INCLUSION OF BATTERY STORAGE FACILITIES AS SHARED

REVENUE/UTILITY AID: Zach Hill, Sr. Public & Community Affairs Manager, Alliant Energy introduced himself and thanked everyone for allowing him time to speak. Mr. Hill provided information on shared revenue and the goals set by Alliant to be carbon neutral by 2050. Mr. Hill also spoke about powerplant shutdowns and when they might occur, and what that could mean for Columbia and Sheboygan counties. Mr. Hill also talked about solar projects around the state. Discussion followed.

WCA REPORT: Dan Bahr provided an overview of what the State Budget will look like and how the WCUTA asks will be affected. Mr. Bahr also said the JFC road show will take place in April. Mark O'Connell, WCA President & CEO, provided an update on different aspects of the State Budget as well as a WCA update. Discussion followed.

NEW BUSINESS: Mr. Goehring said that in his more than ten years with this association that WCUTA is closer than ever to seeing a real change. Discussion followed.

Re: Requested Utility Aid Updates – 2023-25 Biennial Budget

On behalf of the above-listed Wisconsin-based associations and investor-owned utilities representing hundreds of employers, thousands of your constituents, and several million taxpayers and ratepayers, we are respectfully requesting the first significant update to the Utility Aid formula since the mid-2000s. We encourage the Joint Finance Committee to adopt the following changes to the Utility Aid formula to ensure that the quality services provided by local units of government that host energy-generating infrastructure delivering heat and electricity are executed in a cost-effective manner as new energy-providing resources come online. These modest updates would benefit Wisconsin taxpayers, ratepayers, and municipal governments.

Please include the two primary updates/modifications to the current Utility Aid formula in the Joint Finance Committee's 2023-25 biennial budget proposal:

- 1. Include Utility Aid for energy storage facilities hosted by counties and municipalities.
 - a. This would apply to the current and future construction of facilities necessary for renewable energy storage and incentivize local governments to host this form of utility property in their communities. Wisconsin utilities have announced plans to add more than 500 megawatts of energy storage technologies over the next few years. The current Utility Aid statutes do not contemplate energy storage because they have advanced significantly since state statutes were last updated.
- 2. Update existing Incentive Aid Payments to keep pace with municipal service costs.
 - a. 50% adjustment to incentive aid payment provision of \$600 per megawatt to \$900 per megawatt on the site of: or adjacent to an existing or decommissioned plant or on a brownfield or adjacent to a brownfield.
 - b. 50% adjustment to incentive aid payment provision of \$1,000 per megawatt to \$1,500 per megawatt that derives energy from an alternative energy resource.
