1. Call to Order

6. Continued discussion and possible action on creating an ad hoc Evidence Based Decision Making and Data Gathering subcommittee

This subcommittee has been established and met. Ward explained that he placed this item on the agenda so the Council could ratify action at the previous meeting.

Motion by Ward/Rogge to create an ad hoc Evidence Based Decision and Data Gathering subcommittee. Motion passed 15-0.

7. Discussion and possible action on 2021 TAD Grant Application (Holler)

Holler reviewed the allowable categories. These are included in his report. Grant funding will be the same as last time. There will be no increase as we had anticipated so certain things will not be allowable. The committee met and the recommendations are included in the report. Wehmeier suggested exploring a driver’s license restoration program. No action taken.

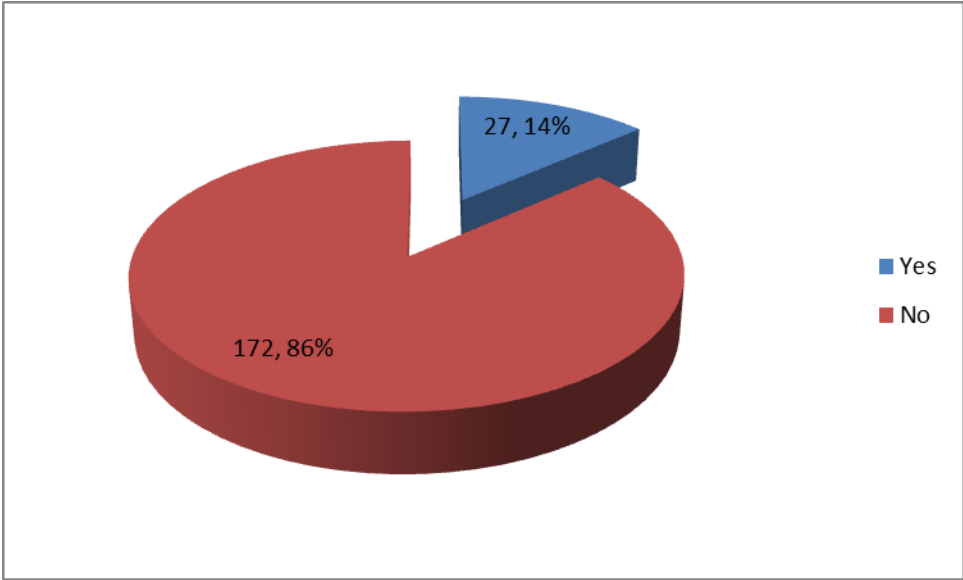
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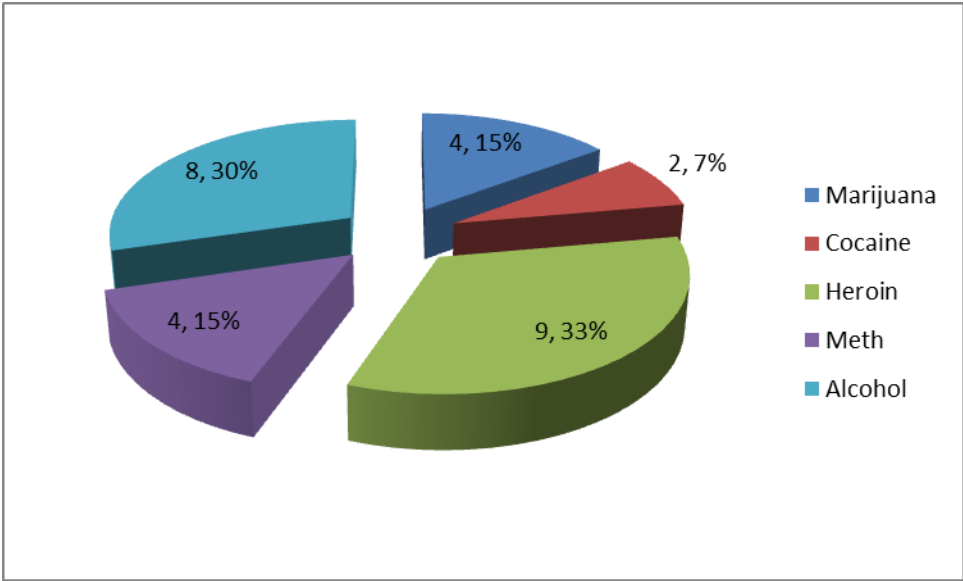
BEEN INCARCERATED WITHIN LAST 3 YEARS



REASON FOR INCARCERATION

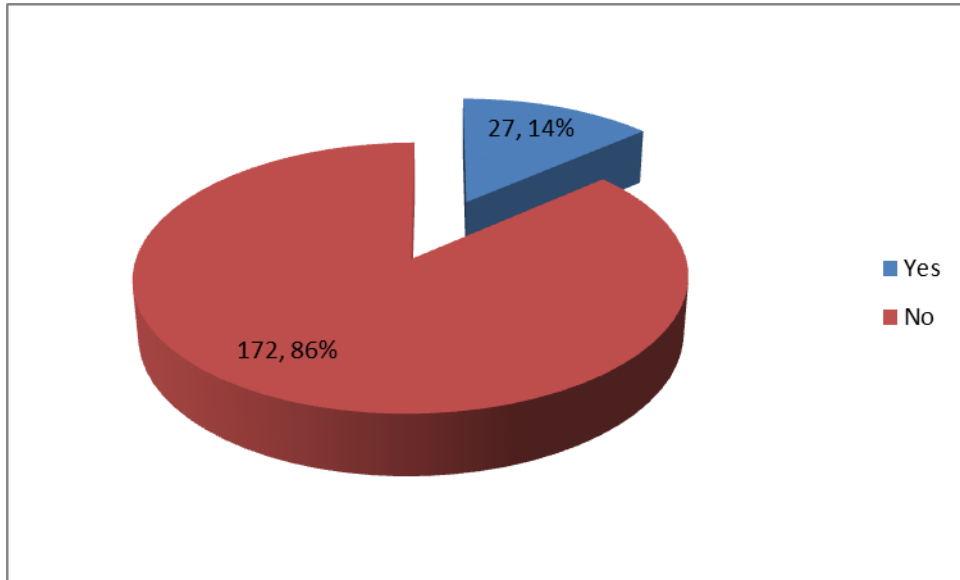


DRUGS OR ALCOHOL RELATED

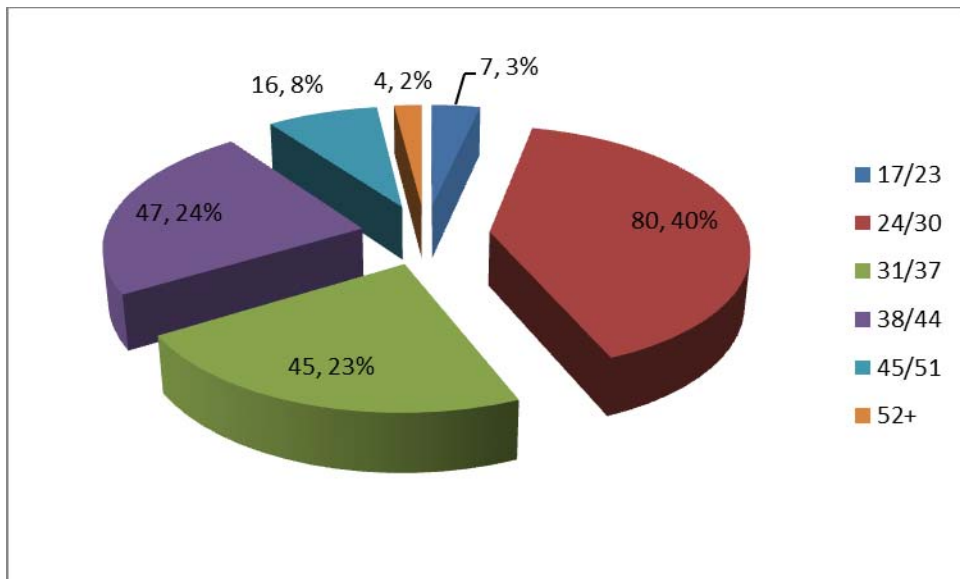


TYPE OF SUBSTANCE USED

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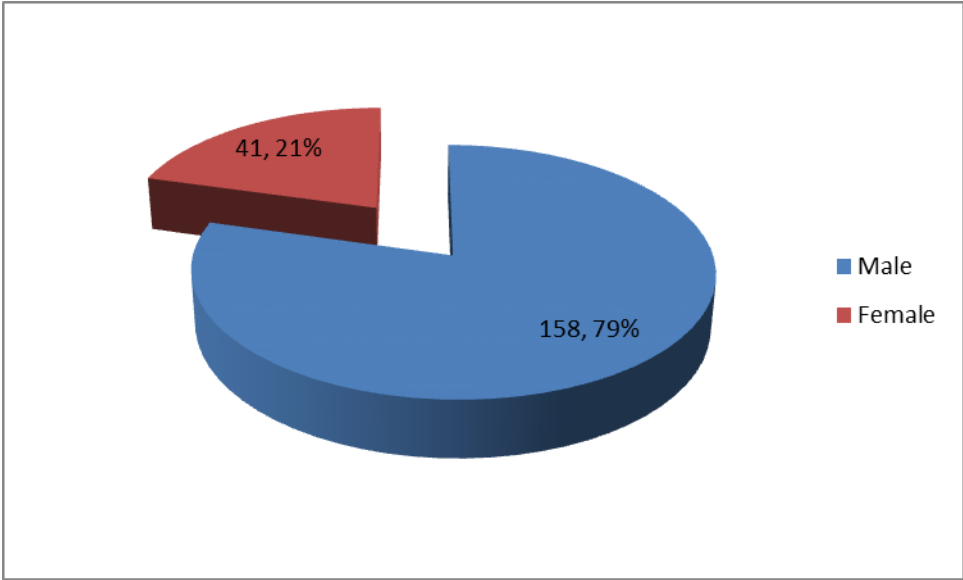


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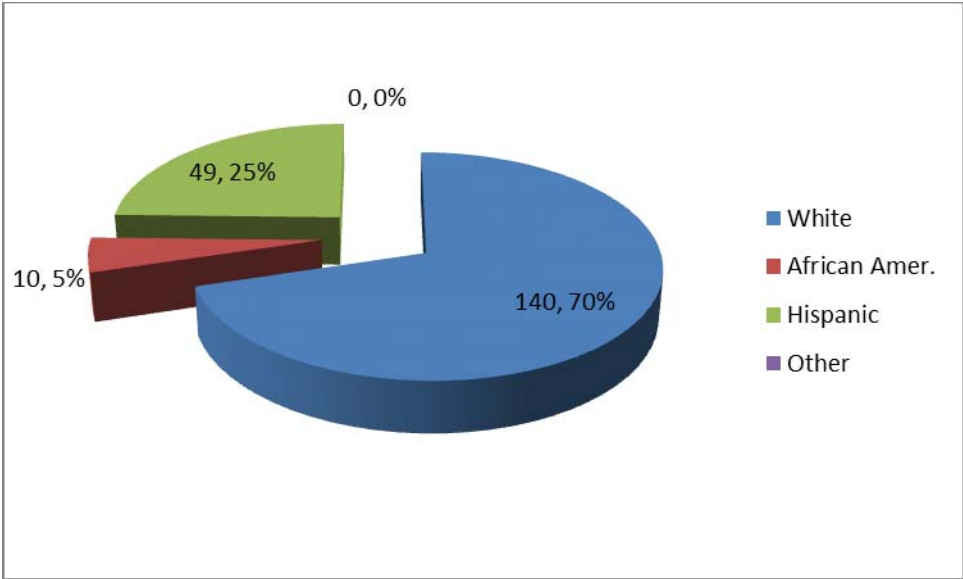

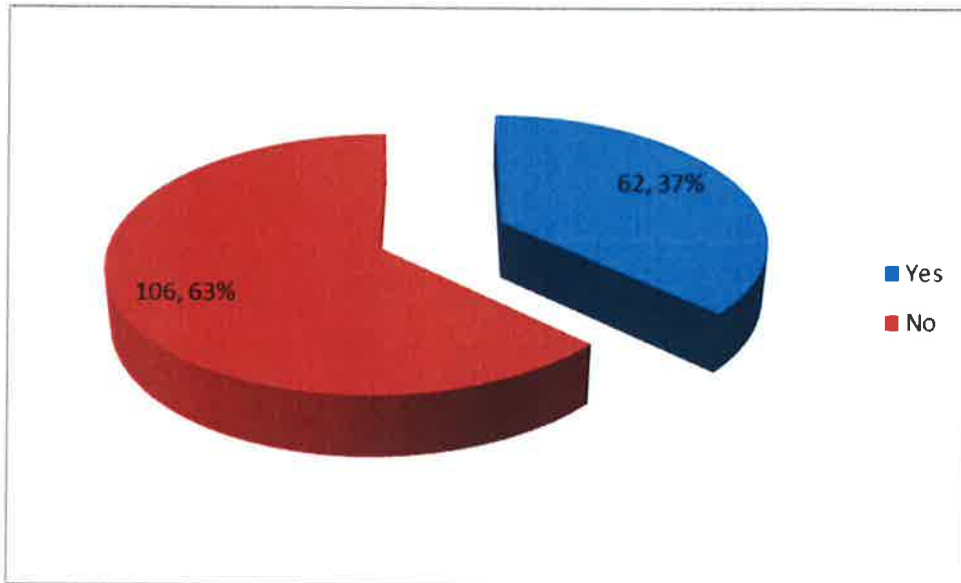
EMPLOYMENT STATUS

RE- INCARCERATION June 2021

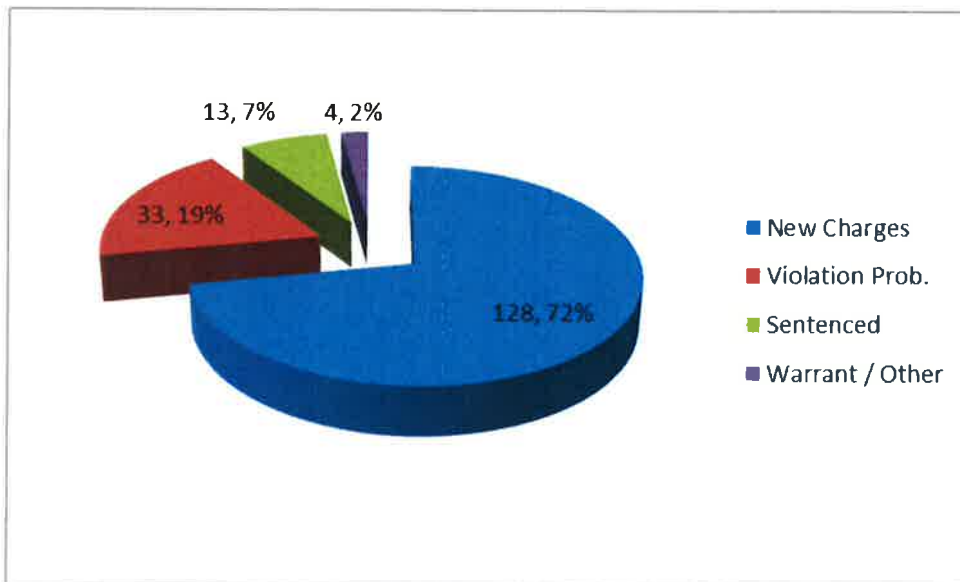


EDUCATION LEVEL

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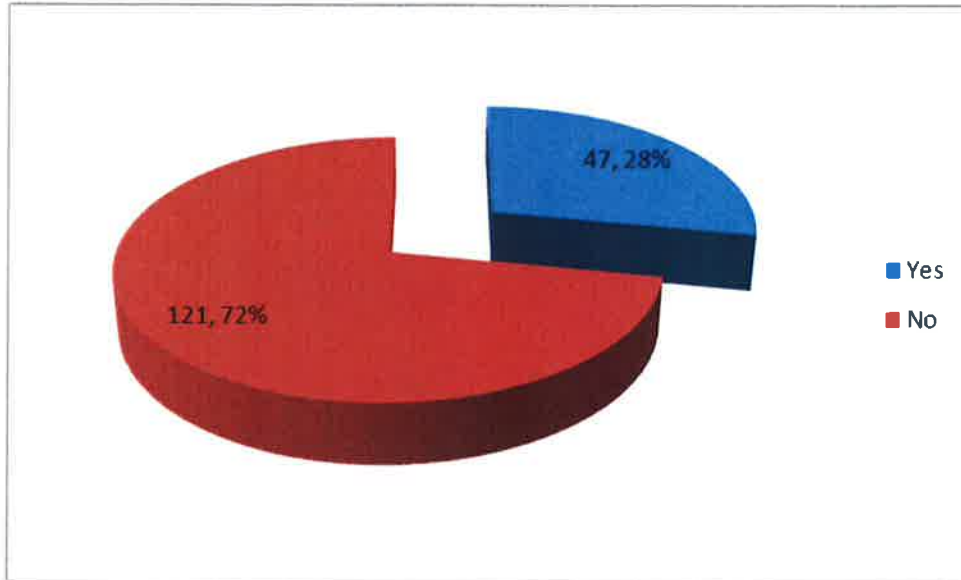


BEEN INCARCERATED WITHIN LAST 3 YEARS

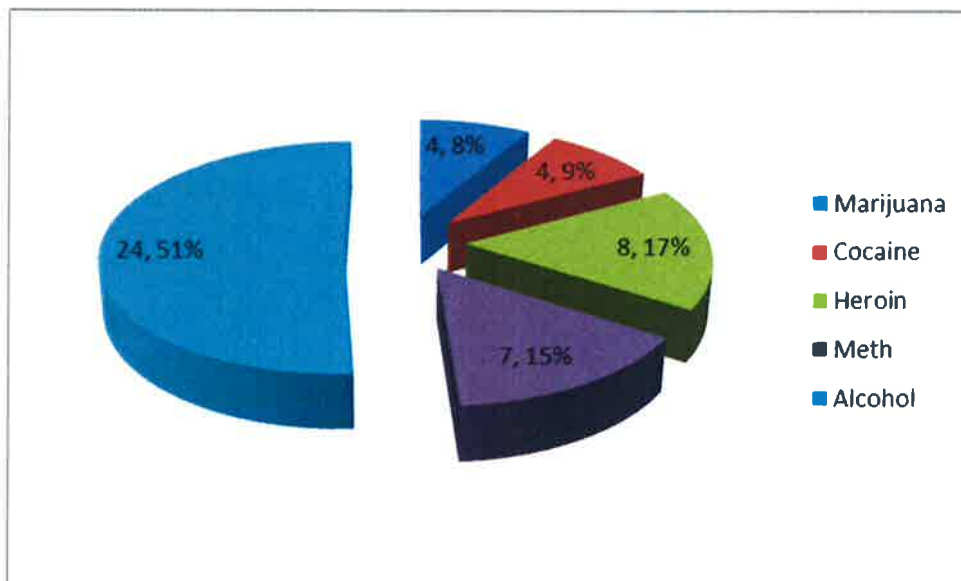


REASON FOR INCARCERATION

RE- INCARCERATION July 2021

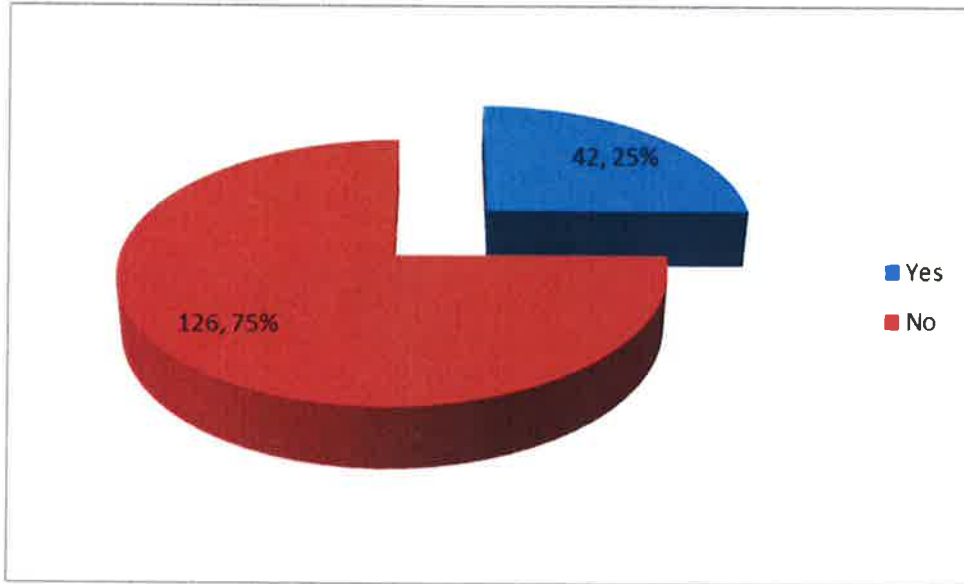


DRUGS OR ALCOHOL RELATED

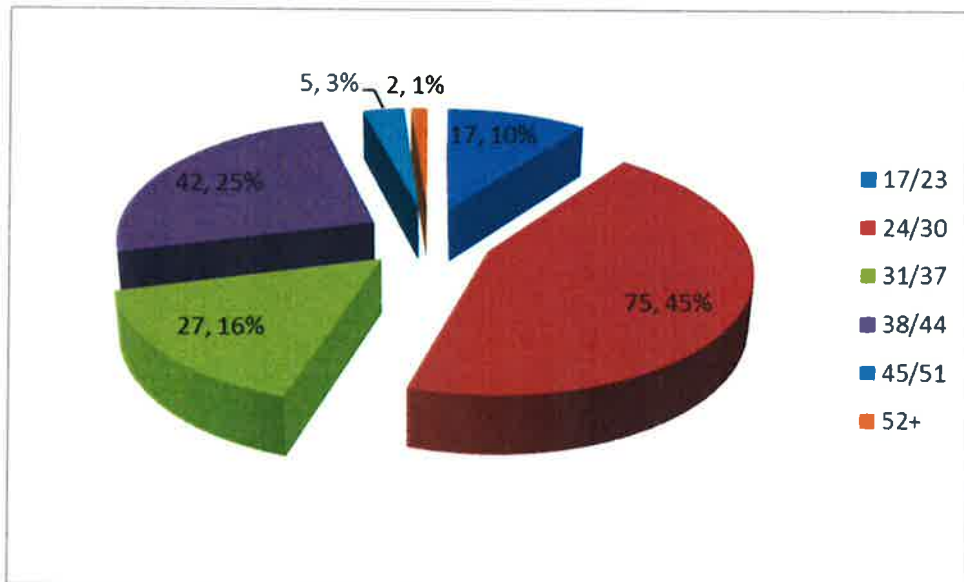


TYPE OF SUBSTANCE USED

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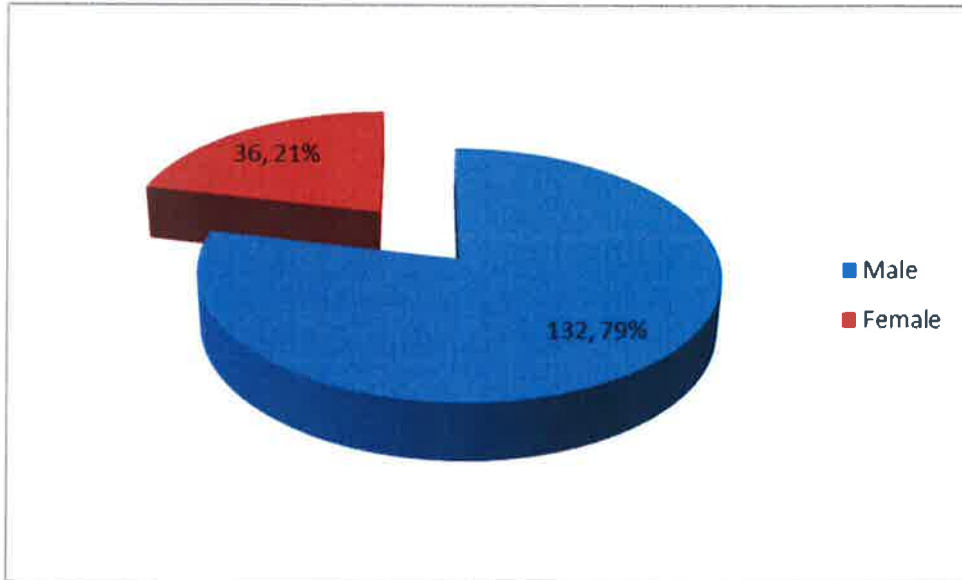


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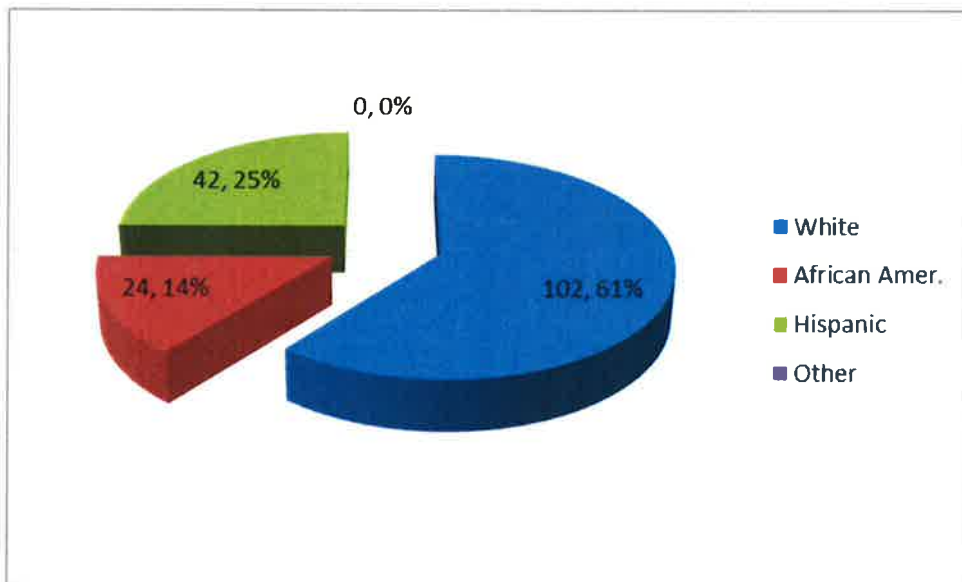

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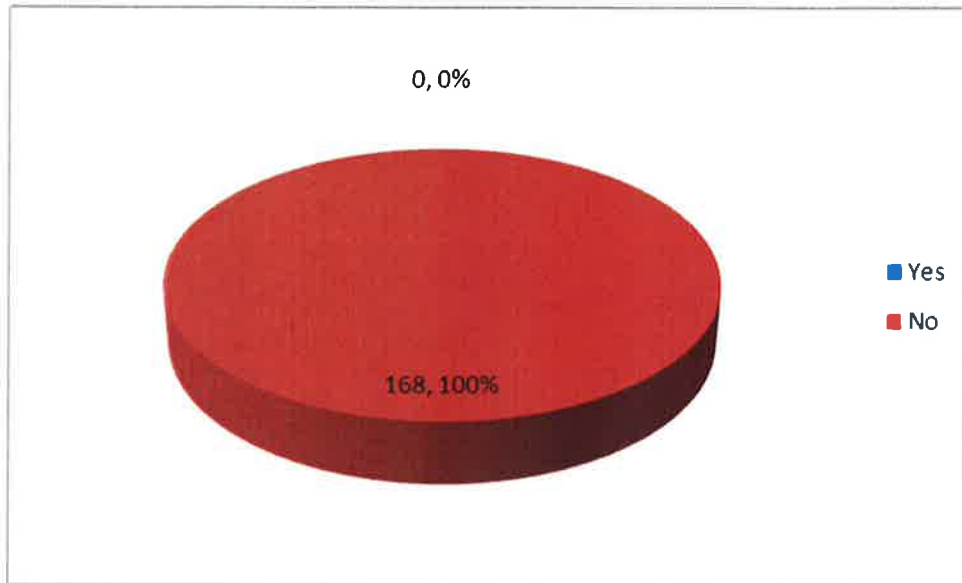

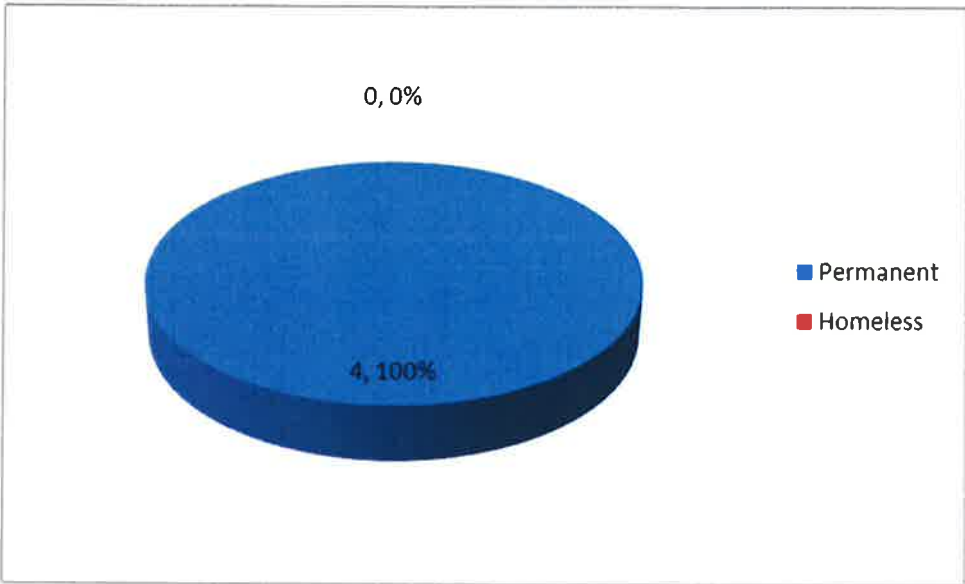


WEAPONS USED

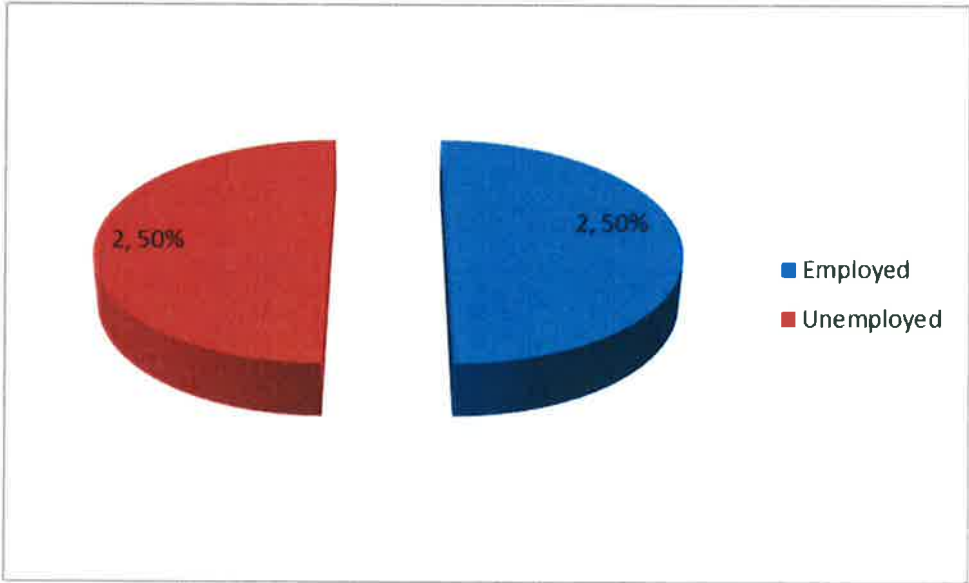


TYPE OF WEAPON

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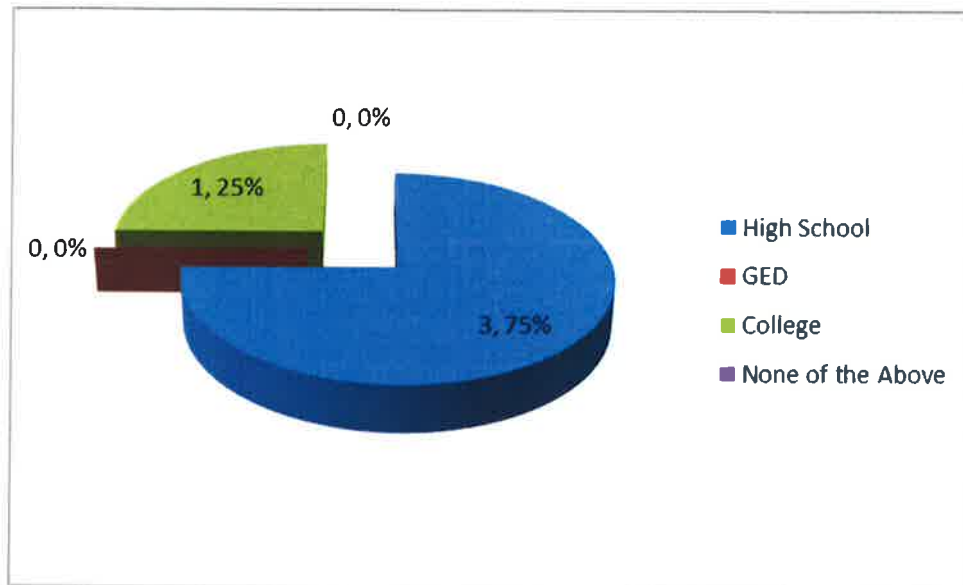

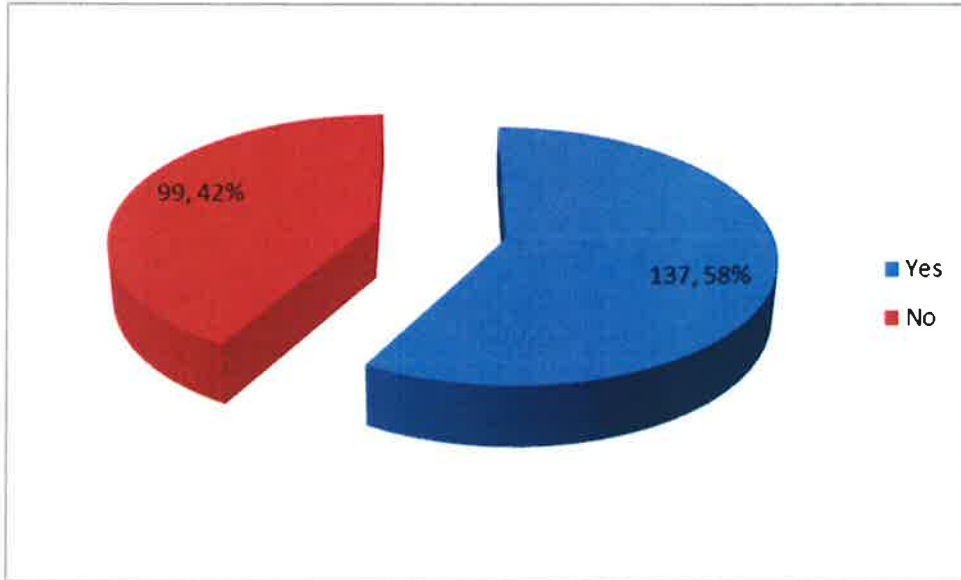
EMPLOYMENT STATUS

RE- INCARCERATION July 2021

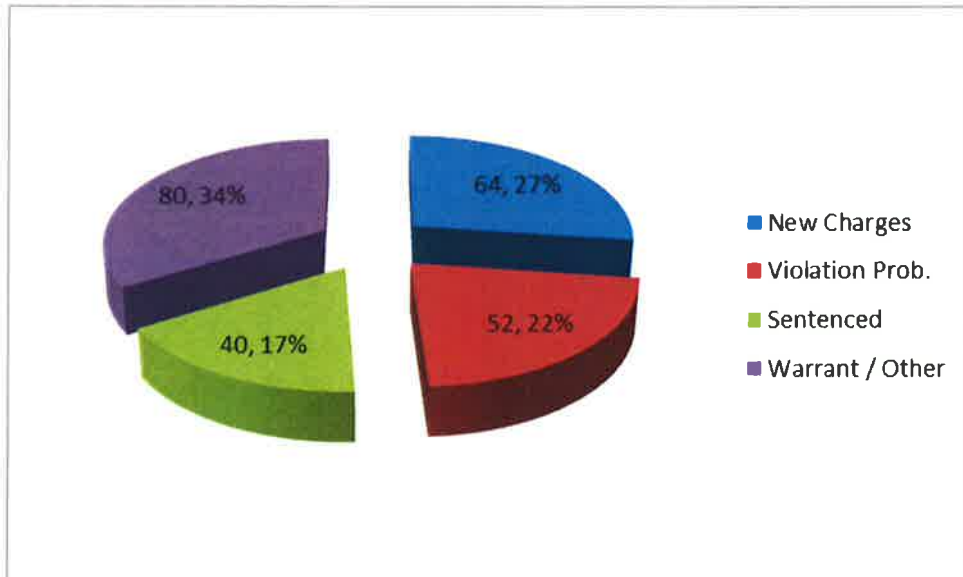


EDUCATION LEVEL

RE- INCARCERATION August 2021

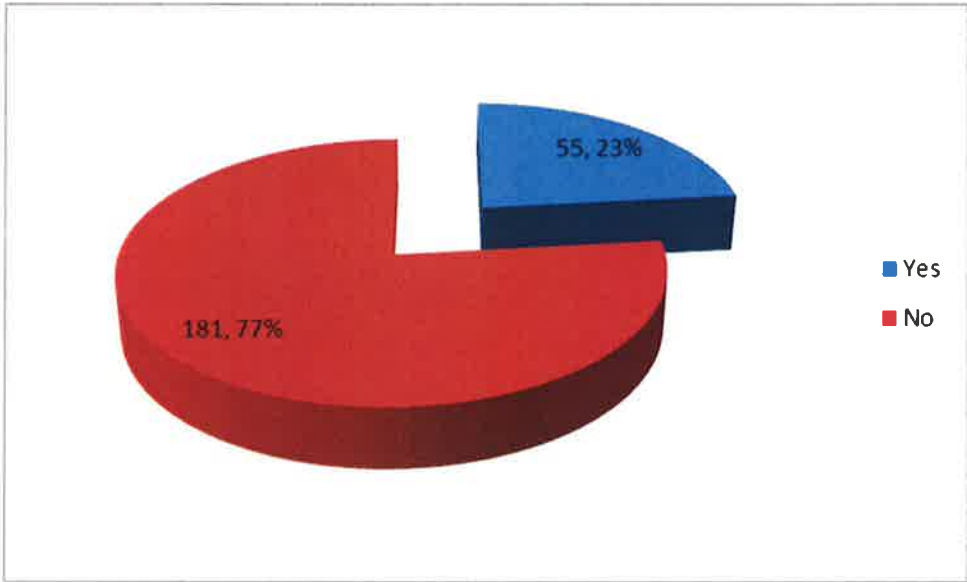


BEEN INCARCERATED WITHIN LAST 3 YEARS

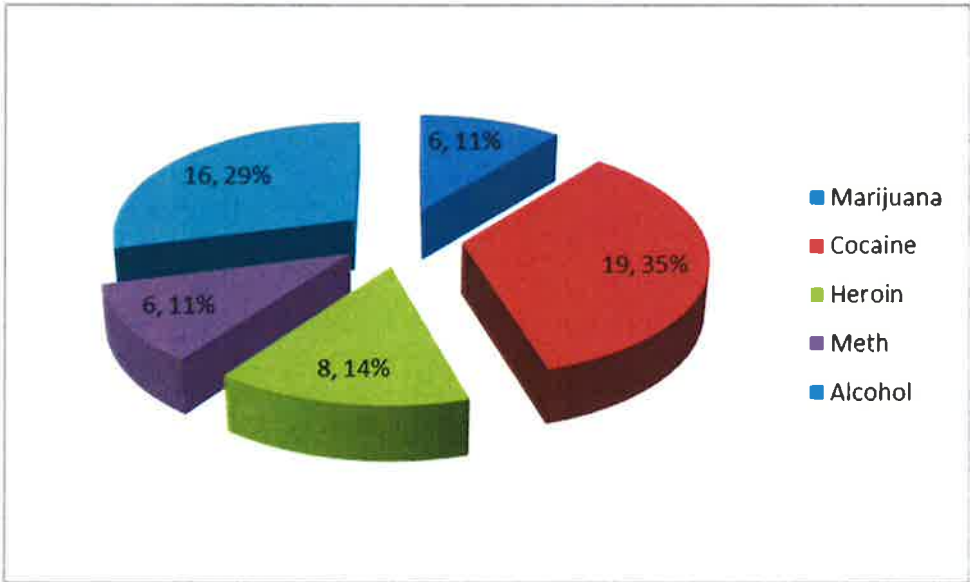


REASON FOR INCARCERATION

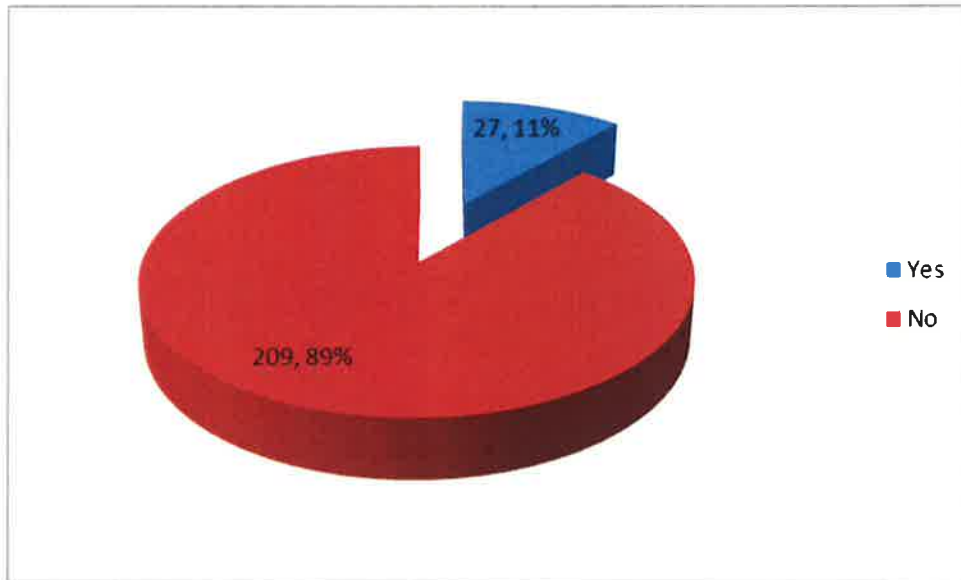


DRUGS OR ALCOHOL RELATED

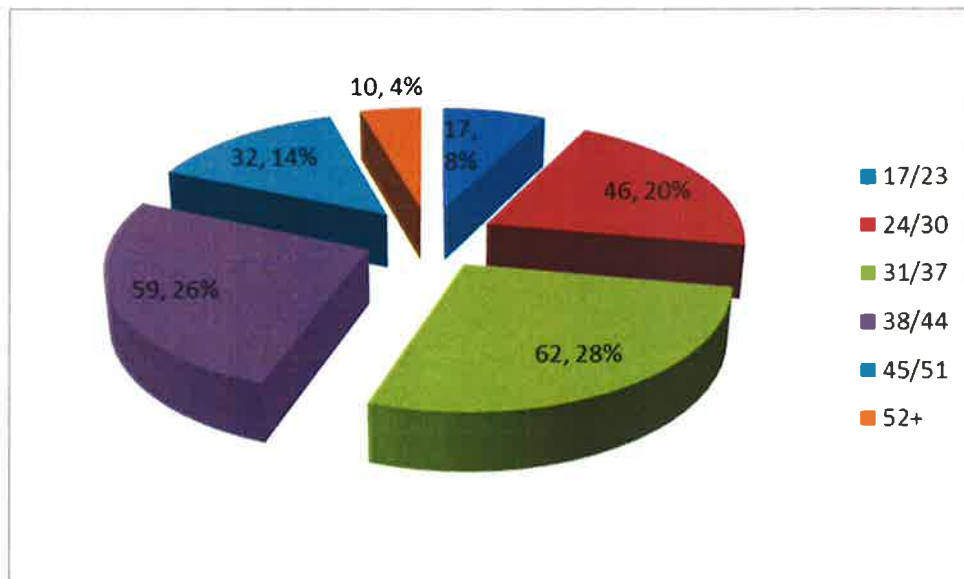


TYPE OF SUBSTANCE USED

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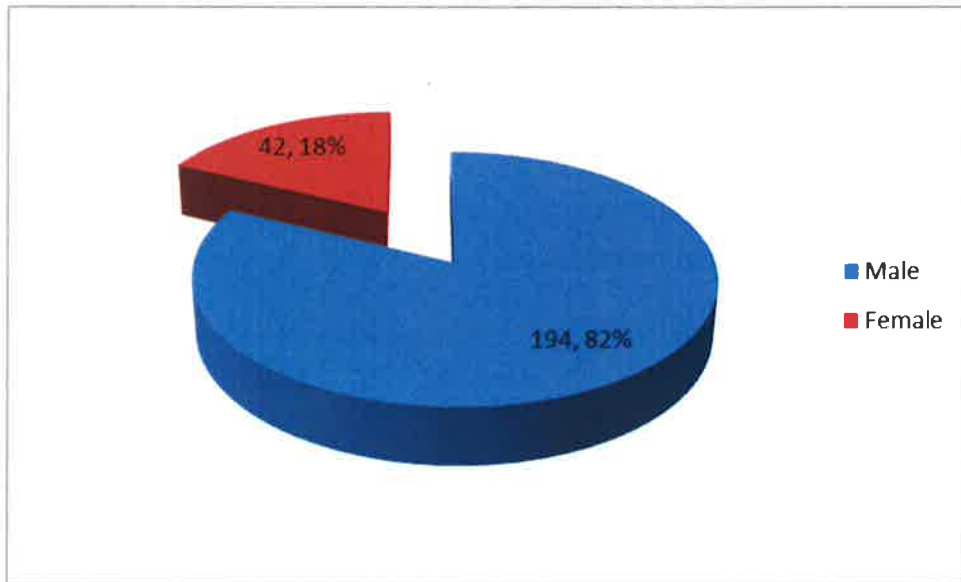


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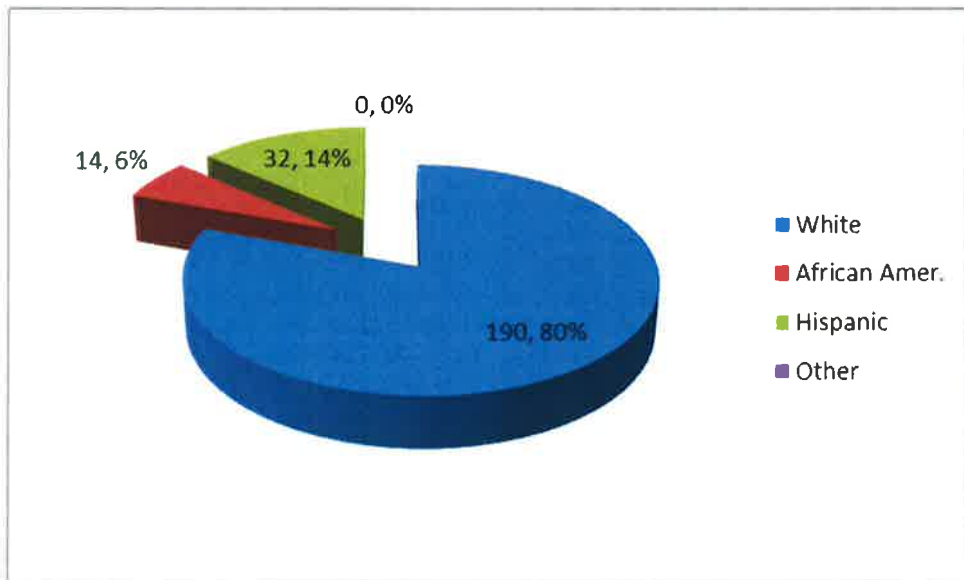


AGE PROFILE

RE- INCARCERATION August 2021

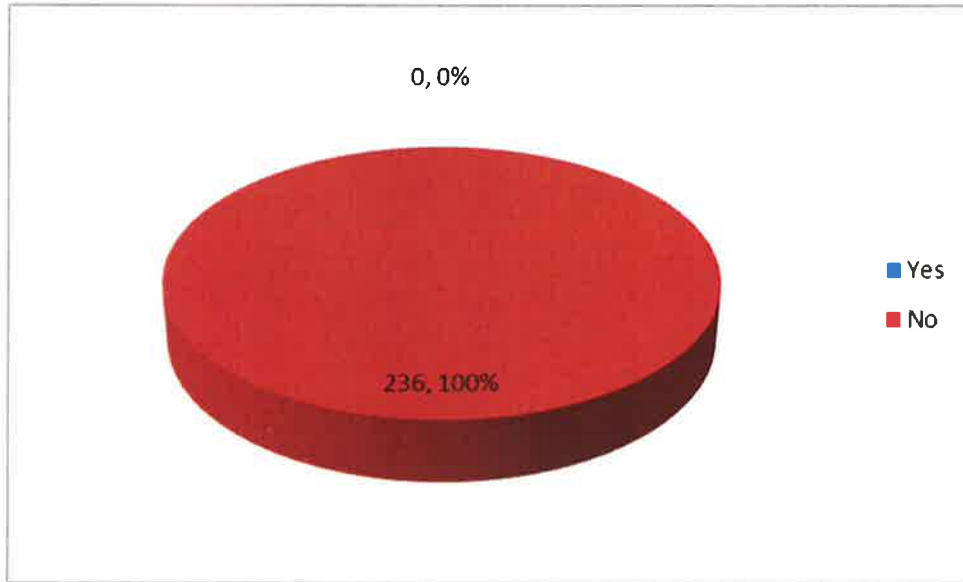


GENDER PROFILE

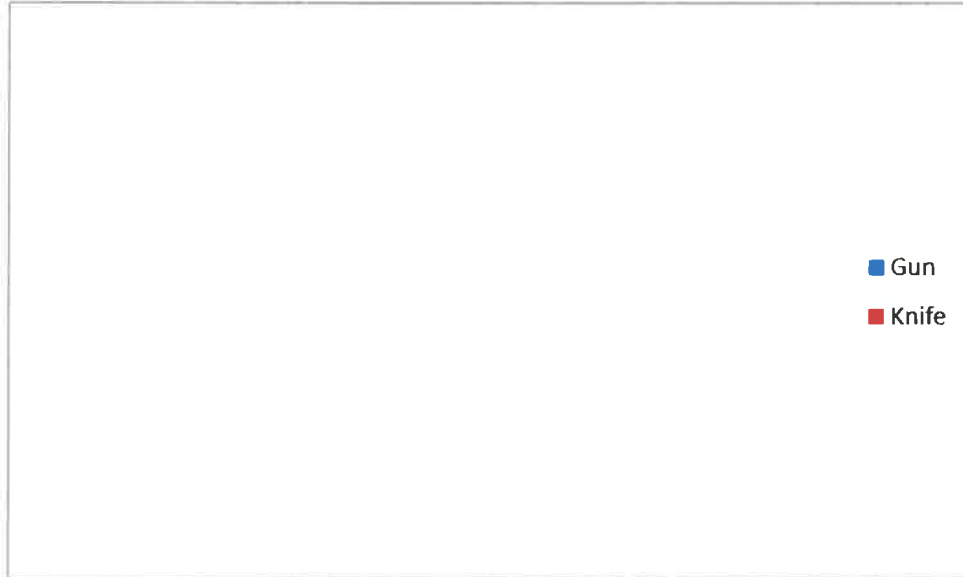


ETHNIC PROFILE

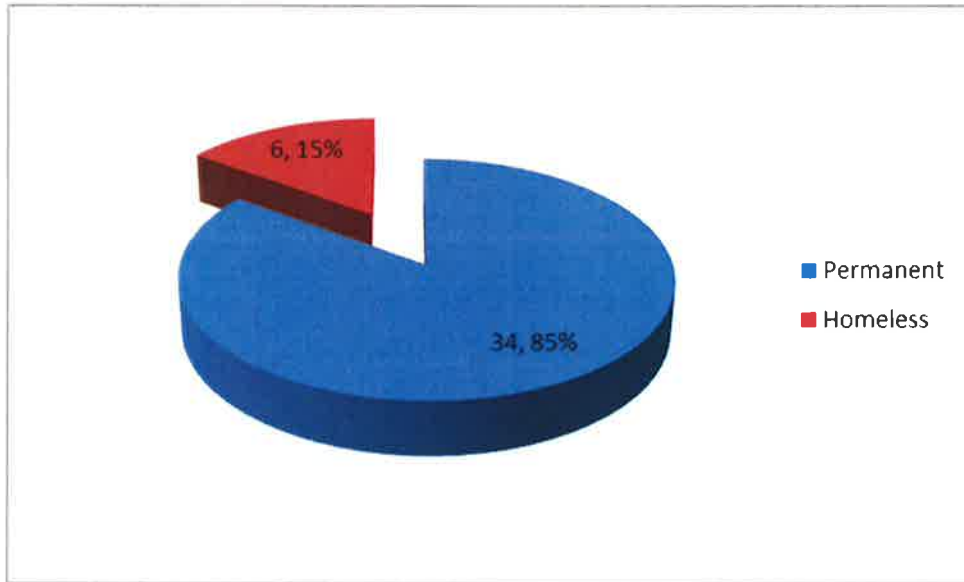


WEAPONS USED

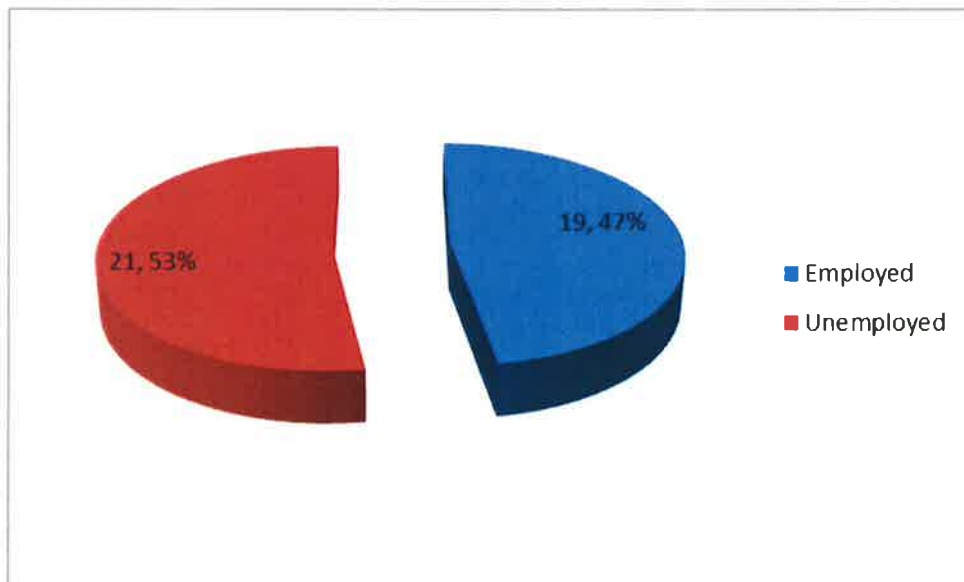


TYPE OF WEAPON

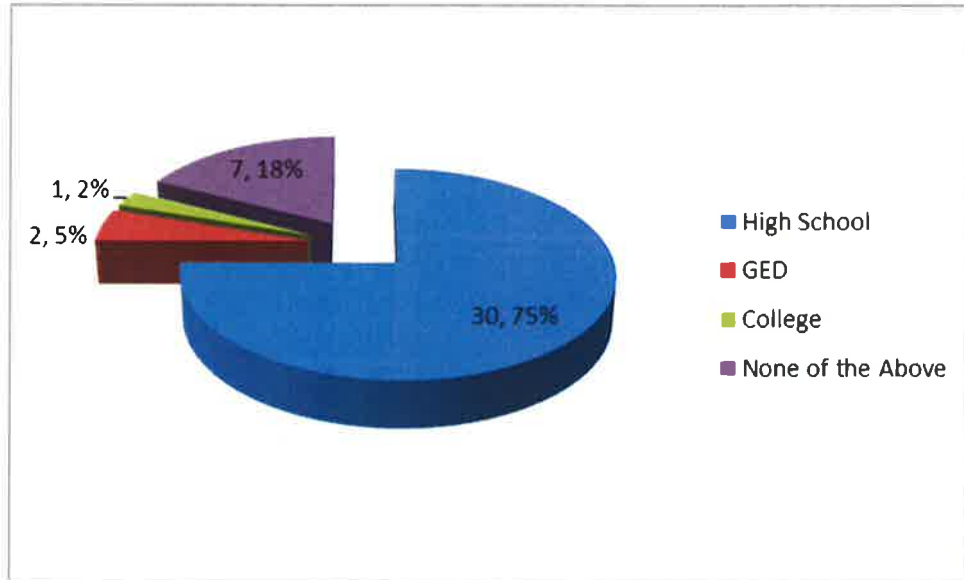
