Land & Water Conservation Committee Minutes August 19, 2020

1. Call to Order:

The monthly meeting was called to order by Matt Foelker at 8:30 am. Committee members Matt Foelker (Chairperson), John Kannard (UWEX Member), and Margaret Burlingham were present. Walt Christensen (Vice-Chairperson), Mike Kelly (Secretary), and JoAnn Davis (FSA Rep) (@ 8:35) and Alison Volk, American Farmland Trust were present via Zoom. Also in attendance were Patricia Cicero, Director, Land & Water Conservation Department (LWCD); and Kim Liakopoulos, LWCD. Dan Herbst (UWEX Member) was absent.

- 2. Roll Call (Establish a Quorum): A quorum was established.
- **3. Certification of Compliance with the Open Meetings Law:** It was determined that the committee was in compliance with the Open Meetings Law.

The August agenda was reviewed by the committee members. No changes were proposed.

5. Approval of the July 15, 2020 Meeting Minutes:

Burlingham made a motion to approve the July 15, 2020 meeting minutes as written, Kannard seconded. Motion passed 5/0.

10. Discussion on Departmental Updates:

More cost-share projects are in the works including a well decommissioning and a manure storage closure. The meeting of the Advisory Committee for the Land and Water Resources Management Plan has been scheduled in September.

Cicero discussed the annual report, the report's new format, and the 2020 distribution procedure.

Updates to the plan are ongoing. An extension was granted. The completed plan will be due February 2021. LWCD staff will be meeting with the advisory committee consisting of local famers, crop consultants, an Ag lender, and agency personnel September 9, 2020.

Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP)

- August 21, 2020 was the deadline for producers to submit signed offers for re-enrolling land in CRP and CREP, including offers that include both re-enrolled and new land. For offers to enroll new land (land not currently enrolled in CRP), producers may submit offers for signup 53 enrollment through September 30, 2020.
- If your county has completed any easement monitoring site visits or compliance checks on easements with expired federal contracts, please send completed Easement Compliance forms or other site visit summaries, including any compliance issues. Contact <u>Melissa.Gilmore@wisconsin.gov</u> with any questions.
- A reminder that DATCP updated the <u>LWR-283 form</u> in January,2020 and this version should be used for completing all CREP agreements submitted to DATCP moving forward. The new form is dated 01/2020 in the upper left hand corner for the first page. The instructions sheet for the LWR-283 has also been updated to reflect the changes. A reminder that counties need to include as an attachment to each LWR-283 the Standard Terms and Conditions (<u>DOA-3054</u>) and Supplemental Standard Terms and Conditions for Procurement for Services (<u>DOA-3681</u>) documents and the landowners should be notified of these attachments prior to signing the LWR-283.

• The Agricultural Enterprise Area petition evaluation committee met on August 12th to review 3 new petitions and 1 modification petition for the 2020 cycle in Green Lake, Dodge, Outagamie and Dunn Counties. Reccomendations will be presented to the ATCP Board on September 24th.

Families and individuals deserve to have productive farmland, healthy natural areas, and clean water to use and enjoy. Therefore the overall goal of this plan is to restore, improve, and protect land and water resources in Jefferson County.

The work plan details the goals, objectives, and activities of the Jefferson County Land and Water Resources Management Plan. This work plan was developed to achieve the overall goal listed above. Items in the work plan that are identified in bold are priority activities for the Land and Water Conservation Department. It is important to note that the implementation of the work plan is dependent on receiving adequate financial resources to cover staff and the cost-sharing programs.
