# Financial Statement Summary

## May, 2023

We are projecting a positive year-end fund balance of \$922,734. This balance includes our carryover from 2022, including \$650,000 from our reserve carryover. This early in the year, most projections are still very volatile. With this projection, we have, at this point, a surplus of only \$272,734, when the reserve is excluded.

### Summary of Variances:

- **We are projecting \$4,933,636 in total CCS expenses, compared to budgeted costs of \$4,849,727.** Our projection for current, internal staff has us \$950,134 under budget for costs. However, this is offset by contractor costs, where we are projected to be \$962,490 over budget. The contractor costs tend to be expensive, especially for those that serve a high number of clients. Because the MA rates are capped, we don't capture a corresponding amount of revenue from contractors as their rates increase. We would capture that as part of next year's WIMCR reconciliation. Finally, we've only billed two months of CCS revenue to date. **As such, our revenue is projected to be \$4,250,267, compared to a budget of \$4,820,930.** This is leading to a CCS budget deficiency.
- Hospitalizations and detox are driving a large unfavorable balance for mental health. **Hospital/Detox is projected to be over budget (unfavorable) by \$279,765 (Net basis):**

This would be our largest hospital expense amount in several years. Total hospital expenses were under \$1.3 million last year, compared to a projection of about \$1.7 million this year. State Institute charges for the past several years are shown below:

The April 2023 State Institute bill was \$77,970. The May bill was \$18,840. However, that bill included a revenue payment of \$66,302, which the State said will be taken back in an upcoming month.

- **The Nutrition Programs – Home Delivered Meals, Site Meals, and NSIP – are projected to have a combined \$766 net favorable balance.** We are presenting these programs with a combined, net balance, because GWAAR has allowed us to flex the costs and funding among them in recent years. While ARPA revenue is down, participant contributions and MCO funding is up.

- **CLTS revenue is projected to be under budget by \$191,515. CLTS expenses are projected to be under budget by \$257,659.** This is one area that is extremely hard to project at this point, and it will be very volatile for the next few months. One new CLTS position for 2023 was just filled, and we expect to fill another one still this year.
- **Salary expenses are projected to be under budget by \$1,385,675:** This is because of numerous vacant or unfilled positions. On the BH side, most of this is because of CCS and EMH positions. Additionally, the CPS and Intake teams in the Children and Families Division have seen numerous vacancies throughout the year, as well. Finally, as noted above, some of the new 2023 CLTS SSC positions are unfilled. The ADRC has also been understaffed for most of the year.
- **Fringes and benefit expenses are projected to be under budget by \$680,837.** This would be due to several reasons. One, it would correspond to salaries and vacant positions. Two, we are seeing a large variance in health insurance costs, as many more staff opted out of the health insurance program that we projected when doing the budget.
- **Children Alternate Care expenses are projected to be under budget by \$725,551.** This projection includes Shelter and Detention costs. We did decrease our alternate care budget in 2023. As shown on the Alternate Care summary, we have no group homes and one RCC placement.
- **CRS and adult alternate care costs are projected to be \$94,663 and \$17,310 over budget, respectively.** These projections have increased since last month because of a new, high-cost CRS placement. CRS will have some MA billing (this year) and WIMCR recovery (next year) to help offset the costs.
- The Transportation program continues to see an increased demand for services. **As such, we are projecting revenue to exceed the budget by \$72,184, while expenses are projected to exceed the budget by \$147,524 for a net unfavorable balance of \$75,339.** We did receive one new van from the State grant, and our projections includes reducing the rental van.
- **Costs related to the HOPE (housing) program are projected to be over budget by \$177,096.**
- **Income Maintenance Consortium revenue and costs are projected to be in-line with the budget.** While we have some decreased costs because of vacant positions, this is offset by some increased ARPA costs and increased staff OT projecting to assist with the unwinding. In both cases, we do have additional revenue to cover those costs.
- **Operating Reserve:** We are projecting a year-end balance of \$650,000 in the operating reserve this year.

**BEHAVIOR HEALTH DIVISION:** Projected unfavorable balance of \$1,032,215. This is because of hospitalization expenses and decreased CCS and EMH billing.

**CHILDREN & FAMILY DIVISION:** Projected favorable balance of \$1,208,995 because of reduced alternate care costs and staffing/positions, along with increased CLTS revenue.

**ECONOMIC SUPPORT DIVISION:** Projected favorable balance of \$52,497.

**AGING & ADRC DIVISION:** Projected favorable balance of \$2,630.

**ADMINISTRATIVE DIVISION:** Projected favorable balance of \$40,826.

**OPERATING RESERVE:** Projected favorable balance of \$650,000.





# Parents Supporting Parents

## Wisconsin's Parent Partner Model in Child Welfare



### Guiding Principles

The Parents Supporting Parents Guiding Principles are grounded in a family-centered and strengths-based framework and are designed to guide the development and operations of Parents Supporting Parents (PSP) programs at the state and local level. The Guiding Principles apply to all components of the PSP program: peer partner direct services, parent voice at the local systems level, and parent voice at the state systems level.

-  Families that have directly experienced the child welfare system have insights and information on programming and system improvements that child welfare professionals and other stakeholders don't have.
-  Child welfare policies, strategies and services will result in more successful outcomes for children and families when the voice of lived experience is incorporated at all levels.
-  Acknowledging the expertise and ideas of parents who have experienced the child welfare system leads to mutual trust and respect between families and the child welfare system.
-  Ongoing communication between the child welfare professionals and parents with lived experience is key to building trust, demonstrating respect for expertise shared, and parents' ongoing engagement.
-  Engaging people with lived experience leads to new and different insights and provides results that meet the needs of those using the system.
-  Inclusion and embracing diversity of individuals, communities and cultures enriches child welfare system improvement work.
-  The culture of child welfare agencies and the system must be welcoming and emotionally safe for parents with lived experience to share their insights and stories.
-  Those most impacted by racial disparities in child welfare must be engaged as leaders in systems improvement; the child welfare system can address racial disparities and reduce bias by listening to and incorporating their interests, ideas, and concerns.
-  The time, expertise and insights of parents with lived experience is of real value to Wisconsin's child welfare system and their contributions deserve compensation.




# Parents Supporting Parents

## Wisconsin's Parent Partner Program in Child Welfare

### How PSP Connects to Wisconsin's Child Welfare Model for Practice:

- ★ Develops shared **trust** between the system, those who work in it, and those served by it.
- ★ Cultivates shared **respect** between the system and those experiencing the system, by acknowledging the worth, ideas, and experiences of the parents who have navigated the child protective services (CPS) system.
- ★ Authentic **engagement** with parents at the direct service, and systems change level is a cornerstone of the program and its effectiveness.
- ★ Holds the system **accountable** to the experiences families have when navigating the CPS system by seeking out the expertise and experiences of families to inform change.
- ★ Grounded in **trauma-informed** practices and principles.
- ★ Is **culturally responsible** by reducing biases, stigmas, and other disparities that families may be facing when navigating the CPS system, and that the system may not be aware of.
- ★ Includes an extensive and comprehensive **workforce support** system to ensure that parents who are professionals within the program, are fully prepared and supported to carry out their peer mentor role.
- ★ Every aspect of PSP is **family-centered** and deeply strengths-based. The program is founded on the idea that a parent's lived experience is expertise. Parents provide peer mentorship to other families newly experiencing the child welfare system.

### Mission

Parents Supporting Parents (PSP) cultivates the leadership of Wisconsin parents who have lived experience in the child welfare system to serve as models of hope and sources of support for parents experiencing public child welfare and to shape services and systems that promote child safety, permanency and family well-being.

### Vision

Parent voices are elevated and supported as key partners in the child welfare process and toward systems improvement efforts in order to promote resilient and thriving Wisconsin families, communities and systems.

### About the Program

Wisconsin's parent partner model (PSP) is an evidence-based model that is aimed at empowering parents with lived Child Welfare experience as mentors to parents currently within the child welfare system.

Parents Supporting Parents in Wisconsin follows the evidence-based Iowa's parent partner model and is becoming the third state to implement and evaluate this model. PSP innovation zones in Wisconsin are **Door**, **Jefferson**, and **Rock** counties.

### PSP Benefits to Parents & Families

Research on Parent Partner programs demonstrate strong positive outcomes for participating parents:

- Higher rates of reunification and lower rates of re-entry in to the system
- A greater belief in one's self and hope
- Knowledge of how to advocate for themselves
- Organizational skills and access to resources

### PSP Engages the Expertise of Parents in Child Welfare Systems Change

Parents who have experienced the child welfare system are engaged as leaders through:



**Direct service:** providing peer support to parents who are currently navigating the child welfare system.



**Local systems change:** impacting and informing needed systems change by advising in their county and community.



**State systems change:** contributing to and facilitating state policy change work by informing decisions.

This multi-level collaboration will build a long-lasting, intentional, and sustainable infrastructure of lived experience voice within all levels of Wisconsin's child welfare system.





### Population trends by age cohort









# Explore and compare regions with highest need for behavioral health services based on socioeconomic risk factors





**Agency mission:** To provide safety, advocacy and support services for victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, human trafficking, harassment and stalking, as well as their affected family members, in Walworth & Jefferson counties . Clients range in age from 3 to 100. All services are free and confidential. Our agency also educates the community—from school children to seniors—on these critical issues.

**Funding Requested: \$28,000**

**Funding Requested for: Crime Victim Services**

### **Program Description:**

New Beginnings provides professional services for victims of deeply personal crimes, whether the victim is in crisis and needs immediate assistance securing safety, or if the victim wants to talk with someone who understands the effects of trauma. Services range from safety planning and legal advocacy to support groups and individual counseling with a licensed professional.

No one expects their life to turn out this way: impacted by a crime so personal that the emotional effects often last years longer than the physical. It's devastating. New Beginnings assists recent victims as well as those who are still trying to recover from past abuse. We help people make the transform from victims to survivors, which is empowering.

### **Services for adults:**

- Crisis counseling for people who are in danger and need help identifying their options. Our program includes a 24-hour hot line.
- Assistance finding safe emergency housing on a short-term basis (1 night to a few weeks), often in a local hotel because shelters within 50 miles are all full. New Beginnings pays for the hotel as well as emergency food and gas.
- Advocacy in Civil Court for victims seeking a restraining order. An advocate helps the client fill out the paperwork and write up their story—what happened recently that justifies the request for a temporary restraining order. The advocate then coaches the client about court preparation, evidence submission, cross examination and how to summarizing a case to a judge or court commissioner. (Most clients cannot afford an attorney, so they must represent themselves.) New Beginnings assists with financial attorney fees when possible. The advocate accompanies the victim to court and coaches her by writing notes, but the advocate cannot speak on a victim's behalf.
- Legal advocacy in the criminal courts, such as attending a hearing on a victim's behalf or with the victim to explain court proceedings or attending a meeting with the victim and a law enforcement investigator.
- Assistance locating longer term housing by connecting clients with the local housing resources.
- Medical advocacy for sexual assault victims who undergo a rape exam (SANE) to make sure their body is in healthy condition and collect forensic evidence for prosecution.
- Individual counseling from one of two licensed counselors, both of whom utilize best practices of trauma-informed care, which means using short-term strategies to deal with the crises and encouraging development and use of longer term coping skills.
- Support groups for adult survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, LGBTQ+ crimes and a Spanish speaking support group as well.
- Spanish-speaking advocates who provide every service that is offered in English by a native Spanish-speaker who understands cultural implications.
- Case management to meet the victim at their level and explain next steps and options.

### **Services for children:**

- Advocacy for children and parents when a child is interviewed at the Tree House Child Advocacy Center when it is suspected a child has been the victim of physical and/or sexual abuse or has witnessed domestic violence.
- Support groups for children age 5-10 who have experienced or witnessed abuse, so they can learn about healthy relationships, how to identify and express their feelings, and to tell a trusted adult when something is wrong.
- Support groups for teens who have been in abusive relationships or are at risk of domestic abuse, dating violence, sexual abuse, stalking, harassment or human trafficking.
- Individual counseling for teen victims.
- Legal advocacy when a child has been victimized and needs a restraining order for safety.
- Age-appropriate prevention education at schools—from preschool through college—from small groups to large assemblies.

**Amount of Funding Requested:** \$28,000, which includes \$14,000 in funding for the much needed victim services mentioned above and an allocation of \$14,000 for staff salaries to offer

the programs listed above. When we became the sole service provider in Jefferson County (2023), we had anticipated additional DOJ funds to assist in serving an entire county. This has not come to fruition. We now operate 3 separate offices in 2 counties with the same amount of staff we had previously.

**Other sources of funding** New Beginnings receives:

Federal grants under the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) program administered by the Wisconsin Department of Justice's Office of Crime Victim Services. In 2023, we lost VAWA funding (\$43,990)

A state grant for Sexual Assault Victim Services (SAVS) from the Wisconsin Department of Justice's Office of Crime Victim Services.

A state grant from the Wisconsin Department of Children and Families to support families affected by domestic violence.

United Way grants from both Jefferson and Walworth Counties.

A community grant from Walworth County and Jefferson County.

Individual donations plus awards from two community foundations.

Our fundraising efforts in 2023 included an in-person fund raiser 'Cheers to 45 Years'. We raised \$28,000. We received an additional \$2,200 from Fort Atkinson Community Foundation grant this year. We implemented and are currently running a Coasters and Posters program to raise awareness and decrease sexual assaults in Fort Atkinson. We educate bar staff, distribute our coasters and hang posters in the bar restrooms. There is a focus in our training on the bystander effect and acting when questionable behaviors are observed.

**Other providers in our community**

Since October 2022, when PAVE left Jefferson County, New Beginnings APFV is the sole provider of direct services specifically for victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, human trafficking, harassment or stalking in Jefferson County. New Beginnings APFV began as a domestic violence-only agency in 1978 but expanded to help sexual assault victims in the year 2001. That includes children, adults and seniors. We worked closely with PAVE in Beaver Dam, to meet the needs of victims in Jefferson County, but since they left the county, we are alone to meet the need. We have partnered with RRCC, Fort Healthcare, United Way, Jefferson Community Action, Easter Seals, HHS, DA's office, Law Enforcement and of course the school district but we remain the only specialist in victims of violent crimes.

**Service Area and client demographics-**

Our agency advocated and supported 1189 unduplicated victims in 2022.

The victims we served in 2022: 72% of our clients are below the federal poverty level. 85% of our clients were female and 71% of our clients were white. \*There are no fees for services from New Beginnings, including counseling. New Beginnings is very specific about many things that will NOT play a factor in receiving services including: gender, sexual orientation, age, sexual identification, political beliefs, race, heritage, citizenship and income. The reality is that people who can afford private attorneys and counselors do not often seek services at New Beginnings APFV.

## **Who receives our program services?**

Our program assists anyone who is a victim of domestic violence, sexual assault, harassment, stalking or human trafficking and anyone related to or impacted by an abuse victim. For example, in a case where a child is sexually abused by a family friend, the parents of that child are what is called “secondary victims.” A parent may feel enormous guilt for not seeing signs the child was being abused and for trusting the friend.

This can be true of spouses, partners, siblings, etc. They share part of the trauma inflicted on the victim. Some victims experience problems with relationships later in life, years after the abuse has ended. New Beginnings helps those people as well. Our grants do not allow us to directly help perpetrators of violence. We do not offer services to offenders but will offer referrals.

New Beginnings was created to serve residents of Walworth County and later Jefferson County. However, if someone lives within driving distance, we will still help them. We do not turn people away. About 98% of our clients are local and are from either Walworth or Jefferson Counties.

New Beginnings is proud to offer all of its services in both English and Spanish. Language is not a barrier. Three of our staff are native Spanish speakers, and one is a licensed interpreter.

New Beginnings provides financial assistance in several forms to clients who are low income. That includes:

- Emergency shelter at local hotels for those fleeing violence, at no cost to the client.
- Gas cards to drive to our offices for legal advocacy, support groups or individual counseling. (Some clients don't have vehicles, but a \$10 or \$20 gas card provides incentive for a friend or neighbor to provide the ride.)
- Gas cards to drive to Job Center to discuss employment options, to the Walworth & Jefferson County Departments of Health & Human Services for additional services, as well as to the Judicial Center for court proceedings or meetings with the DA's Office.
- New Beginnings also provides a limited number of vouchers for the county's shared taxi service, grocery cards for families fleeing domestic violence, and vouchers to Goodwill and the Clothing Outreach Center.
- Periodically we are able to give Walmart gift cards to families that need cleaning supplies or other essential household items.
- Our agency uses federal grant and other funds to pay for legal services through Legal Action of Wisconsin for a very limited number of clients each year. These are people who have complex restraining orders and/or emergency custody and placement issues related to domestic violence or sexual assault. (New Beginnings has a \$20,000 contract with Legal Action each year. All requests must be authorized by New Beginnings' Director.)
- New Beginnings APFV also provides referral to other agencies and groups that help low-income residents.

## **Our Jefferson County Team**

- Carmen Garces heads into her 10<sup>th</sup> year with New Beginnings APFV. She is a bilingual Licensed Professional Counselor/Advocate. She and her husband reside in Fort Atkinson and her husband's family operates a community-based business there for generations.
- Irma Hernandez celebrated her 1<sup>st</sup> anniversary with us in March. Irma, her husband and 3 children have resided in Jefferson for the past 9 years. She is passionate about community outreach and assisting the Latina community. Irma is the primary Bilingual Counselor/Crime Victim Advocate working from our Jefferson office.
- Lisa Peach just recently joined our team. She has been dedicated to working with special needs children in a school setting and responds well to crisis and trauma. We are thrilled to have her join our team as a Crime Victim Advocate.
- I, Suzi Schoenhof, am the Director at New Beginnings APFV since March 16, 2020. I have been in the field of Social Services for 36 years and am still as passionate as ever. I sit on the Community Navigation Team spearheaded by Fort Healthcare, Social Worker Advisory Board at UWW as well as participate in the monthly SAPA meetings at UWW. I participate in quarterly United Way of Walworth/Jefferson County meetings and attend the monthly Jefferson County Chief and Sheriff's Meetings. I am also a member of the Southeastern Regional Director's Meetings. I have spent much time meeting with partners in Jefferson County in the past year.

## **Conclusion**

Thank you for taking the time to read about New Beginnings APFV, our clients, our team and our organization's efforts to ensure that families impacted by domestic and sexual violence receive the help they need to break the cycle of abuse. Without intervention, the cycle continues from one generation to the next. New Beginnings looks forward to strengthening our partnership and our involvement with Jefferson County.

## Why New Beginnings?

### A story of time, talent and treasure

Because of the nature of my work as a teacher of multilingual students I have worked very closely with Hispanic families in the Whitewater Unified School District. I have realized over the past two years that there is a pressing need for social and emotional support among the newly arrived families. Our students struggle in the school environment but often school districts lack resources to meet their needs especially as there is a language barrier.

This is why I reached out to New Beginnings and was able to find a bilingual staff member who was able to provide mental health services on site. This was tremendously needed and helpful for both students, teachers and their families.

New Beginnings is an essential social resource in our ever more conflicted community. The stresses of today's world have brought forward an urgent need for organizations that can provide free services to all persons experiencing domestic violence and abuse. Smaller communities, as opposed to big cities, often have less access to social resources to support their population. ## Why New Beginnings?

### A story of dedication & compassion

New Beginnings is so important to our community because we provide a safe space for survivors of crime to seek assistance with their escape from danger and journey towards safety. In rural communities, domestic violence and sexual assault cases tend to be higher due to our rural/private settings. Therefore, the importance of New Beginnings being present in these rural locations ensures we are meeting the needs of survivors within our community. New Beginnings is also so important to our community because we offer outreach that focuses on awareness and prevention of the victimizations that we serve. Without New Beginnings, survivors may not get the services and assistance they deserve, and our community would not be as well educated as they are now about violence within the home and in our community.

When looking for an internship, I was looking for a non-profit that worked with individuals in crisis that could provide me purpose. I am proud of being able to fill out temporary restraining orders with clients and provide supportive assistance during the civil injunction process. I am also proud of learning a tremendous amount about the criminal courts while in this position. I feel thankful when I am able to be a person that survivors feel safe with and confide in when seeking support. Ultimately, providing a safe space for anyone that encounters me is something I treasure.

Assisting clients with their journey to find safety and freedom from the abuse they had endured is my purpose. I am also proud of taking part in our support groups and cofacilitating our LGBTQ youth support group. I enjoy running the parent LGBTQ group. I love running these groups because I always learn something new from the clients we speak with. I also learn more about myself and the community that I am a part of. I also find it fascinating how my life experiences are similar to others.








