#### **Discussion of Monthly Educator Reports:**

Committee members received the Extension May 2024 written report in their agenda packets.

Steve Chmielewski, Community Development Educator, was unable to attend the meeting. His written report was provided.

Alison Pfau, Regional Dairy Educator, provided an oral report for the committee.

- Currently, working on writing an article on the measures of methane in dairy cattle.
- Attending a dairy conference next week in Florida to learn about dairy updates, new projects and research.
- Helping to plan and develop a meeting for dairy producers on automatic milking systems.

Jerry Wilcenski, 4-H educator, provided an oral report for the committee.

- Cloverbud Day Camp will be at Never Rest Dairy at the end of June and youth will learn about the dairy industry.
- The Livestock Project Learning Day happened in May. There were 75 kids in attendance. Each livestock project had different classes for the youth to learn about the specific species.
- Ran a food stand at the Spring Preview Livestock Show.
- Currently wrapping up this 4-H year and getting ready for fair.

Julie Hill, Horticulture Educator, was unable to attend the meeting. Her written report was provided.

Lisa Krolow, FoodWise Coordinator, was unable to attend the meeting.

Josh Kamps, Regional Crops Educator, provided an oral report for the committee.

- Actively working on the moth tracking network. This is in partnership with the Department of Ag. They
  supply everything needed to do this. This project helps the educators get an idea of when the moths
  are entering the state so that they can time their scouting on when the moths lay eggs and the larva
  hatches.
- Currently working on nitrogen plots with farmers. Specifically, one farm in Jefferson County looking at nitrogen credits available from alfalfa cover crop.
- Researching the benefit of manure crop application.
- It has been about a year but the state is no longer in a drought period.
- Collaborating with the Weed Science Team at the farm in Rock County.
- Working on a team who is putting together a crop scouting training. This training will first be presented
  internally and then will be presented to agronomists and students next year.
- The Crops and Soils Update Tour Team is working on their annual meeting to be hosted in 3 different locations in the state to introduce new research from UW-Madison.
- Discussion occurred.

### **CROPS & SOILS**

Our innovative dairy management programs range from genetics to farm and business management. Extension researchers work hand-in-hand with row crop, forage and fresh produce growers to provide best practices for every aspect of the growing phase. - Plot layout and implementation of a two-year field research program on three farms in the region designed to study the optimal nitrogen rate for corn production through nitrogen credit valuation of dairy manure, municipal sludge, and legume cover crops. (Joshua Kamps)
- A field research project at the Rock Co. farm designed to inform farmers and agronomists decision making of the
  optimal nitrogen rate application rates for corn production following soybean production with a winter cereal
  rye cover crop. (Joshua Kamps)
- An ongoing planning effort to prepare for a day long Extension weed management workshop during the fall of 2024 for farmers, agronomists, conservation professionals, and educators to increase capacity in weed id, IPM techniques, herbicide resistance, and cropping systems management. (Joshua Kamps)

### **HEALTH & WELL-BEING**

Rooted in both urban and rural communities, we're working together to help solve the state's most pressing well-being needs and to ensure that all Wisconsinites live stronger, healthier lives.

• Delivered a program consisting of a 5-week series of nutrition lessons at a subsidized housing site. The residents at the site are elderly and disabled. Participants learned about My Plate and healthy eating habits, how to read nutrition labels, how to identify and calculate the amount of added sugar in a product, and how to budget for healthy food.
