The most recent statement of revenues and expenditures was distributed.



#### **DATCP REPORT**

#### **Bureau of Land and Water Resources**

#### September 2021

#### Verification of Depth to Bedrock Technical Standard

- The technical standard DATCP 01 Verification of Depth to Bedrock is published. The technical standard language and an accompanying guidance document are available on our <u>website</u>. The purpose of the standard is to provide criteria, methodology, and the qualifications for verification of depth to bedrock to support implementation of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Wis. Admin. Code s. NR 151.075 in areas where the bedrock consists of Silurian dolomite with a depth to bedrock of 20 feet or less.
- We are currently working to develop curriculum for training individuals interested in becoming qualified to collect depth to bedrock verification data. We are also establishing the requirements for conservation engineering practitioners who voluntarily seek certification through DATCP's Conservation Engineering Practitioner Certification, which is available to government employees. We don't have a specific timeline for these efforts yet, but are planning to roll the training out later this year.

#### Farmland Preservation Program and Agricultural Enterprise Areas

- The Agricultural Enterprise Area Petition Evaluation Committee met August 11<sup>th</sup> to review petitions for AEAs in Buffalo and Douglas Counties.
- Comprehensively revised farmland preservation plans were approved for Dodge and Fond du Lac Counties. A new farmland preservation plan was approved for Taylor County.
- Farmland Preservation Planning grants are now available for counties that need to update or revise their Farmland Preservation Plan. Contact DATCPWorkingLands@wisconsin.gov for more information.

#### **Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP)**

• Due to the ongoing drought this year FSA has opened up several of our CREP counties for landowners to request emergency haying or grazing approval on their CREP sites. Counties eligible for haying or grazing CRP are shown in the following FSA map. FSA approval is needed prior to landowners beginning any haying or grazing activities on CREP enrolled land. Landowners that receive FSA approval should work with their LCD's to complete and submit the State/County "2021 Request to Temporarily Release Lands for Emergency Haying and Grazing" form along with supporting FSA documents to DATCP. The form is for use with County/State CREP 15 Year agreements or perpetual easements with active FSA CRP1 contracts. Submittal to DATCP is over the internet via the CREP Secure FTP site. DATCP sent an email to the LCD's on 8/16/2021 that included the State/County form and additional details regarding the emergency haying and grazing eligibility and provisions. The project is located between State Truck Highway 96 in Outagamie County, WI to County Truck Highway F in Brown County, WI. ## Authorizing the Application and Implementation of a Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Healthy Lakes and Rivers Grant

#### **Executive Summary**

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources has a grant program called Healthy Lakes and Rivers which assists landowners with practice implementation costs related to the installation of native plant shoreland gardens and rain gardens. These practices protect the quality of the lakes and rivers. The Jefferson County Land and Water Conservation Department applies for the DNR funds on behalf of property owners who want to install the conservation practices. The Land and Water Conservation Committee considered this resolution at its September 22, 2021, meeting and recommended forwarding to the County Board to authorize the Land and Water Conservation Department Director to submit a grant application and supporting documents seeking \$11,000 in grant funds to the Wisconsin DNR for funding to support the Healthy Lakes and Rivers Program.
