Land & Water Conservation Committee Minutes June 21, 2023

1. Call to Order:

The monthly meeting was called to order by Matt Foelker at 8:30 am. Committee Members Matt Foelker (Chair) (UW), Walt Christensen (Vice-Chair), Dan Herbst (UW), Cassie Richardson (8:30 - 9:30), Meg Turville-Heitz (via Zoom), Kirsten Jurcek (FSA), and Margaret Burlingham (PACE), were present. Also in attendance were Patricia Cicero, Director, Land & Water Conservation Department (LWCD); Kim Liakopoulos, LWCD; Dave Hoffman, LWCD; Zach Nagel, LWCD; and Joe Strupp (8:30 - 10:00), LWCD.

• Others in Attendance: Frankie Fuller and Sue Marx (9:00 - 10:05) (via Zoom), Cole Ciochon, Anita Martin, and Matt Zangl (8:45 - 9:15).

2. Roll Call (Establish a Quorum):

A quorum was established.

3. Certification of Compliance with the Open Meetings Law:

It was determined that the committee was in compliance with the Open Meetings Law.

4. Review of the June Agenda:

The June agenda was reviewed by the committee members. No changes were proposed.

5. Approval of the May 17, 2023 Meeting Minutes:

Christensen made a motion to approve the May 17, 2023 meeting minutes as written, Richardson seconded. Motion passed 7/0.

6. Public Comment:

There were no comments.

7. Communications:

• Department of Agriculture, Trade & Consumer Protection June 2023 Report.

8. Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) Report:

NRCS did not attend the meeting therefore a report was unavailable. Rachel Olds is the acting District Conservationist for Jefferson County, and the Resource Conservationist will start at the end of July.

9. Introduction of Zach Nagel, Water Resources Management Specialist:

Nagel introduced himself to the committee and gave an overview of his education and experience.

10. Discussion on Departmental Updates:

Farmland Preservation spot checks are complete. Cicero attended a Lake Ripley Critical Habitat Area Designation hearing. Cicero is working with the Drainage Board regarding a Memorandum of Understanding that would detail some of the work LWCD could do for the board if requested. Cicero attended a Village of Palmyra meeting regarding a draw down for Eurasian watermilfoil management on Lower Spring Lake. LWCD staff have been meeting to determine the details of the City of Watertown water quality trading practices offered. Strupp, Hoffman, and Sam Peterson are contacting landowners that signed up for cost-sharing of multi species cover crops after small grains to sign contracts.

11. Discussion on Erosion Control and Stormwater Management Work Group Meetings:

The work group's first meeting was 5/24/2023. The group is considering a Department of Natural Resources (DNR) model to determine how to craft a Jefferson County ordinance. The next meeting is 6/27/2023 at 8:30 am.

12. Discussion and Possible Action on High Capacity Well Location and Information Mapping:

High capacity well locations cannot be shared with the public per the DNR.

13. Discussion on Informational Materials for Future Meeting on Spray Irrigation of Manure and Industrial Waste: Cicero inquired what materials and/or speakers the committee would like to have at a future

meeting on spray irrigation of manure and industrial waste. Materials requested include the report from the Wisconsin Manure Irrigation workgroup, ordinances from other towns or counties, and slides from the joint meeting. Speakers requested include Elizabeth Chilsen from the Health Department, possibly a farmer that uses spray irrigation, and someone involved in the Wisconsin Manure Irrigation workgroup.

- 14. Discussion on 2022-2023 Tree Sale Report:
 - Liakopoulos discussed the 2020-2023 Tree Sale Report.
- **15. Discussion on Producer-Led Groups: Jefferson County Soil Builders & Rock River Regenerative Graziers:**Jefferson County Soil Builders (JCSB) and Rock River Regenerative Graziers (R3G) are having a Rain and Runoff Presentation at 4:00 at Korth Park 06/22/2023. R3G are hosting a Pasture Walk tonight (06/21/2023).
- 16. Discussion on 2022 Conservation Progress Report:
 - Cicero presented the 2022 Conservation Progress Report.
- **17.** Discussion and Possible Action on Notices of Noncompliance Farmland Preservation Program (FPP): There were no notices.

Christensen made a motion to approve the resolution authorizing purchase of an agricultural conservation easement, Burlingham seconded. Motion passed 6/0.
- **21.** Discussion and Possible Action on Purchase of Agriculture Conservation Easement (PACE) Applications & Baseline Documentation: Hoffman spoke to the committee about recent interest in the PACE program. When funding is available, Hoffman will send out applications to the interested parties. The Rollefson application has been ranked and is awaiting funding.
- **22.** Discussion and Possible Action on Letter of Intent to Purchase Land from the County at State Road 26 Bypass and Business 26: Burlingham made a motion to have Jefferson County follow a process when selling county-owned land that includes obtaining an appraisal, consider impacts to taxpayers and to county Departments, and puts the farmland value of agricultural land sold into the County's Purchase of Agricultural Conservation Easement Program, Herbst seconded. Soil and Water Resources Management Grants

- 2024 budget numbers are available and we are working hard to get the Allocation together for the August Land and Water board meeting.
- Please note that many staffing awards will be lower than 2023 numbers.
- Another change in the budget was to change the source of funding SWRM has traditionally used for structural practices or what have always been referred to as bond practices. These will now be funded with general purpose revenue (GPR) funds and will be referred to as structural practices. The allocated cost-share GPR funds can only be used on structural practices due to wording in the budget. The easiest way to think about this for contracting and reimbursements is bond = structural.

MADISON, **Wis.** – The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) today affirms that the recent decision by the Supreme Court of the United States (SCOTUS) in Sackett vs United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) does not alter Wisconsin's wetland regulations under state law.

Since 1978, the DNR has recognized the need to preserve, protect, restore and manage the state's wetland communities because of the critical recreational, water quality, flood protection and habitat functions they provide to the public. Wisconsin was one of the first states to adopt Water Quality Standards for Wetlands in 1991 and was the first state to pass comprehensive regulations for isolated, non-federal wetlands in 2001 under 2001 Wisconsin Act 6. In a bipartisan effort, the Wisconsin governor and legislators recognized the critical functions wetlands play when they unanimously established state regulations for wetlands not covered by the federal Clean Water Act.

Under current state wetland regulations, projects that propose to impact wetlands must either request a state exemption or apply for permit authorization to complete their project. State permitting standards require projects to avoid and minimize wetland impacts to the greatest extent practicable and, in many instances, to mitigate for their wetland impacts.

"While the Sackett decision will likely remove federal jurisdiction and oversight from a large amount of Wisconsin's wetlands, the DNR will continue to implement the State's uniform wetland regulatory program for projects that propose to impact wetlands in order to preserve and protect these critically important resources," said Tom Nedland, DNR Waterway and Wetland Policy Section Manager.
