RESOLUTION NO. 2019-

Amending the 2020 Land and Water Conservation Department Budget

Executive Summary

The multi-discharger phosphorus variance is available to Waste Water Treatment Facilities (point sources) who are permitted by the state to discharge treated wastewater via a pipe to a waterbody. The variance gives facilities a time extension to comply with more restrictive phosphorus limits for their discharge. During the time extension, facilities are required to reduce their phosphorus discharge and implement a watershed project to help reduce phosphorus pollution that enters waterbodies from the land (nonpoint sources). Among the options for implementing a watershed project, facilities can choose to make a payment in the amount of \$50.00, times the number of pounds of phosphorus that exceeds their target phosphorus discharge. The funds are then offered to the Land and Water Conservation Departments located in their watershed.

In 2019, five facilities in the Upper Rock River Watershed elected to use the multi-discharger variance and chose to allocate funds to Land and Water Conservation Departments in their watershed. A portion of Jefferson County is located in the Upper Rock River Watershed. As such, Jefferson County Land and Water Conservation Department has the opportunity to receive funds to implement projects that reduce phosphorus nonpoint sources. The Land and Water Conservation Committee considered this resolution at its February 19, 2020, meeting and recommended forwarding to the Finance Committee for their approval. The Finance Committee considered this resolution at its March 12, 2020, meeting and recommended forwarding to the County Board for approval.

WHEREAS, the Executive Summary is hereby incorporated into this resolution, and

WHEREAS, Jefferson County Land and Water Conservation Department applied for funds through the multi-discharge phosphorus variance in December 2019 after the 2020 Budget was approved by the County Board, and

WHEREAS, the amount of money allocated for use by Jefferson County Land and Water Conservation Department was determined in February 2020 to be \$11,129.21, and

WHEREAS, at least 65% of the funds must be used on conservation practices that bring agricultural sources into compliance with state standards, and up to 35% of the funds can be used for staffing, innovative projects, monitoring, modeling, and demonstrations, and

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Land and Water Conservation Department staff routinely work to implement conservation practices on agricultural land, and

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Land and Water Conservation Department must develop a plan to use the funds appropriately and submit annual reports to the state until the funds are used.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Jefferson County Board of

Supervisors hereby approves the amendment of the 2020 Land and Water Conservation Department budget to include \$11,129.21 for the multi-discharger phosphorus variance program.

Fiscal Note: This is a budget amendment that increases revenue and expenditures by \$11,129.21. Funds can offset the work of staff to implement the program. As a budget amendment, County Board approval requires a two-thirds vote of the entire membership of the County Board (20 members of the 30-member County Board must vote in favor of the budget amendment).

Conservation Engineering

- Some updates to pass along pertaining to DATCP Engineering Certification:
 - Certification levels for CPS 313-Waste Storage Facility and associated liner standards (520, 521, 522) are being restored to DATCP Area Engineering staff. NRCS EJAA for these practices is also being restored to NRCS Area Engineers.
 - o Both "legacy" Certification for the previous 313 and CPS 635-Vegetated Treatment Area have been removed from the Certification database and form.
 - Having Certification for the "current" 313 and 635 will cover the legacy standards as well.
 - Legacy standards should only be used if absolutely necessary, and <u>only DATCP Area</u>
 Engineering staff have 313 and 635 approvals.
 - The DATCP Certification database has been updated with the criteria changes from NRCS for the CPS 580-Streambank & Shoreline Protection, CPS 582-Open Channel, 584-Channel Bed Stabilization, and 533-Pumping Plant.
 - NOTE: 580 projects currently in the works will continue using previous Certification controlling factors until training on the new criteria is available.
- The WI Standards Oversight Council (SOC) is working with NRCS to form a stakeholder team charged with revisiting four NRCS conservation practice standards related to stream restoration (CPS 580, 582, 584 and 395). NRCS and SOC are seeking volunteer technical experts to participate in updating these standards. If you are interested in participating, more information and the application can be found here. ⁵

Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP)

- Enrollment in CREP was authorized by FSA to begin again on January 8, 2020. New enrolls can be submitted to FSA until September 30, 2020. Re-enrollment of agreements expiring this year can begin in April, 2020 and have until August 21, 2020 to be submitted to FSA. State and Federal incentive payments remain the same as previous years and soil rental rates are not reduced for CREP. Cost sharing remains at 50% from FSA for establishment, however, no cost share is available from FSA for management activities. DATCP will pay its 20% cost share and the 40% practice incentive payment continues from FSA for eligible practices.
- Updated CREP Agreement Forms (LWR-283) will be available from DATCP shortly. DATCP will require all CREP agreements moving forward to use the updated forms.
- All outstanding agreements from 2019 should be submitted to DATCP as soon as possible. Please check with your local FSA office to see if they have any remaining CREP contracts not yet reported to you.

Agricultural Impact Statement (AIS) Program

• We sent a survey to 192 farmland owners who received an Agricultural Impact Statement in the last 20 months. The survey will help us understand the information most useful to farmland owners and enable us to improve future AISs.

(g) LAND AND WATER CONSERVATION/ UNIVERSITY EXTENSION EDUCATION COMMITTEE - Seven members appointed by the County Board Chair consisting of not less than five County Board Supervisors. The Chair of the FSA (Farm Service Agency or his/her designee) shall serve on this Committee and shall have the powers and duties as set forth in Chapter 92, Wisconsin Statutes. This Committee shall serve as the designated land conservation committee as required in Wisconsin Statutes 92.06(1)(a) and as the Committee on agriculture and extension education as outline in Wisconsin Statutes 59.56 (b).

This Committee shall also be responsible for acquiring conservation easements, reviewing applications to grant such easements and recommending action thereon to the County Board when appropriate. The Chair of the FSA (Farm Service Agency) (or his/her designee) shall serve on the Land and Water Conservation Committee and shall have the powers and duties as set forth in Chapter 92, Wisconsin Statutes. This Committee shall also be responsible for acquiring conservation easements, reviewing applications to grant such easements and recommending action thereon to the County Board when appropriate.
