1. Call to Order

Meeting called to order at 8:04 a.m. by Reese.

2. Roll Call (Establish a Quorum)

Committee members in attendance at 8:04 a.m. were Reese, Patrick, Lund & Kutz. Payne arrived at 8:10 a.m.
Staff member in attendance at 8:04 a.m. was Zangl.

Guests in attendance at 8:04 a.m. were Don Smith-Manager, Waste Manager Deer Track Park Landfill and Rick Schultz-Superintendent, City of Watertown Street Department.

3. Certification of Compliance With the Open Meetings Law

Zangl stated that the Solid Waste/Air Quality Committee complied with open meetings law requirements.

Motion by Patrick, seconded by Kutz to approve the June 16, 2017 minutes as presented.

9. Discussion with Possible Action-Deer Track Park Landfill with Don Smith

a. Landfill Updates

Smith explained/updated on the landfill and handed out a Host Fee update. The Host Fee is \$2.10 a ton. The estimate for the Solid Waste/Air Quality Committee to receive is \$57,639 if the landfill stays on the same track. Smith explained using more RGC which is an alternative cover. Smith estimated the landfill life at another 20 years. They have a shortage of soil at the site so that is one of the reasons for using alternative cover. A month ago they put in 6 new horizontal wells to catch gas. Vertical gas wells to be installed early October. They will be coming to the Town and County for approval to mine soil for landfill cover this winter.

10. Discussion with Possible Action-2018 Budget – Rob Klotz

Reese explained the budget updates in the absence of Klotz. Administrator put \$15,000 into the Solid Waste/Air Quality budget for 2018.

11. Discussion with Possible Action-Watertown Glass Recycling with John's Disposal

Schultz said everything is working well and they are experimenting right now. They had a problem with a load of glass brought that should have been delivered to the landfill. They are blending 80/20 using mix as a base and final. Payne asked what the savings was and Schultz said they don't crush as much virgin gravel.

12. Discussion with Possible Action-Clean Sweep for 2017

a. Next Clean Sweep September 22 and 23, 2017 – Watertown

Kutz will work Friday – Laura both days if possible – Lund & Patrick both days. Reese will be only working on Friday.

Reese gave a summary of milk carton recycling and what was happening with Fort Atkinson School District. Patrick said that the Green Teams in the schools will start next month to implement milk carton recycling at all the schools. Ehrhardt has the strainers, pails and displays ready to be delivered.

Ehrhardt wasn't able to attend the meeting on September 14th. Zangl explained the connection with Ehrhardt and Master Gardeners. Zangl took some brochures over to the farmer's market so they can help promote recycling and Clean Sweep.
16. **Discussion with Possible Action – Brew with a View – Ehrhardt**
Reese explained Ehrhardt's view about the non-success at the Brew with a View. Two Committee members never saw Sharon at the event. May try again next year in a different area, more publicity. Talk with Payne if she is still on the Parks Committee next year. Put this back on the agenda.

Subject: October 21, 2017 Drug Collations Information

The Sheriff reported that he took 357 pounds of drugs, including from Lake Mills Police Department, for disposal on October 23, 2017

If any of you have totals that you would like to share, please send them to me so I can add them to my reports.

I attended the PWWG (Pharmaceutical Waste Working Group) meeting yesterday. This is what Danielle Long from the DOJ reported:

The preliminary weight for drugs disposed of in Wisconsin was 60,257 pounds. The final weight will come from Covanta at disposal time next week.

Wisconsin is third in the national for collecting drugs. California is first. Texas is second and New York fourth.

Wisconsin has the most law enforcement agencies in the nation involved with collecting drugs. We had 150 law enforcement agencies bring drugs for disposal on October 23 and we have 349 permanent drug boxes in police/sheriff departments throughout the state. Some of the private pharmacies, clinics and hospitals are starting to place drug boxes in their facilities. They have to use a reverse distributor in order to do this and also register with the DNR and maybe DOJ.

Daniele said nationwide, 912,305 pounds were collected which is 456 tons.

Milwaukee alone collected 2,000 pounds, so it would be interesting to get a total for Jefferson County and see how we compare. I'm betting we do better than most counties and cities in Wisconsin.

Thank you all for doing a great job and supporting the drug drop-off sites.
