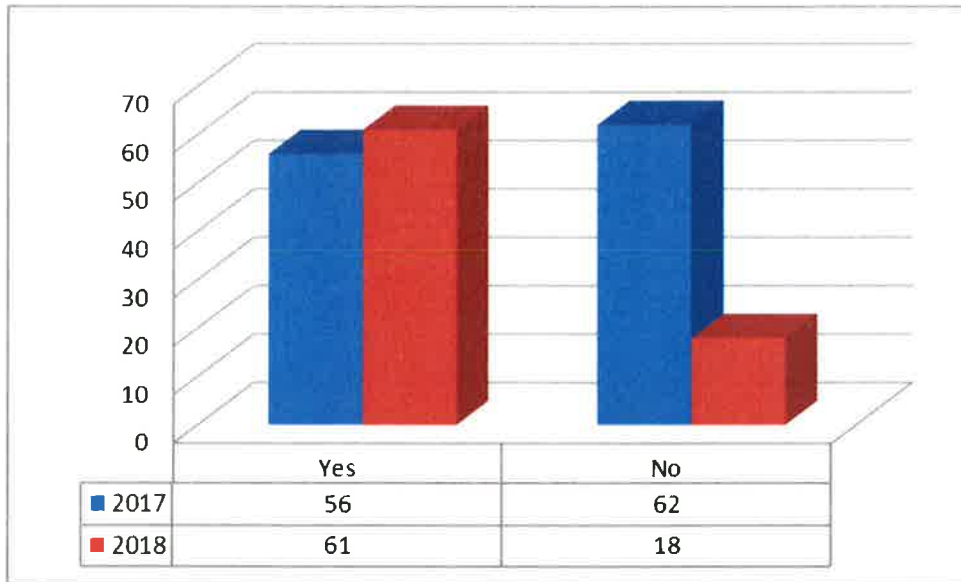

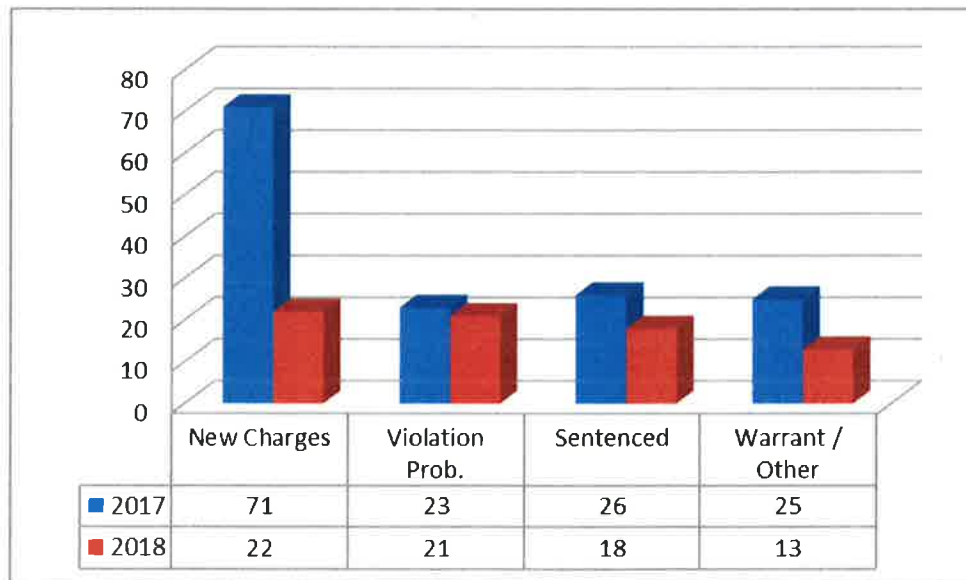

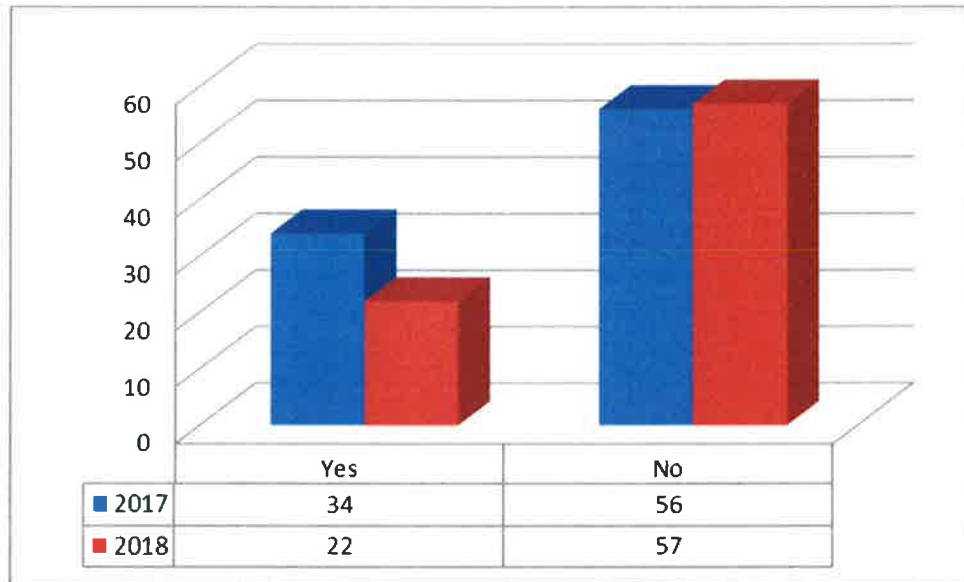
INCARCERATED WITHIN LAST 3 YEARS



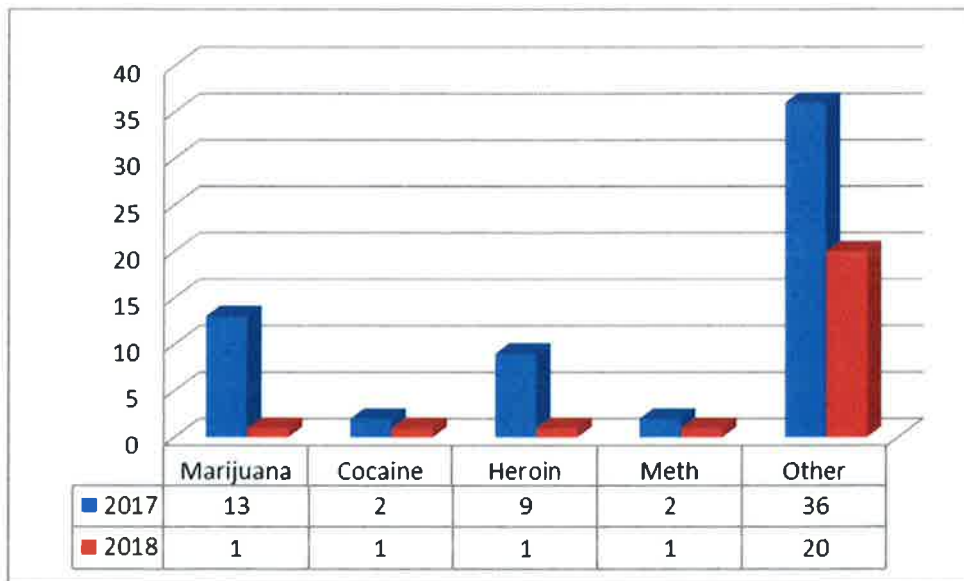
REASON FOR RETURN

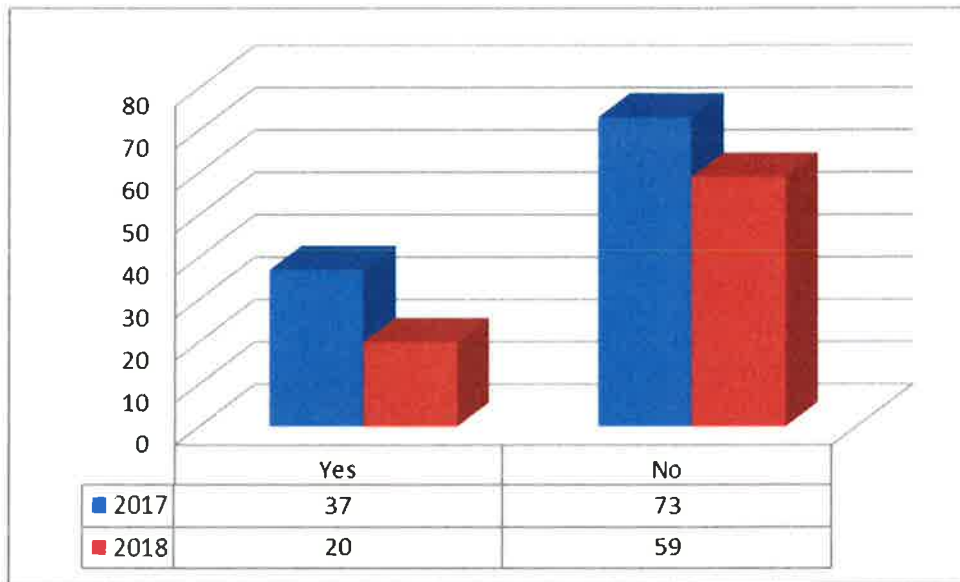
DRUGS USED



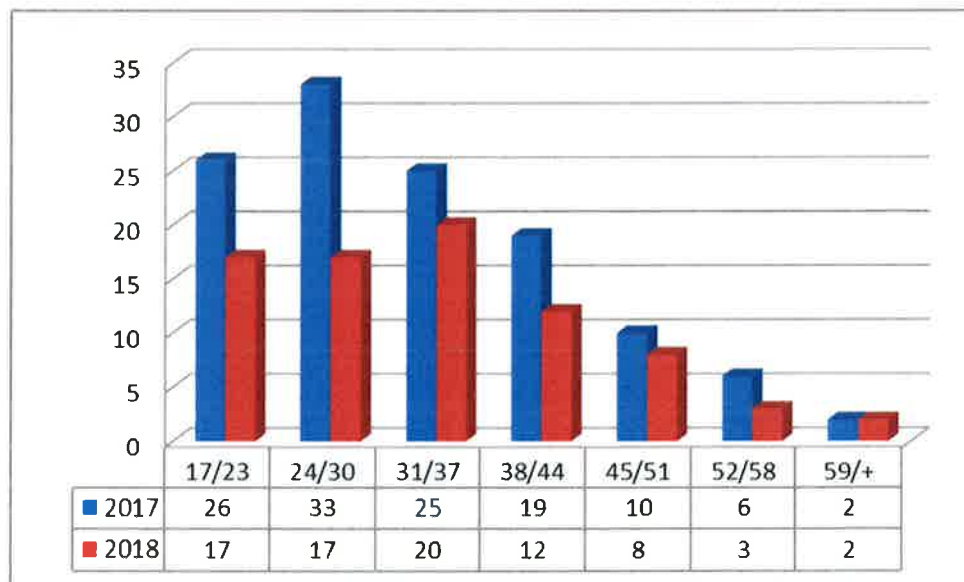
DRUG TYPE

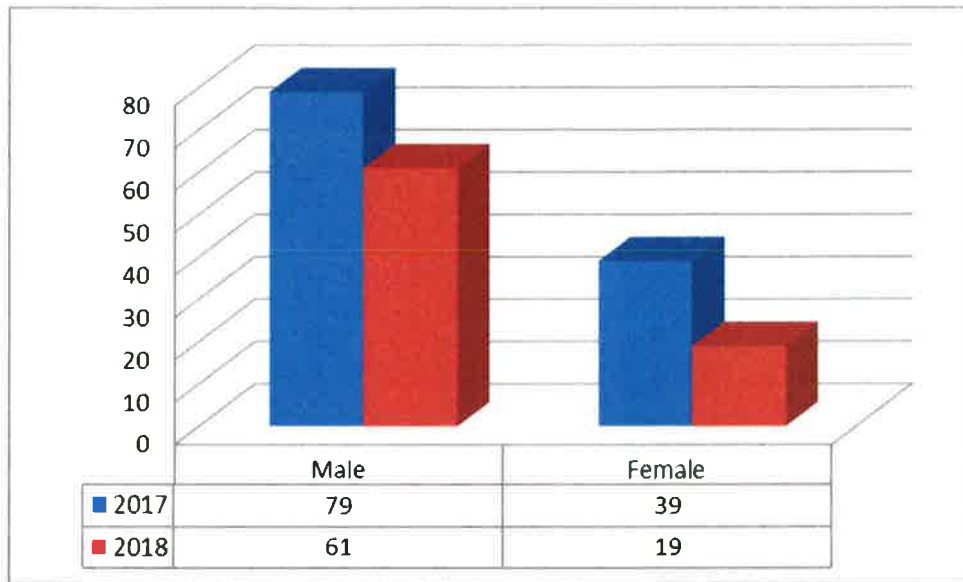
UNDER INFLUENCE AT BOOKING



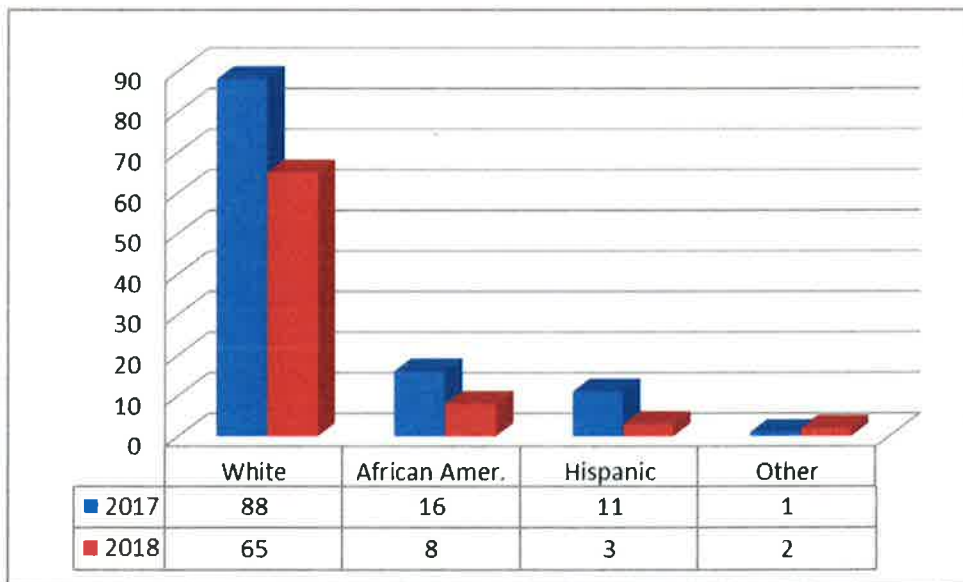
AGE PROFILE

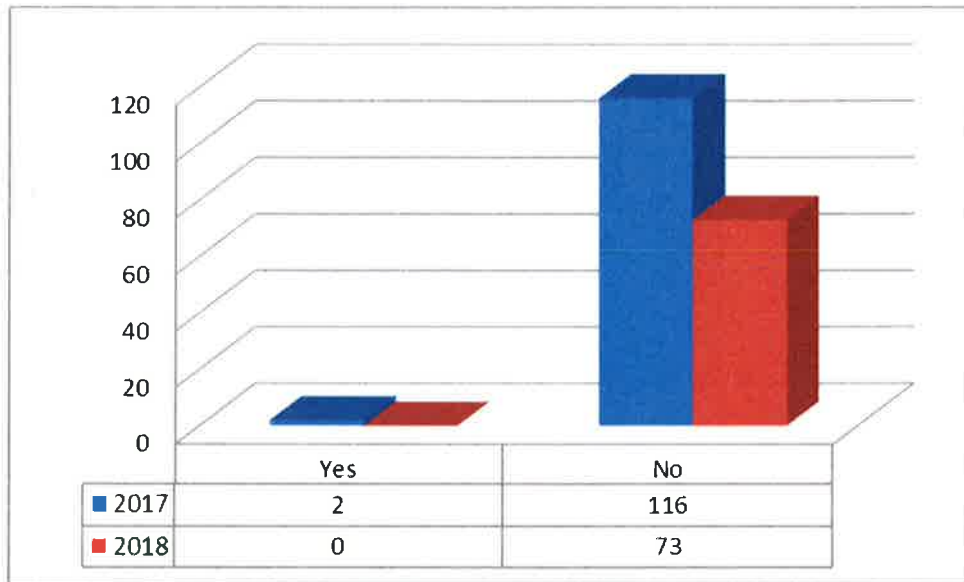
GENDER PROFILE



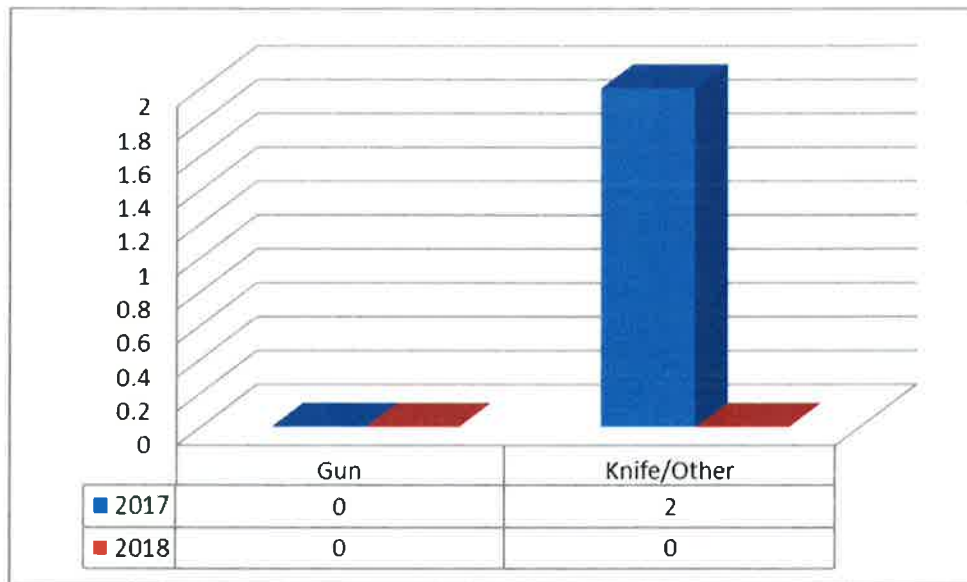

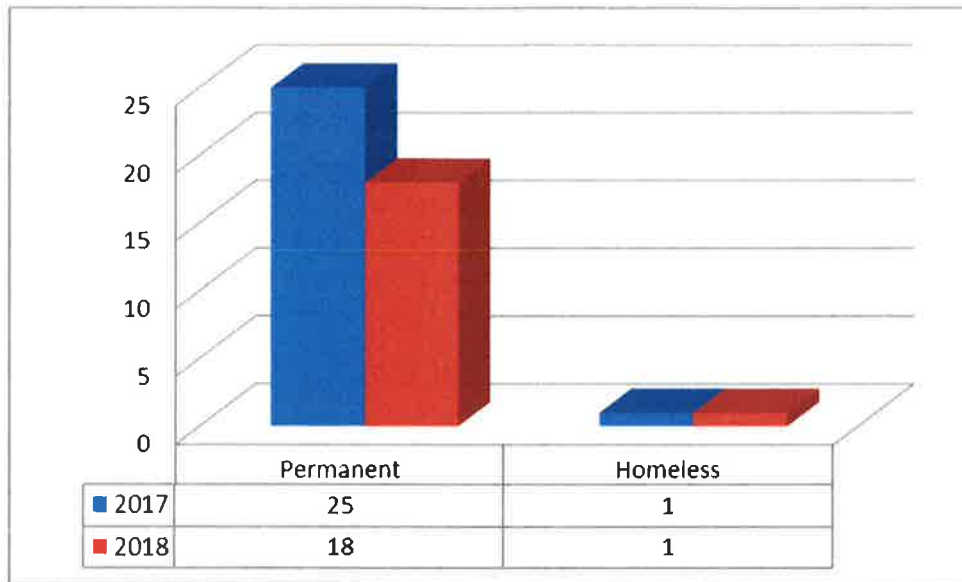
WEAPONS USED



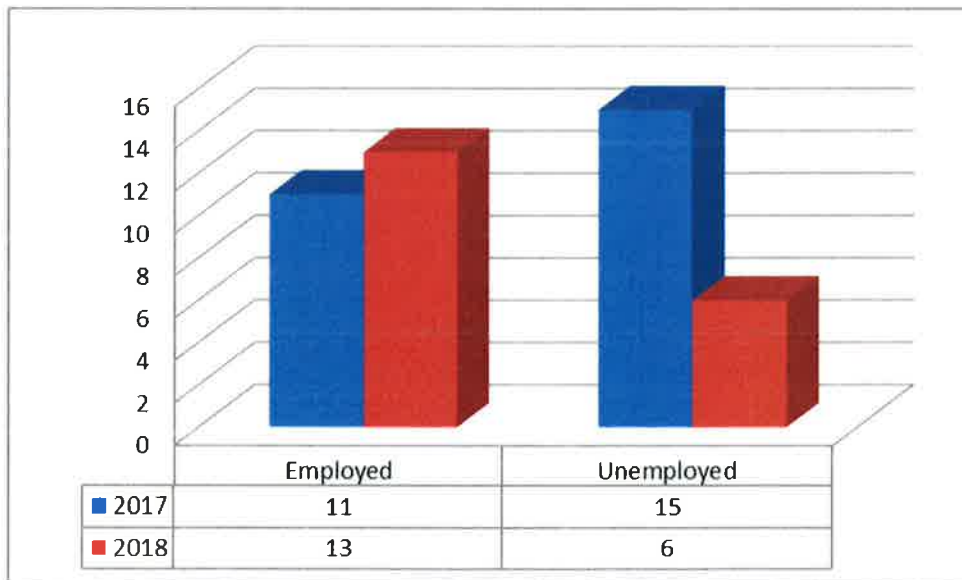
TYPE OF WEAPON USED

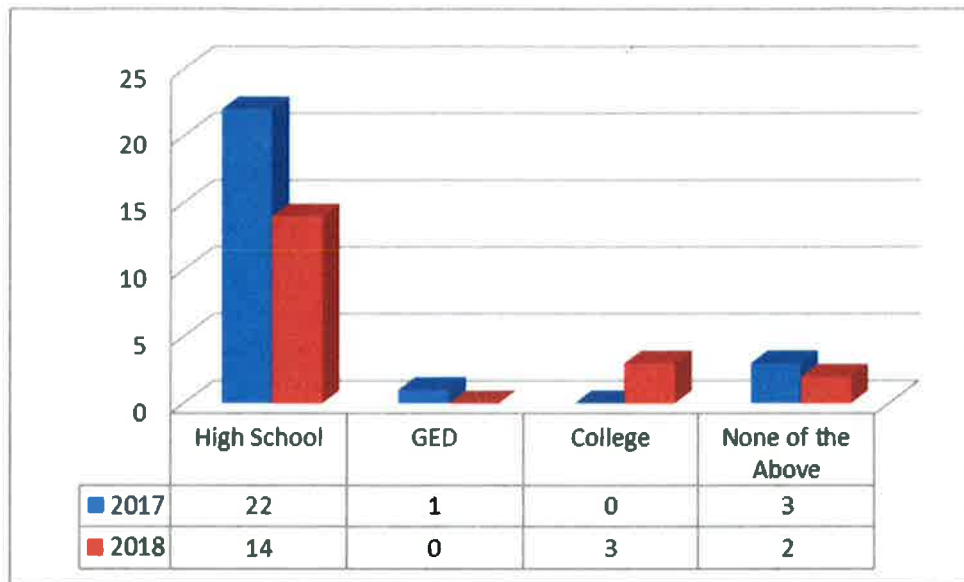
HOUSING PROFILE

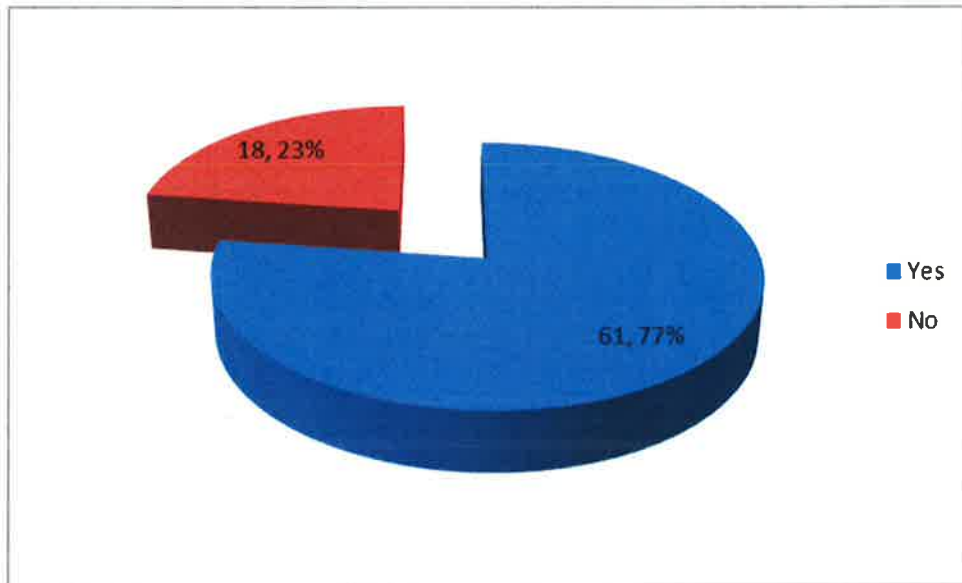

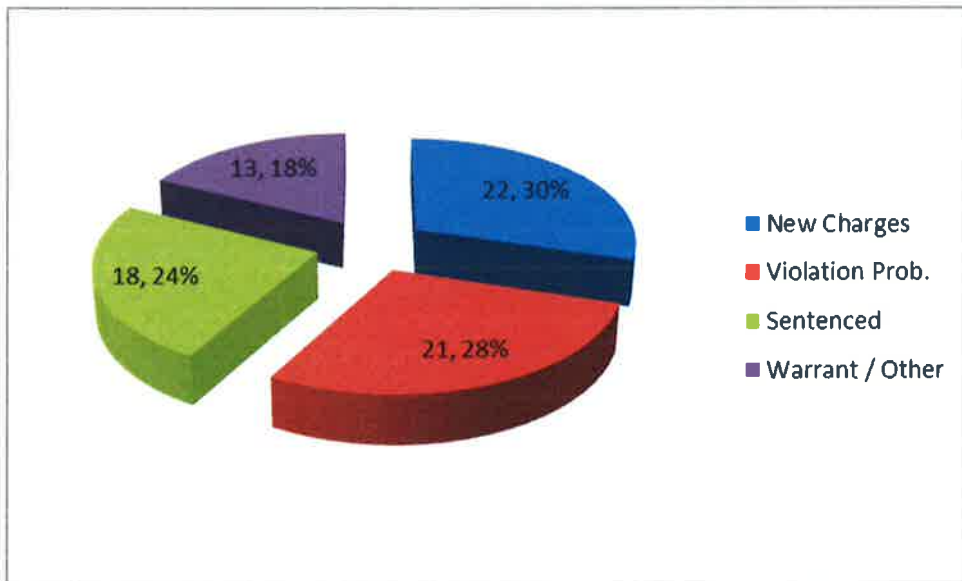


EDUCATION PROFILE

RE- INCARCERATION MAY 2018

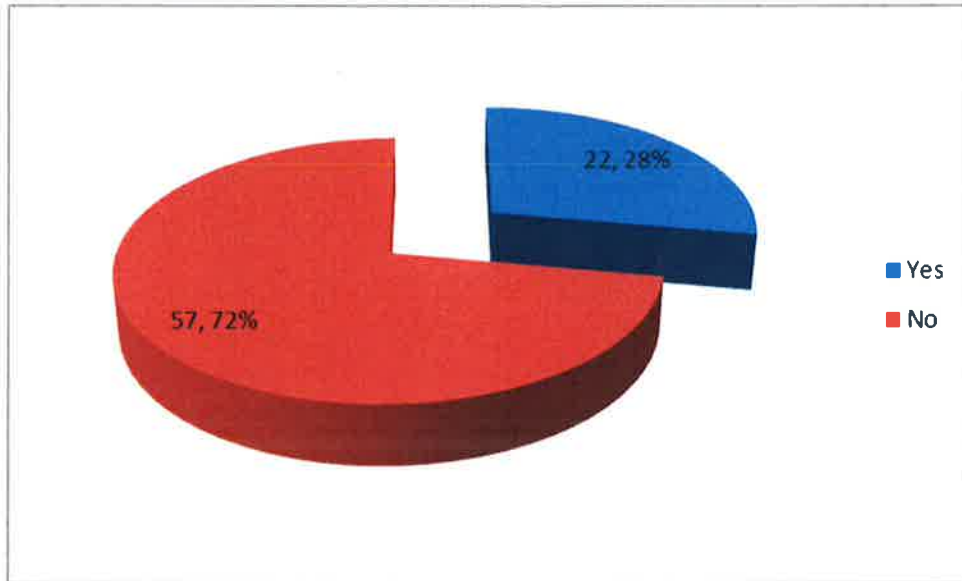


BEEN INCARCERATED WITHIN LAST 3 YEARS

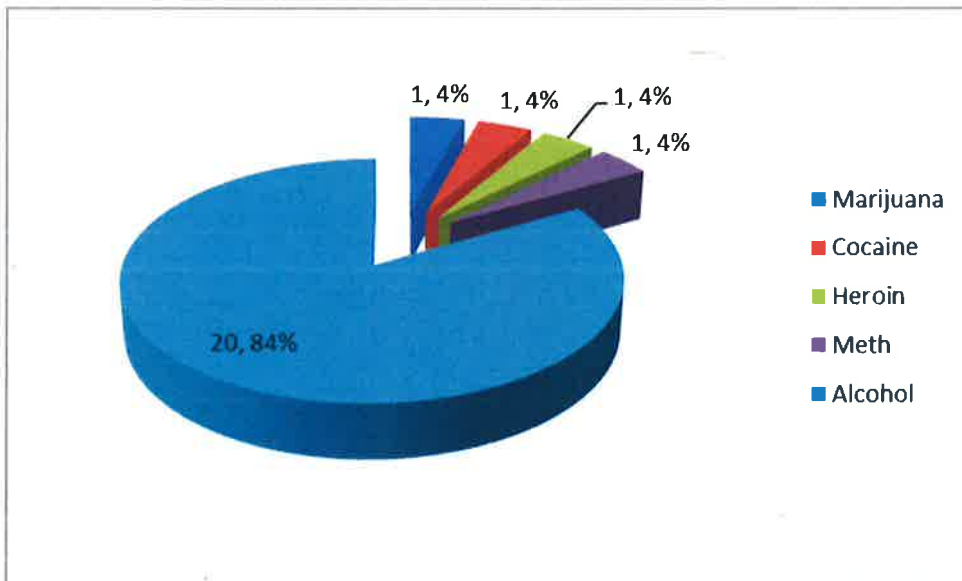


REASON FOR INCARCERATION

RE- INCARCERATION MAY 2018

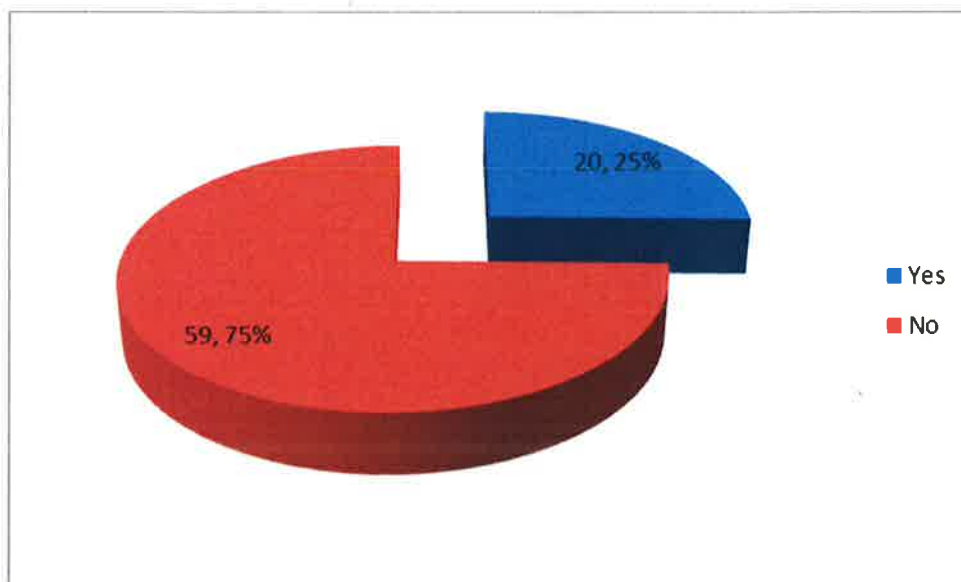


DRUGS OR ALCOHOL RELATED

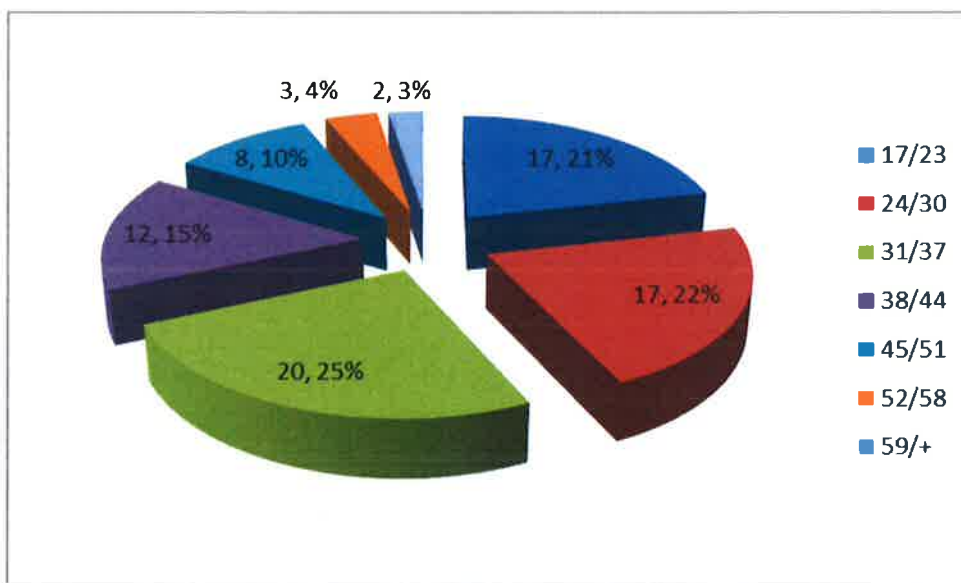


TYPE OF SUBSTANCE USED

RE- INCARCERATION MAY 2018

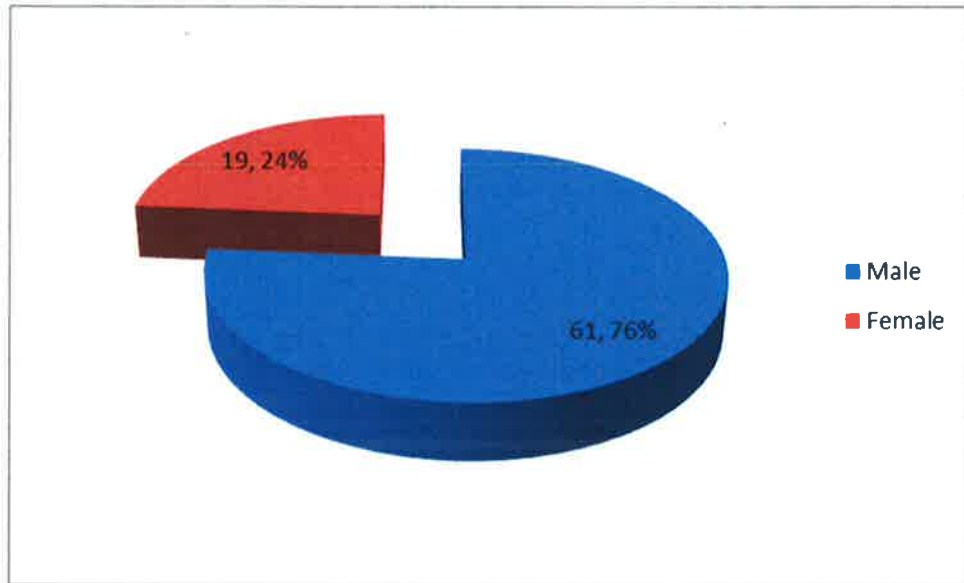


UNDER INFLUENCE AT BOOKING

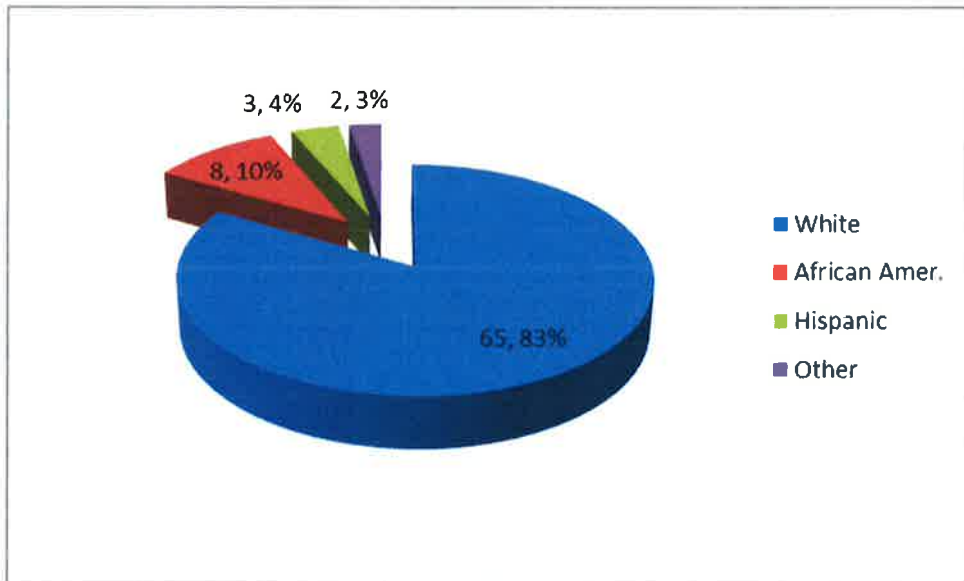


AGE PROFILE

RE- INCARCERATION MAY 2018

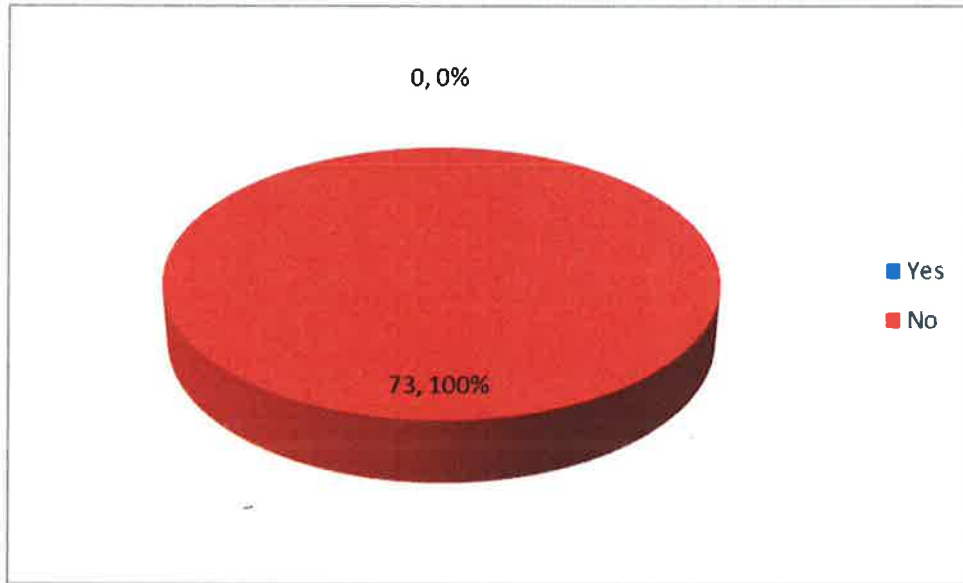


GENDER PROFILE

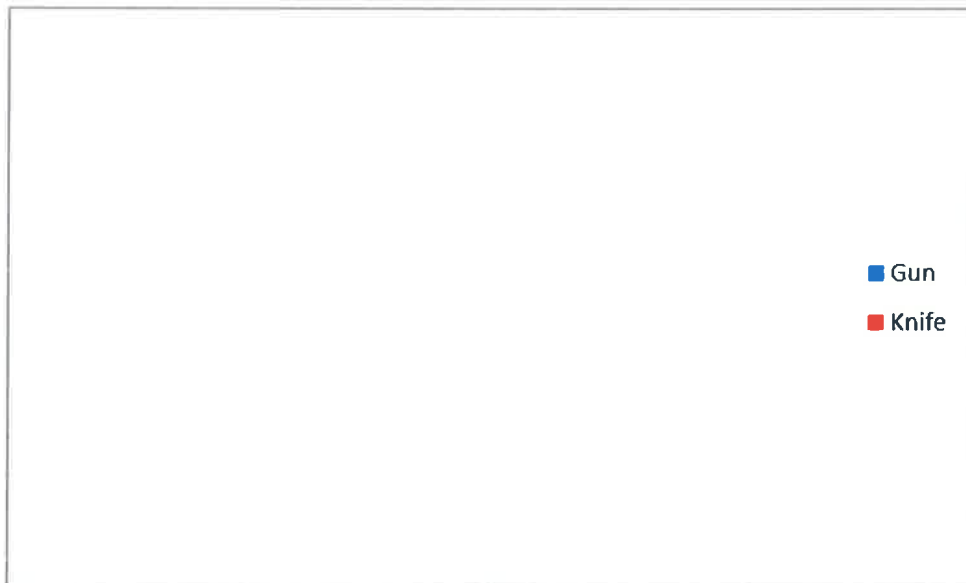


ETHNIC PROFILE

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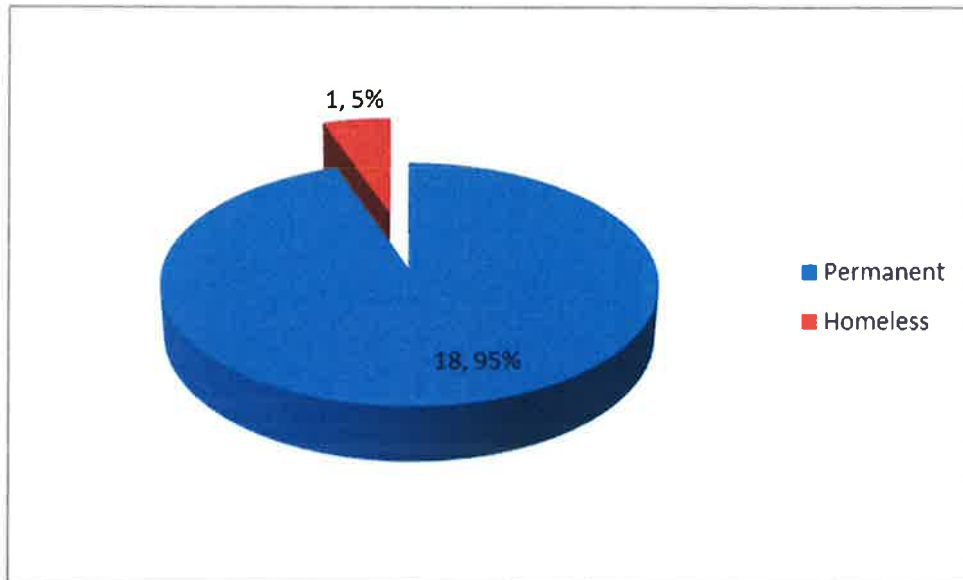


WEAPONS USED

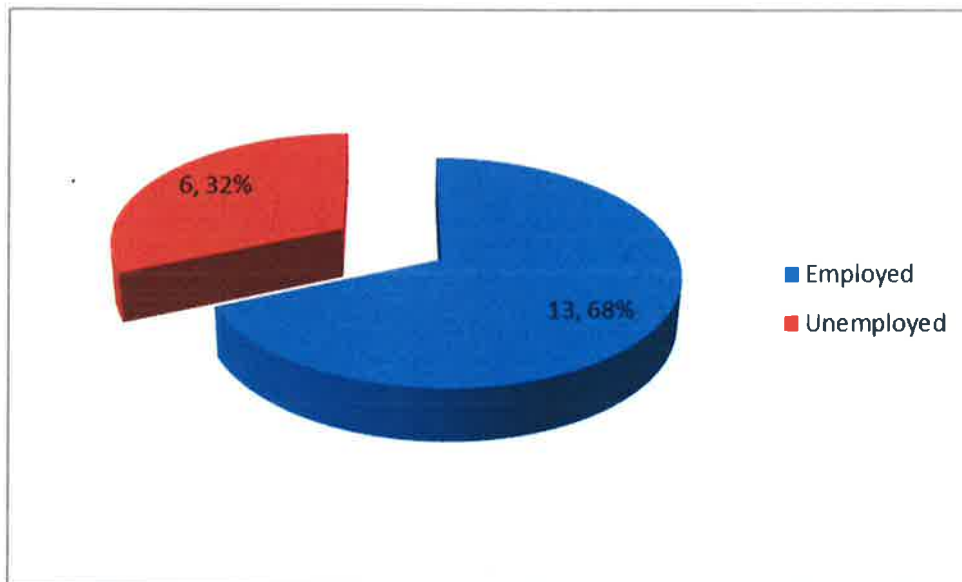


TYPE OF WEAPON

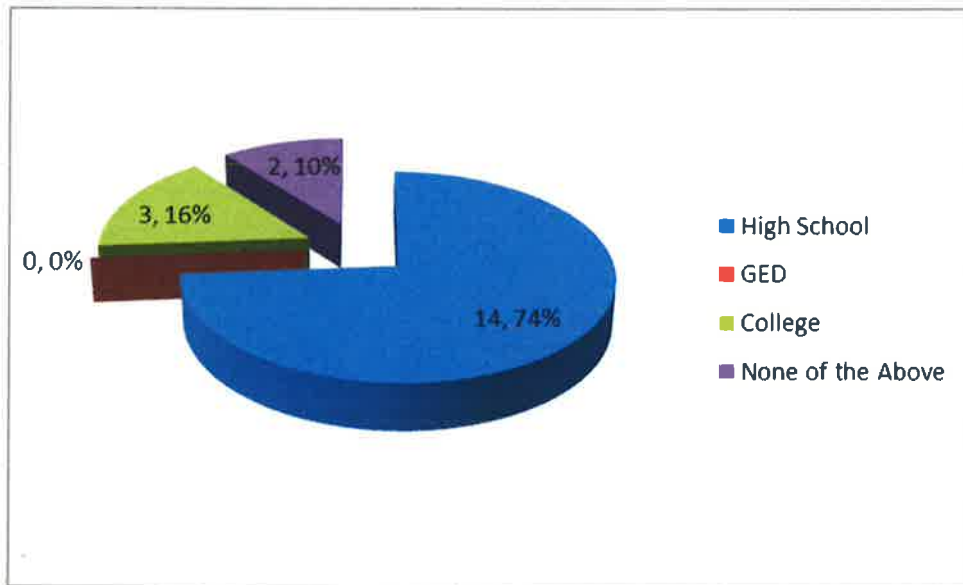
