Land & Water Conservation Committee Minutes July 17, 2019

1. Call to Order:

The monthly meeting was called to order by Matt Foelker at 8:30 am. Committee members Matt Foelker (Chairperson), Walt Christensen (Vice-Chairperson), Dan Herbst (UWEX), Mike Kelly (UWEX), Frank Anfang (FSA Rep), and Margaret Burlingham (Member) were present. Also in attendance were Patricia Cicero, Interim Director, Land & Water Conservation Department (LWCD); Kim Liakopoulos, LWCD; Gerry Kokkonen, LWCD; and Joe Strupp, LWCD. Ed Morse (Secretary) was excused.

A quorum was established.

3. Certification of Compliance with the Open Meetings Law:

DATCP REPORT

Bureau of Land and Water Resources August 2019

Soil and Water Resources Management Grants

• The 2020 joint preliminary allocation plan will be presented at the August 6th meeting of the Land and Water Conservation Board. DATCP proposes to allocate \$9,439,100 for county staffing grants, \$5,776,732 for bond and nutrient management cost-share grants which includes \$300,000 for the bond reserve, and \$1,238,268 in cooperator grants. Send comments on the proposed allocations to datcpswrm@wisconsin.gov by Sept. 4, 2019.

Land and Water Conservation Board and LWRM Plans

• At the August 6, 2019 LWCB meeting Ashland, Oneida, Barron, and Vernon counties will present their LWRM plan revisions for approval.

Livestock Facility Siting

• DATCP has scheduled six dates in August and September to hold public hearings on the proposed revisions to the livestock facility siting rule, ATCP 51. Hearings will take place on August 15th in Oshkosh, August 19th in Eau Claire, August 20th in Wausau, August 22nd in Madison, September 4th in Onalaska, and September 5th in Spooner. There will be two sessions at each location from 1-4 pm and 5-8 pm. Written comments will be accepted through September 13th. See our website¹ for all information regarding the draft rule and public hearings.

Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP)

- The deadline to submit signed offers for signup 52 for both new enrollment and re-enrollment is August 23, 2019. Please pass the word to landowners interested in installing CREP conservation practices to get started now, especially landowners who have experienced crop damage or nutrient loss from flooding.
- Please download the updated CREP 15-year Agreement (LWR-283) form from the CREP website. The form
 was updated on 7/25/2019 to reflect Jennifer Heaton-Amrhein, new Land Management Section Chief, as the
 signing authority on CREP agreements for DATCP.

Producer-led Watershed Grant Program

• DATCP will soon be recruiting for a project position to provide technical support to the producer-led watershed groups. The position is possible through a cooperative agreement between DATCP and NRCS through the Conservation Collaboration funding opportunity. This three-year position will develop reports designed to track estimated water quality benefits and soil health improvement possible through the implementation of conservation practices across all producer-led groups. The position will also work to increase knowledge about conservation practice benefits and their impact on water quality and soil health, assist with the establishment of demonstration plots according to protocols, and promote available technical and financial assistance to support conservation.

Conservation Engineering

• The DATCP Conservation Engineering Practitioner Certification form (Certification) has been revised so the practices are listed in alphabetical order and will print <u>all</u> the available practices. Practices you don't have levels for will print with blanks ("---") similar to how the forms used to be when they were in Excel. Previously, the form printed in numerical order by practice number and only printed the practices that
