

#### ORDINANCE NO. 2020-

## Powers and Duties of County Health Officer (previously known as the Communicable Disease Ordinance)

16.01 PURPOSE. This ordinance is enacted is to promote and protect the public health, safety, and general welfare.

16.02 JURISDICTION. This ordinance applies in all cities, villages, and towns, provided, however, that any section of the ordinance that has a counterpart in an ordinance of a city, village or town shall not be enforced by the County in said city, village or town, or in a city, village or town with a local health department.

16.03 AUTHORITY. This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the authority granted in Chapter 252 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

#### 16.04 DEFINITIONS. As used in this Ordinance:

- 1. Public Building means any structure, including exterior parts of such building, such as a porch, exterior platform, or steps providing means of ingress or egress, used in whole or in part as a place of resort, assemblage, lodging, trade, traffic, occupancy, or use by the public including the land upon which the public building is located. Public Building as defined above also includes structures and land where members of the public pay a fee to gain entry or where there is a license required to conduct business with members of the public.
- 2. Place of Employment means every place, whether indoors or outdoors or underground, and the premises appurtenant thereto, where either temporarily or permanently any industry, trade, or business is carried on, or where any process or operation, directly or indirectly related to any industry, trade, or business, is carried on, and where any person is, directly or indirectly, employed by another or self-employed.
- 3. Communicable Disease means a disease or condition listed in Appendix A Chapter DHS 145 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code, any previously unknown novel contagion or novel subtypes of any disease designated as notifiable at the national level.
- 4. Outbreak means an unusual aggregation of health events that are grouped together in a short time period and limited geographic area. Epidemic means an increase in the number of cases of a disease above what is normally expected in the population in the area. Pandemic means an epidemic that has spread over several countries or continents.
- 5. Unless specifically defined in this ordinance, definitions as set forth in Wis. Stat. Chapter 252 and Wis. Admin. Code Chapter DHS 145, as amended and/or renumbered from time to time, are hereby adopted and incorporated by reference as if fully set forth in this section.
- 16.05 The Jefferson County Health Officer is the appointed department head, or in the absence of an appointed department head, the acting department head, of the Jefferson County Health Department.
- 16.06 The Jefferson County Health Officer, or designee, upon the appearance of any communicable disease in his or her territory, shall immediately investigate. The Jefferson County Health Officer shall promptly take all measures necessary to prevent, suppress and control communicable diseases. The County Health Officer may inspect schools, places of employment, and other public buildings within his or her jurisdiction as needed to determine whether the buildings are kept in a sanitary condition.
- 16.07 The Jefferson County Health Officer may establish systems of disease surveillance and inspection to ascertain the presence of any communicable disease within Jefferson County. The County Health Officer may, with a special inspection warrant issued under s. 66.0119, enter any private property,

building, place of employment, vessel or conveyance not open to the public to inspect the same, to issue orders, and/or to remove therefrom any person affected by a communicable disease if necessary to promote the safety and welfare of the public.

- 16.08 The County Health Officer may issue orders for guarding against the introduction of any communicable disease into Jefferson County, for the control and suppression of communicable diseases, for the quarantine and disinfection of persons, localities and things infected or suspected of being infected by a communicable disease and for the sanitary care of schools, places of employment, public buildings, and other places.
- 16.09 Any rule or order may be made applicable to the whole or any specified part of Jefferson County or to any vessel or other conveyance. Orders that are issued under the authority herein supersede conflicting or less stringent regulations, orders or ordinances.
- 16.10 The County Health Officer may close schools and forbid public gatherings in schools, churches, places of employment, public buildings, private property, and other places, when deemed necessary, to control outbreaks, epidemics or pandemics.
- 16.11 The County Health Officer may authorize and implement all emergency measures necessary to control communicable diseases and do what is reasonable and necessary for the prevention and suppression of disease including, but not limited to, prohibiting public and private gatherings when deemed necessary to control outbreaks, epidemics or pandemics.
- 16.12 Any Order issued by the Jefferson County Health Officer may be appealed to the Jefferson County Board of Health within 30 days of issuance which may rescind, amend, or continue such Order by majority vote of the members present.
- 16.13 Any person who willfully violates or obstructs the execution of an Order of the Health Officer under this Ordinance and relating to the public health, shall be imprisoned for not more than 30 days or be subject to a fine or forfeiture of not more than \$500, or both, or injunctive relief. Each calendar day, or part thereof, during which a violation exists or continues to exist shall be considered a separate violation. The violator shall be liable for costs of prosecution under this Ordinance.
- 1. The Corporation Counsel shall be responsible for all cases where an injunction to correct and/or abate a violation or forfeiture is being sought.
- 2. The District Attorney shall be responsible for all cases where imprisonment or a fine is being sought.
- 16.14 Severability. Should any portion of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected.
- 16.15 Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect on the day following the date of publication as required by law.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 2020 -**

#### **Extension of Emergency Declaration**

#### **Executive Summary**

On March 13, 2020, in response to an emerging concern of a Public Health Emergency then County Board Chair Jim Schroeder issued an emergency declaration. This order has been subsequently ratified and continued as written by the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors on March 19, 2020, April 21, 2020 and May 12, 2020.

The Public Health Emergency was also impacted by the orderly transfer of one term Board of Supervisors to a new term of the Board of Supervisors which included the need to elect new officers to the Board through the required organizational meeting on April 21, 2020. Subsequent to this meeting appointments of committee assignments and the subsequent need to select leaders of these committees, boards and commissions were required. As such, the County Administrator has been delegated additional authorities under the declaration to maintain the continuity of operations and ensuring the protection of the public. The County Administrator has reported the actions taken during this declaration to committees to include ratification of said actions.

Since the emergency has been declared, the County has developed several systems to respond to the COVID-19 status along with the process to begin recovery operations externally and internally. These systems have allowed the operations to normalize and processes are in place to deal with emerging issues. These systems will continue to be enhanced as we work through potential additional dollars the County may receive from the state and federal government and as the situation requires.

Further, most of the newly formed committees and boards have met or are expected to meet soon which will facilitate in their role for policy making and guidance. Pending Board approval, it is also the intent that the remote attendance will be maintained for an indeterminate time, even beyond the declaration.

Based on the above conditions, it is being recommend by the Executive Committee and the County Administrator that the County should begin the process to phase down the emergency declaration. With the proposed extension of the declaration before the Board this evening, the first phase will remove the authority related to extraordinary spending authority and reduce this to normal operational needs. This will not limit the County Administrator 's authority to further control budget oversight beyond normal operations, nor will it affect the County Administrator's authority to make emergency procurements under the County's current Purchasing Ordinance.

The Executive Committee will continue to review information at future meeting and will consider further reduction of powers for the July Board meeting to include potentially ending the declaration. This will include monitoring the requirements of a declaration for funding reimbursement from the State and Federal Government.

WHEREAS, Jefferson County's Emergency Management Ordinance, No. 1987-24 as amended by Ord. No. 2011-16, provides "In the event an emergency occurs within Jefferson County at a time when the County Board is unable to meet for the purpose of making such a declaration . . ., the following persons may declare state of emergency: (a) County Board Chair . . . ", and

WHEREAS, the Emergency Management Ordinance and § 323(4)(b), Wisconsin Statutes, indicates that if the emergency declaration is made by the County Board Chair, the Board shall ratify or repeal such declaration as soon as the body can meet, and

WHEREAS, an emergency, namely the COVID-19 Pandemic, has impacted and will continue to impact Jefferson County, and

WHEREAS, County Board Chair Jim Schroeder issued an emergency declaration on March 13, 2020, following the World Health Organization's designation of the COVID-19 pandemic a Public Health Emergency of International Concern, Governor of the State of Wisconsin's declaration of a State of Emergency; President Trump's Declaration of a National Emergency; and the United States Health and Human Services Secretary's declaration of a public health emergency for the entire United States, which declaration is presently in effect, and

WHEREAS, the County Administrator is authorized to amend or suspended personnel policies in the best interest of Public and Employee Safety and continuing County Operations, and

WHEREAS, such emergency declaration may make Jefferson County eligible for emergency funds and will facilitate and expedite the use of various resources to protect persons from the impacts of the spread of COVID-19 while maintaining continuity of operations for the Jefferson County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the County Board extends the emergency declaration issued by County Board Chair Jim Schroeder on March 13, 2020, which is presently in effect with the full power and effect as determined will be continued until July 14, 2020.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Jefferson County Administrator serving as the Chief Administrative Officer of Jefferson County shall exercise all of the powers conferred upon the governing body of Jefferson County under all applicable statutes and ordinances, which within the discretion of the officer appear necessary and expedient during said state of emergency.

#### **Authorization for Remote Attendance**

WHEREAS, an emergency, namely the COVID-19 Pandemic, has impacted and will continue to impact Jefferson County, and

WHEREAS, then County Board Chair Jim Schroeder issued an emergency declaration on March 13, 2020, which has subsequently been ratified and continued by the Jefferson County Board on March 19, 2020, April 21, 2020, May 12, 2020 and June 9, 2020, and

WHEREAS, it is imperative that the Governing Bodies of the County have the ability to meet as required to maintain the operations of the County, and

WHEREAS, the County Administrator and staff have developed a process, procedures and capabilities to facilitate remote attendance at County meetings in compliance with all applicable laws and allows for participation of board members, public and staff by in person and through remote practices.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the County Board authorizes the utilization of remote attendance at all County meetings held to facilitate the transaction of County business with minimal barriers to participation of members of Board/Commissions/Committee and facilitate ability for public transparency. This broadly construed policy shall be in place until rescinded by the County Board or is superseded by an updated Remote Attendance Policy.

Fiscal Note: The remote technology used capitalizes on hardware and infrastructure the County had in place pre-COVID -19. The Zoom software system utilized was purchased on a countywide basis to facilitate meeting and on-going operations. Total cost was \$1,999 for a one-year subscription with 10 host accounts and allows for up to 300 participants per meeting. This may be an eligible cost that may be reimbursed back to the County.

# Accepting the Birth to Three Program: Innovation in Social-Emotional Development grant funding through the State of Wisconsin Department of Health Services at the Human Services Department

#### **Executive Summary**

Jefferson County Human Services was recently awarded a grant from the State of Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) to fund projects that support the implementation of evidence-based practices and system changes to improve social-emotional outcomes for enrolled children.

The County will receive a grant in the amount of \$54,005.50 to fund the implementation of the Brazelton Touchpoints training. This training will be provided to Jefferson County, Dodge County, and contracted staff. A Jefferson County staff member will also become a certified trainer and provide training to community partners.

On June 09, 2020, the Finance Committee reviewed the request from the Human Services Director and recommended forwarding this resolution to the County Board to accept the grant funding of \$54,005.50 and create a budget amendment.

WHEREAS, the above Executive Summary is incorporated into this resolution, and

WHEREAS, grant funding is available from the Birth to Three Program: Innovation in Social-Emotional Development grant to expand the services the Human Services Department provides to children enrolled in the Birth to Three program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the 2020 County Budget be amended to accept the grant funding from the Birth to Three Program: Innovation in Social-Emotional Development grant for the amount of \$54,005.50.

Fiscal Note: The Birth to Three Program: Innovation in Social-Emotional Development grant is runs until December 31, 2021. Jefferson County will receive reimbursement for costs incurred in 2020 and 2021. Please see the attached Budget Adjustment or Amendment Request form for the proposed adjustment to the 2020 budget. This is a budget amendment. County Board approval requires a two-thirds vote of the entire membership of the County Board (20 votes of the 30 member County Board). Grant funds not expended during 2020 will be incorporated into the Human Services' 2021 budget.

#### **Disallowing Claim of Lincoln Keeser**

#### **Executive Summary**

A claim has been made against Jefferson County for damages. The claim has been reviewed by the County's insurance carrier, WMMIC, and was recommended for disallowance based on the finding that the County has no liability for this claim and is not legally responsible for the alleged damages. This resolution formally denies the claim filed against Jefferson County and directs the Corporation Counsel to give the claimant notice of disallowance. WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Committee held a public hearing for the proposed amendment on May 21, 2020, and


