- 1. Call to Order: Meeting was called to order by LaMuro at 1:00 p.m.
- 2. Roll Call (establish a quorum):

Board of Health Members Present: Steve Nass; Meg Turville-Heitz (via zoom); Samantha LaMuro, R.T.; Jessica Coburn, RN, PhD (via zoom); Donald Williams, M.D. **Quorum established per LaMuro.**

- 3. Certification of Compliance with the Open Meetings Law: Wehmeier certified compliance with the Open Meetings Law.
- 4. Approval of the Agenda: No changes to the Agenda were requested. Motion by Nass/Williams to approve the Agenda. Motion passed 5-0.
- 5. Approval of Board of Health Minutes January 18, 2023 Meeting: Motion by Nass/Williams to approve the minutes as written. Motion passed 5-0.
- 6. Approval of Joint Committee Minutes from January 30, 2023 Meeting: Motion by Nass/Williams to approve the minutes as written. Motion passes 5-0.
- 7. Communications:
 - a. Health Department Open House: Chilsen discussed the upcoming Open House and shared the flyer. Board of Health members to attend if able, Chilsen will follow up with each Board Member to determine schedule and availability.
 - **b.** Ground Water Study Press Release: Chilsen shared the press release and provided an update on the current progress of the Ground Water Study.
- 8. Public Comment: 1 guest discussed Agenda Item #18 and #19, and had a hand out.
- **9.** Approval of the Health Department Financial Report: Schmidt reviewed the "February 2023 Statement of Revenue & Expense Report". Motion by Williams/Nass to approve the financial report. Motion passed 5-0.
- **10.** Approval of the Childcare Lead in Water Initiative Grant: Chilsen discussed the Grant Scope of Work and Departments implementation plan and would like approval. Motion by Williams/Nass to approve the Childcare Lead in Water Initiative Grant. Motion passed 5-0.
- **11. Approval of the Public Health Infrastructure Grant:** Chilsen discussed the Grant and would like approval. Motion by Nass/Williams to approve the Public Health Infrastructure Grant. Motion passed 5-0.
- 12. Discussion and Approval of the 2022 Annual Report: Chilsen discussed the 2022 Annual Report and key highlights. Motion by Nass/Williams to approve the 2022 Annual Report. Motion passed 5-0.
- **13.** Discussion of the Updated Jefferson County Health Department Logo: Chilsen shared the updated logo.
- **14. Operational Update of the Environmental Health Program:** Hisel updated the Board of the seasonal inspections and school inspections that will be starting soon. Hisel discussed license renewals in May, with the hope to start taking credit cards. Hisel updated that the Watertown Lab should be up and going by January 1, 2024.
- **15.** Operational Update of the Public Health Divisions
 - a. Divisional Updates: Bender reported that the Health Department has completed the process to align our current Programs and Services with the Five Foundational Areas of Public Health. Bender discussed the new Divisions in the Department.

- **b. Review of Statistics:** Bender and Chilsen discussed the new Performance Management Document and provided a preview of the format for the next Board of Health meeting. Bender reported on the year-to-date Public Health Statistics.
- c. Review of Communicable Disease Cases Reported: Jakvani provided an update on current communicable disease cases reported.
- d. Staffing Update: Chilsen reported that we have a new Community Health Development Worker, Vanessa, who starts on Monday.
- **16. Operational Update on the Strategic Plan:** Chilsen showed what it will look like and discussed. Chilsen reported that the 140 Review will be June 14, 2023, last Review was 2018.
- **17.** Discussion of the Fall Prevention Initiative: Chilsen discussed the Fall Prevention Initiative and working with the ADRC. Feedback requested from the Board on the continuation of this Initiative. Options to connect with local universities were discussed.
- 18. Discussion of the After-Action Report for Avian Influenza: Chilsen discussed the After-Action Report and what areas of improvement exist. Wehmeier discussed some of the challenges noted with the Palmyra Avian Influenza Outbreak. Concerns were brought forward on the composting site. Cicero provided an update on her discussions with the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) and it was stated that ideal composted had been done.
- **19.** Discussion Related to Aerial Spraying (spray irrigation) of Manure and Other Industrial Waste: Brief update of the past Joint Committee Meeting was provided to the Board of Health Members and topic was discussed. Nass shared that there is one township in the county that has an ordinance prohibition. Nass handed out Code of Ordinances Sec. 16-43 – Prohibition of use of center pivot manure distribution systems – Ixonia, WI. This Ordinance was discussed. Suggestion made to allow Center Pivots with drop down hoses that are applied directly to the ground and to develop a policy that would dictate the distance center hoses must be from the ground to limit or minimize aerosolization. Discussion held on which Department would deal with enforcement. Motion made by Nass to advance the Ixonia, WI Ordinance example to the Land and Water Conservation Committee with the Board of Health's recommendation to prohibit Center Pivots with the exception of those with drop down hoses and for the Land and Water Conservation Committee to develop a policy that would dictate the distance center hoses must be from the ground to limit or minimize aerosolization. Motion seconded by Turville-Heitz. Motion passed 5-0.
- 20. Future Agenda Items: Williams discussed PFAS. No future items at this time were requested.
- 21. Adjourn: Motion by Turville-Heitz/Nass to adjourn meeting at 2:27 p.m. Motion passed 5-0.

RESOLUTION NO. 2023-____

Accepting a \$9,000 Capacity Building Grant from the Greater Watertown Community Health Foundation and amending the 2023 Health Department budget

Executive Summary

The Greater Watertown Community Health Foundation offers Capacity Building Grants to fund leadership development and provide technical assistance to help local organizations further their mission. Jefferson County was awarded \$9,000 to provide an opportunity for leadership with the Jefferson County Health Department to be certified on Results Based Accountability which is a simple approach to effectively measure and report on program-level performance. It offers a framework to describe how programs work together in order to contribute to community-wide results at the population level and integrate this practice into the core operations. This implementation will ensure that the Jefferson County Health Department is providing services in alignment with the Wisconsin State Health Improvement Plan, the Dodge Jefferson Healthier Community Partnership Community Health Improvement Plan, and the Jefferson County Strategic Plan. Alignment of these plans will assure the department is driven by state and local needs and that the Jefferson County Health Department has organizational goals and objectives to address the public health needs of the community. In addition, the \$9,000 will allow the Department to purchase the Clear Impact software program to track performance indicators. On June 13, 2023, the Finance Committee considered this resolution and recommended forwarding to the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors to accept \$9,000 in grant funding from the Greater Watertown Community Health Foundation.

WHEREAS, the above Executive Summary is incorporated into this resolution, and

WHEREAS, grant funding is available to the Jefferson County Health Department from the Greater Watertown Community Health Foundation to fund leadership development and provide technical assistance, and

WHEREAS, the integration of Results Based Accountability will ensure provided services are driven by state and local needs, and

WHEREAS, the purchase of the Clear Impact Software will allow for the intentional sharing and monitoring of performance indicators with stakeholders and the community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors hereby accepts grant funding from the Greater Watertown Community Health Foundation in the amount of \$9,000 to fund the staff certification of Results Based Accountability and the purchase of Clear Impact software to track performance indicators.

Fiscal Note: This resolution will increase the Jefferson County Health Department Budget revenue and expenditures by \$9,000 through a Capacity Building Grant from the Greater Watertown Community Health Foundation. As a budget amendment, this resolution requires twenty 20 out of 30 affirmative votes from the total membership of the County Board for passage. Referred By:
