### 6. APPROVAL OF SEPTEMBER 9, 2025, BOARD MINUTES

### 8. REVIEW OF THE AUGUST 2025 FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Mr. Bellford reviewed the August financial statement (attached) and reported that we are projecting a positive year-end fund balance of \$736,811. This balance includes our carryover from 2024, including \$650,000 from our reserve carryover. We are, at this point, \$86,811 favorable to the budget when the reserve is excluded.

### 9. DISCUSS AND APPROVE SEPTEMBER 2025 VOUCHERS

Mr. Bellford reviewed the summary sheet of vouchers totaling \$934,925.46 (attached).

Mr. Wineke made a motion to approve the September 2025 vouchers totaling \$934,925.46.

Ms. Abrahamsen seconded.

Motion passed unanimously.

# 10. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON NEW 2025 PROFESSIONAL SERVICE CONTRACTS (DAY CARE, SHELTER CARE, AND CCS REGIONAL SERVICE ARRAY)

Mr. Ruehlow reported that we have six new service providers. (attached)

Mr. Jones made the motion to approve the contracts listed.

Mr. Racanelli seconded.

Motion passed unanimously.

# 11. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF STATE HUMAN SERVICES CONTRACTS, CONSORTIUM AGREEMENTS, AND PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AND CARE PROVIDER CONTRACTS

Mr. Bellford reported that this authorizes the execution of contracts, agreements, and provider contracts for 2026. This resolution will be on the County Board agenda in November. (attached) Ms. Abrahamsen made a motion to approve the Human Services contracts for the 2026 budget as presented.

Mr. Wineke seconded the motion.

Motion passed unanimously.

# 12. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON JEFFERSON COUNTY'S SPECIALIZED TRANSPORTATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (Wis. Stat. 85.21) APPLICATION

Mr. Hansen reported on the 2026 Application for the Wisconsin DOT funding of \$228,147. The application will have seven projects; the Driver/Volunteer Escort Program; the Senior Dining Program; later weekday evenings & weekend service hours; Day Trip; shopping van service; third party wheelchair accessible transportation; and public taxi transportation. The total cost of these projects is budgeted to be \$607,020 in 2026.

Mr. Wineke made a motion to approve the Application for 85.21 Specialized Transportation Assistance as presented.

Ms. Abrahamsen seconded.

Motion passed unanimously.

#### 13. DIRECTORS REPORT

Mr. Ruehlow reported on the following items:

- Mr. Ruehlow provided an update on the potential impacts of the federal government shutdown. WIC and SNAP (also known as FoodShare) currently have enough funding to continue operations through October. The Department of Children and Families (DCF) has indicated that they have sufficient state-level funds to continue through the end of the calendar year. However, prolonged shutdowns may result in more significant funding cuts.
- As part of the reconciliation package, Medical Assistance will allow only 60 days of retroactive eligibility, whereas previously it was 90 days. This is effective 12/31/2026.
- Starting October 1, 2026, federal funding for the administrative portion of the FoodShare program will decrease from covering 50% to only covering 25%. This will require the state to cover the remaining 75%. The implications of this shift are still unclear.
- Beginning in October 2026, new penalties will be imposed based on the state's error rates in the FoodShare program. If the error rate exceeds 6%, the state will be required to pay 5% of the benefit amount. For error rates between 8% and 9.9%, the state's share will increase to 10%, and if the error rate reaches 10% or higher, the state will be responsible for 15%. Mr. Ruehlow shared the following historical error rates: 4.39% in FY 2022, 4.98% in FY 2023, 4.41% in FY 2024, and 6.43% in FY 2025. In FY 2025 specifically, the agency recorded a total of four errors, one attributed to a staff member and three due to client mistakes. In light of the increased risk and upcoming changes to federal funding structures, the agency has submitted a request to the Governor for \$69.2 million in General Purpose Revenue (GPR). This funding would support the addition of a Quality Control position for the consortium across the state and help offset the anticipated reduction in federal support for the FoodShare program.
- A successful fire drill was conducted last week. Mr. Ruehlow commended Facilities Director John Fox for his leadership in organizing the drill. Updates were also made to the facility maps and paging system as part of ongoing safety improvements.

• Mr. Ruehlow presented a plaque to retiring Chair Richard Jones in recognition of his service on the Human Services Board. He expressed his appreciation for Mr. Jones' leadership and invited others to share their own reflections and words of gratitude.

### 14. ADJOURN

Mr. Jones made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Ms. Callan seconded. Motion passed unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 9:56 a.m.

# Financial Statement Summary September, 2025

We are projecting a positive year-end fund balance of \$707,972. This balance includes our carryover from 2024, including \$650,000 from our reserve carryover. We are, at this point, \$57,972 favorable to the budget when the reserve is excluded.

### **Summary of Variances:**

- CCS continues to be understaffed compared to the budget, so more services are contracted out. We are projecting \$6,854,506 in total CCS expenses, compared to budgeted costs of \$7,370,684. This includes \$4,165,160 in staffing (wages, salary, fringe, overhead, and MD costs) compared to a budget of \$5,633,434. However, our contractor costs are projected to be \$2,648,351 compared to a budget of \$1,700,000. Because of this, our revenue from MA is projected to be \$4,952,702, compared to a budget of \$5,899,019, while our WIMCR settlement is projected to be \$2,500,000 compared to a budget of \$2,150,041.
- Hospital/Detox is projected to be over budget (unfavorable) by \$195,467 (Net basis).

In 2023, our hospitalization net balance was (\$879,913). In 2024, our hospitalization net balance was (\$679,057). The September 2025 State Institute bill was \$165,704. The August 2025 State Institute bill was \$168,545. These are the highest single month charges since at least 2020.

- The Nutrition Programs are projected to have a combined \$44,965 unfavorable balance. This is mostly because the Nutrition Supervisor position has been vacant since July 7. The new Supervisor started on September 8. GWAAR did also provide for an opportunity to re-obligate unspent funds from other counties for 2025. We did put in for our submission, but we have not heard back. We also had the opportunity to transfer funding from our underused GWAAR contract (Cong Meals) to help with our overspent contract (HDM). While a portion of this transfer was approved, the federal portion cannot be approved because of the shutdown. Even without this transfer, we are hopeful that we can still use all of our contracted dollars.
- CLTS revenue is projected to be under budget by \$173,043. CLTS expenses are projected to be under budget by \$193,459.
- Children Alternate Care expenses are projected to be over budget by \$86.573. This projection includes Shelter and Detention costs and excludes kinship care. Kinship is included in the alternate care summary (attached), and it will be fully funded by DCF. We did decrease our

alternate care budget by \$107,355 2025 when compared to 2024. The last few years of alternate care budgets are shown below.

We do have a number of high-cost placements currently. One Group Home placement did move to a Level 5 foster home, which is high-cost, but also funded, in part, by CLTS. So, going forward, we will have several the following high-cost placements: 1 group home, 1 RCC, and 1 Level 5 foster home.

- CSP is projected to be unfavorable to the budget on a net basis of \$207,189. Expenses are projected to be under budget because of vacant positions; however, revenue is projected to under significantly under budget. While we have billed several months of 2025, the billing has not increased as much as anticipated when we did our budget. We have adjusted CSP revenue in our 2026 budget.
- Outpatient Clinic Revenue (insurance, Medicare, and MA) is projected to be \$261,774 underbudget. Clinic revenue has been increasing approximately 15-20% each year for the past several years. However, it has stagnated this year for a few factors, including several vacant positions and several new staff (which take time to credential before insurance will pay us).

- Capital Projects are projected to be \$266,939 underbudget, because the preschool renovation and Lueder House repairs are coming in under budget at this point. Additionally, the appx. \$200,000 we had for lobby renovations will not be used in 2025.
- **Operating Reserve:** We are projecting a year-end balance of \$650,000 in the operating reserve this year.

**BEHAVIOR HEALTH DIVISION:** Projected unfavorable balance of \$584,479, because of increasing hospitalizations and decreasing CSP and Clinic revenue.

**CHILDREN & FAMILY DIVISION:** Projected favorable balance of \$489,066. Alternate care costs are over budget; however, staffing costs for several teams are under budget. Those teams do not typically have revenue offsets.

**ECONOMIC SUPPORT DIVISION:** Projected favorable balance of \$22,579. These programs are right in-line with the budget currently.

**AGING & ADRC DIVISION:** Projected unfavorable balance of \$53,686, because of nutrition costs.

**ADMINISTRATIVE DIVISION:** Projected favorable balance of \$184,491, because of capital projects.

**OPERATING RESERVE:** Projected favorable balance of \$650,000.
