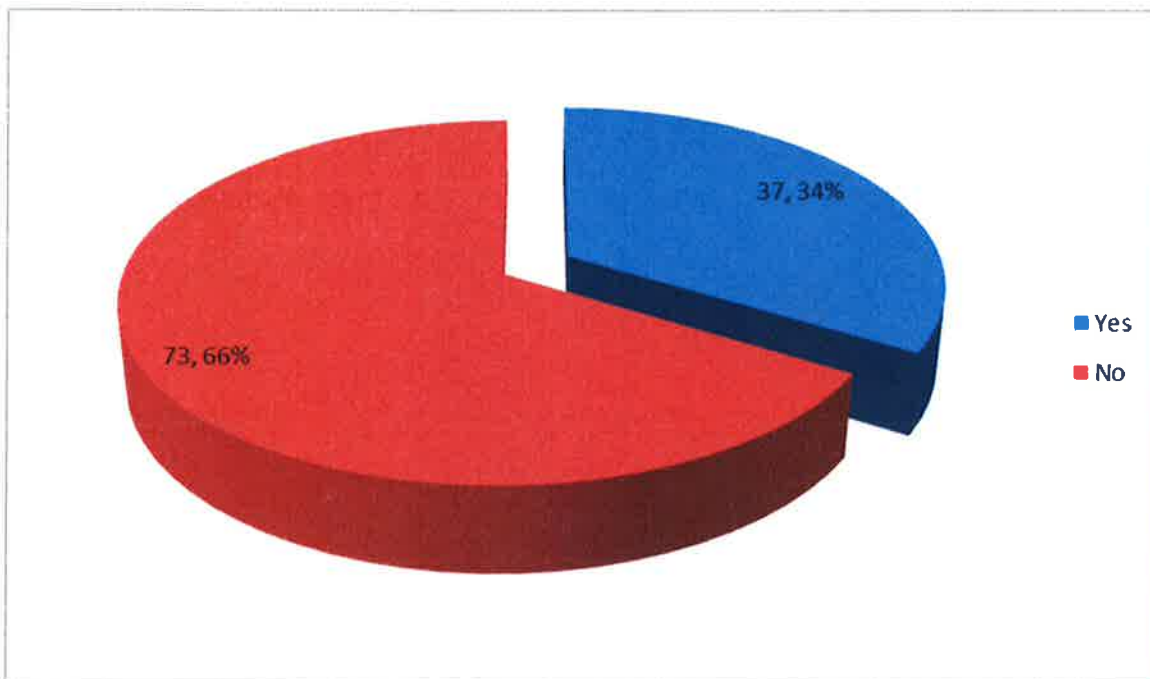


DRUGS OR ALCOHOL RELATED

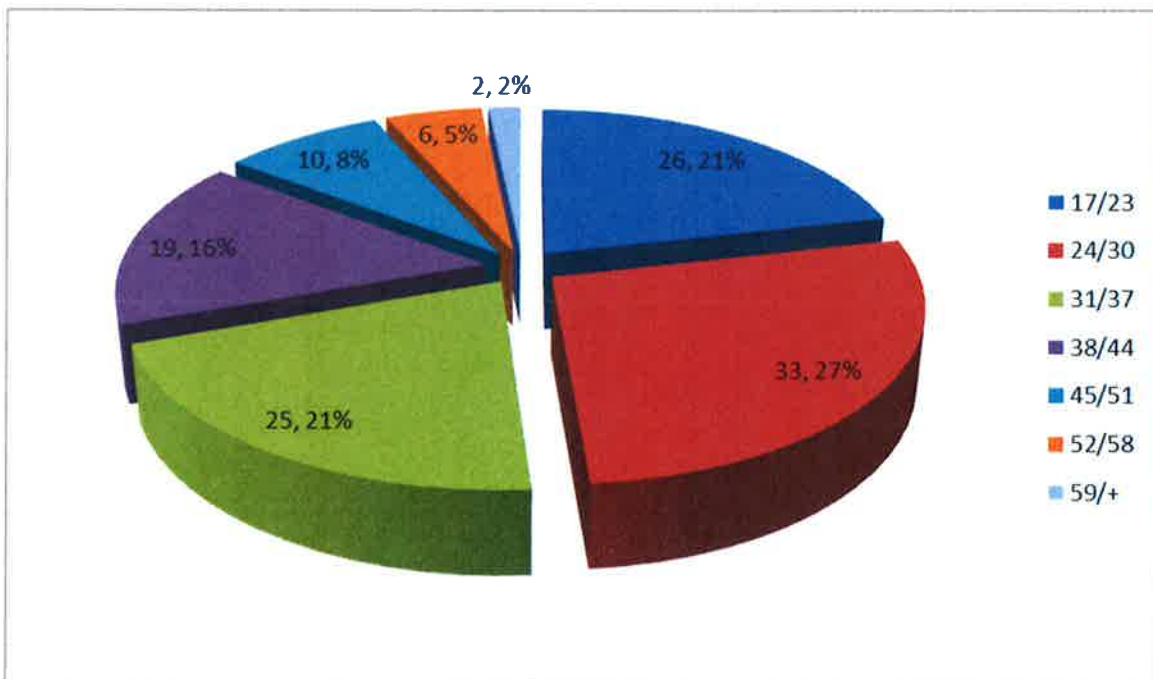


TYPE OF SUBSTANCE USED

RE- INCARCERATION May 2017

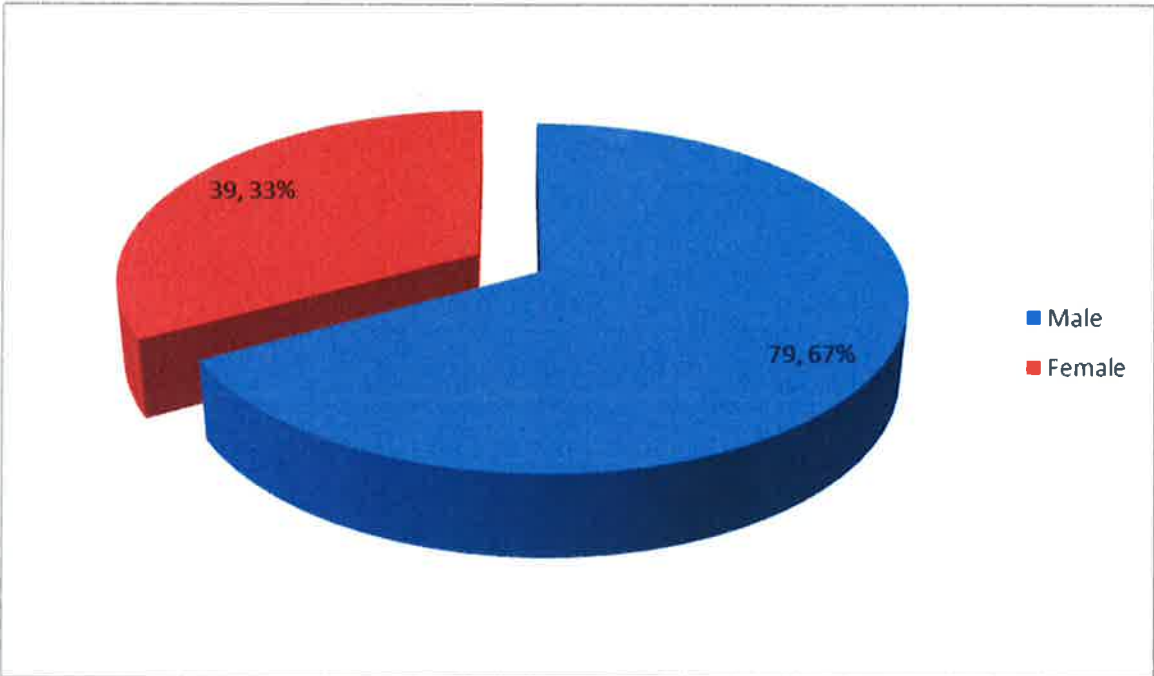


UNDER INFLUENCE AT BOOKING

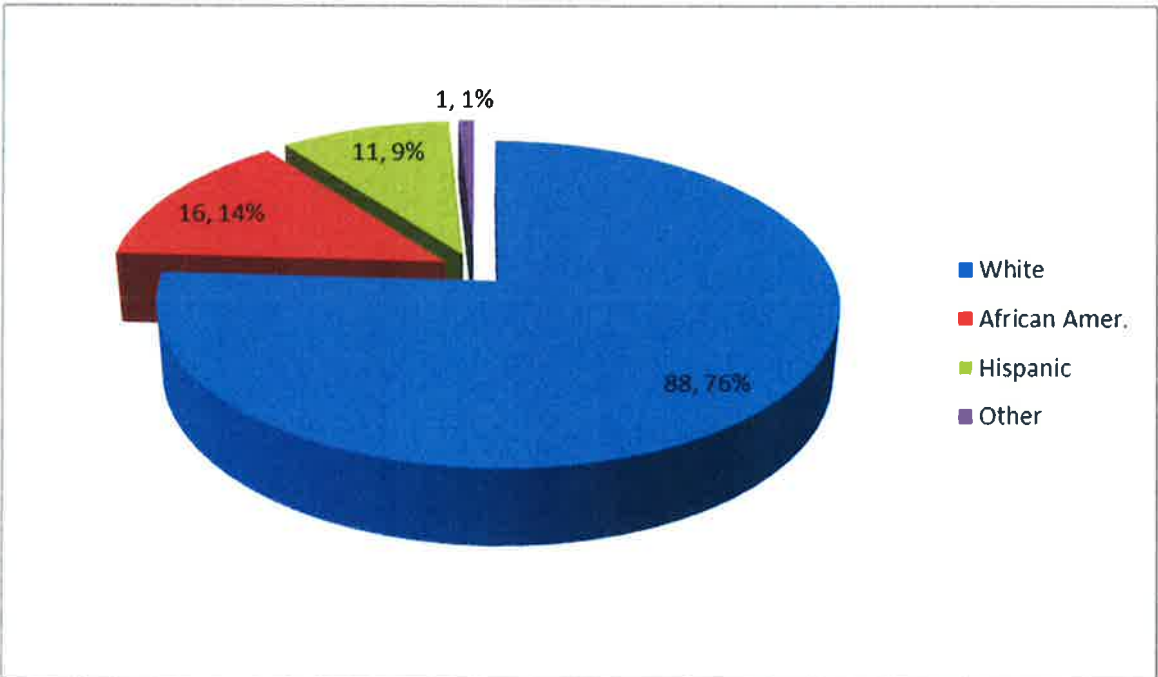


AGE PROFILE

RE- INCARCERATION May 2017

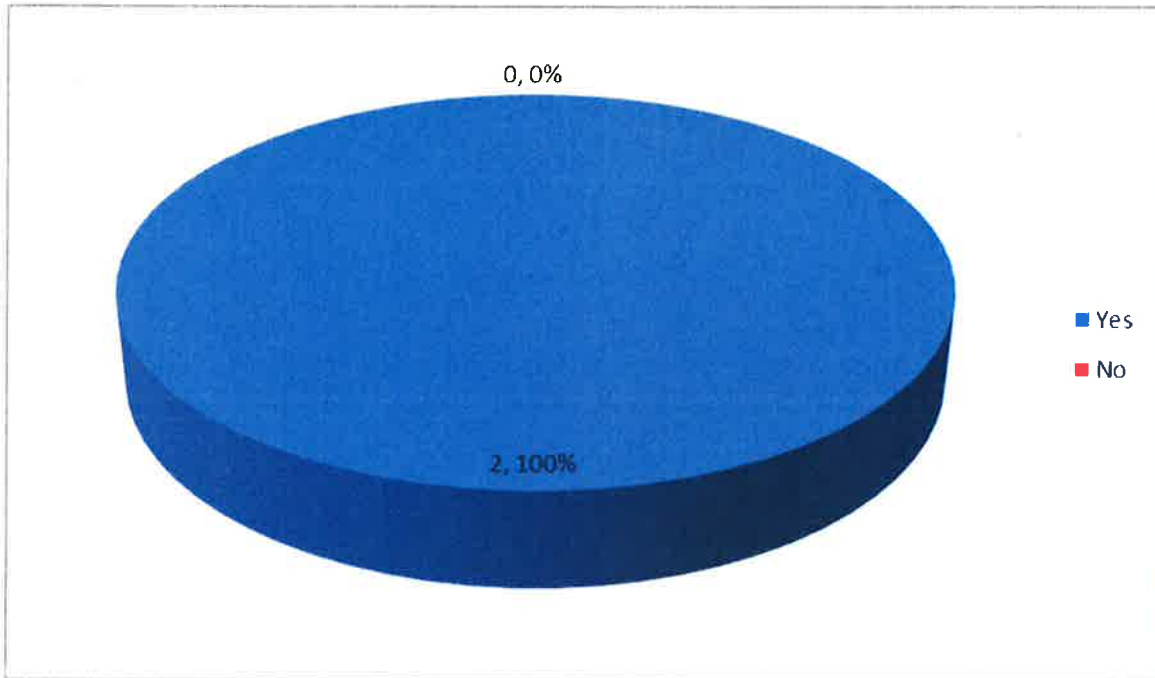


GENDER PROFILE

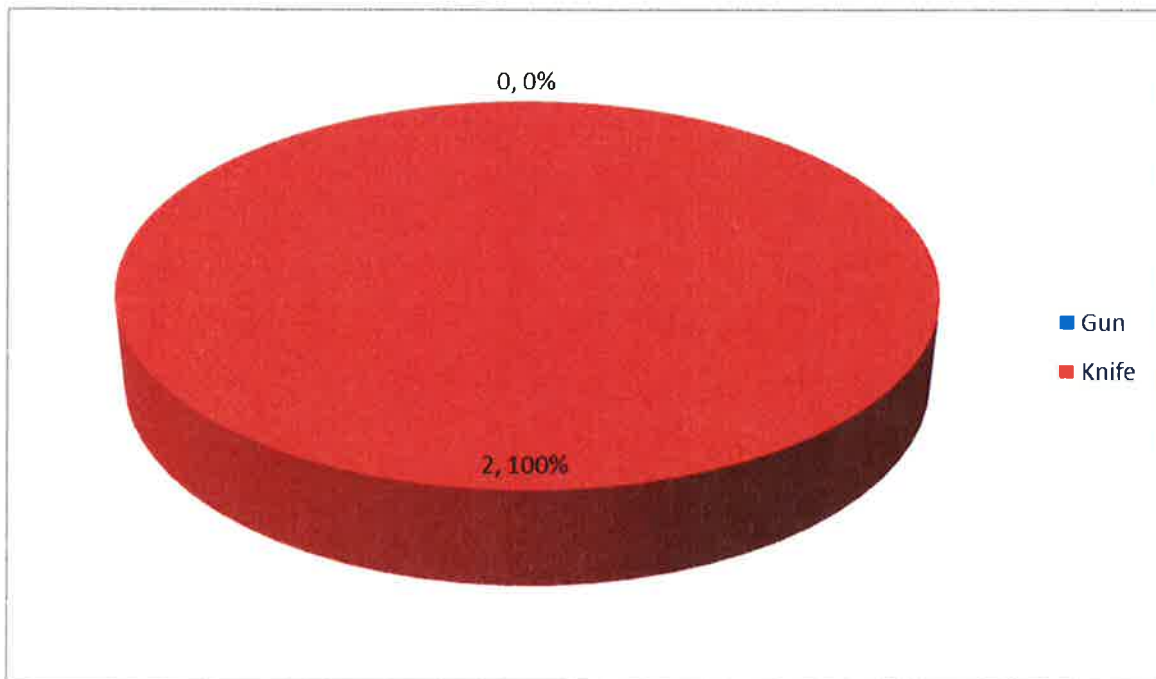


ETHNIC PROFILE

RE- INCARCERATION May 2017

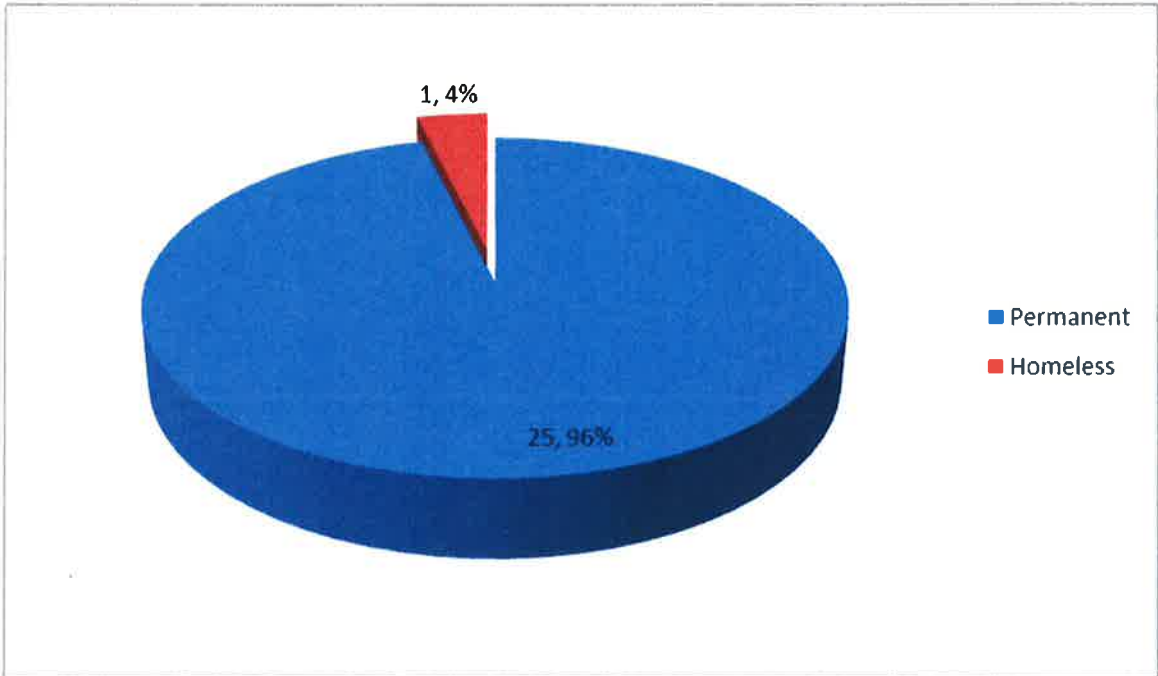


WEAPONS USED

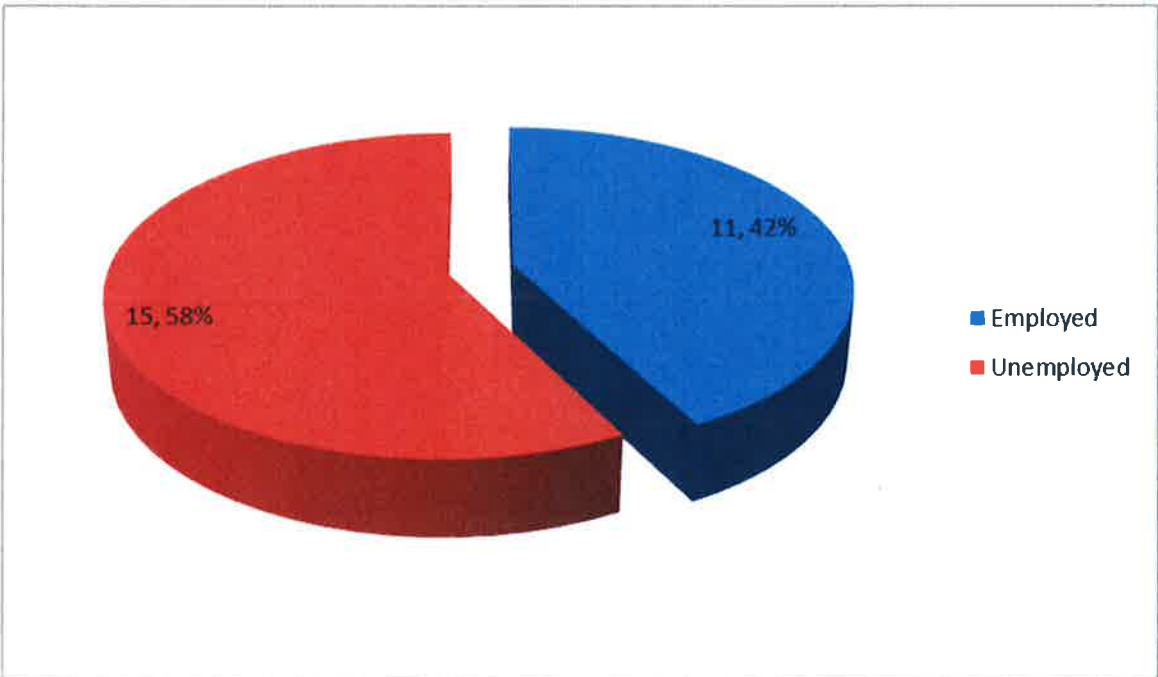


TYPE OF WEAPON

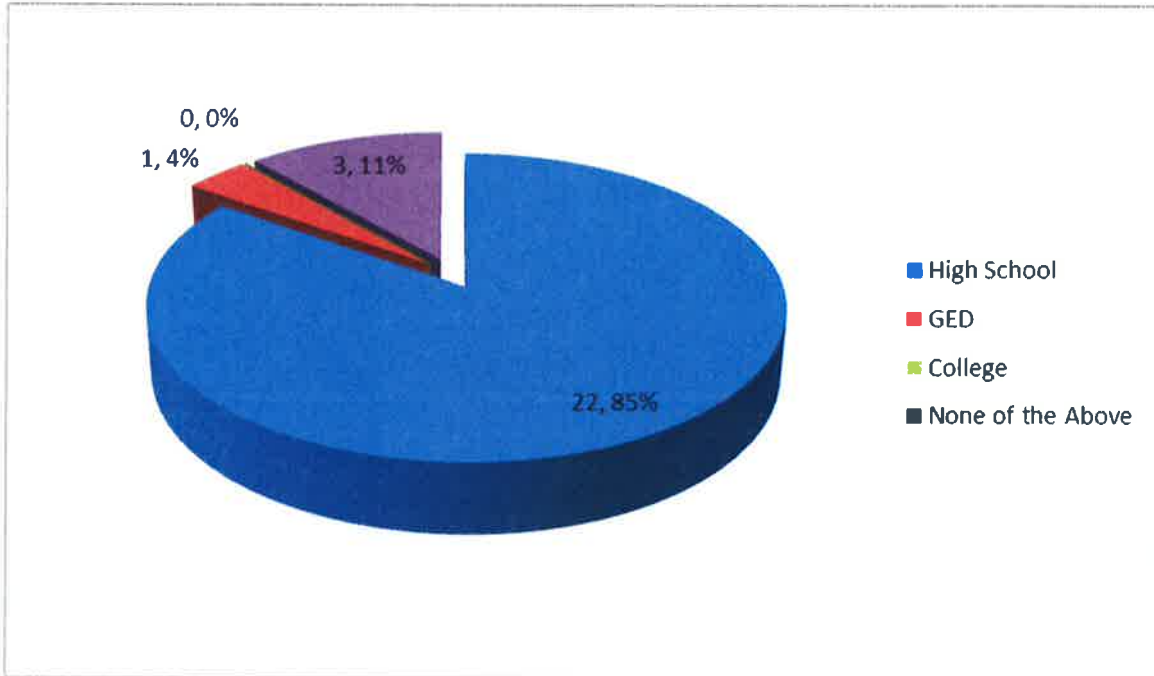

EMPLOYMENT STATUS

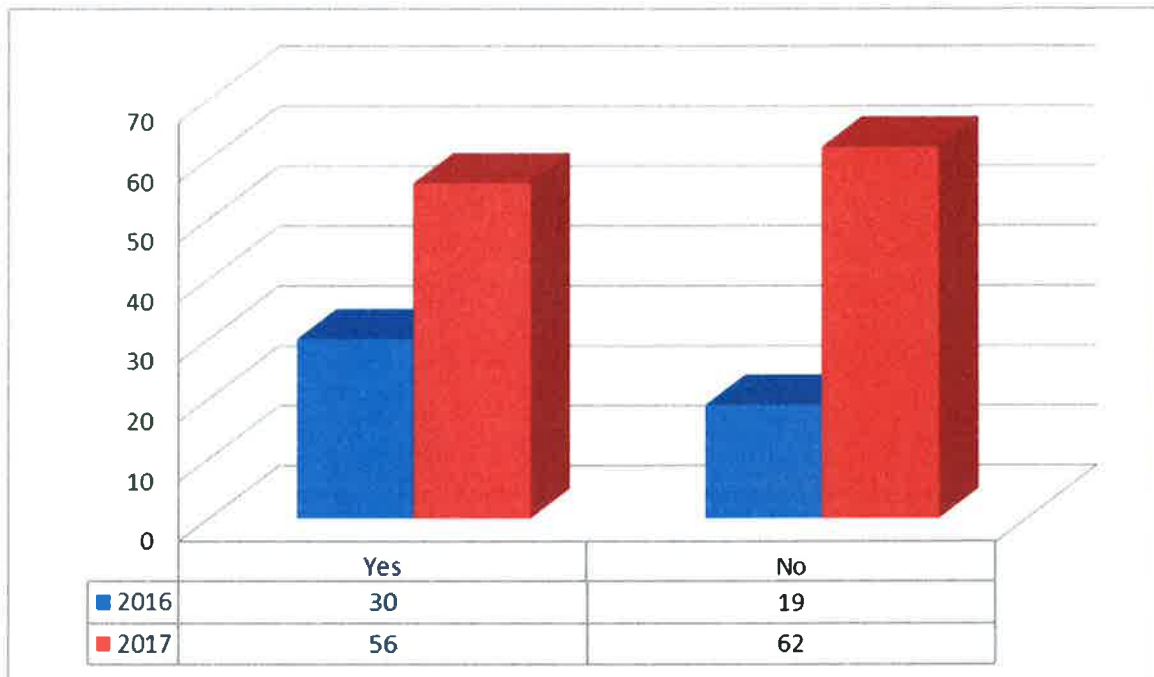

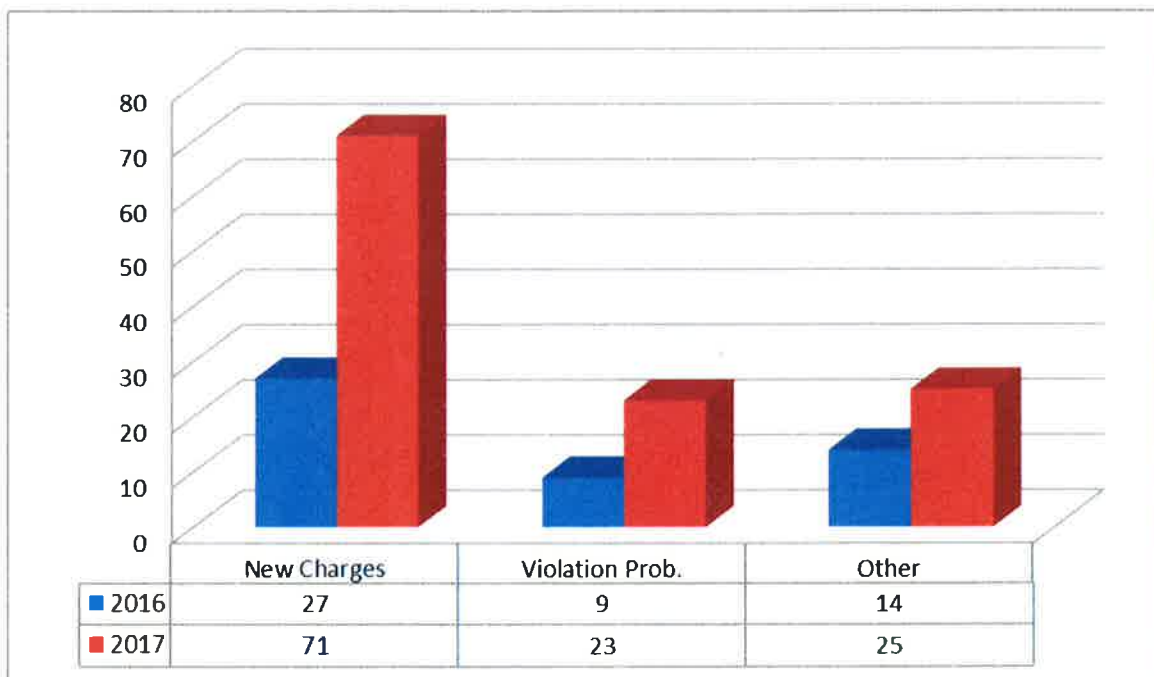
EDUCATION LEVEL

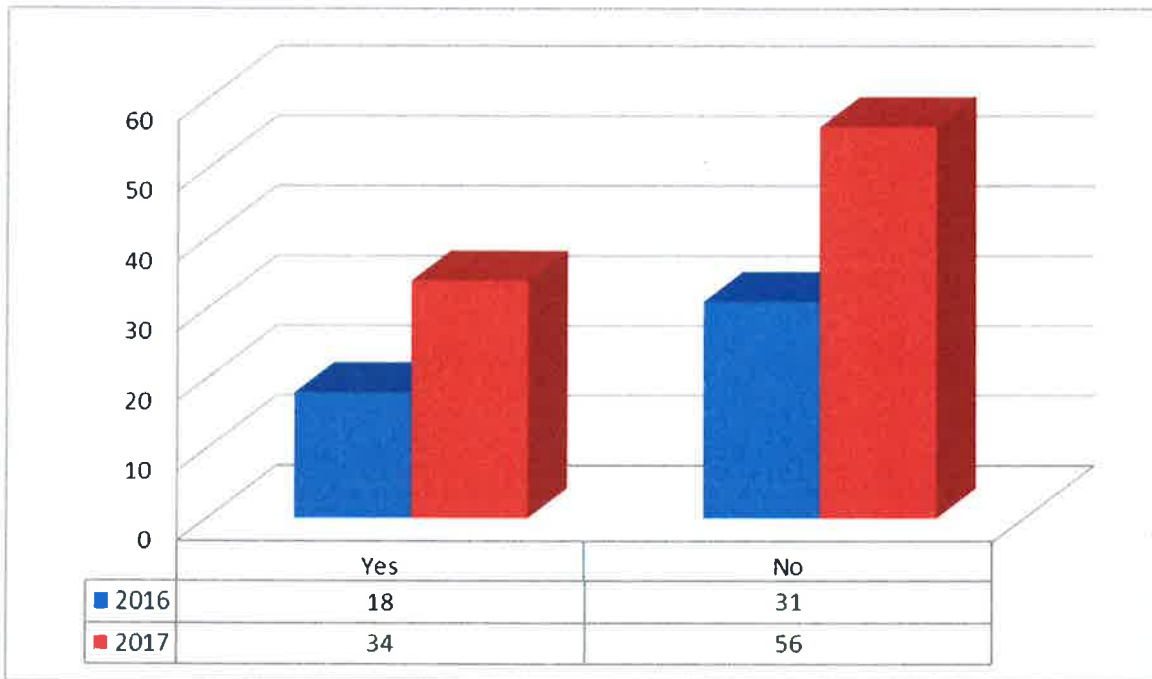
INCARCERATED WITHIN LAST 3 YEARS



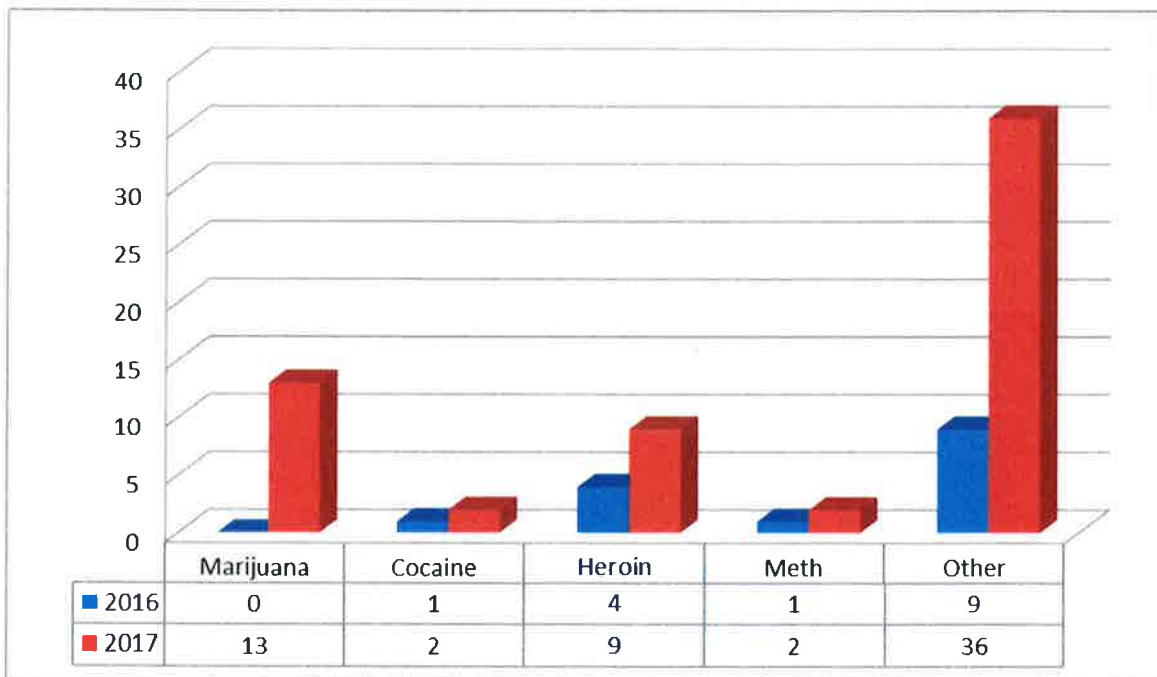
REASON FOR RETURN

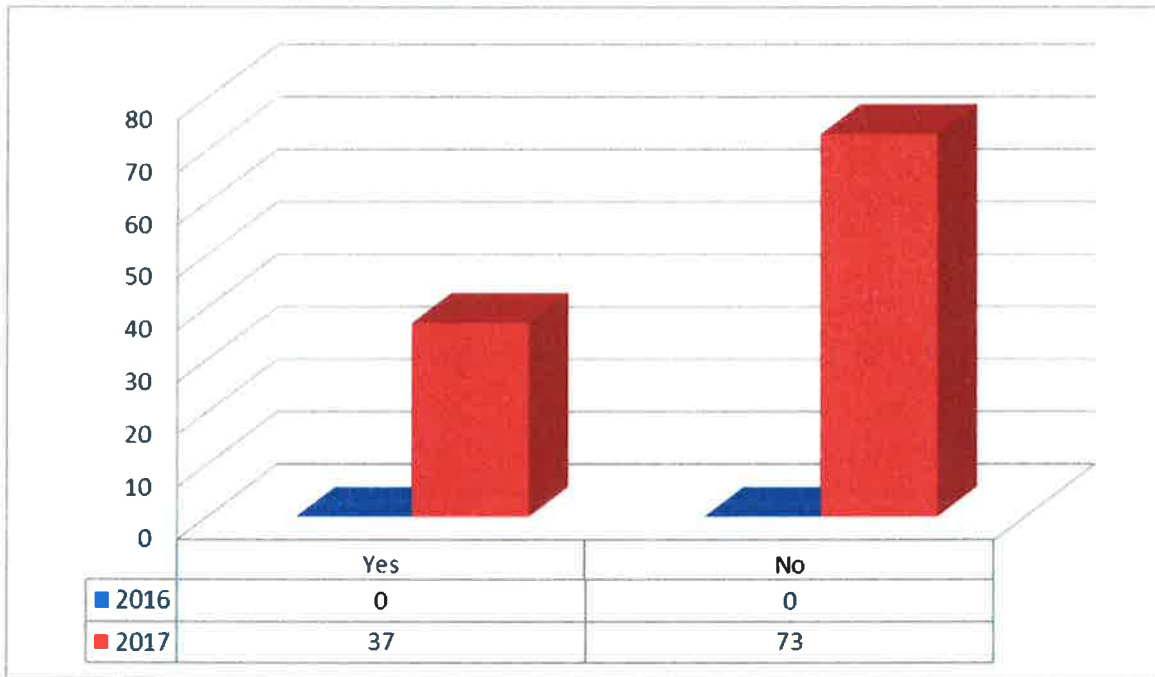
DRUGS USED



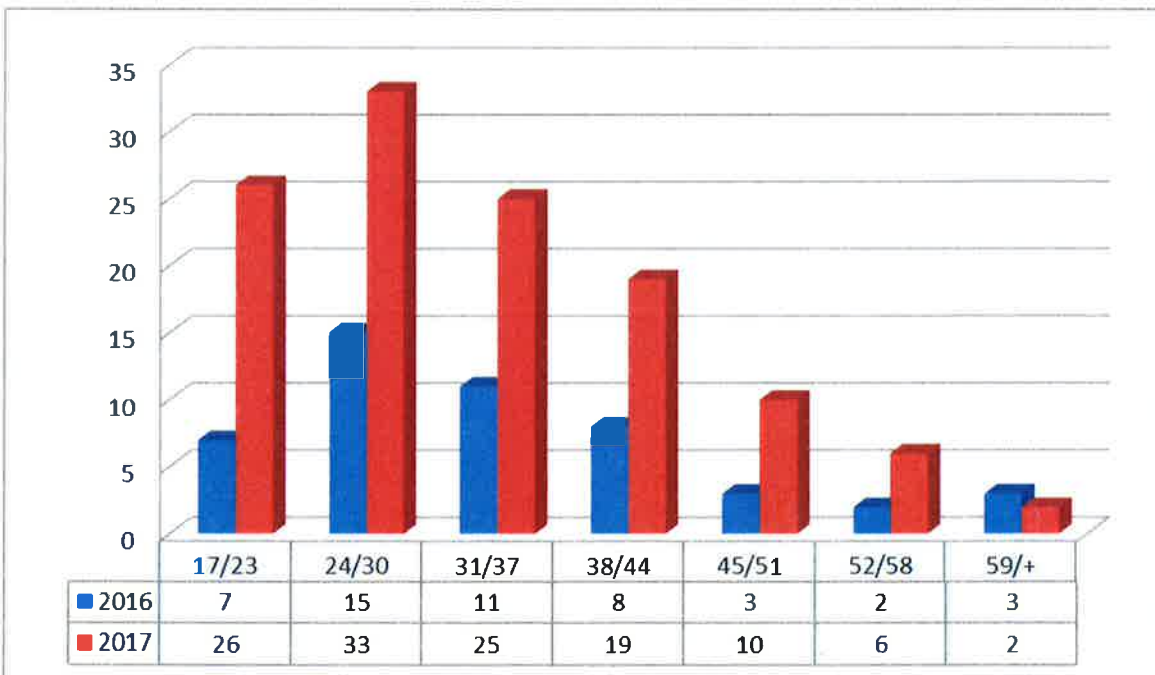
DRUG TYPE

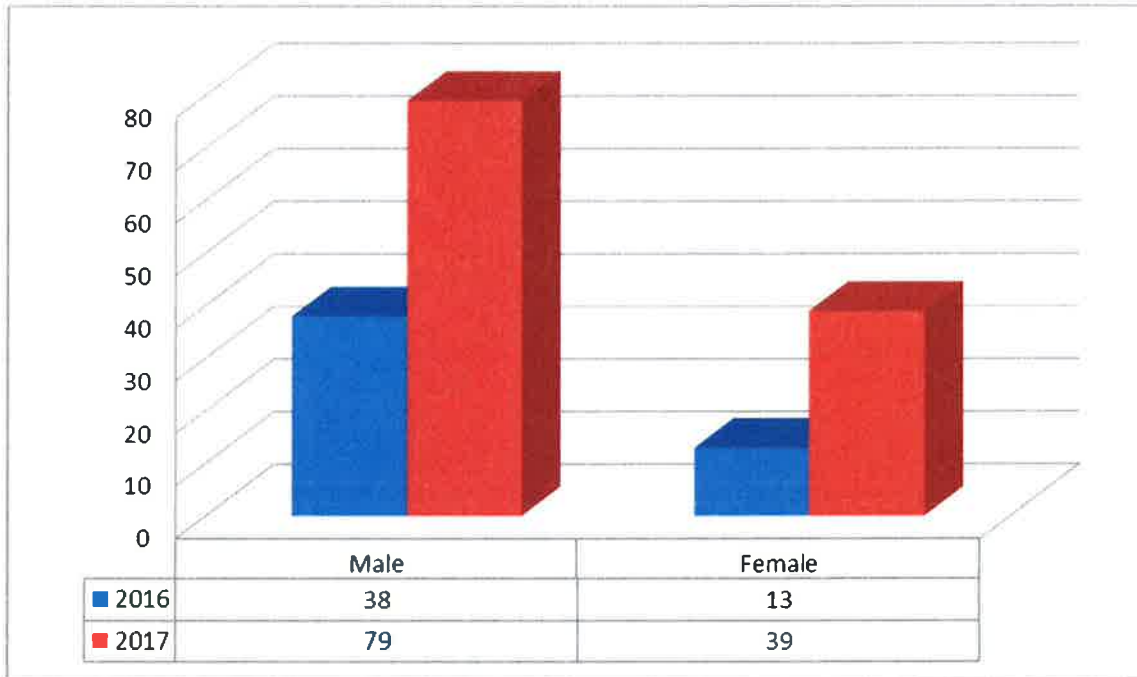
UNDER INFLUENCE AT BOOKING



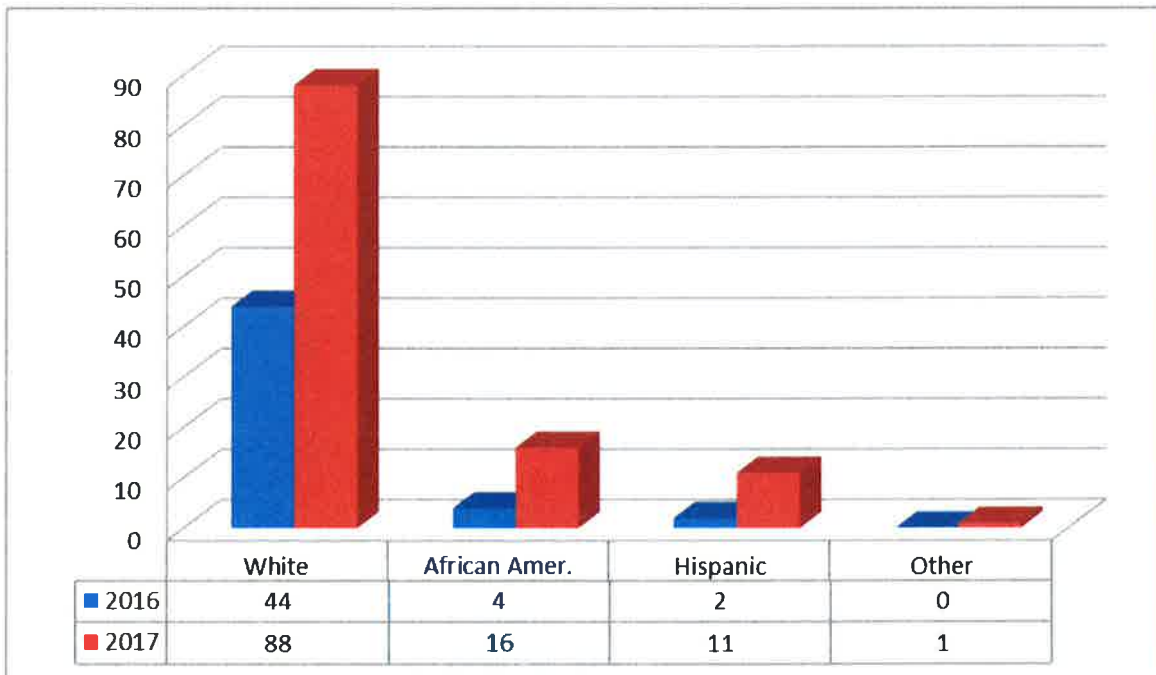
AGE PROFILE

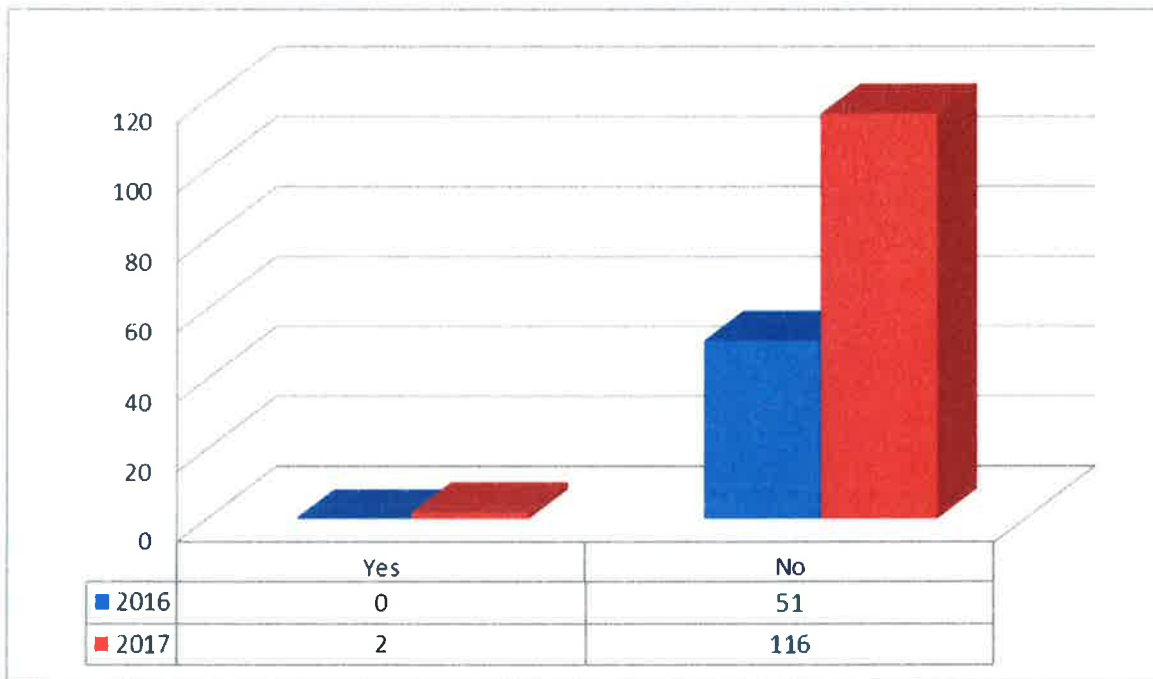
GENDER PROFILE



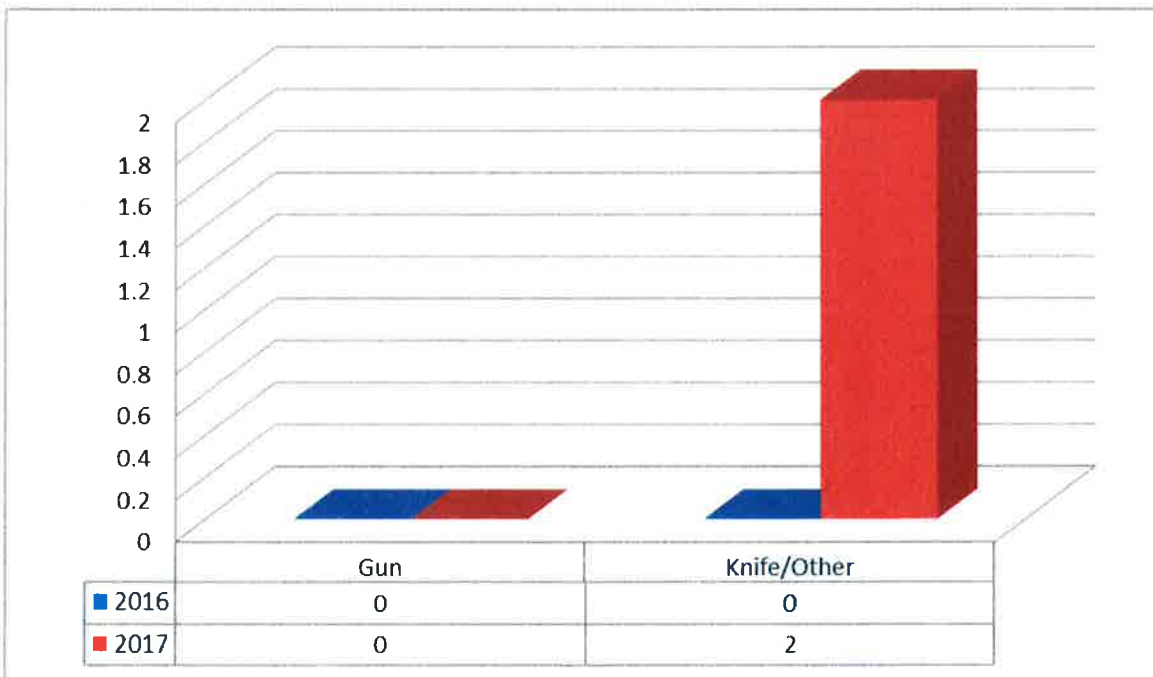
ETHNIC PROFILE

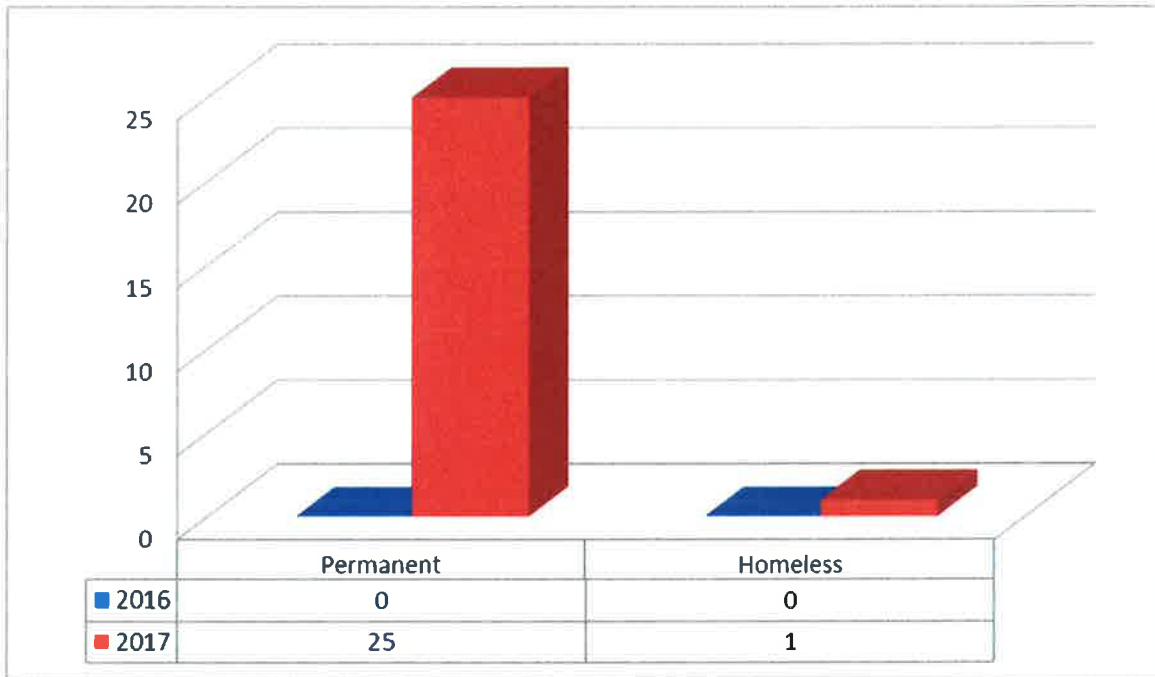
WEAPONS USED



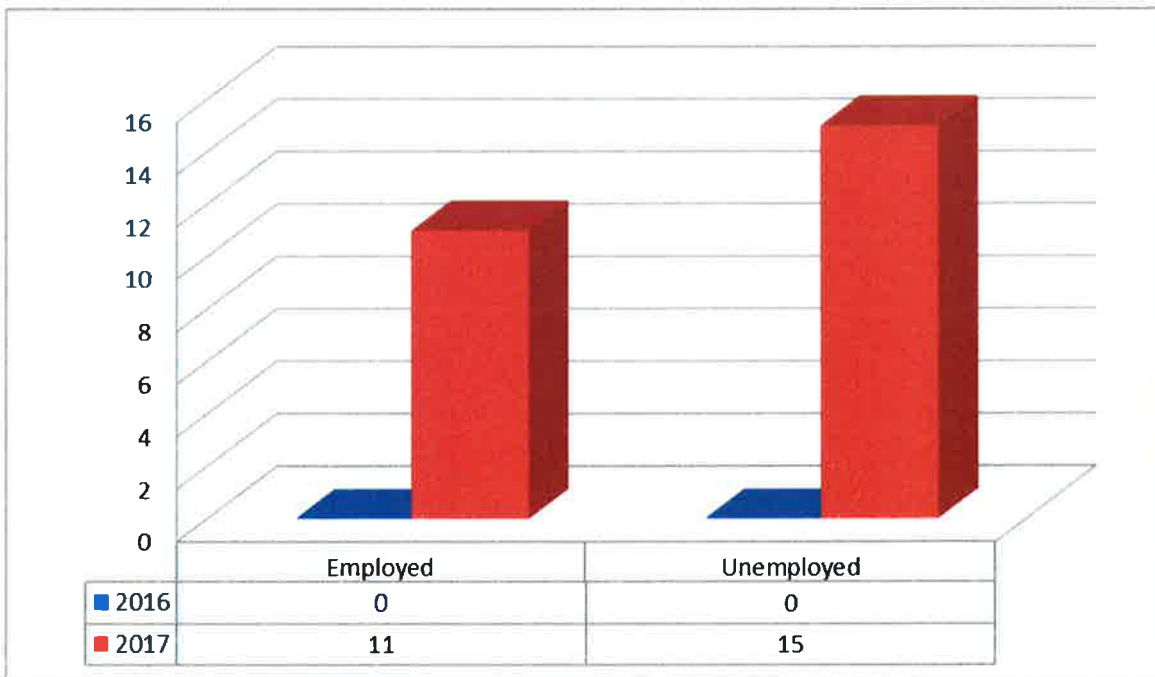
TYPE OF WEAPON USED

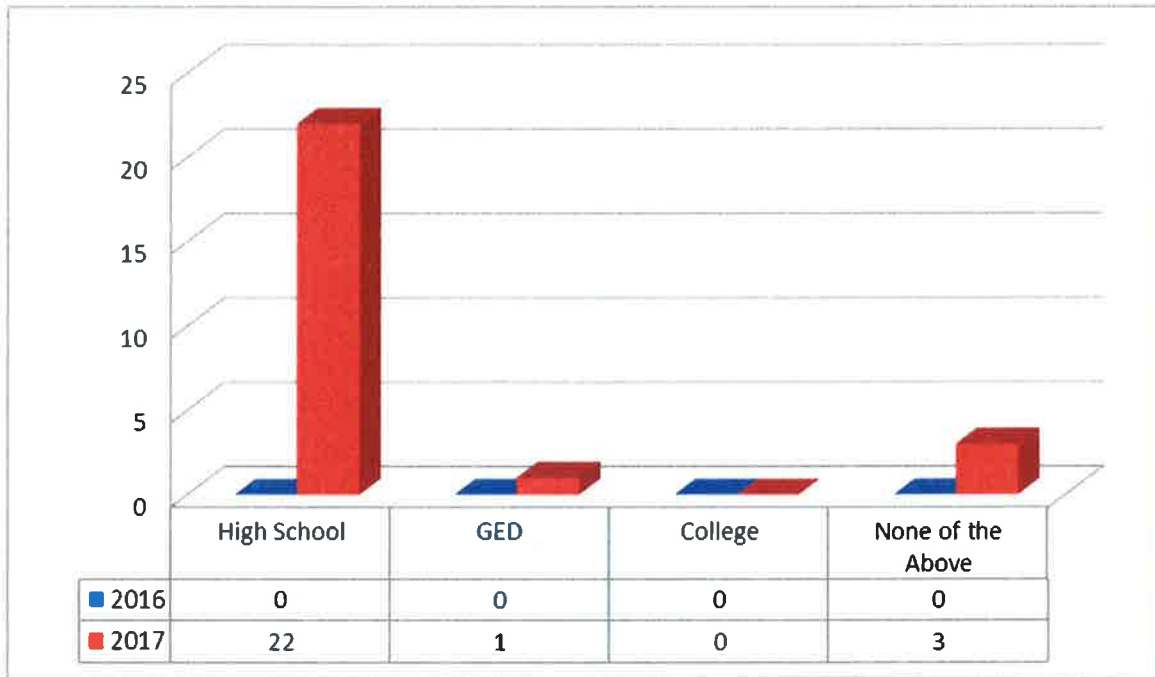
