- Wehmeier showed a video on a remote alcohol breathalyzer kiosk, (ab kiosk system)
- Add education sessions and track other objectives for the CJCC meeting agendas, along with the current reports. It was suggested that the reports be provided ahead of time
- Address problems with compliance of sobriety requirements.
- Look at identifying resources for individuals in the substance abuse program; The DOJ has funding but there are no private resources available in Jefferson County. Transportation is an issue when offering resources outside of the county. Fort HealthCare is willing to talk about this and try and come up with a solution.
- Find solutions for people with mental health issues who say they drink and take drugs to get through the day.
- Look into treatment in the jail. Give the inmates time to work on these issues and work with counselors. Look into the waiting list for getting into treatment programs for the inmates.
- Talk about how to improve providing resources to individuals who speak Spanish.
- Use current resources that are already in place but not fully utilized.
- Work on communication between departments to coordinate programs and resources.
- Look into the possibility of having the JCEDC target businesses associated with professional treatment resources and bring them in to Jefferson County.
- Importance of continuing education for long term success.

The goal is to develop action plans to address these concerns. Ward will send a copy of the CJCC bylaws to better frame objectives for future agendas.
