1. Call the Meeting to Order

- 7. Terri Tinsley Dog Exercise Area enforcement Sheriff's Department

A letter from a concerned dog park patron was discussed with her concerns regarding visitors not abiding by rules, not using proper size areas for their dogs and not paying fees for the use of the park. It was determined the enforcement will need to be stepped up and will look for alternative organizations to help with enforcement.

8. Travel Green Wisconsin – Gail Towers MacAskill

Towers MacAskill gave a brief talk on the purpose and goals of "Travel Green Wisconsin" an outreach project of the Department of Tourism. Travel Green is now partnering with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources on a joint marketing project called "Nature is Our Business". Jefferson County has been picked as a pilot area for this project due to several factors including local non-profit partnerships and the Glacial Heritage Area designation. The primary marketing focus will be to communicate the integrated partnership activities and opportunities of governmental, recreation, tourism and business interests in the

Jefferson County area to the mass public through written content on the web and in print media.

9. Rock Lake County Park Parking Lot project re-bid opening results and potential recommendation to County Board

Hoeft presented the re-bids for the Rock Lake County Park Parking lot.

Motion to accept B. R. Amon & Sons bid and the Parks Director is authorized to approve change orders up to the total amount of funds remaining to complete items that were removed from the original bid to bring the project cost below the amount of funds available. Nass/Kramer, carried 3-0.

10. Discussion and possible action on potential impacts of American Transmission Company's planned power line adjacent to Upper Rock Lake County Park

Hoeft reported a significant number of trees and brush have been marked for removal by the American Transmission Company, primarily between the north side of the park and I 94. He noted we will be compensated by the company for the removal of these trees and shrubs for new species to re-establish the area with species that will not interfere with their tower and lines.

11. Discussion and possible decision on new Korth Park Shelter fees.

Park fees for the new Korth Park Shelter were discussed. Fair Park Director, Novitzke discussed caterers used at the Fair Park and the fees they pay.

13. Update on Dorothy Carnes County Park Master Planning Process

Kramer reported the committee looked at areas in the park and what could be done in those areas regarding grant restrictions, since the park is a nature based park. Nehmer reported there are 81 acres of non-restricted land at the Mason Farm area and there is plenty of opportunity for planning. It is a big area in the park.

Hoeft reported on the paving of the Glacial River Trail. Paving is completed south of the Allen Creek to the end of the project. North of Allen Creek will be completed after the Enbridge Pipeline is completed.
