Soil and Water Resource Management Grants

- The 2020 application and instructions for NM Farmer Education Grants are available on the <u>DATCP website</u>.³ Electronically submit applications by Monday, April 15, 2019 to Ryan Erisman at <u>ryan.erisman@wisconsin.gov</u>.
- The SWRM working manual has a new name, "SWRM Grant Resources," and now includes a new form (<u>ARM-LWR-385</u>)⁴ for securing approval of cost-share projects over \$50,000 and/or reallocation of funds from the DATCP reserve for farm discharges.

Land Verification Standard work group

• The first meeting of SOC team was held on February 28, 2019 in Oshkosh, WI. You may learn more about the SOC team and follow their progress at the <u>SOC website</u>.⁵

Producer-Led Watershed Protection Grants

• The 3rd annual Producer-Led Watershed Proction Grants workshop was held on February 19, 2019, in conjuction with the Wisconsin Cover Crop Conference. Over 100 farmers and collaborators attended to learn about increasing farmer participation, reaching "middle adopters," collecting and analyzing data for field comparisons as well as several brainstorming sessions.

Farmland Preservation Program

- The 2019 Agricultural Enterprise Area (AEA) Petition Cycle is now open. You can access petition materials on the Farmland Preservation Program's AEA <u>webpage</u>.⁶ Petitions are due to <u>natalie.cotter@wisconsin.gov</u> by June 21, 2019.
- DATCP is accepting applications for farmland preservation planning grants until April 19th. Counties that have previously received grant funding may apply again to fund a plan update or amendment. Land and Water Conservation Board and LWRM Plans

- At the April 2, 2019 LWCB meeting Kewaunee, Price, and Vernon counties will be presenting their LWRM plan revisions for approval.
- A reminder to counties that are due for LWRM plan revisions and/or reviews in 2020, if you have not done so please contact Lisa.Trumble@wisconsin.gov to schedule your LWCB presentation.
- 2019 Annual Work Plans are due April 15, 2019.

Livestock Facility Siting

- The Technical Expert Committee will hold a meeting on March 22 at DATCP to consider issues related to groundwater protection. Meeting materials are made available on the <u>DATCP website</u>.⁷
- Ledgeview Farms filed an appeal to the Livestock Facility Siting Review Board. The board does not have jurisdiction in this case, because the Town of Ledgeview (Brown County) has not taken action to approve or deny the farm's application.

Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP)

- The Department is waiting to hear details from FSA regarding CREP administration and enrollment under the new Farm Bill (Food Security Act of 1985). We expect the program to continue in Wisconsin, however, there will likely be some adjustments to the rental rates, federal incentives, and national acreage limitations. LCD offices can continue to promote CREP to landowners and to assist landowners interested in enrolling new acres by getting the State CREP application process started. Once we receive further information we will forward it to county offices.
- The CREP annual report for 2018 was submitted to FSA. Thanks to all your work on CREP this past year. A total of 604 agreements totaling 7,767 acres were enrolled. This included reenrolling 4,706 acres of expiring agreements, which accounted for almost 90% of the expiring acres, as well as an additional 3,061 acres enrolled under new agreements. The 2018 annual report can be found on the DATCP <u>CREP website</u>.⁸
