1. Call to Order

-Chairman Schultz called meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

2. Roll Call (Establish a Quorum)

-Solid Waste Committee members present were Dick Schultz, Greg David, Jeff Johns and Peter Hartz. Solid Waste Committee member Roger Lindl was not present. Jefferson County staff present were Blair Ward, LaVern Georgson, Patricia Cicero, Matt Zangl and Brett Scherer. Members of the public present were Victor Karalinunas (Town of Ixonia) and Allan G. Kountz (Veolia)

3. Certification of Compliance with the Open Meetings Law

-Ward certified compliance with Open Meeting Law

4. Introductions

-No new introductions

5. Approval of the Agenda

- Schultz approved agenda. **No objections.**

6. Public Comment (Not to exceed 15 minutes – Members of the public who wish to address the Committee on specific agenda items must register their request at this time)

-Karalinunas wanted the incinerator ordinance to move forward. Karalinunas and colleagues will give any more information needed to Solid Waste Committee. Also, incinerator training manual was handed out by Martin and Karalinunas. Supports the incinerator ordinance.

-Foust stated Chapter 13 and importance of educating the public. Stated committee members should be doing their research and come prepared to the meeting for these decisions.

-Martin stated this type of incinerator is not regulated by DNR or EPA. Stated this information was provided to all committee members except Roger Lindl who was not present at the last meeting.

-Monroe had question on how many chicken mortalities are going to the Deer Track Landfill

7. Communication

-No Communication

8. Approval of Minutes for August 6th, September 20th, September 21st and October 8th.

-Scherer broke down what each date was for.

-Motion made by David, seconded by Schultz to approve minutes. **Motion carried 5-0**

9. Discussion and Possible Action on Incinerator Ordinance

-Schultz asked Corporation Council and Jefferson County employees to help advise a recommendation.

-Ward explained setting up the meeting, who was involved and what took place to come to a recommendation.

- Ward said it was an unanimous decision that the incinerator ordinance would have no benefit to Jefferson County at this time.

- Cicero said after contacting the DNR, the incinerator classes are for garbage and not for carcass disposal. Two large farm operations are currently not using any incinerators.

-LaVern spoke about cost, manufacturing training and the air curtain process that takes place which emits zero emissions.

-Martin- Asked about Daybreak's future plans.

-David thanked everyone for hard work, but didn't see too much good coming from the proposed ordinance. David wanted to hear more about the cost and enforcement aspect if the proposed ordinance was to go forward.

-Ward said costs of operation would increase if the proposed ordinance was to be enforced.

-Zangl stated the Zoning and Planning Department is operating at full capacity currently. Don't have staff time to enforce the proposed ordinance; current programs are already stretched thin.

- Johns stated that he does not think oversight from the county is needed due to insurance companies already overseeing and manufacturing restrictions.

-Motion made by Hartz, seconded by David for no recommendation of the incinerator ordinance to the County Board. **Motion carried 4-0**

10. Discussion and Possible Action on Deer Track Park Landfill

a.) Landfill Updates – Dean Kelley

-Dean Kelley not present.

11. Discussion and Possible Action on Updates from Ixonia and Watertown Recycling

a.) Watertown Update – Randy Frank

-Randy Franks not present.

b.) Ixonia Update – Vic Karalinuas

-Karalinuas announced retirement on December 31st. Will have replacement taking over.

12. Discussion and Possible Action on Appliance Recycling

-Scherer still looking for a possible site. Spoke on meeting with Refrigerant Depot and Goodwill and how a permanent site could be possible. Spoke on possible partnership with Walworth County.

13. Discussion and Possible Action on September 20th, September 21st and October 4th Cleans Sweeps

-Scherer spoke about the Clean Sweeps and said numbers of participants were normal

-Kountz said things went well. Except Watertown has not been properly packaging their fluorescent bulbs.

-Johns spoke about the electronic/appliance recycling, the popularity and traffic. Finding a permanent site should be ideal.

14. Discussion and Summary on Drug Collection

a.) Drug Take Back Event October 26th, 2019

-Scherer explained that the event is a collection of drugs and all Jefferson County law enforcement agencies weigh and turn the drugs over to the DOJ.

-Zangl explained the Drug Grant helps pay for the cost of the drug drop-off boxes.

b.) Jefferson County Drug Free Coalition Poster

-Scherer had an update on the sharp issues in the drug boxes. Explained that new poster are being made to help or minimize sharps in the drug boxes.

15. Discussion and Possible Action on Elementary Education Opportunities

-Scherer explained the surplus in compost bins. He suggested donating them to schools for green and recycling programs

-Johns suggests reaching out to middle schools and high schools.

16. Discussion and Possible Action on 2020 Budget and 2020 Grants

-Scherer said he submitted the 2020 grant applications and will soon gather all the information for the 2019 final review.

17. Upcoming Meeting Dates and Possible Agenda Items.

-Schedule next Solid Waste Committee meeting for early December

The Jefferson County Clean Sweep Program had another busy and successful year educating the citizens of Jefferson County. In 2019 the Clean Sweep Program:

- Held three Clean Sweep Events
 - 7.7 tons of tires, 360 appliances and 162,729 pounds of e-waste (electronics) were collected
- Drug drop-off boxes are in every police department and the Sheriff's Office in Jefferson County
- Continued educating the public on pharmaceutical drug disposal
 - Attended events in Watertown, Fort Atkinson, Jefferson, Johnson Creek and Whitewater
 - Provided information on the proper disposal methods for pharmaceutical drugs through flyers, advertisements, and in-person conversations
- Attended the Jefferson County Fair and set up a recycling education booth
 - Interacted with fair participants through a recycling game
 - Answered questions on recycling from Jefferson County Residents
- Attended the Jefferson County Dairy Breakfast

While 2019 was a busy year with many accomplishments, there are on-going projects that we hope to continue working on in 2020. Those projects include:

- Offer Clean Sweep events for Jefferson County citizens to dispose of recyclable materials and hazardous wastes
 - Increase electronic and appliance recycling events
 - Create a permanent electronic and appliance recycling site
- Partner with local schools to implement a milk carton recycling program
 - Donate 5-gallon pails, strainers, and containers to the schools who haven't already implemented the program
- Educate the public on recycling through posters, flyers, ads, etc.
- Develop partnerships with communities to further recycling education

The Jefferson County Clean Sweep Program is an important service to residents, agricultural communities and small businesses within the County. The program provides proper disposal for hazardous waste chemicals, recycling events for electronics and appliances, and nine drop-off sites for pharmaceutical drugs. Providing proper disposal methods for pharmaceutical drugs helps to keep these substances away from children, teenagers, pets, and out of the surrounding environment and groundwater. These programs are funded by grants, contributions, and a host fee from Waste Management Deer Track Park Landfill. Host fees have decreased by \$60,000 since 2008 and grant proportions continue to dwindle. Contributions are received from Jefferson County towns, cities, villages, businesses, and residents. The City of Watertown continues to be a generous supporter to the program. Our supporters realize that the cost of preventative programs is cheaper than clean-up costs. These programs provide residents an opportunity to safely dispose of hazardous wastes and drugs.

For 2020, the Solid Waste Committee is planning Clean Sweeps at three sites over five days, which will also include three electronic and appliance recycling events and one tire recycling event. A Clean Sweep brochure and a map of all the events for 2020 are enclosed with this letter.

Thank you in advance for considering a contribution to the Clean Sweep Program. We are eager to work with you to maintain this valuable program for our citizens. We are always open to new ideas and recycling methods.
