5. **Approval of Park Committee Minutes for October 5, 2020**
Smith/David motion to approve the Park Committee Minutes of October 5, 2020. Motion passes 3/0.
6. **Communications**
News releases on the Born Learning Trail and commemorative bench for Joe Nehmer Included in the packet
Wiesmann provided an update on Paragliders in the park – may be future agenda item
Wiesmann also noted an increase of Homeless persons in the parks
7. **Public Comment (Members of the public who wish to address the Committee on specific agenda items must register their request at this time)**
No Public Comment
8. **Discussion and Possible Action on Proposed Installation of Mountain Bike Trails at Upper Rock Lake Park**
A Power Point was presented to the committee, highlighting preliminary plans proposing approximately (less than) one mile of trail in Upper Rock Lake Park.
Wiesmann – highlighted the volunteer work that the individuals (requesting these trails) have done, noting that this will be a team effort and that Jefferson County will be involved/manage the project as time and staffing allow. County has tools, from previous projects, that can be used on this project.
Smith – stated concerns about user group conflicts and life/sustainability of the project
Johns/Smith motion to move forward with design & planning to be brought back to the committee for review. Motion passes 3/0.
9. **Discussion and Possible Action on Access Agreement for Property Located at N1573 Business 26, Fort Atkinson, in the Town of Koshkonong, County of Jefferson, State of Wisconsin**
Wiesmann – Property owners (Amacher) are requesting an easement across the Glacial River Trail south of Fort Atkinson. They have a home and agricultural land on the west side of the trail. This easement requested for legal access to their property. Legal descriptions and easement access have been drafted.
Ward- approval requires resolution for final approval by Co Board
Smith – if there are damages by the owners, who is responsible?
Johns/Smith motion to move forward to the County Board. Motion passes 3/0.
10. **Discussion and Possible Action on Kemmeter Farm Lease**
Wiesmann – introduced Joe Strupp (nutrient management and conservation practices from the Land and Water Information Office) and Kristen (grazing specialist)
Strupp – the Land & Water department has worked with Parks, a conservation plan was written when this property was first made available for agriculture. A nutrient management plan has also been in place on the property since the lease began. Establishing organic farming is time consuming (three years before it can be established), and thus not often done on rented

land.

Kirsten Jurcek – Grazing Education Specialist, there would be significant costs (estimated at \$50k +/- for fencing/water/etc.) for the infrastructure needed to convert the property into rotational grazing. True conservation, Forage & Biomass plantings to include alpha and grasses (diverse seeding) planted to establish healthy soils, this may take up to five years. There is a need in the area for hay production.

Kelly – If interested in converting to perennial crops, should the lease be extended to five years? Is the County eligible for USDA/NRCS cost-share funding?

Wiesmann – reviewed the grant application (for purchasing the property) and DNR requirements. The department is responsible to return this land to a 50 acre recreation area, bike trailhead and 70 acre habitat oak savanna and prairie. Seed costs, for a space that large, would be a Capital expense.

Wehmeier – potential to expand the current lease by 1 year so that staff can put together a restoration plan.

Johns/Kelly motion to extend lease for 1 year, requesting the current farmer plant soybeans in 2021, staff complete a transition plan for prairie restoration.

Johns/David = motion to issue Request for Proposals to include rates based on beans and rates based on corn for planting of one-year. Motion passes 4/00

11. Discussion and Possible Action on Authorizing County Conservation Aids Grant Application

Wiesmann – yearly application, this year's application is for Crawfish River Park, volunteers have secured donations to match the grant. \$2,500/\$5,000.

Johns/Smith motion to accept the grant award. Motion passes 4/0.

12. Discussion and Possible Action on Use of Parks during Closed Hours

Wiesmann – noted that grant terms and conditions along with the Natural Resource Foundation laws may override park ordinances. Ordinance amendment follows states laws for those properties.

*Proposed language: *Any boat launched at Rock River County Park or Cappies Landing during normal operating hours may utilize the park boat launches at any time outside of normal operating hours for egress purposes.*

Johns/Smith motion to approve the parks ordinance. Motion passes 4/0,

13. Discussion and Possible Action on Live Viewing Cameras of Rose Lake at Dorothy Carnes Park

Staff will continue to research cameras and pricing. No action taken.

14. Discussion on Public Information Meeting for the Interurban Trail, Phase II

Udovich – stated that a property owner along the trail asked a number of questions as they relate to that specific property. Largest concerns were related to land use and access agreements between property owners and We Energies.

15. Discussion on Historic Sites Council – October Meeting Update

Truman – submitted the following on behalf of the Historic Sites Council:

It was the desire of the committee that our next meeting we should invite representatives from the county historical societies etc, to coordinate our efforts to get information on line.

16. Discussion on Glacial Heritage Area (GHA) – Friends of GHA Activity Update

Fuller – will participate in fundraising, Natural Resources field trip (8ppl) attended, discussing potential bio-blitz in 2021

Rose Lake State Natural Area and Dorothy Carnes Park North

Restoration Implementation Plan

Project Narrative

The Jefferson County Parks Committee is requesting planning and budget information for the restoration of the 78 acres of agricultural land owned by Jefferson County along Keisling Road in the Town of Jefferson. This is known as the Kemmeter Farm. Funds have been set aside from 9 years of agricultural leases and are available for the implementation of restoration and improvements at the park. Below is a general statement of options and priorities that have been identified for the parcel since its purchase in 2011.

Acreage

- 120 Total acres of Land
 - 78 Acres of existing farmland
 - 3 acres upland woods with oak and hickory component
 - 5 acres wet woodland marsh mix
 - 25 acres of wetland

Land restoration goals

- Complete a plant inventory and develop full restoration plan for the entire 120 acres, incorporate this into the updated Carnes Park Master Plan (2021).
- Planting a complex of native vegetation with maximum biodiversity consisting of mesic short prairie grasses, native trees, and native shrubs providing the following habitat types:
 - Grasslands benefitting ground nesting birds;
 - Wet, mesic and dry soil types are present on this parcel allowing a significant variety of plantings and habitat types.
 - providing a population of robust and season-long forbes for pollinators including bees and butterflies;
 - native woodland habitats with fire adaptive qualities such as oak and hickory;
- Establishment of plant densities that will compete with other non-native and invasive plants limiting the amount of maintenance required to manage the habitat.
- Removal and control of non-native and native invasive woody plants including buckthorn, honeysuckle, boxelder, mulberry, and Siberian elm from adjacent treelines, woodlots, etc. Possibly working with willing neighbors to extend management activities beyond boundary lines.
- Management preference is to reduce the amount of Big Blue Stem and Indian Grass in seed mixes and replace with prairie dropseed, little blue stem, side oats gramma, and June grass. If possible eliminate these larger “bully” grass species in the beginning and focus these prairies on the shorter grasses only to provide a greater showcase of native forbes and better habitat for ground nesting birds.
- Continue restoration goals into the adjacent 42 acres of woods, wetlands, and fallow areas of the property that are not in the currently cropped 78 acres.

Recreation Goals

- The number one priority should be to complete an update to the 2008 Carnes Park Masterplan to incorporate this parcel, provide for public comment, establish goals, objectives, budgets, and evaluate opportunities.
- Update the 2020 Parks Recreation and Open Space Plan with implementation goals as well.
- Multiple hiking/running trails that double as management trails through the 120 acres.
- Seeking connectivity to Carnes Park West through engineered and designed boardwalks across the wetlands that fall between.
 - Maximizing the miles of trails and moving closer to a loop trail around the lake.
 - Possible trailhead parking and access off Keisling Road.
 - Connection to Carnes West highly desirable and would require a boardwalk.
- Continue to provide and improve access for youth hunting and limited access hunting in the park, especially with CWD continuing to have a presence in Jefferson County.
 - With smart design and limits on trail lengths, this parcel could be managed with more wildlife and undisturbed habitat and less high density recreation (Option for planning process).
- This property is also on the Fort Atkinson/Cambridge Intercommunity Bike route and could serve as a trail-head.
- Multiple planning processes have identified “Marsh Magic” trails, or other boardwalks and adjacent trails that could take you on an intimate walk within a wetland area.

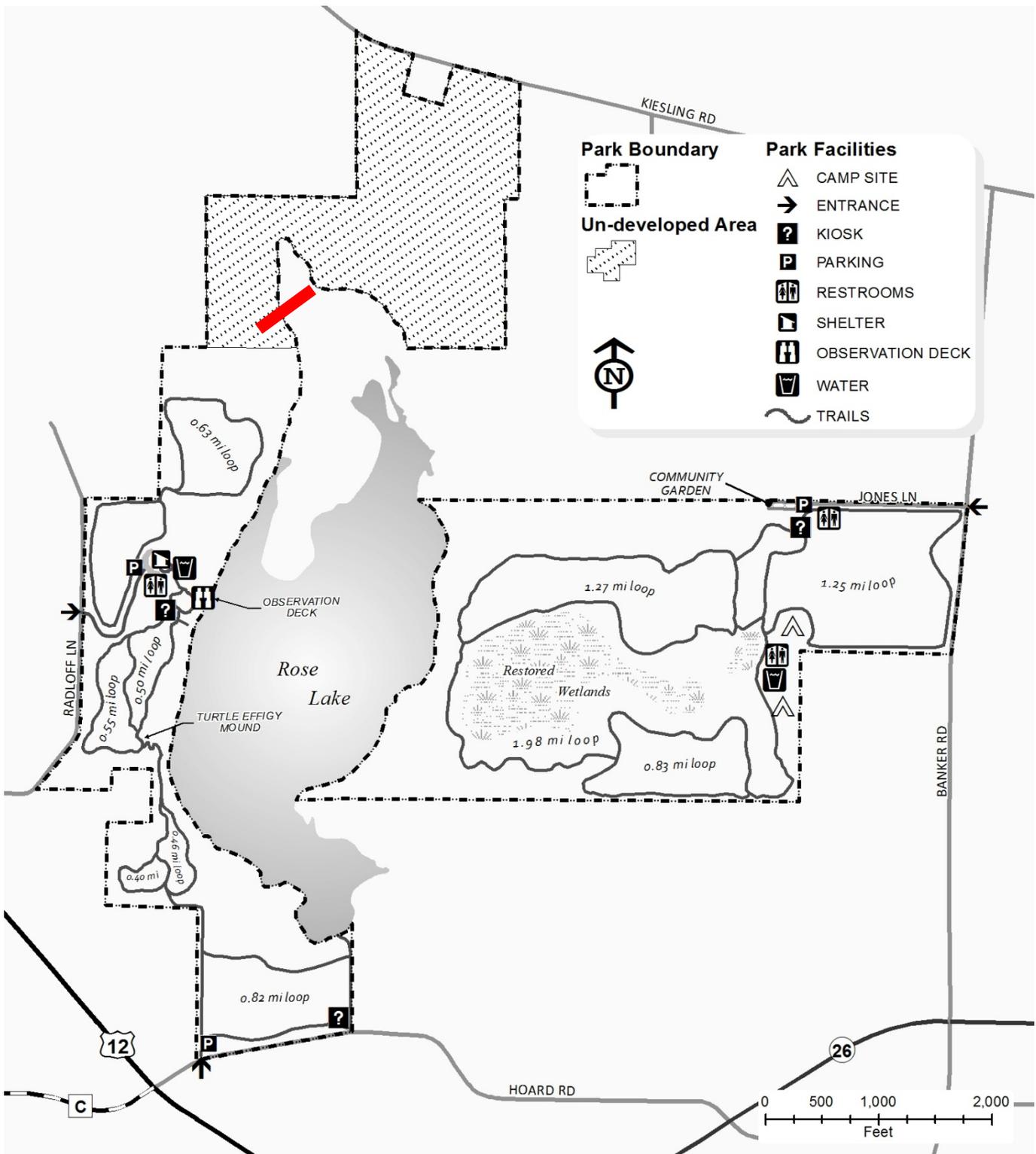
Project Budget

- Drilling Seeding 78 Acres with no-till 6’ drill seeder - \$4,800.00
- Seed, variation can be significant for purchase and some costs can be offset with collection.
 - \$500-\$800 for low diversity mix
 - \$1,200-\$2,000 for high diversity, high density and low grasses mix
 - Totals Ranging from \$39,000 - \$156,000
- Mowing three times in the first year \$3,500 per trip = \$10,500
- Herbicide spot application for two years \$5000

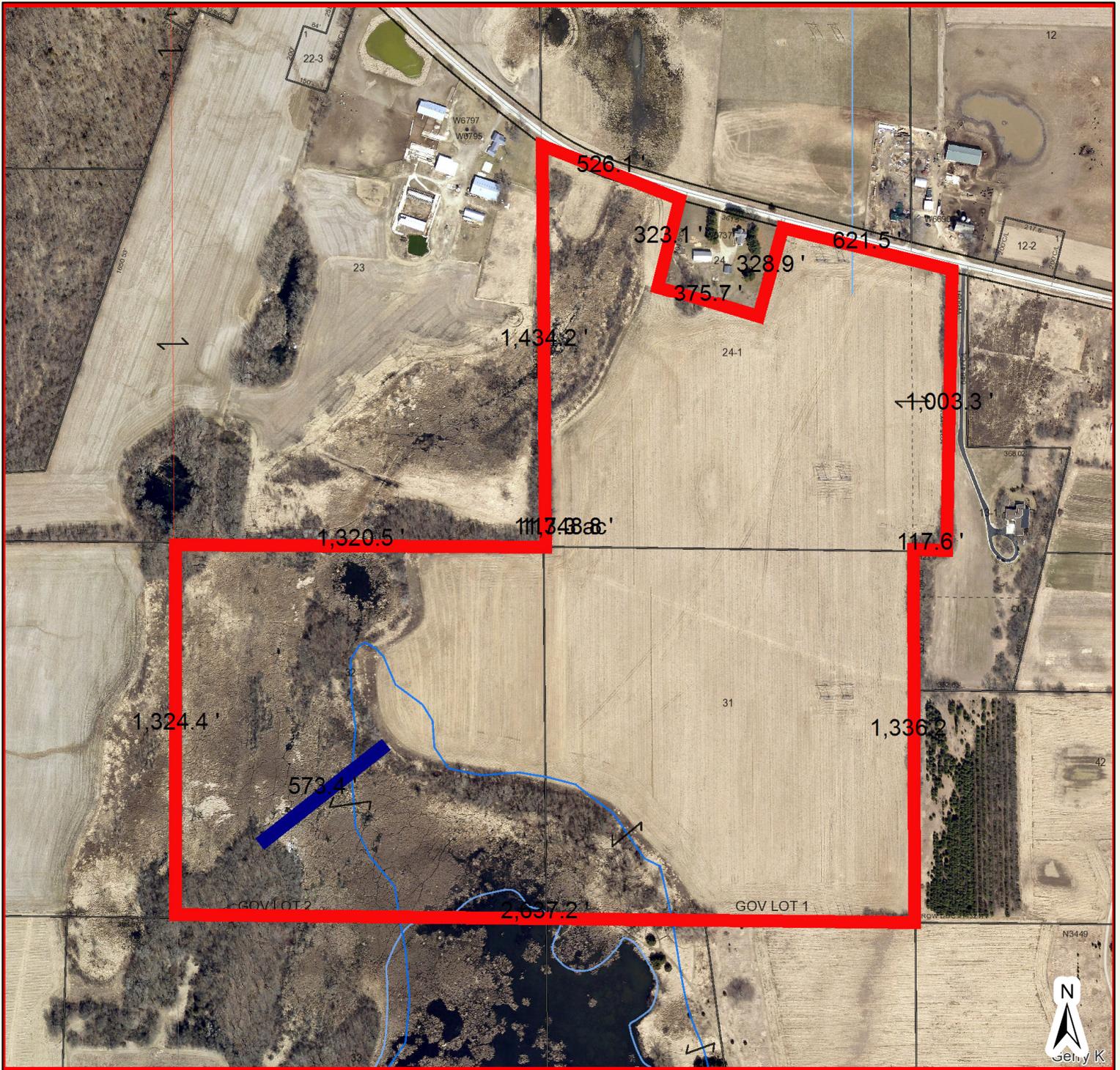
Prairie Restoration estimate based on \$1,000.00/acre seed mix and three years of management by a private restoration contractor = **\$98,300.00**

Other Recreational Improvements

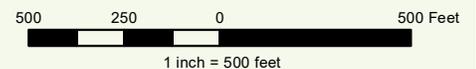
1. Boardwalk @ 570’ x 8’ with kick rail and no hand railing \$40,00-\$50,000 plus install
2. Parking and access for 10-15 cars with gravel, kiosk, some amenities (\$20,000.00)
3. Additional trails, wildlife viewing blinds, overlooks, ADA hunting blinds or platforms, viewing tower?
4. Complete Marsh Magic Trail at Carnes East?



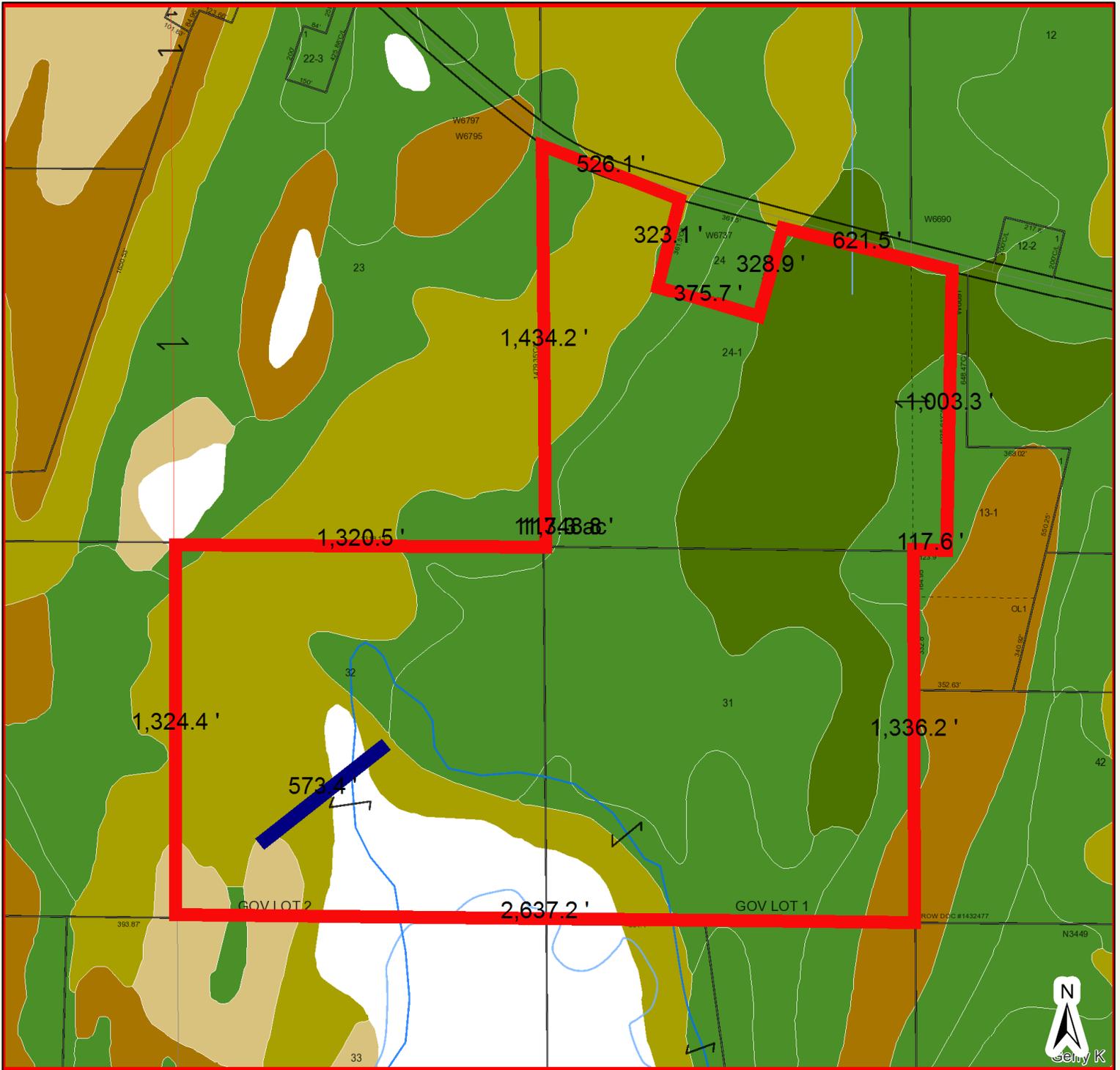
