<u>9a. Discuss land purchase for construction of new City of Jefferson sanitary lift station on</u> <u>Highway Department property</u>

Mike Kelley, City of Jefferson, spoke in regards to the sanitary lift station on the corner of Woolcock and Elizabeth Street. The lift station was built between 1950-1960, and is in need of updates. It no longer fills the required needs for this area. The City would be interested in purchasing a small parcel to place a new and updated lift station in this area.

It was moved by Mr. Borland and seconded by Mr. Peterson to support the purchase of the parcel property to the City of Jefferson for a new lift station, and to move forward to determine the value and to complete a survey.

9b. Review past, present, and future Highway Department operations

Commissioner Kern handed out a summary sheet showing the number of full time employees through the years. In 1969, the department had 141 employees; in 1983, 94 employees; in 2008, 60 employees; and in 2010, 57 employees. He stated that through the years efficiencies changed the number of employees needed to perform duties. He mentioned that two employees were needed in the trucks at one time to operate the wing, and one to operate the plow. Today, technology has eliminated the need for two employees. Through time, technology, efficiencies, and privatization have caused the changes at the department. Privatization has caused some efficiency among the workers, as a control mechanism. The decline of employees has stabilized and potentially, the STH 26 bypass may increase the number of employees in the future. He commented that the department is pretty stable now and comfortable for where we are at, versus where we came from. He feels no changes are on the horizon in the near future. Commissioner Kern had also handed out a list showing county work that has been done in house previously, and since has been contracted out. In the last five years, all or in part, the listed operations are now done by private contractors: Hot mix operations; gravel crushing operations; pavement reclaiming; concrete curb and gutter; pavement marking; trucking; salt deliveries; and truck setup. Commissioner Kern also had an equipment operations summary from 2001-2010. This summary shows that although the department has approximately 20% less equipment than in 2005, the average purchase value created in the equipment fund from 2006-2010 is \$920,000.00. The summary showed equipment losses in 2002 of \$69,000.00 to equipment profits in 2010 of \$385,000.00.

Regarding the Governor's budget, the Commissioner sees transportation aids cut by 10%, or \$150,000-\$160,000. However, he sees the state side of maintenance increasing, due to more lane miles in Jefferson County. With the employee benefit cuts of \$160,000-\$170,000 for County and \$100,0000 for the state per year, the cuts should be offset by these savings in insurance and state retirement system. No Motion
