Webinars for LCC training now available

• A webinar providing a short overview on the <u>Soil and Water Resoruce Management grants</u>¹ and allocation process and on the <u>Land and Water Resource Management plans</u>² are now posted. The webinars are short (about six-minutes) and are designed to help orient new members and provide a refresher to others. The webinars can be viewed independently or included on meeting agendas. Soil and Water Resource Management Grants

- Counties interested in CREP equivalent cost-sharing should be aware that DATCP has new forms and guidance documents in the SWRM manual. If you are considering reenrolling land by providing a second 15 years of CREP equivalent payments, contact <u>Richard.Castelnuovo@wi.gov</u> for the requirements.
- Any 2018 cost-share projects that won't be completed this year must be extended into 2019 if you want to use your 2018 funds. Extension requests (form 200), along with the signed cost-share contracts, are due to DATCP by December 31, 2018.

Annual Reporting

• It is almost annual report time again! The annual report questions for the counties will be in the same format as the last couple of years. We plan to send the link out to everyone before December 31. The deadline for completing the reporting questions will again be mid-March. This gives us the chance to get the report finished by June. Nutrient Management

- The annual update featuring progress in NM plan implementation and highlights from the 2018 review by the Quality Assurance Team is complete and posted here.³
- For the next for months, nutrient management staff will be providing extensive training support for SnapPlus. If you are interested in holding a training, review the <u>calendar of trainings</u>⁴ and contact Sue Porter, Mark Jenks or Stephanie Schneider to schedule a training in your area..

Farmland Preservation Program

- A Farmland Preservation Plan Map Amendment was approved for Barron, Dodge, Green Lake and Marquette Counties.
- Farmland Preservation Zoning Ordinances were approved for the Village of Soldiers Grove in Crawford County and the City of Middleton-Town of Westport ETZ area in Dane County.
- A Farmland Preservation Zoning Ordinance Map Amendment was approved for Marqette County to extend certification to the Town of Montello.

Livestock Facility Siting

• The final decision from the Livestock Facility Siting Review Board in the case of *Ledgeview Farms v. Town of Ledgeview* (Brown County) is available on the board's <u>webpage</u>⁵. Counties interested in imposing more stringent standards need to review this decision for guidance.

Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP)

- Counties should provide DATCP with their "County CREP Annual Report" with costs from 10/1/2017 to 9/30/2018. County contributions to administer CREP count toward Wisconsin's overall match requirements for federal CREP funds. Although not reimbursable, these costs are an important contribution to statewide CREP requirements.
- Congress allowed the Farm Bill (Food Security Act of 1985) to expire on October 1, 2018 and with it
 authorization for FSA to enroll or reenroll any CRP/CREP agreements for FFY2019. While it is unclear when a
 new Farm Bill will be passed, we expect CREP to be included in any new version. County CREP partners
 should continue to assist landowners interested in enrolling new CREP acres in the program under contracts that
 will eventually start in FFY2019. LCD offices can also continue to assist landowners by getting the State CREP
 application process started and continuing to promote CREP to landowners, particularly in areas with flooded
 crop and pasture land.

Land and Water Conservation Board and LWRM Plans

- The board will hold its next meeting on December 4th. Board agenda items include recommending approval of LWRM plan revisions for Dane and Taylor Counties.
- A reminder to the counties scheduled for 2019 LWRM plan revisions or reviews, check your timelines. Final plan revision and board materials need to be submitted 3-4 weeks prior to the LWCB meeting. Agricultural Impact Statements

• November 2018 is an anniversary for the Agriculture Impact Statement (AIS) program. Forty years ago, the very first AIS was published. Wisconsin is still the only state to drafts these documents, which not only clearly identify potential eminent domain impacts to farmers, but also recommend methods to mitigate impacts. Conservation Engineering

- Engineering Field Handbook, Chapter 4, Exhibit A (EFH-4, Exhibit A) *Preliminary Geologic Investigations* for completing soils investigations to the latest NRCS CPS 313 Waste Storage Facility (313 standard) recently had some minor updates. The document can be found here.

- Huffcutt precast concrete manure transfer channels drawings and calculations have been updated to comply with criteria in the latest 313 standard.
