E-bike ordinance: Fort Atkinson Council considers amendments

FORT ATKINSON — Between 2024-25, Madison hospitals reported a 700% increase in injuries from e-bike accidents. To counter this spike, the Fort Atkinson Police Department brought proposed changes to the City Council during an Aug. 4 meeting.

“When we started doing research on off-highway motorcycles (OHMs), we started seeing a trend with more violations related to OHMs and e-bikes and bicycles,” said Fort Atkinson Police Chief Adrian Bump. “We also said we should take a look at our e-bike ordinance to make sure it’s where it should be.”

“The last time we (drafted) the ordinance, it was (the) early stage of e-bike popularity and things have changed a little bit. We saw that the definition needed to be improved within our ordinance, so it adopted state law, and that way we’re consistent.”

Bump informed the Council that he had brought forward an updated ordinance upgrading the definitions for different classes e-bikes to align with state law.

He mentioned that the department had also looked at “other locations out of the state” to ensure the changes were comprehensive.

Members of the Fort Atkinson City Council asked a series questions, such as:

Do e-bikes require license plates?

“The current e-bike, bicycle, e-bike, and e-scooter ordinance requires licensing of all bicycles in the city for residents, but not for visitors,” Bump said. “They can come to the police department and get a license for that, and that’s something we’ve been doing for 50 years or more.”

Is \$10 enough for a first offense citation?

“\$10 is the citation amount that does not include court fees,” Bump said. “\$77.30 would be the total citation amount.”

Does that citation go to a parent or a child, depending on the situation?

“The way the ordinance is written, it could go to either,” Bump said. “There is a parental responsibility that we have included because I think we’ll see better compliance if we have the parents’ help motivating them to change the behavior as well.”

Is there a graduated scale for citations?

“It goes up after the second (offense),” Bump said. City Manager Rebecca Houseman clarified that the second offense citation would be \$50, plus court costs.

What is the age limit for a Class Three electric bike?

“A Class Three electric bike goes a little bit faster than the rest of them — up to 28 miles per hour with pedal assist...We probably (wouldn’t) prefer someone under the age of 16 who doesn’t have a valid driver’s license (or) road experience operating those bikes. Faster speeds also result in more serious injuries when accidents occur,” Bump said.

Is there a helmet requirement?

“We have not included that in our ordinance,” Bump said. “Sometimes we have to choose our battles. I think it was most important to get this ordinance in place and update it. Wisconsin is not a mandatory helmet state for bikes or motorcycles, so knowing the atmosphere of the community, I thought I might be picking a fight there.”

Would e-bikes be barred from bike trails?

“Under state law, we cannot restrict the use of e-bikes on trails because they need to be treated as a normal bicycle. There is an enforcement aspect that can probably be increased a little bit to help increase safety when it comes to the bikes, the use of the bike trail and following street signs.”

The amended ordinance will go for its second reading at the Aug. 18 Fort Atkinson City Council meeting.

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-___

Authorizing County Conservation Aid Grant Application for Crawfish River County Park

Executive Summary

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Fish and Wildlife Management Grant Program was created to assist counties in the improvement of fish and wildlife resources. The program was established by the Wisconsin Legislature in 1965 and provides matching funds for a growing list of county sponsored fish and wildlife habitat projects. The Jefferson County Parks Department Is seeking funds through this program to supplement vegetation management activities at Crawfish River County Park including; conducting a prescribed burn, brush removal, and overseeding of areas with low biodiversity. The total cost of the project is estimated at \$5,000.00 with up to 50% covered by the grant (\$2,500.00) and the remaining 50% covered by a cash donation to the park provided by the Friends of Jefferson County Parks Fund at the Jefferson Community Foundation (\$2,500.00). The Parks Committee considered this resolution at its meeting on August 27th, 2026 and recommended forwarding to the County Board for approval.

WHEREAS, Crawfish River Park, located in Jefferson County, is a 18-acre conservation park along the Crawfish River with a variety of upland and wetland habitats including wetland scraps installed with the help of the NRCS and Ducks Unlimited in 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Parks is seeking grant funding through the Wisconsin Department of natural Resources County Conservation Aid program to help control woody invasives, increase biodiversity to areas of low diversity, and improve the habitat for all species that use the park; and

WHEREAS, proposed project activities include conducting a prescribed burn, invasive plant removal, and overseeding of areas that have been negatively impacted by invasive plants; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project aligns with the goals of the Wisconsin County Conservation Aids program and supports long-term ecological stewardship, native habitat restoration, and enhanced recreational and educational opportunities at Carlin Weld County Park;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Jefferson County Parks Department to act on behalf of the County to submit an application to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources for financial assistance under the County Conservation Aids program for the above described purposes; to sign documents; and to take all necessary actions to undertake, direct, and complete the approved project.

Fiscal Note: This resolution authorizes the application for up to \$2,500.00 grant through the

Wisconsin County Conservation Aids program. The grant will cover 50% of the total project cost of \$5,000.00. The required 50% local match (\$2,500.00) will be met through cash donations by the Friends of Jefferson County Parks Fund. No additional county tax levy funding is required.
