DATCP REPORT

Bureau of Land and Water Resources July 2019

Soil and Water Resources Management Grants

• The Governor signed the budget! Grants staff is preparing the 2020 preliminary allocation plan as usual. Counties that need assistance in preparing their annual budgets should contact DATCP for staffing allocations.

Livestock Facility Siting

- DATCP will request approval from the ATCP Board at their July 10th meeting in Bowler to take the draft ATCP 51 out to public hearings. Public hearings would take place in August.
- On June 28, 2019, the Livestock Facility Siting Review Board heard a second appeal filed by Ledgeview Farms based on the Town of Ledgeview's denial of a pemit to expand its dairy operation to 3,483 Animal Units. The LFSRB upheld the Town's decision. The LFSRB will finalize its written decision on July 12th.

Farmland Preservation Program

- A farmland preservation plan amendment was approved for Kewaunee County.
- A farmland preservation zoning ordinance was approved for the Town of Carlton, Kewaunee County.
- The 2019 AEA petition period closed June 21, 2019.

Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP)

- CREP reopened for enrollment on June 3, 2019. Please pass the word to landowners interested in installing CREP conservation practices to get started now, especially landowners who have experienced crop damage or nutrient loss from flooding. The deadline to submit signed offers for signup 52 for both new enrollment and reenrollment is August 23, 2019. Soil rental rates remain the same as those in effect September 2018. The cropping history for new enrollment is now 4 of 6 years from 2012 to 2017. Federal Signing Incentive Payments (PIP) and Practice Incentive Payments (PIP) remain available to landowners. Federal cost-share is available for practice installation, however, there is no cost-sharing for CREP management activities for signup 52 contracts.
- An updated CREP brochure is available on the DATCP website. DATCP is also publishing a press release on June 25th about CREP enrollment reopening.

Agricultural Impact Statement (AIS) Program

- DATCP has written an AIS for the high-voltage electric project, Cardinal-Hickory Creek, between Cassville in Grant County to Middleton in Dane County. The AIS is available from the DATCP web site.¹ The Public Service Commission (PSC) held public meetings and received comments on the project in June. The PSC will make a decision and choose a route in August/September. If you have any questions about this project, please contact Marilyn Weiss at (608) 224-4650.
- DATCP will have written an AIS for a new natural gas line project, Lakeshore Lateral, proposed by We Energies in the counties of Walworth, Kenosha, and Racine. The published AIS will be available from the DATCP web site². The PSC will hold public meetings in the project area in July and decide the merits of the project in February 2020.
