6. Public Comment – Jane Stanger

11. Decision to limit the number of days allowed to send in money for a shelter reservation

Nehmer commented we have recently encountered a problem with regard to sending in deposits for rental of shelter and will be changing the Shelter Contract to limit the number of days to send in rental agreements with deposits.

12. Discussion and possible decision on issuance of a Metal Detecting permit – Ronald Dahlke

Dahlke requested permission for a Metal Detecting Permit to metal detect in the Jefferson County Parks. The Parks Committee noted after reviewing the county park ordinance this type of activity is not allowed per the ordinance that would be under section 8.09 destruction or removal property, no person shall intentionally cut down, break, injure, destroy any tree, shrub, flowers, turf, building signs, tables or other property within any park or on a recreation trail. The committee decided not to issue a permit for metal detecting in the Jefferson County Parks.

Tietz reported on the Inter-Urban Rail Line and the possibility of a bike and ped trail on the abandoned line from Watertown to Milwaukee. We will be meeting with representatives from WE Energies and Oconomowoc. Tietz will report back to the committee with any new information.

16. Jefferson County Watertrails

Nehmer stated that we are in the process of ordering 10,000 more maps. Watertrails Committee is in the process of distributing them to sports stores and will distribute the maps at the Jefferson County Fair.
